MSG Sports features some of the most recognized teams in professional sports, including the New York Knicks (NBA) and the New York Rangers (NHL). As an original franchise of the NBA, the Knicks have a rich history that includes eight trips to the NBA Finals and two NBA Championships. The Rangers hockey club is one of the “Original Six” franchises of the NHL. With four Stanley Cup Championships and 11 Stanley Cup Final appearances, the Rangers remain one of the league’s marquee teams. Both teams play their home games in New York’s Madison Square Garden – The World’s Most Famous Arena.

Other MSG Sports properties include two development league teams – the Westchester Knicks, which serve as the exclusive G-League affiliate of the Knicks, and the Hartford Wolf Pack, the player development team for the Rangers playing in the American Hockey League (AHL).

In addition to its teams, MSG Sports operates a state-of-the-art performance center. The Madison Square Garden Training Center in Greenburgh, NY is a 16-acre facility that offers the Knicks, Rangers and Westchester Knicks a specialized training environment, with dedicated equipment for each team, the latest sports technology to optimize performance and first-class amenities.

MSG Sports in the Community

MSG Sports is committed to leveraging the power of its brands to benefit communities across the tri-state area. The Company is also dedicated to affecting positive change through social impact and cause-related initiatives including food donations, providing free educational resources to local schools and supporting non-profits and fundraising efforts across the region.

The Knicks and Rangers both run grassroots programs – Junior Knicks and Junior Rangers – focused on eliminating barriers and creating more inclusive opportunities for all kids to enjoy basketball and hockey. This commitment includes programs such as Learn to Play, a 10-week skills development program for kids 10 and under, and the Rookie Series, a 10-week recreational league. The Rangers have also been a leader in growing the game by offering girls-only programming through Junior Rangers Girls Hockey, an initiative that seeks to empower girls of all ages through the sport of hockey. In February 2021, the Rangers helped make history by working with the Professional Women’s Hockey Players Association to bring women’s hockey to The Garden for the first time ever as part of the Association’s “Dream Gap Tour” to advance gender equality in the sport. Additionally, the Junior Knicks Assist program organizes charity basketball games to support non-profit youth basketball organizations through fundraising, increased visibility and community gatherings. And the Knicks support local youth basketball through equipment donations and court refurbishments, while also hosting free skills clinics and supporting local non-profit leagues. Both teams also celebrate home-grown heroes throughout the year, including awards such as the Knicks’ “Sweetwater Clifton ‘City Spirit’ Award,” which pays tribute to local heroes who have made a difference in the lives of others, and the Rangers’ “Salute to Our Troops,” which proudly honors the brave men and women who have served or currently serve in the United States Armed Forces.

MSG Sports also has a close association with the Garden of Dreams Foundation, a non-profit organization that assists young people in need. In partnership with MSG Sports, Madison Square Garden Entertainment Corp. and Sphere Entertainment Co., Garden of Dreams provides young people in our communities with access to scholarships; educational and skills opportunities; mentoring programs; and memorable experiences that enhance their lives, help shape their futures and create lasting joy. All of the Foundation’s activities target young people facing illness or financial challenges, as well as children of uniformed personnel who have been lost or injured while serving our communities. JAMES L DOLAN

**Executive Chairman and Chief Executive Officer,
Madison Square Garden Sports Corp.**

James L. Dolan is Executive Chairman and Chief Executive Officer of Madison Square Garden Sports Corp. (MSG Sports), which features the New York Knicks (NBA) and New York Rangers (NHL) franchises. In addition, the Company's properties include two development league teams – the Westchester Knicks (NBAGL) and the Hartford Wolf Pack (AHL).

In his role at MSG Sports, Mr. Dolan sets the Company's overall vision and guides the development of effective strategies to drive its business and maximize growth opportunities. Mr. Dolan also serves as governor to the National Basketball Association and the National Hockey League on behalf of the New York Knicks and New York Rangers.



In addition to his oversight of MSG Sports, Mr. Dolan is Executive Chairman and Chief Executive Officer of Madison Square Garden Entertainment Corp. (MSG Entertainment). MSG Entertainment's portfolio features renowned venues and entertainment brands, including Madison Square Garden – home to the New York Knicks and New York Rangers – as well as the original production, the Christmas Spectacular Starring the Radio City Rockettes.

Mr. Dolan is also Executive Chairman and Chief Executive Officer of Sphere Entertainment Co., whose portfolio includes Sphere – a next-generation entertainment medium that is redefining the future of entertainment. The first Sphere venue opened in Las Vegas in September 2023. In addition, Sphere Entertainment has two regional sports networks, MSG Network and MSG Sportsnet, that telecast a wide range of sports content, including exclusive live local games featuring the New York Knicks and New York Rangers. Mr. Dolan is also Chairman of AMC Networks Inc., which owns and operates several award-winning brands in television and film.

Mr. Dolan was CEO of Cablevision Systems Corporation from 1995 until June 2016, when the media and telecommunications company, which served as MSG's parent company until 2010, was sold to Altice. Prior to his role as Cablevision CEO, Mr. Dolan was CEO of Rainbow Media Holdings, the former Cablevision programming subsidiary now known as AMC Networks. Mr. Dolan began his career with Cablevision in the 1970s and held a variety of executive positions before overseeing Rainbow Media.

Mr. Dolan supports the ongoing commitment of MSG Sports, MSG Entertainment, and Sphere Entertainment to their communities, particularly through the Garden of Dreams Foundation, the non-profit organization that works closely with all three companies to assist young people in need. In addition, he is Vice Chairman Emeritus of the board of the Lustgarten Foundation, an organization he helped found in 1998, which today is the nation's largest private supporter of pancreatic cancer research.

Mr. Dolan has six children and is an avid musician.



CHRIS DRURY

President and General Manager, New York Rangers

Chris Drury enters his fifth season as the Rangers' President and General Manager, after being named the 12th President and 12th General Manager in franchise history on May 5, 2021.

Drury begins his 11th season with the Rangers in a front office role. He rejoined the organization on September 4, 2015, and he was promoted to Associate General Manager on February 5, 2021 after previously serving as the team's Assistant General Manager from September 2, 2016 until he received the promotion. In his current role with the Rangers, Drury also serves as an Alternate Governor.



In his first season as President and General Manager in 2021-22, Drury was named a finalist for the Jim Gregory Award, an annual award presented to recognize the work of the top general manager in the NHL.

During his tenure in a front office role, Drury has also served as the General Manager for the Rangers' American Hockey League (AHL) affiliate, the Hartford Wolf Pack. He was named Hartford's General Manager on May 16, 2017. In 2019-20, after he helped assemble a new coaching staff in Hartford, the Wolf Pack posted a 31-20-6-5 record in 62 games. Hartford's .589 points percentage in 2019-20 was the best the team posted since the 2014-15 season. The Wolf Pack followed up their successful 2019-20 season by posting a 14-9-1 record (.604 points percentage) in a 24-game season in 2020-21. Drury also served as the team's Director of Player Development in 2015-16.

In addition to his role with the Rangers, Drury has worked in an executive role at the international level. Prior to the NHL opting out of the 2022 Olympics, Drury was named AGM of Team USA. He has served as the General Manager for the U.S. Men's National Team at the IIHF World Championship in 2019 and 2021, and helped Team USA earn a bronze medal in the tournament in 2021. Drury was also selected to serve in the same capacity for the 2020 IIHF World Championship. He served as the Assistant General Manager at the inaugural NHL 4 Nations Face-Off in February of 2025 and will serve as the AGM at the 2026 Olympic Games.

During his 12-year NHL career, the Trumbull, Connecticut native skated in 892 games with the Colorado Avalanche, Calgary Flames, Buffalo Sabres and the Rangers, registering 255 goals and 360 assists for 615 points. Drury captured the Stanley Cup as a member of the Avalanche in 2000-01, ranking second in the NHL with 11 goals in 23 games during the team's playoff run. In 1998-99, Drury received the Calder Trophy as the NHL's Rookie of the Year after registering 20 goals and 24 assists for 44 points with Colorado. Drury recorded at least 20 goals in nine seasons in his career.

Drury's team reached the playoffs in nine of his 12 seasons in the NHL, and his team advanced to the Conference Finals on six occasions. In 135 career NHL playoff games, Drury registered 47 goals and 42 assists for 89 points, along with a plus-24 rating and 46 penalty minutes. Over the 12 seasons in which he played in the NHL (1998-99 – 2010-11), he led the NHL in playoff game-winning goals (17), ranked second in playoff overtime goals (four), ranked fourth in playoff goals and ranked ninth in playoff games played.

Drury played four seasons with the Rangers (2007-08 – 2010-11) after signing with the team as a free agent on July 1, 2007. In addition, Drury served as the Rangers captain for three seasons (2008-09 - 2010-11) after being named the 25th captain in franchise history – as well as the second American-born captain in franchise history – on October 3, 2008. In 264 regular season games with the Blueshirts, Drury recorded 62 goals and 89 assists for 151 points, along with 116 penalty minutes. Over his first three seasons with the Rangers, Drury led the team in goals (61) and points (146), ranked second in assists (85), and tied for second in game-winning goals (10). In addition, the Rangers made the playoffs three times during Drury's four seasons with the team. Drury is the second person in franchise history who served as the Rangers' captain while playing for the team and later served as the Rangers' General Manager following their playing career (along with Phil Esposito).

Prior to joining the NHL, Drury completed one of the most impressive collegiate hockey careers in NCAA history. Over four seasons at Boston University (1994-95 – 1997-98), Drury tallied 113 goals and 101 assists for 214 points in 155 games. During his collegiate career, the Terriers captured the National Championship in 1994-95, appeared in the National Championship Game twice (1994-95, 1996-97), and appeared in the Frozen Four three times (1994-95, 1995-96, 1996-97). Drury was selected as a First Team All-American on two occasions (1996-97, 1997-98), a Hobey Baker Finalist as the Top Player in College Hockey on three occasions (1995-96, 1996-97, 1997-98), and he became the first Terrier to receive the Hobey Baker Award in 1997-98.

Internationally, Drury represented the United States in numerous tournaments and earned several medals. He participated in three consecutive Winter Olympics (2002, 2006, 2010), capturing silver medals at the 2002 Winter Olympics in Salt Lake City, Utah and the 2010 Winter Olympics in Vancouver, British Columbia. Drury was inducted into the U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame in 2015.

Drury and his wife, Rory, have a son, Luke, and two daughters, Dylan and Kelly.



JAMAAL LESANE

Chief Operating Officer

As Chief Operating Officer of Madison Square Garden Sports Corp. (MSG Sports), Jamaal Lesane works closely with executive leadership to strengthen the Company's portfolio and support its long-term direction and growth. This includes supporting MSG Sports' overall strategic vision, while driving innovation and optimizing corporate performance across the Company's professional sports franchises. In his role, Mr. Lesane also oversees business operations for the Company's teams, including the New York Knicks and New York Rangers, directly managing core functions such as strategic planning, marketing, ticketing, and the in-game experience, as well as community and fan development.

Mr. Lesane has been with the MSG Family of Companies since 2008, in roles of increasing responsibility. Prior to becoming Chief Operating Officer of MSG Sports in July 2024, Mr. Lesane served as Executive Vice President and General Counsel, where he was the Company's chief legal officer. Prior to MSG Sports becoming a standalone company in April 2020 when The Madison Square Garden Company (MSG) separated its entertainment and sports businesses, Mr. Lesane was MSG's Senior Vice President, Legal and Business Affairs. In this role he served as team counsel for the Knicks, Rangers, and Westchester Knicks, while also providing legal support for all other MSG sports properties – including college basketball, boxing, wrestling, and mixed martial arts – occurring at MSG's venues, which includes Madison Square Garden.

Prior to joining MSG, Mr. Lesane worked as an Associate Counsel at Home Box Office, Inc. (HBO), where he provided legal support and counsel to HBO Sports and HBO Licensing and Retail. Prior to HBO, he was a corporate lawyer at Covington and Burling LLP.

Mr. Lesane graduated with a B.A. from Yale University and received his J.D. from Harvard Law School. He was born, raised, and currently resides in Brooklyn, NY.





RYAN MARTIN

Associate General Manager &
General Manager, Hartford Wolf Pack.

Ryan Martin begins his fifth season with the Rangers as Assistant General Manager and General Manager of the Hartford Wolf Pack, but first in his role as Associate General Manager.

With the Rangers, Martin oversees all aspects of hockey operations with the Wolf Pack, including player personnel decisions, player development, contract negotiations, and player movement.

Martin was General Manager of the 2022 U.S. Men's National Team at the World Championships and has played a role in the player personnel decisions for Team USA for over a decade.



Martin joined the Rangers organization after spending 16 seasons with the Detroit Red Wings organization (2005-06 – 2020-21). He spent eleven seasons (2010-11 – 2020-21) as the organization's Assistant General Manager. In that role, Martin spent eight seasons (2013-14 – 2020-21) as the General Manager of the Red Wings AHL affiliate, the Grand Rapids Griffins. Under Martin's guidance, the Griffins won the 2017 Calder Cup and advanced to the Calder Cup Playoffs in every season in which the annual postseason tournament took place.

While with the Red Wing's organization, Martin spent five seasons (2005-06 – 2009-10) as the team's Director of Hockey Administration. Martin was also a member of the Red Wings organization when the club won the Stanley Cup at the conclusion of the 2008-09 NHL season.

In addition to his work with the Red Wings, Martin served as a scout with USA Hockey for their World Junior Championship team in 2021. That team won a Gold Medal in the Edmonton bubble in January 2021.

Prior to beginning his career with the Red Wings, Martin worked in Denver, Colorado from 1999 through 2003 as an attorney. He also worked at KO Sports, Inc.



ASSISTANT GENERAL MANAGERS

JIM SULLIVAN

Jim Sullivan begins his first season as Assistant General Manager and 17th with the Rangers organization after spending four seasons as the Rangers' Vice President, Hockey Strategy after being promoted prior to the start of the 2021-22 season.

Sullivan served as Director, Player Care & Development/Analytics & Hockey Technology for seven seasons. In his role, he works directly with the Rangers' front office to provide reporting and analysis of player progress, skill building plans, and improvement metrics. Under Sullivan's guidance, the Rangers expanded their use of analytics, utilizing a software platform to import tracking data, statistics, and salary information in order to assist in player valuation and analysis.

Sullivan originally joined the Rangers organization in 2009 as a video analyst, and he was promoted to Director of Hockey Technology after two seasons. In his role as Director of Hockey Technology, Sullivan was responsible for researching and implementing solutions in accordance with the Rangers' organizational strategy.



RYANE CLOWE

Ryane Clowe begins his first season as Assistant General Manager and rejoins the Rangers' front office after spending last season as the Assistant General Manager for the San Jose Sharks.

He spent three seasons in the Rangers' hockey operations department prior to becoming Assistant General Manager with the Sharks (2021-22 – 2023-24), holding the titles of Hockey Operations Advisor and Co-Senior Advisor.

Prior to joining the Rangers' front office, Clowe spent two seasons as an Assistant Coach with the New Jersey Devils and part of one season as the head coach of the Newfoundland Growlers of the ECHL. He played parts of 10 seasons in the NHL with the Sharks, Rangers, and Devils, registering 112 goals and 197 assists for 309 points in 491 career NHL games.





MIKE SULLIVAN

Head Coach

Mike Sullivan begins his first season with the Rangers after being named the 38th Head Coach in franchise history on May 2, 2025.



Sullivan has posted a 479-311-15-112 (W-L-T-OTL) record in 917 games as head coach with the Boston Bruins (2003-04 – 2005-06) and Pittsburgh Penguins (2015-16 – 2024-25). During his tenure with the Penguins, he led the team to back-to-back Stanley Cup Championships in 2015-16 and 2016-17, and in the process, he became just the second head coach in NHL history to win the Stanley Cup in each of his first two seasons with a team. Sullivan is also the only American-born head coach in NHL history who has won the Stanley Cup multiple times.

With Pittsburgh, the team posted a 409-255-89 record in 753 regular season games. He helped Pittsburgh reach the postseason in each of his first seven seasons behind the Penguins' bench, and the Penguins posted a 44-38 record in 82 postseason games with

Sullivan as their head coach. Sullivan is the Penguins' all-time leader in several coaching categories, including regular season games coached, regular season wins, postseason games coached, and postseason wins.

In addition to his head coaching experience in the NHL, Sullivan has been a part of coaching staffs for several NHL teams. He has eight years of experience as an Assistant Coach with four different NHL teams: Boston (2002-03), the Tampa Bay Lightning (2007-08 – 2008-09), New York Rangers (2009-10 – 2012-13), and Vancouver (2013-14). Sullivan was also the development coach for the Chicago Blackhawks during the 2014-15 season when they won the Stanley Cup. Sullivan also served parts of two seasons as a head coach in the American Hockey League (AHL) with the Providence Bruins (2002-03) and Wilkes-Barre/Scranton Penguins (2015-16).

Internationally, the Marshfield, Massachusetts native has coached with Team USA in several tournaments. Sullivan served as Team USA's head coach at the inaugural 2025 4 Nations Face-Off, and he was named the head coach for the U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team for the upcoming 2026 Winter Olympics. Sullivan had also initially been named the head coach for Team USA at the 2022 Winter Olympics (ultimately did not coach in the tournament after NHL players were unable to play). He also served as an Assistant Coach for Team USA at the 2006 Winter Olympics and the 2016 World Cup of Hockey.

During his playing career, Sullivan skated in 709 career NHL games over 11 seasons with the San Jose Sharks, Calgary Flames, Boston Bruins, and Phoenix Coyotes. He was selected by the Rangers in the fourth round (69th overall) of the 1987 NHL Draft. In addition, Sullivan played four years of college hockey at Boston University, and he served as the team's captain in his senior year.

DAVID QUINN

Assistant Coach | David Quinn begins his first season as an Assistant Coach with the Rangers after being named to the position on June 5, 2025.

Quinn rejoins the Rangers organization after serving as an assistant coach with the Penguins last season under Mike Sullivan.

He has over 30 years of coaching experience, including five seasons as a head coach in the NHL with the Rangers (2018-21) and San Jose Sharks (2022-24).

During Quinn's tenure as a head coach in the NHL, two defensemen won the Norris Trophy as the league's best defenseman (Adam Fox – 2020-21 with the Rangers; Erik Karlsson – 2022-23 with San Jose).

The Cranston, Rhode Island native has also been behind the bench in several international tournaments with Team USA. Quinn was an assistant coach at the 2025 4 Nations Face-off, as well as the head coach of the 2022 and 2023 World Championship teams and the 2022 Men's Olympic Team.

Quinn served as head coach at Boston University from 2013-18, and the Terriers posted a 105-68-21 record over his five seasons at the helm. During Quinn's tenure, Boston University made four consecutive appearances in the NCAA tournament (2015-18), including three regional final appearances, and captured two Hockey East tournament titles and two Hockey East Regular Season titles. In the 2014-15 season, Quinn guided Boston University to an appearance in the National Championship game.

Sacco joins the Rangers organization after spending the past 11 seasons with the Boston Bruins. He served for 10 seasons as an assistant coach before being elevated to associate coach at the start of the 2024-25 season and was later named interim head coach for the final 62 games of last season.

Prior to his tenure with the Bruins, Sacco spent one season as an assistant coach for the Buffalo Sabres (2013-14) and four seasons as the head coach of the Colorado Avalanche (2009-13). In his first season as a head coach in 2009-10, Sacco was named a finalist for the Jack Adams Award. The native of Medford, Massachusetts skated in 738 career NHL games with Toronto, Anaheim, NY Islanders, Washington, and Philadelphia, where he had 213 points over his 13 NHL seasons.



TY HENNES

Assistant Coach | Ty Hennes begins his second season with the Rangers coaching staff after being named Assistant Coach on June 5, 2025.

Hennes joins the Rangers organization after serving in the Pittsburgh Penguins organization for the last seven seasons, including parts of the last three seasons as an assistant coach.

Before his promotion to assistant coach during the 2022-23 campaign, Hennes spent four seasons as the Penguins' skating and skills development coach. In his role with the Penguins, he assisted the team's coaching staff with practices, skills sessions and on-ice injury rehabilitation.

Hennes, who is a native of Dickinson, North Dakota, but grew up in Kent, Washington, also has previous experience with USA Hockey. He served as an assistant coach at the 2024 World Championships, as well as being a coach/evaluator at various USA Hockey National Player Development Camps. Prior to the start of his coaching career, Hennes played four seasons of collegiate hockey at Boston College, where he was a member of the Eagles' 2001 national championship squad.
