- Eight different Stars skaters recorded a point during the game and four had multi-point outings.
- The win marked Dallas' 30th win in just 48 games, tied with 2015-16 for their third fewest needed to hit the mark. The only seasons they won 30 games faster were 2005-06 (44 GP) and 1998-99 (46 GP) according to NHL Stats.
- **Roope Hintz** opened the scoring with his 20th goal of the season, making 2024-25 the fourth consecutive year that he has scored at least 20 goals.
- **Wyatt Johnston** factored on both of **Jason Robertson's** goals, giving him points in six consecutive games for the third time this season, matching his career high that he set from Nov. 20 to Dec. 1 and hit again from Dec. 23 to Jan. 4.
- **Miro Heiskanen** assisted on **Jamie Benn's** goal, which allowed him to tie Darian Hatcher (223) for sixth on the franchise's all-time assists list by defensemen.
- **Matt Duchene** and **Evgenii Dadonov** both recorded two assists in the win.

GAME NOTES

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Tonight is the second of three games the Stars will play against the Blues this season and the only time the teams are facing off in St. Louis this year. They will next play on March 2 in Dallas.
- Yesterday's game against the Golden Knights and tonight's game against the Blues is the sixth of 11 back-to-back sets that the Stars will play this season.
 - The Stars also played a back-to-back sets the last two weekends: against Montreal and Ottawa on Jan. 11 and 12 and against Colorado and Detroit on Jan. 18 and 19.
- Since Jan. 1, the Stars have gone 10-for-33 on the power play for a 33.3 percent success rate, which was the fourth-best mark in the NHL during that span entering play Saturday.
- Entering play Saturday, the Stars and the Washington Capitals were the only NHL teams this season that have not lost more than two consecutive games.
- The Stars have allowed only 2.50 goals against per game this season, which was tied for the fourth-best mark in the NHL entering play Saturday. Dallas has allowed two or fewer goals in 27 of the 48 games that they have played this year.

SINGING THE BLUES

- Dallas is 121-131-56 all-time vs. St. Louis, including a 46-81-28 mark on the road.
- The Stars have earned points in seven of their last eight contests against the Blues (6-1-1). Since the 2013-14 season Dallas has earned 21 wins against St. Louis, which is the fourth-most of any team across the NHL during that span.
- Dallas' .664 points percentage against the Blues since the start of the 2022-23 season ranks third in the NHL, trailing only the Boston Bruins and the Carolina Hurricanes.
- **Jamie Benn** has scored 51 points (22-29—51) against St. Louis during his career, his second-highest total against any opponent since making his NHL debut in 2009-10. His 51 points against the Blues rank third among active NHL skaters and his 22 goals rank second among active NHL skaters.
- **Matt Duchene** has 17 points (6-11—17) in his last 14 games against the Blues dating back to Feb. 15, 2020.
- **Evgenii Dadonov** has registered 10 points (2-8—10) in 17 career games against St. Louis. In the eight total games where Dadonov has earned a point against the Blues, his team has a 6-1-1 record, dating back to Jan. 9, 2018.
- **Jason Robertson** has 10 points (5-5—10) in 12 career games against the Blues including a multi-point outing in his last game vs. St. Louis on Dec. 14 (1-1—2). Since the 2021-22 season, his 10 points against the Blues mark the most of any active Stars skater during that span.

BACK TO DECEMBER

- Since Dec. 23, the Stars have posted an 11-4-1 record for 23 points and a .719 points percentage. No team had won more games than the Stars since Dec. 23 entering play Saturday, and their 23 points were tied with Washington for the most in the league during that span.
 - Only Washington (.767) has a better points percentage than Dallas since Dec. 23 entering play Saturday.
- During that span, the Stars have outscored their opponents 50-37. Their plus-13 goal differential was the second-best mark in the league since Dec. 23 entering play Saturday, trailing only the Washington Capitals (plus-17).
- Thirty-six of the Dallas' 50 goals since Dec. 23 have been scored at 5-on-5, which ranked second in the NHL entering play Saturday, trailing only St. Louis (38).
- The Stars have gone 495-for-923 at the faceoff dot since Dec. 23 for a 53.6 percent success rate, which was the third-best mark in the league during that span entering play Saturday.
- **Jason Robertson** is the team's leading scorer since Dec. 23, totaling 22 points (10-12—22) in 16 games played. His 22 points were tied for the second-most in the NHL during that span entering play Saturday, trailing only Edmonton's Leon Draisaitl (24).
- Fourteen different Stars skaters have scored at least one goal since Dec. 23: **Jason Robertson** (10), **Jamie Benn** (7), **Roope Hintz** (6), **Matt Duchene** (5), **Wyatt Johnston** (5), **Evgenii Dadonov** (4), **Mavrik Bourque** (3), **Thomas Harley** (3), **Logan Stankoven** (2), **Oskar Bäck** (1), **Colin Blackwell** (1), **Matěj Blümel** (1), **Miro Heiskanen** (1) and **Esa Lindell** (1).
 - **Robertson's** 10 goals since Dec. 23 were tied for the third-most in the NHL entering play Saturday.

ROAD WARRIORS

- The Stars have posted a 6-2-0 record in their last eight road games dating back to Dec. 23. Their six wins, 12 points and .750 points percentage on the road during that span all ranked second in the NHL entering play Saturday.
- Dallas has outscored its opponents 27-19 on the road during that span. Their plus-eight goal differential on the road during that span was the best mark in the league entering play Saturday.
- **Jake Oettinger** has posted a 4-0-0 record in four games played on the road since Dec. 23, posting a .936 and 1.70 goals-against average during that span.
 - His four road wins were tied for the most in the NHL during that span entering play Saturday and his goals-against average and save percentage both ranked seventh among netminders to play in at least two games since Dec. 23.
- **Matt Duchene** is the team's leading scorer on the road this year, totaling 25 points (9-16—25) in 22 games. He has seven points (3-4—7) in his last seven games on the road.
- **Jason Robertson** has 15 points (5-10—15) in his last 14 road games and enters tonight's game riding a three-game road point streak.
- **Wyatt Johnston** has 10 points (3-7—10) in his last 10 road games dating back to Dec. 4 against the Los Angeles Kings.
- **Logan Stankoven** has five points (2-3—5) in his last five road games.

JOHNNY B. GOODE

- **Wyatt Johnston** tallied two assists in Dallas' last game to extend his point streak to six games. With the assists, **Johnston** now has 32 points (9-23—32) in 31 games since Nov. 28.
 - **Johnston's** assists brought his career total up to 78, passing **Matty Beniers** (77) and **Owen Power** (77) for the most by a skater drafted in 2021.
- **Johnston's** six-game point streak was tied for the eighth-longest active point streak in the NHL entering play Saturday.
- A goal or an assist tonight would give **Johnston** points in seven consecutive games for the first time in his career.
- **Johnston** enters tonight's matchup one point shy of reaching the 40-point plateau for the third consecutive season.
- **Johnston** is now pacing to finish the year with 19 goals, 47 assists and 68 points
 - Forty-seven assists and 68 points would both be career highs for the forward.

- Since Nov. 28, the Stars are outscoring their opponents 22-14 at 5-on-5 when **Johnston** is on the ice according to Natural Stat Trick.
 - His 22 5-on-5 on-ice goals for since Nov. 28 are the most of any Stars skater.
- **Johnston** tied his single-game career high with three assists in Dallas' game on Jan. 18, factoring in on all three of the Stars' goals.
- **Johnston** also went 20-for-24 at the faceoff dot on Jan. 18, setting career highs in both faceoffs taken and draws won in a single game. It also made **Johnston** the first Stars skater to win 20 draws in a single-game since Brad Richards went 20-for-37 at the faceoff dot Dec. 18, 2008.

ROBO ON THE GOGO

- **Jason Robertson** scored two goals in Dallas' last game — including the game winner — to bring his career total to 150. He is the 19th skater in franchise history to score 150 goals with the team.
- **Robertson's** second goal of the game was 358th career point (150-208—358), giving him sole possession of 19th on the franchise's all-time scoring list.
- **Robertson** enters tonight's matchup having totaled 31 points (12-19—31) in his last 26 games played dating back to Dec. 1 against the Winnipeg Jets. His 31 points during that span are the most of any Stars skater and were tied for seventh in the NHL entering play Saturday.
 - **Robertson** has multi-point efforts in eight of the last 13 games that he has played.
- **Robertson** factored in on all three of Dallas' goals in their Jan. 18 game against the Avalanche, scoring two goals and adding an assist to bring his season total to 40 points (14-26—40). **Robertson** has recorded at least 40 points in each of the five full NHL seasons that he has played.
 - His two goals came just 39 seconds apart, marking the fastest two goals by a Stars skater since Joe Pavelski on Nov. 26, 2021 (0:19) according to NHL Stats.
- **Robertson** scored the deciding goal in the shootout in Dallas' Jan. 11 game, a 2-1 victory over the Montréal Canadiens.
 - In his career, **Robertson** has gone 16-for-28 in shootout attempts. His 57.1 career percent success rate in the shootout is tied for the sixth-best mark among all active NHL skaters that have at least five shootout attempts.
- **Robertson** recorded two assists in Dallas' game on Jan. 2 against the Ottawa Senators for his 100th career multi-point game, becoming the 15th player in Stars/North Stars history to record 100 multi-point games according to NHL Stats. Only four players in franchise history have posted 100 multi-point games before age 26: Brian Bellows (151 GP), Mike Modano (126 GP), Bobby Smith (123 GP) and Dino Ciccarelli (101 GP).
- **Robertson** tallied three points (1-2—3) in Dallas' game on Dec. 31 against the Sabres to take sole possession of 21st on the franchise's all-time scoring list, passing Joe Nieuwendyk and Al MacAdam. **Robertson** has 344 career points (142-202—344) in 329 regular-season games.
- **Robertson's** second assist against the Sabres was the 200th of his career, making him the 27th player in Stars franchise history at the seventh player from the 2017 draft class to total 200 NHL assists.
- Additionally, **Robertson** — who turned 25 on July 21 — became the third player in Stars team history to register 200 career assists at age 25 or younger (all assists w/ DAL) according to NHL Stats.

HEATING UP

- **Jake Oettinger** has an 8-2-0 record in his last 10 games played dating back to Dec. 29, posting a .925 save percentage and a 1.88 goals-against average during that span.
 - His eight wins since Dec. 29 were tied with Washington's Logan Thompson for the most in the NHL entering play Saturday.
 - Among goalies that have played in at least five games since Dec. 29, **Oettinger's** 1.88 goals-against average ranked fifth in the NHL entering play Saturday.
- **Miro Heiskanen** has recorded an assist in each of Dallas' last three games. A goal or an assist tonight would give him points in four consecutive games for the second time this season. An assist would give him his first four-game assist streak of the year.
- **Roope Hintz** scored his 20th goal of the season in Dallas' last game on Jan. 24 against the Golden Knights. **Hintz** is the sixth Stars skater in the last 30 years to have at least four consecutive 20-goal seasons according to NHL Stats, joining Mike Modano (8: 1995-96 – 2002-03), **Jamie Benn** (6: 2013-14 – 2018-19), **Tyler Seguin** (6: 2013-14 – 2018-19), **Loui Eriksson** (4: 2008-09 – 2011-12) and **Joe Pavelski** (4: 2020-21 – 2023-24).

LEAGUE LEADERS

- **Miro Heiskanen** is averaging 25:16 of ice time per game this season, which was the fifth-most in the NHL this year entering play Saturday.
- **Thomas Harley** enters tonight's matchup against the Blues with a plus-24 on-ice, even-strength goal differential this season, which was the fifth-best mark in the NHL this year entering play Saturday.
 - In all this season, **Harley** has a plus-21 plus/minus rating, which was tied for the second-best mark among all NHL defensemen entering play Saturday.
- **Oskar Bäck** has gone 72-for-126 at the faceoff dot this season for a 57.1 percent success rate, which topped all rookies that have taken at least 20 draws this season entering play Saturday.

DOUBLE DUTCH

- **Matt Duchene** had two assists in Dallas' last game on Jan. 24 against the Golden Knights and now has 17 points (5-12-17) in his last 14 games played dating back to Dec. 29 against the Chicago Blackhawks.
- His 17 points during that span are the second-most on the Stars roster and were tied for seventh in the NHL entering play Saturday.
- **Duchene** has 47 points (18-29-47) this season, which tops all Stars skaters. It puts him on pace to finish the year with 31 goals, 50 assists and 80 points.
 - Fifty assists would be a career high for the forward.
 - Thirty-one goals (tied) and 80 points would all be the second-highest totals of his 15-year career.
- In all, **Duchene** has totaled 112 points (43-69-112) in 128 regular-season games with the Stars since the start of the 2023-24 season, which is the second-most of any Stars skater during that span (**Jason Robertson**; 124).

IRON SHARPENS IRON

- The Stars have four skaters that have played in at least 200 consecutive games: **Jamie Benn** (345), **Jason Robertson** (258), **Esa Lindell** (218) and **Wyatt Johnston** (212). Entering play Saturday, Dallas was the only team in the NHL to have four players riding Iron Man streaks of at least 200 games.
- Dallas' last game on Jan. 24 against the Golden Knights was the 345th consecutive game that **Benn** played in, which is the fifth-longest active Iron Man streak in the NHL. He is one of seven players to have an Iron Man streak of at least 300 games.
- **Robertson's** 258-game Iron Man streak is the 13th-longest in the NHL. The Stars and the Detroit Red Wings were the only teams to have two players ranked in the top 15 entering play Saturday.
- **Lindell's** 218-game Iron Man streak ranks eighth among all NHL defensemen.
- **Johnston's** Iron Man Streak began when he made his NHL debut on Oct. 13, 2022. He is one of 44 players in NHL history to begin their NHL career by playing in at least 200 consecutive games according to NHL Stats.

ONE FOR THE HISTORY BOOKS

- **Jake Oettinger's** next shutout will be the 12th of his career, which will tie Jon Casey for the sixth-most in franchise history.
- **Esa Lindell** enters tonight's contest two assists shy of tying Alex Goligoski (155) for 25th all-time among Stars/North Stars defensemen.
- **Miro Heiskanen** enters tonight's game one assist shy of tying Gordie Roberts (224) for 5th all-time among Stars/North Stars defensemen.

CONNECT FOUR

- Stars forward **Roope Hintz** (Finland), defensemen **Miro Heiskanen** (Finland) and **Esa Lindell** (Finland), and goaltender **Jake Oettinger** (United States) have all been selected to represent their home country at the 4 Nations Face-Off, which will be held in Montreal and Boston from Feb. 12 to 20, 2025.
- Dallas is one of six NHL teams to have at least one forward, defenseman and goaltender from their roster to be selected for the 4 Nations Face-Off, with the others being Boston, Minnesota, Vancouver, Vegas and Winnipeg.
- Only six teams have had more players selected to a 4 Nations roster than the Stars: Colorado, Florida, Minnesota, Tampa Bay and Vegas. The full breakdown is as follows:

- All four players have previously represented their home countries in international competition.
 - **Heiskanen** has played for Finland at the 2017 and 2018 IIHF World Junior Championships, 2018 and 2022 (gold) IIHF World Championships and at the 2018 Winter Olympic Games.
 - **Lindell** suited up for the Fins at the 2014 IIHF World Junior Championship, where he won a gold medal. He again represented Finland at the 2015, 2016 (silver) and 2022 (gold) IIHF World Championships and at the 2016 World Cup of Hockey.
 - **Hintz** previously played for Finland at the 2015 and 2016 IIHF World Junior Championships, winning a gold medal at the later tournament.
 - **Oettinger** has played for Team USA at the 2017 and 2018 IIHF World Junior Championships and at the 2021 IIHF World Championship. He medaled in all three tournaments, winning bronze in 2018 and 2021 and gold in 2017.
- The 4 Nations Face-Off will mark the first time that all three of **Heiskanen**, **Hintz** and **Lindell** are playing for Finland together.
 - **Heiskanen** and **Lindell** previously won a gold medal together at the 2022 IIHF World Championship.

- The Stars will also be well-represented among the 4 Nations staff, with **Jim Nill** (Associate GM), **Pete DeBoer** (Assistant Coach) and **Misha Donskov** (Assistant Coach) all set to join Canada's staff for the tournament. Additionally, former Star **Jere Lehtinen** will serve as Finland's General Manager.

CONNECTIONS

- Blues GM Doug Armstrong was the assistant GM with the North Stars in 1992-93 and the Stars from 1993-94 to 2001-02 before becoming the GM in Dallas mid-season in 2001-02 until the middle of the 2007-08 season.
- Blues assistant coach Steve Ott was drafted by the Dallas Stars with the 25th pick of the 2000 NHL Draft. He played for the Stars in 2003-04 and 2005-06 to 2011-12 where he served as the assistant captain his last two seasons.
- Stars GM **Jim Nill** and Player Development Coordinator **Ben Bishop** played for the Blues during their careers. Nill during the 1981-82 season and Bishop in 2008-09 and 2010-11.
- Blues forward Radek Faksa was drafted by the Stars 13th overall in the 2012 NHL Draft and played for Dallas from 2015-16 to 2023-24.
- Blues head coach Jim Montgomery played for the Stars for nine games during the 2001-02 and 2002-03 seasons. He also was the head coach in Dallas from 2018-19 to 2019-20.
- Blues defenseman Ryan Suter played for Dallas from 2021-22 to 2023-24.
- Stars Special Assistant to the President **Marty Turco** and Blues defenseman Nick Leddy played together with the Chicago Blackhawks during the 2010-11 season.
- Stars Director of Player Personnel **Rich Peverly** and Blues defenseman Ryan Suter played together in Nashville from 2006-07 to 2008-09.
- Stars defenseman **Brendan Smith** and forward **Colin Blackwell** played with Blues forward Pavel Buchnevich as members of the New York Rangers. Smith and Buchnevich were teammates from 2016-17 to 2020-21, Blackwell joined the duo for the 2020-21 season.
- Stars goaltending coach **Jeff Reese** and Blues forward Brayden Schenn were both with the Philadelphia Flyers from 2011-12 to 2014-15 when Reese was a goalie coach in Philadelphia.
- Stars forward **Sam Steel** and defenseman **Matt Dumba** were teammates with Blues forward Oskar Sundqvist in Minnesota, when Sundqvist played 15 games for the Wild during the 2022-23 season.
- Stars forward **Matt Duchene** and Blues forward Alexandre Texier played two games together with the Columbus Blue Jackets at the end of the 2018-19 season.
- Stars goaltender **Casey DeSmith** and Blues defenseman Pierre-Olivier Joseph were teammates in Pittsburgh from 2020-21 to 2022-23.
- Stars defenseman **Matt Dumba** and Blues defenseman Ryan Suter were teammates from 2013-14 to 2020-21 in Minnesota.
- Stars defenseman **Brendan Smith** and Blues assistant coach Steve Ott played together in Detroit during the 2016-17 season.
- Stars Player Development Assistant **Jordie Benn** and Blues assistant coach Steve Ott were teammates at the end of the 2016-17 season in Montreal.
- Stars Director of Player Development **Rich Peverly** and Special Assistant to the President **Marty Turco** played under Blues assistant coach Claude Julien when Julien was the head coach in Boston. Peverly played under Julien in Boston from 2010-11 to 2012-13, winning a Stanley Cup together in 2011, and Turco played under Julien in 2011-12.
