

**FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP****February 19, 2024 – CALGARY FLAMES [6] vs. Winnipeg Jets [3]**[Game Summary](#) | [Event Summary](#)

The Calgary Flames welcomed the Winnipeg Jets to the Scotiabank Saddledome for a Family Day matinee affair on Monday afternoon. Oliver Kylington would score his first of the season after slicing right through the Jets defence and finishing with a backhand under the glove of Hellebuyck to give the Flames an early lead. The Jets would respond with three-straight to go up 3-1, before Blake Coleman buried his team-leading 22<sup>nd</sup> goal of the campaign, and the Flames trailed 3-2 through a busy opening 20. Calgary would score the only two markers of the middle stanza with Nazem Kadri and Jonathan Huberdeau both finding the back of the net to give the Flames a 4-3 lead through 40. In the third, the home side tacked on two more as the Flames knocked off the Jets for the second time this season, 6-3.

**TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS**

This is the second and final meeting this season between the Flames and Bruins. Calgary knocked-off Boston in their first matchup earlier this month with a 4-1 win on February 6<sup>th</sup>.

This is a Pacific Division versus Atlantic Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 6-4-1 against Atlantic Division teams and a record of 10-11-3 against Eastern Conference opponents.

### **FIRST MEETING:**

The Calgary Flames began a four game Eastern Conference road trip out of the All Star Break at TD Garden against the Boston Bruins on February 6<sup>th</sup>. The Flames would pepper the Bruins in the opening frame, and just 4:20 into the contest Jonathan Huberdeau found Andrei Kuzmenko who snapped home his first as a Flame to put the visitors up 1-0. Connor Zary would double Calgary's advantage later in the period with a slick backhand finish and the Flames skated into the break, up 2-0. The middle frame would see no scoring and in the third Boston would score 4:14 in to cut the Flames lead to one. However, Calgary would respond with goals from Jonathan Huberdeau and Noah Hanifin to skate away with a 4-1 win.

### **MARKY MARK:**

Jacob Markstrom played his 200<sup>th</sup> game with the Calgary Flames on Monday against Winnipeg, becoming just the sixth goalie to play in 200 NHL games in franchise history. Markstrom turned aside 28 of the 31 shots he faced on Monday to become the fifth goaltender in Flames history to record 100 victories with the franchise. The Gavle, SWE native has recorded 15 of his 20 career shutouts in Calgary which rank third in Flames franchise history, trailing only Miikka Kiprusoff (41) and Dan Bouchard (20).

### **COMEBACK KIDS:**

After trailing 3-1 early, the Flames rallied to knock off the Jets 6-3 on Monday afternoon. With their response to the early deficit, Calgary recorded its fifth multi-goal comeback win of the season, tied with Anaheim and Toronto for the third most in the NHL this season, trailing only Colorado (7) and Dallas (6). Since the start of the 2022-23 campaign, the Flames have won an NHL-best 12 games when trailing by multiple goals.

### **SHILLY'S BACK:**

On Monday afternoon, Oliver Kylington found a lane up ice, drove the net, and buried his first of the season against the Jets. The goal was Kylington's first regular season tally since April 18<sup>th</sup>, 2022 in Chicago and first goal in NHL action since Game 3 vs. Edmonton during Round 2 of the 2022 Stanley Cup Playoffs on May 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2022. Flames defenceman have now scored 36 goals which is the second-most by a defensive core in the league so far this season, trailing only Colorado (48). Weegar leads the charge with 15 tallies, while Noah Hanifin (9), and Rasmus Andersson (7) are currently second and third in scoring among blueliners on the Flames.

### **THE KUZMENK-SHOW:**

In these clubs' first meeting, Andrei Kuzmenko made his Calgary Flames debut, scoring a goal in his second shift in a Flames uniform. Kuzmenko's goal at the 4:20 mark of the first was the fifth-fastest goal by a player in their debut with the Flames behind: Eddy Beers (1:45 on March 17, 1982), Alex Chiasson (1:46 on Oct. 12, 2016), Pierre Rioux (2:30 on Dec. 7, 1982) and Nick Ritchie (3:53 on March 6, 2023).

### **HOMETOWN HANIFIN:**

Noah Hanifin was born in Boston, MA and gets set to face his childhood team for the 18<sup>th</sup> time in his career with five goals and eight assists for 13 points against the Bruins. Hanifin has recorded a point in seven of his nine meetings against the Bruins as a member of the Flames (3G, 5A). Prior to the 2023-24 campaign, Hanifin scored his first goal of the season against the Bruins at TD Garden, (2021-22: Nov. 21 at BOS) (2022-23: Nov. 10 at BOS) and has recorded seven of his eight points against the Bruins since becoming a Flame at even strength, with his goal in these club's first meeting being his first power play goal against the Bruins since joining Calgary.

### **TRIPLE HEADER:**

With two goals and an assist on Monday against Winnipeg, Nazem Kadri recorded his 22<sup>nd</sup> multi-point game since joining Calgary in 2022-23 and moved within one of Elias Lindholm (23) for the most by a Flames player over that span. The effort was Kadri's 10<sup>th</sup> multi-point game, and second three-point outing of the season.



### **HEY DID YOU KNOW?**

The Flames are 6-0-1 this season when Kazem Kadri and Blake Coleman both score in the same game.

Blake Coleman matched his career-high in goals on Monday against Winnipeg (22) which he set during the 2018-19 season as a member of the New Jersey Devils.

Flames assistant coach Mark Savard spent five seasons with the Boston Bruins from 2006-07 to 2010-11.
