## TONIGHT'S GAME NOTES

### SERIES TRENDS

The Avalanche/Nordiques are 6-9 in best-of-seven playoff series when trailing 2-games-to-1, which includes a 4-6 mark since relocating to Denver...The Avs came back from a 2-1 series deficit to win the 1996 Conference Semifinal versus Chicago, 1999 Conference Semifinal against Detroit, 2002 Conference Semifinal against San Jose and the 2008 Conference Quarterfinal against Minnesota...The Avs will try and even the series tonight...The franchise is 11-12 when splitting the first four games of a best-of-seven series, 8-8 since moving to Denver.

### THERE'S NO PLACE LIKE HOME

Colorado is 2-1 at home so far this postseason after finishing with the NHL's best home record during the regular season at 31-9-1 (63 points)...Colorado out-scored Winnipeg 11-3 in the two games at Ball Arena during the first-round series...Only the 2021-22 Avalanche had more victories (32) and points (68) on home ice than this year's club...The Avs finished with the league's best home record for the fourth time since relocating, joining the 1996-97, 2020-21 and 2021-22 team.

### THIS IS MY, MY BAD, COMEBACK SONG

The Avalanche are tied for the league lead with four comeback wins this postseason...Colorado rallied from an 0-3 deficit to beat the Stars in Game 1, the third time in franchise history that the Avs came back from a three-goal deficit to win a playoff contest...They also accomplished the feat in Game 6 of the 1997 Conference Quarterfinal vs. Chicago (April 26, 1997) and Game 6 of the 1987 Division Semifinal at Hartford (April 16, 1987)...Including the regular season, the Avs have rallied from a multi-goal deficit to win three games at American Airlines Center this year, as they also trailed 3-0 on Nov. 18 (won 6-3) and trailed 3-1 on Jan. 4 (won 5-4 in OT)...The Avalanche set a franchise record with 26 comeback wins during the regular-season, tied for the second most in the NHL behind only the Rangers (28)...Colorado overcame a deficit of two or more goals 10 times and three or more goals on four occasions, both league bests and franchise records...The Avs had 11 third-period comebacks.

### HIGH-SCORING OFFENSE CONTINUES IN POSTSEASON

The Avalanche are the highest scoring team in the postseason, averaging 4.5 goals-per-game (36 total)...Colorado's 36 goals are tied for its second most through eight games of a postseason, one behind the 1996-97 club (37)...The 2021-22 Avs also had 36...The Avs scored five or more goals in all five games of the First Round against Winnipeg, joining the 1985 Blackhawks (seven contests), 1994 Rangers (six) and 1981 Islanders (five) as the only teams in Stanley Cup Playoff history to light the lamp 5+ times in each of their first five games of a postseason...The Avalanche's 28 goals in the first round were the most in a five-game postseason series since the 1988 Flames potted 30 goals in the Division Semifinal versus the Kings...Colorado led the NHL with 302 goals during the regular season, the only NHL team to light the lamp over 300 times in 2023-24...It marked the first time that the Avalanche/Nordiques have ever led the NHL in goals over a full 82-game campaign.

### PLAYOFF HOCKEY...AN AVALANCHE TRADITION SINCE 1996

The Avalanche are competing in their 44th playoff series since relocating to Denver, with the club posting a 27-16 record in the previous 43 (.628)...The Avs are 148-106 in playoff games since relocating, the most wins of any NHL team since 1996...The Avalanche have won three Stanley Cups and made seven appearances in the Western Conference Final...Since 2019, only Tampa Bay (51) has more postseason wins than Colorado (46).

### **TWO STREAKS ARE BETTER THAN ONE**

Valeri Nichushkin and Artturi Lehkonen both opened the postseason with five-game goal streaks, becoming the first set of teammates in NHL history with simultaneous playoff-opening goal streaks of five-plus contests.

### **IT'S A FAMILY AFFAIR**

Nikolai Kovalenko made his NHL debut in Game 4 of the first-round against the Jets on April 28...Kovalenko's father, Andrei, played for Colorado during its inaugural season of 1995-96, making them the first father-son duo to appear in a game for the Avalanche (not including Quebec players).

### **MAKING YOUR DEBUT WHEN IT MATTERS MOST**

Nikolai Kovalenko in Game 4 against Winnipeg became the fourth Avalanche player (sixth franchise) to make his NHL debut in the Stanley Cup Playoffs...He joined Sampo Ranta in Game 1 of the 2021 Second Round vs. Vegas (May 30, 2021), Cale Makar in Game 3 of the 2019 First Round vs. Calgary (April 15, 2019) and Joey Hishon in Game 4 of the 2014 First Round at Minnesota (April 24, 2014) as the only other Colorado players to do so.

### **MAKAR NORRIS FINALIST**

Cale Makar was named a finalist for the Norris Trophy for the fourth consecutive year...Cale finished second among NHL defensemen with 90 points, the most by a rearguard in a single season in franchise history...He broke his own record of 86 set during his Norris Trophy-winning campaign of 2021-22...Cale is the 12th defenseman in NHL history (29th instance) to reach 90 points in a season...Makar's 69 helpers were also a franchise record for a defender and he became the first blueliner in Avalanche/Nordiques history to have two 20-goal campaigns...His 1.17 points-per-game average this year led all rearguards, and he was second in goals and assists.

### **MACKINNON NAMED HART/LINDSAY FINALIST**

Nathan MacKinnon was named a finalist for the 2023-24 Hart Trophy, the fourth time he's been up for the league's MVP (2017-18, 2019-20, 2020-21)...He was also named a finalist for the Ted Lindsay Award as the NHLPA's top player...MacKinnon finished second in league scoring with 140 points (51g/89a) in 82 games, breaking the single-season franchise scoring record of 139 set by Peter Stastny in 1981-82...He reached the 50-goal plateau for the first time in his career and his 87 helpers were also a personal best...Nathan was just the second NHL player in the last 25 years to reach 50+ goals and 85+ assists in a season, joining Connor McDavid in 2022-23...MacKinnon led the NHL in multi-point games (44), shots (405), even-strength points (92) and home points (89), all franchise records...In fact, his 92 EVP and 89 home points were the most in the NHL since 1995-96...MacKinnon was the first player in NHL history to register two different point streaks of at least 19 games in the same season and recorded the second-longest home scoring streak in NHL history at 35 games.

### **DYNAMIC DUO**

The Avalanche were the first NHL team to have a 50-goal forward (Nathan MacKinnon, 51) and 20-goal defenseman (Cale Makar, 21) since the 2008-09 Washington Capitals, who featured Alex Ovechkin (56) and Mike Green (23).

### **IRONMEN**

Devon Toews and Nathan MacKinnon were the only Avalanche players to appear in all 82 games this season...Toews extended his ironman streak to 158 consecutive games, the longest streak of his career, while MacKinnon has dressed in 130 straight contests...Casey Mittelstadt, who joined the Avalanche in March, has appeared in 195 contests in a row...Mikko Rantanen saw his career-high streak of 161 consecutive games come to an end when he left the April 5th contest at Edmonton due to a head injury...Zach Parise had his ironman streak of 180 games halted after getting injured on March 6 against Detroit.

### **LET'S PUT IT TO BED(NAR)**

Jared Bednar led the Avalanche to their seventh consecutive playoff appearance in 2023-24, the longest active streak in the Western Conference and tied for the third-longest active stretch in the league...Bednar is the winningest coach in franchise history with a 341-217-60 (.600) record in 618 games...Jared's 341 regular-season wins rank 49th on the NHL's all-time list and are the 23rd-most victories by a coach for a single franchise...Bednar recorded his 300th win on Nov. 13 in Seattle, tying Mike Keenan as the 12th fastest to hit the 300 mark (550 games)...Colorado's March 6 victory over the Red Wings was Bednar's 600th career game as an NHL head coach...After posting a 135-132-33 (.505) record in his first 300 games, Bednar amassed a 195-80-25 (.692) ledger in his next 300.

### MORE ON THE HEAD COACH

Hired on Aug. 25, 2016, Jared Bednar is in his eighth season behind the Avalanche bench and is the third-longest tenured coach in the NHL following Tampa's Jon Cooper (March 25, 2013) and Pittsburgh's Mike Sullivan (Dec. 12, 2015)...The only individual to win a championship in the NHL, AHL and ECHL as a head coach, Bednar signed a three-year contract extension through 2026-27 on March 21, 2023.

### HOME, SWEET HOME

Nathan MacKinnon recorded a point in each of the first 35 home games this season, the second-longest home scoring streak in NHL history...Only Wayne Gretzky, who found the scoresheet in all 40 home contests in 1988-89, had a longer such run...MacKinnon also posted a 21-game home assist streak, one short of the NHL record set by Nikita Kucherov in 2022-23.

### HEY 19, THAT'S ARETHA FRANKLIN

Nathan MacKinnon recorded two 19-game point streaks in 2023-24, the longest streaks in the NHL this season...He is the first player in NHL history to register two different point streaks of at least 19 games in the same season...Nathan became first NHL player to finish with the top-two point streaks in a single campaign since Robert Lang in 2003-04.

### JUST AN OLD SWEET SONG, KEEPS GEORGIEV ON MY MIND

Alexandar Georgiev led the NHL with 38 wins after sharing the league lead with 40 victories in 2022-23...He became just the fourth goaltender since 1980 to lead the NHL in wins in back-to-back seasons, joining Braden Holtby (2015-17), Andrei Vasilevskiy (five straight, 2017-22) and Martin Brodeur twice (four straight, 2002-07 and four straight, 1997-2001)...Georgiev is the only netminder in franchise history to lead the league in wins twice and his 78 victories with Colorado are the most in a two-year span in club history...The Ruse, Bulgaria, native joined Patrick Roy (seven times) as the only goalies in franchise history to record multiple 30-win seasons...Georgiev appeared in a career-high 63 games—second most in the NHL—and led the league in minutes (3,638) ...He ranked second among netminders in starts (62) and was fifth in saves (1588).

### JUSTUS IS SERVED

Justus Annunen, who agreed to a two-year contract extension on March 26, appeared in 14 games (12 starts) with the Avalanche this season, posting an 8-4-1 record with a 2.25 goals-against average, .928 save percentage and two shutouts...His .928 Sv% and 2.25 GAA ranked first among all rookies who appeared in at least 10 games...Annunen blanked the Blackhawks in back-to-

back starts, Feb. 29 at Chicago (5-0) and March 4 vs. Chicago (also 5-0), becoming the first rookie netminder in franchise history to record consecutive shutouts...Annunen's 37 saves on March 4 tied the franchise record for the most stops by a rookie goaltender in a shutout, matching Marc Denis' effort from Nov. 3, 1999 vs. St. Louis...Annunen had a scoreless streak of 123 minutes, 24 seconds from Feb. 29–March 12, the third-longest stretch by a rookie in franchise history behind Calvin Pickard (149:24) in 2014-15 and Jonas Johansson (124:41) in 2020-21.

## DALLAS STARS POSTSEASON NOTES

**TONIGHT'S GAME:** After earning a 4-1 victory at Ball Arena in Game 3 on Saturday, the Stars take a 2-1 series lead into a pivotal Game 4 tonight in Denver. (8:30 p.m. CT, TV: ESPN, Radio: The Ticket 96.7-FM/1310-AM). The best road team in the NHL found a way to limit the Avs to just one goal in Saturday's contest while getting two goals each from Tyler Seguin and Logan Stankoven. The Stars went 2-1 on the road in the First Round against the Golden Knights, winning Games 3 and 4 at T-Mobile Arena. Dallas is coming off a first-round win over Vegas in a series that went seven games. Colorado, meanwhile, dispatched the Winnipeg Jets in five.

## READY TO RUMBLE

- The Stars are facing the Avalanche in their sixth head-to-head Stanley Cup Playoffs series, following the 2020 Second Round, 2006 Conference Quarterfinals, 2004 Conference Quarterfinals, 2000 Conference Finals and 1999 Conference Finals. Dallas holds a slight edge with three wins in their five all-time best-of-seven meetings, including in their most recent matchup in the 2020 Second Round (4-3 W).
- The Second Round between the Stars and Avalanche marks the second Stanley Cup Playoffs series featuring one franchise who eliminated the reigning champions and one team who ousted the club with that season's William M. Jennings Trophy winner(s) in their previous round. The first was between the Bruins and Devils in the 1994 Conference Semifinals after Boston and New Jersey eliminated Montreal and Buffalo, respectively, during the Conference Quarterfinals – the Canadiens captured the Cup in 1993, while Sabres goaltenders Grant Fuhr and Dominik Hasek won the Jennings in 1993-94.
- Forward **Joe Pavelski** leads active Stars in goals (8) and points (8-7—15) and ranks fourth in assists (7) in a team-high 18 career postseason games vs. Colorado.
- Captain **Jamie Benn** shares second in assists (8) and ranks third in points (4-8—12) in 11 career playoff contests against the Avs.
- Defenseman **Miro Heiskanen** leads the Stars in assists (8), ranks second in points (4-9—13) and shares third in goals (4) in 11 career postseason games vs. the Avs.
- The Stars went 1-2-1 against the Avs during the 2023-24 regular season, including a 7-4 victory at Ball Arena on April 7.

## STARS-AVALANCHE SEASON SERIES IN REVIEW

### Nov. 18, 2023 – STARS 3 vs. AVALANCHE 6

Holding a 3-0 lead, the Stars allowed six unanswered goals in a 6-3 defeat to the Colorado Avalanche in front of 18,532 at American Airlines Center. The loss snapped Dallas' four-game winning streak and gave the club its first regulation loss when scoring first this season (6-1-1). Forward **Tyler Seguin** opened the scoring and finished the game with two goals (2-0—2) while extending his point streak to three consecutive games (3-3—6). Forward **Joe Pavelski** (1-0—1) recorded his seventh goal of the season to place him in a tie with **Wyatt Johnston** for the team lead in that category. Forward **Matt Duchene** (0-1—1) pushed his point streak to five consecutive games (4-5—9), while forward **Jason Robertson** (0-1—1) extended his point streak to three straight. Forward **Mason Marchment** picked up his first multi-point game of the season with two assists (0-2—2), and goaltender **Jake Oettinger** made 32 saves on 37 shots in the loss.

Despite two goals from **Tyler Seguin** (2-0—2) and multi-point performances from **Mason Marchment** (0-2—2) and **Matt Duchene** (0-2—2), the Stars let a lead slip away late in regulation and earned a point in a 5-4 overtime loss to the Colorado Avalanche in front of a sellout crowd of 18,532 at American Airlines Center. **Evgenii Dadonov** (1-0—1) opened the scoring at the 11:57 mark of the first period. Seguin and **Joe Pavelski** (1-0—1) added goals in the middle frame and Seguin tallied his second goal of the night midway through the third. **Scott Wedgewood** made his ninth consecutive start, stopping 29 of 34 shots.

### Feb. 27, 2024 – STARS 1 at AVALANCHE 5

**Logan Stankoven** (1-0—1) scored for the second game in a row, but the Stars came up empty handed in a 5-1 defeat to the Colorado Avalanche at Ball Arena. It was the second game of a back-to-back that opened with an overtime loss to the New York Islanders at American Airlines Center on Monday. Stankoven's goal was scored 60 seconds into the contest, giving Dallas five goals in the opening minute this season – the second most among all teams and trailing only Edmonton (6). Boston, and Tampa Bay also have four. Picking up assists on Stankoven's goal were **Wyatt Johnston** (0-1—1) and **Jason Robertson** (0-1—1). The Stars fell to 0-2-1 against the Avs this season. **Jake Oettinger** made 22 saves on 27 shots in the loss.

### April 7, 2024 – STARS 7 at AVALANCHE 4

Fueled by three-point performances from captain **Jamie Benn** (1-2—3), **Wyatt Johnston** (1-2—3) and **Thomas Harley** (0-3—3) and a multi-goal effort from **Tyler Seguin** (2-0—2), the Stars earned a 7-4 victory over the Colorado Avalanche at Ball Arena. The win gave Dallas a five-point edge on Colorado for first place in the Central Division with four games remaining for both clubs. The Stars also hold a three-point advantage on the Vancouver Canucks for the No. 1 seed in the Western Conference. Despite the game being the second half of back-to-backs and the Stars not arriving in Denver until the day of because of weather the night before, they had multiple players step up with big performances. **Matt Duchene** (1-1—2) tied the game 1-1 with 2:49 remaining in the first period. Then, Benn put the Stars up 2-1 with just 42 seconds left in the opening frame. After the Avs tied it up early in the second period, the Stars reeled off three unanswered goals in less than six minutes on tallies from **Roope Hintz** (1-0—1), Seguin and **Mason Marchment** (1-0—1) to put them up 5-2. With the score 5-4 in the final five minutes of regulation, Johnston added a crucial insurance marker to put Dallas up by two and Seguin added an empty netter with nine seconds left on the clock. **Jake Oettinger** extended his win streak to seven games for the second time this season (also 7 GP from Jan. 23-Feb. 15) with 34 saves on 38 shots to become the first goaltender in franchise history to record multiple seven-game win streaks in a single season.

## FIRST ROUND SERIES NOTES

- The Stars became the second team in NHL history to win a best-of-seven series against the reigning Stanley Cup champions *after dropping each of the first two games at home*, joining the Avalanche (vs. DET in 1999 CSF).
- The Stars all-time had a 2-14 (.125) record when trailing 2-0 in a best-of-seven series.
- Head coach **Pete DeBoer** remains undefeated in Game 7s in his head-coaching career with a record of 8-0. DeBoer tied **Darryl Sutter** (8-3) for the NHL record for Game 7 victories.
- **Joe Pavelski** (8-3) matched the NHL record for career Game 7 wins, a mark shared by six skaters (**Brad Richards**, 8-0; **Ray Bourque**, 8-1; **Justin Williams**, 8-1; **Carl Hagelin**, 8-2; **Ryan McDonagh**, 8-2; and **Glenn Anderson**, 8-4).
- Forward **Radek Faksa** (1-0—1) became the ninth Czech-born player to score the winning goal in a Game 7 and first since David Pastrnak did so against the Maple Leafs on May 4. The 2024 postseason marks the first to feature multiple Czech-born players achieve the feat.

### “THIS GUY CAN’T EVEN HAVE A BEER IN THE UNITED STATES (YET)”

- Still just 20 years of age, forward **Wyatt Johnston** (4-3—7) joined **Mitch Marner** (2-7—9 in 2018 R1 w/ TOR), **Robby Fabbri** (2-6—8 in 2016 R2 w/ STL) and **Nathan MacKinnon** (2-6—8 in 2014 R1 w/ COL) as the fourth player age 20 or younger in the past decade to record at least seven points in a playoff series.
- Johnston, who leads the Stars in goals (5) and shares second in points (5-3—8) this postseason, became the second player in NHL history to score a goal in each of his first two Game 7s at the age of 20 or younger (also 2023 R2), joining **Jeremy Roenick** (1990 DSF & DF w/ CHI).

- With 14 points (9-5—12) in 29 career playoff games, Johnston is the fifth player in franchise history to record 10+ postseason points at age 20 or younger, joining **Brian Bellows** (9-20—29), **Mike Modano** (9-13—22), **Tom McCarthy** (5-9—14) and **Brad Palmer** (8-5—13). All four players achieved the feat when the club played in Minnesota.
- In Game 1 against Colorado on May 7, Johnston scored his ninth career postseason goal, tying **Sidney Crosby**, **Patrick Kane** and **Jesper Kotkaniemi** for the second most before age 21 among active players behind **Jordan Staal** (13).
- In Game 4 at Vegas on April 29, Johnston scored his seventh career postseason goal, tying **Andrei Svechnikov** for the sixth most before age 21 by an active player. He trails **Jordan Staal** (13), **Sidney Crosby** (9), **Patrick Kane** (9), **Jesper Kotkaniemi** (9) and **Patrik Laine** (8).
- In Game 3 at Vegas on April 27, Johnston (20 years, 349 days) became the youngest player in franchise history to score an overtime goal in the playoffs, surpassing the mark set by **Steve Ott** (21 years, 237 days in Game 3 of the 2004 CQF). That night, Johnston also became the fourth-youngest player in franchise history to record a multi-goal game in the playoffs behind **Brian Bellows** (18 years, 221 days in Game 4 of 1983 DSF), **Brad Palmer** (19 years, 237 days in Game 6 of 1981 SF) and **Mike Modano** (20 years, 321 days in Game 4 of 1991 DF).

### STANKY DELIVERS

- In Game 3 against the Avs, forward **Logan Stankoven** became the fifth different rookie in Stars team history to score multiple goals in a playoff game, joining **Joel Kiviranta** (3 in Game 7 of 2020 R2), **Denis Gurianov** (4 in Game 6 of 2020 R1), **Roope Hintz** (2 in Game 2 of 2019 R2 & Game 4 of 2019 R1) and **Niko Kapanen** (2 in Game 5 of 2003 CSF).
- He also became the fourth rookie in franchise history to score multiple times in the game he scored his first postseason goal, following Hintz (2 in Game 4 of 2019 R1), Kiviranta (3 in Game 7 of 2020 R2) and **Bill Collins** (2 in Game 3 of 1968 CQF).
- The 21-year-old has two goals and four points (2-2—4) in 10 postseason games.

### SMOOTH WITH IT

- With two goals in Game 2 vs. Colorado, defenseman **Miro Heiskanen** matched the franchise mark for most goals in a playoff game by a defenseman. Heiskanen, who also scored twice in Game 2 of the 2020 First Round, joined **Sergei Zubov** as the only other defenseman in franchise history with two multi-goal performances in the playoffs.
- Heiskanen joined **Brian Glynn** (Game 4 of 1991 DF) as the second defenseman in franchise history with two power-play goals in a playoff game. The last defenseman league-wide with two power-play goals in a game was **Dougie Hamilton** (Game 3 of 2019 R1).
- In Game 3 against Colorado, Heiskanen recorded his 41st career postseason assist and tied **Saku Koivu** for the eighth most by a Finnish-born player – **Jari Kurri** (127) paces the list.
- Still just 24 years of age, Heiskanen ranks second in franchise history among defensemen in assists (41) and points (13-41—54) and third in goals (13) in 76 GP.
- Among defensemen in the 2024 playoffs, Heiskanen shares second in goals (3), ranks third in points (3-6—9) and shares fourth in assists (6), while also leading the Stars in points in 10 GP.

## BREAK IT OUT!

- With just one point through his first eight games of the 2024 Stanley Cup Playoffs, forward **Roope Hintz** factored on each of Dallas' first three goals in Game 2 vs. Colorado as well as the final marker to record his second career four-point outing in the postseason (also 1-3—4 in Game 2 of 2023 R1).
- Only three other players in franchise history have posted multiple four-point games in the playoffs: **Bobby Smith** (3 GP), **Miro Heiskanen** (2 GP) and **Dino Ciccarelli** (2 GP).
- Hintz has five points (1-4—5) over his past two games and ranks fourth on the squad in assists (4) and shares fifth in points (2-4—6).
- Hintz is coming off a 2023 postseason run that saw him ranks second in the league in assists (13) and share third in points (10-14—24) and sixth in goals (10) in 19 GP.

## HE'S HEATING UP!

- Forward **Tyler Seguin** has scored in consecutive playoff games (Games 2 & 3 vs. Colorado) for the fourth time in his career and second with the Stars (also 2 GP in 2023).
- Seguin has 30 goals against the Avalanche (regular season & playoffs), his highest such total against a single franchise (previously 29 vs. WPG & COL).
- Seguin shares second on the Stars in goals (3) and fifth in assists (3) and points (3-3—6) in 10 GP.

## BIG GAME JAKE

- Following a 28-save performance in Game 3 at Colorado on May 11, goaltender **Jake Oettinger** (1,001 saves) became the sixth goaltender in franchise history with at least 1,000 career saves in the playoffs, joining **Ed Belfour** (1,800), **Marty Turco** (1,193), **Gilles Meloche** (1,139), **Cesare Maniago** (1,026) and **Jon Casey** (1,016).
- Oettinger allowed two goals or fewer in Games 2-7 in Dallas' first-round series against Vegas. Over that span, he went 4-2 with a 1.61 goals-against average and .942 save percentage.
- Oettinger joined **Marty Turco**, who did the same over the course of one series from Games 2-7 of the 2007 Conference Quarterfinals.

## RECAPPING THE FIRST ROUND GAME BY GAME

### Game 1: April 22, 2024 – STARS 3 vs. GOLDEN KNIGHTS 4

The Stars dropped Game 1 of their 2023 Western Conference First Round series vs. Vegas 4-3 in front of a sellout crowd of 18,532. Down by two halfway through the third, forward **Mason Marchment** (1-0—1) gave the Stars life with his seventh career postseason marker. Rookie **Logan Stankoven** (0-1—1) recorded an assist in his Stanley Cup Playoff debut and finished the game with two shots and three takeaways in 14:44 TOI. Goaltender **Jake Oettinger** made 11 saves on 15 shots in the loss. He registered his first career postseason point with an assist on Marchment's goal in the third period.

### Game 2: April 24, 2024 – STARS 1 vs. GOLDEN KNIGHTS 3

Despite scoring the game's opening goal, the Stars fell 3-1 to the Golden Knights in Game 2 of the first round at American Airlines Center. **Jason Robertson** (1-0—1) scored for the second consecutive game to give Dallas a 1-0 lead in the final minutes of the opening frame on assists from **Miro Heiskanen** (0-1—1) and **Jamie Benn** (0-1—1). The lead was short-lived, as Vegas responded less than two minutes later to even the score. The Golden Knights added an insurance goal with 1:07 left in the second period and put the game away with an empty-net tally in the closing seconds of regulation. **Jake Oettinger** made 23 saves on 25 shots but has gone winless in two appearances in the series.

### Game 3: April 27, 2024 – STARS 3 at GOLDEN KNIGHTS 2 (OT)

In a game the Stars desperately needed to win, 20-year-old **Wyatt Johnston** delivered a standout multi-goal performance, including the overtime winner in a 3-2 victory over the Vegas Golden Knights in Game 3. Johnston (2-0—2) opened the scoring with his first goal of the series at the 11:11 mark of the first period. **Miro Heiskanen** (1-1—2) made it 2-0 five minutes into the middle frame, but Vegas clawed its way back with two goals in a span of 3:10 to even the game at two goals apiece. After a scoreless third period and time winding down in OT, Johnston went top shelf on Golden Knights goaltender **Logan Thompson** to give Dallas its first win of the series. It marked Dallas' first victory in a Game 3 after falling to a 2-0 series deficit since the 2014 First Round against Anaheim. Johnston,

Heiskanen and **Jason Robertson** (0-2—2) each had multi-point games. Heiskanen led all skaters in TOI (34:09) and **Chris Tanev** recorded a game-high six blocked shots. **Jake Oettinger** stopped 32 of 34 shots, including seven in OT.

#### Game 4: April 29, 2024 – STARS 4 at GOLDEN KNIGHTS 2

Erasing two one-goal deficits, the Stars came out victorious by a 4-2 score in Game 4 in their first-round series against the Vegas Golden Knights at T-Mobile Arena. It marked just the fourth time in franchise history they've come back from a 2-0 deficit to tie a best-of-seven series at 2-2 following the 2014 First Round, 1970 Quarterfinals and 1968 Quarterfinals. **Evgenii Dadonov** (1-0—1) scored his first goal of the 2024 playoffs to tie the game 1-1 at the 17:52 mark of the first period. Then, trailing 2-1 at the halfway point in regulation, **Wyatt Johnston** (1-0—1) lit the lamp for his third goal of the series (all in the past two games). **Ty Dellandrea** (1-0—1) gave the Stars their first lead of the night with a crucial go-ahead tally with 1:26 left in the second period. **Roope Hintz** (1-0—1) potted his first goal of the series with an empty-net tally with 1:22 left in regulation. **Ryan Suter** (0-1—1), **Matt Duchene** (0-1—1), **Tyler Seguin** (0-1—1), **Craig Smith** (0-1—1) and **Sam Steel** (0-1—1) picked up assists, while **Jake Oettinger** turned aside 33 of 35 shots in the win.

#### Game 5: May 1, 2024 – STARS 3 vs. GOLDEN KNIGHTS 2

Despite giving up the opening goal just four minutes into the contest, the Stars came away with a 3-2 victory in Game 5 to take a 3-2 series lead over the Vegas Golden Knights in front of a sellout crowd of 18,532 at American Airlines Center. Knights captain **Mark Stone** gave his club a 1-0 lead with a power-play goal that felt eerily similar to the opening minutes of Game 1. But just 62 seconds later, **Evgenii Dadonov** (1-0—1) tied it up with his second goal in as many games. Dallas took the lead when **Matt Duchene** (1-0—1) tallied his first goal of the series on the power play. After Vegas tied it at the 12:31 mark of the middle frame, **Jason Robertson** (1-0—1) came up with an enormous power-play goal to restore Dallas' lead late in the second period. **Jake Oettinger** became the first Stars goaltender to allow two goals against or fewer in four consecutive playoff starts since **Anton Khudobin** from Game 3 of the 2020 Conference Finals to Game 1 of the Stanley Cup Final in 2020. Oettinger's 25-save performance included a crucial stop on a breakaway attempt from **Chandler Stephenson** in the closing minutes of regulation to keep the score 3-2.

Vegas defenseman **Noah Hanifin** broke the scoreless tie at the 9:54 mark of the third period and **Mark Stone** added an empty-net goal with 19 seconds left on the clock. **Miro Heiskanen** logged a game-high 26:45 TOI and **Esa Lindell** recorded a team-high six blocked shots.

#### Game 7: May 5, 2024 – STARS 2 vs. GOLDEN KNIGHTS 1

With goals from **Wyatt Johnston** (1-0—1) and **Radek Faksa** (1-0—1) and a 22-save performance from **Jake Oettinger**, the Stars eliminated the Vegas Golden Knights by a 2-1 score in a winner-take-all Game 7 in front of a standing-room only crowd of 19,046 at American Airlines Center. Johnston opened the scoring at the 14:34 mark of the first period with his team-leading fourth goal of the series. Then, with the score tied 1-1 in the opening minute of the third, Faksa sent a backhander top shelf past Golden Knights netminder **Adin Hill** to give Dallas a 2-1 lead. It marked Faksa's first goal of the series in his third game with assists from **Craig Smith** (0-1—1) and **Thomas Harley** (0-1—1). With the win, the Stars became the second team in NHL history to win a best-of-seven series against the reigning Stanley Cup champions *after dropping each of the first two games at home*, joining the Avalanche (vs. DET in 1999 CSF). Head coach **Pete DeBoer** (8-0) tied **Darryl Sutter** (8-3) for the NHL record for Game 7 victories, and **Joe Pavelski** (8-3) matched the NHL record for career Game 7 wins, a mark shared by six skaters (**Brad Richards**, 8-0; **Ray Bourque**, 8-1; **Justin Williams**, 8-1; **Carl Hagelin**, 8-2; **Ryan McDonagh**, 8-2; and **Glenn Anderson**, 8-4).

### POSTSEASON NOTES (CONTINUED...)

The Stars are in the postseason for a third straight year, 19th time since relocating to Dallas in 1993-94 and 36th time in franchise history. They were the first Western Conference team to clinch a playoff spot this season.

1. This is the fifth time since 2018-19 that Dallas has reached the playoffs, with forward **Roope Hintz** (21-34—55) leading the team in points over that span. Defenseman **Miro Heiskanen** (13-41—54) ranks second.

2. Forward **Jason Robertson** was born one month after the Stars' Stanley Cup win in 1999 and looks to lead Dallas to its first championship since. He ranked second among Stars in playoff scoring last year, behind **Roope Hintz**, as Dallas came within two victories of its second Final appearance in four seasons (they lost in the 2020 SCF).



3. Forward **Joe Pavelski** is in his 16th postseason and leads all skaters from the vaunted 2003 NHL Draft in playoff goals (73) and points (73-67—140). Pavelski's last playoff goal was in Game 4 of the 2023 Western Conference Final when he became the oldest player in NHL history to fend off elimination with an OT goal.
4. Pavelski ranks third in career playoff scoring among U.S.-born players, four points back of tying **Chris Chelios** for second place and six to equal former Stars captain **Mike Modano** for the most all-time. Pavelski (192) ranks third all-time for career playoff games played before winning the Cup (including those who never won), behind **Ray Bourque** (214; 2001 COL) and **Patrick Marleau** (195).
5. Defenseman **Ryan Suter** (1,444) tops the list for most regular-season games by active players who have yet to win the Stanley Cup – a group that includes four Stars with 1,000+ contests (also **Joe Pavelski**, **Jamie Benn** & **Matt Duchene**). Suter ranks eighth all-time for regular-season games before winning the Stanley Cup (including those who never won).
6. Forward **Wyatt Johnston**, who turns 21 on May 14, scored the series-clinching goal in both the First and Second Round last year. He can become first player in NHL history with three series-clinching goals before age 21 (currently tied with **Jaromir Jagr** and **Jeremy Roenick**). Johnston can also become the first with three before age 22.
7. Head coach **Peter DeBoer**, 8-0 in career Game 7s, has reached at least the conference finals six times with four different franchises.
8. The Stars/North Stars franchise has advanced to the Stanley Cup Final five times, twice while based in Minnesota and three times in Dallas. They stand as one of two non-Original Six franchises with a Final berth in four different decades (1980s, 1990s, 2000s & 2020s), alongside Philadelphia (1970s, 1980s, 1990s & 2010s).

### 2023-24 REGULAR SEASON NOTES

- Clinched the top seed in the Western Conference for the fifth time in franchise history and first since 2015-16.
- Clinched first place in their division for the 11th time in franchise history and first since 2015-16, when they concluded the season atop the Central Division and Western Conference.
- Recorded the second-most points in a regular season since the club relocated to Dallas in 1993-94, one point shy of the 1998-1999 squad that went on to win the Stanley Cup.
- Finished the season with 52 wins, which is the second time in franchise history the club has won as many (the Stars had 53 in 2005-06).
- Scored the most goals (294) in Dallas Stars history (1993-present) and seventh most in franchise history (1967-present).
- The Stars wrapped up their most productive road season in franchise history with 26 wins and 57 points in 41 games (26-10-5), besting last season's point total by two points (55 points; 25-11-5) and set a franchise mark in points percentage (.695%).
- Had the second-best faceoff win percentage in the league (54.0).
- Established a franchise-record eight-game winning streak with a victory March 16-April 3.
- Had eight players with 20 goals in a season for the first time in franchise history: **Wyatt Johnston** (32), **Roope Hintz** (30), **Jason Robertson** (29), **Joe Pavelski** (27), **Tyler Seguin** (25), **Matt Duchene** (25), **Mason Marchment** (22) and **Jamie Benn** (21).

### CAPTAIN STANDS ON BUSINESS

- Captain **Jamie Benn** (21-39—60) reached the 20-goal mark for the 11th time in his NHL career, surpassing **Brian Bellows** (10) for the second most in franchise history behind **Mike Modano** (16).
- Benn had a career-tying six-game goal streak (7-3—10) from March 16-28. The last time he had a goal streak of six games was 13 years ago (March 1-11, 2011). He also had a season-high eight-game point streak (7-5—12) from March 12-28.
- Benn (383-524—907) – who during the 2023-24 regular season passed **Neal Broten** (274-593—867) for sole possession of second place on the franchise's all-time points list – earned his 900th career point with an assist on March 28 at Vancouver.
- Among team leaders, Benn ranked fifth in assists (39), sixth in points (21-39—60) and eighth in goals (21).
- He skated in his 1,100th career NHL game (all with Dallas) on March 20 vs. Arizona. Benn is one of two players in Dallas Stars history to play 1,000 or more games with the club – the other being **Mike Modano** (1,182).
- He recorded his seventh career game of four or more points with a goal and three assists (1-3—4) March 5 at San Jose.
- Benn concluded his 11th season as the Stars captain and is the longest-tenured captain in franchise history.
- With his 500th career assist on Dec. 11, 2023 vs. Detroit, Benn became the third player in franchise history to post 500 assists with the franchise, joining **Mike Modano** (802) and **Neal Broten** (593). Benn is also just the third player from the 2007 Draft class to hit 500 assists, joining **Patrick Kane** and **Jakub Voracek**, and the fifth player selected in the fifth round all-time to reach the milestone.

### JOHNNY B. GOOD

- At just 20 years of age, forward **Wyatt Johnston** led the Stars in goals (32), shared third in points (32-33—65) and ranked seventh in assists (33) in 82 GP. He also co-led the squad in shorthanded tallies (3), sharing fifth overall in the league in that category.
- With 65 points, Johnston tied **Brian Bellows** (35-30—65 in 1982-83) for the third-most points in a single season by a player age 20 or younger in franchise history. The only players with more in a single campaign are Bellows (41-42—83 in 78 GP in 1983-84) and **Mike Modano** (29-46—75 in 80 GP in 1989-90).
- On April 3 vs. Edmonton, Johnston tallied his 30th goal of 2023-24 and joined **Brian Bellows** (35 in 1982-83 & 41 in 1983-84) as the second player in franchise history to record a 30-goal season prior to their 21st birthday.



- With his second point (assist) on March 30 at Seattle, Johnston recorded his 100th career point (53-47—100 in 157 GP). He became the third player in club history with 100 career NHL points before age 21, following **Brian Bellows** (102-108—210 in 234 GP) and **Mike Modano** (57-82—139 in 159 GP).
- In his two NHL seasons, Johnston has seven games with three-or-more points - the third most by a player before age 21 in franchise history on a list topped by **Brian Bellows** (17) and **Mike Modano** (11).
- Johnston's six career multi-goal games are the third most by a player age 20 or younger in franchise history behind only **Brian Bellows** (19) and **Mike Modano** (10).
- His goal on March 16 vs. LA marked the 50th goal of his NHL career, making him the third player in franchise history to reach the milestone before age 21, following **Brian Bellows** (102) and **Mike Modano** (57).
- On March 12 vs. Florida, Johnston recorded his 50th and 51st points of the season (24-27—51) with a goal and an assist. Johnston joined **Brian Bellows** (3x), **Mike Modano** (2x) and **Glen Sharpley** as the only players in franchise history to reach the 50-point mark in a campaign at age 20 or younger.
- Johnston (3-2—5) had himself a breakout game in Dallas' 7-6 comeback victory over San Jose on March 5, recording his first career three-goal performance and five-point outing. He became the fifth player in franchise history to record a hat trick at age 20 or younger, joining **Mike Modano** (March 17, 1990), **Todd Harvey** (April 22, 1995), **Steve Payne** (March 21, 1979) and **Brian Lawton** (Feb. 19, 1986). At 20 years, 296 days, he became the youngest player in franchise history to record five points in a game, besting the previous mark set by **Dino Ciccarelli** (21 years, 276 days on Nov. 11, 1981 w/ MNS).
- On Jan. 23 at Detroit (at 20 years, 254 days), he became the second-youngest player in Stars team history to record a three-assist game, behind only **Valeri Nichushkin** (18 years, 278 days on Dec. 7, 2013).
- With his second point against the Devils (goal) on Jan. 20, Johnston (37-32—69 in 127 GP) passed **Miro Heiskanen** (20-48—68 in 150 GP) for the most points before age 21 in Stars team history.
- The Toronto native joined rare company during the 2023-24 regular season, becoming the second player in franchise history to score a shorthanded goal on consecutive days (Nov. 11, 2023 at Winnipeg and Nov. 12, 2023 at Minnesota). He also became just the third player to accomplish the feat in the past 10 years alongside **William Karlsson** (March 30-31, 2018 w/ VGK) and **Matt Read** (March 15-16, 2014 w/ PHI).
- His shorthanded goal on Nov. 12, 2023 at Minnesota represented his 30th career goal in his 96th game. Among players to debut with the Dallas Stars, only two have reached the mark in as many contests or fewer: **Jason Robertson** (81 GP) and **James Neal** (88 GP).
- At 20 years, 182 days, he became the fourth-youngest player in franchise history to score 30 career goals behind **Brian Bellows** (18 years, 196 days), **Mike Modano** (20 years, 126 days) and **Tom McCarthy** (20 years, 145 days).
- He appeared in his 100th career NHL game on Nov. 22, 2023 vs. Vegas.

## TRY TEXAS

- In his first season with the Stars, forward **Matt Duchene** recorded 65 points (25-40—65) in 80 GP. He shared third on the club in assists (40), fourth in points and fifth in goals (25). He led the club in game-winning goals (7), ranked third in even-strength points (19-30—49) and shared fourth in even-strength tallies (19).
- He recorded his 800th career NHL point (339-461—800 in 1,034 GP) with a goal on Feb. 26 against the New York Islanders. He became the second member of the 2009 NHL Draft class to reach the mark, following Toronto's **John Tavares**.
- He had 29 points (11-18—29) through his first 30 games with Dallas – his highest total through that game count since his career-best season in 2021-22 (43-43—86 in 78 GP with Nashville).
- Duchene became the 384th skater in NHL history to reach the 1,000 regular-season games played mark with his appearance against the Washington Capitals on Dec. 7, 2023. He joined **Joe Pavelski**, **Ryan Suter** and **Jamie Benn** as the fourth active Stars skater to reach the milestone. Pittsburgh is the only other club with as many active players with 1,000 games (**Sidney Crosby**, **Evgeni Malkin**, **Jeff Carter**, **Kris Letang**).
- He became the 259th forward to reach the league-recognized milestone and is one of five players from the 2009 NHL Draft to reach 1,000 games (also **John Tavares**, **Ryan O'Reilly**, **Victor Hedman** and **Nick Leddy**).
- With an assist against the Caps, Duchene became the 11th player in franchise history to collect a point in their 1,000th career game. Only two other active players have done so with Dallas: **Andrew Cogliano** (0-1—1 on Feb. 13, 2020) and **Joe Pavelski** (0-1—1 on Dec. 20, 2019).
- Duchene became the sixth player to register his first 15 career points (6-9—15) with the Dallas Stars in 16 contests or fewer. **Tyler Seguin** (14 GP in 2013-14), **Benoit Hogue** (14 GP in 1995-96), **Brett Hull** (15 GP in 1998-99), **Jason Spezza** (16 GP in 2014-15) and **Alex Chiasson** (16 GP from 2012-13 – 2013-14) are the only ones to do so to date.
- He had a four-game goal streak from Nov. 9-14, 2023 (4-4—8). The last time he scored in four straight was Dec. 17-23, 2022 with Nashville.
- He became the sixth player in franchise history to score three winning goals in a four-game span (Nov. 9, 11 & 14, 2023), joining **Jamie Benn** in 2019-20, **Jere Lehtinen** in 2005-06, **Pierre Turgeon** in 2002-03, **Jude Drouin** in 1971-72 and **Wayne Connelly** in 1967-68.

## KING OF THE NEW AGE

- At 39 years of age, forward **Joe Pavelski** ranked second on the Stars in points (27-40—67), shared third in assists (40) and ranked fourth in goals (27). He also paced the club in power-play goals (11), shared third in power-play points (11-10—21) and ranked fourth in even-strength points (16-30—46).
- With an assist on April 7 at Colorado, Pavelski (475-591—1,066) surpassed **Keith Tkachuk** (538-527—1,065) for fifth place on the all-time points list among U.S.-born players.
- Pavelski recorded his 14th multi-point game of the season with two assists on March 28 at Vancouver. The last player to record at least that many multi-point games in a season at age 39 or older was **Jaromir Jagr** in 2015-16, when he posted 16 multi-point games at 43 years old.

- On March 22 vs. Pittsburgh, Pavelski (1-0—1) recorded his 12th season with at least 25 goals, the third most among U.S.-born players behind only **Keith Tkachuk** (13x) and **Mike Modano** (13x).
- On Feb. 22 at Ottawa, Pavelski reached the 20-goal mark for the 14th time in his career, a feat only three other U.S.-born players in NHL history have achieved: **Mike Modano** (16), **Patrick Kane** (16) and **Keith Tkachuk** (15). Pavelski became the second player in franchise history to record a 20-goal season at age 39 or older, joining **Dean Prentice** (26 in 1972-73 & 20 in 1971-72).
- Pavelski skated in his 1,300th career game on Feb. 6 at Buffalo to become the seventh U.S.-born player in NHL history to reach the milestone. Pavelski joined **Doug Gilmour** (1,474 GP; Round 7 in 1982) and **Luc Robitaille** (1,431 GP; Round 9 in 1984) as the third player selected during the sixth round or later in an NHL Draft to reach the milestone.

- Pavelski had points in nine consecutive games (6-6—12) from Nov. 12-Dec. 2, 2023 – the longest point streak in franchise history by a player at his age and the lengthiest by any NHL skater 39 or older since **Teemu Selanne** with the Ducks from Dec. 2-19, 2011 (3-10—13 in 9 GP).
- Pavelski scored his 456th career NHL goal on Nov. 18, 2023 vs. Colorado, surpassing **Theo Fleury** (455-633—1,088 in 1,084 GP) for sole possession of the third most in league history among players selected in the seventh round of the NHL Draft or later. The top two are **Luc Robitaille** (668-726—1,394 in 1,431) and **Peter Bondra** (503-389—892 in 1,081 GP).
- His goal against the Wild on Nov. 12, 2023 marked his 100th with the Stars (100-153—253), joining eight other active players with 100 tallies for multiple franchises. Also: **TJ Oshie** (STL & WSH), **Jordan Staal** (PIT, CAR), **Adam Henrique** (NJD, ANA), **John Tavares** (NYI, TOR), **Brayden Schenn** (PHI, STL), **Jeff Skinner** (CAR, BUF), **James van Riemsdyk** (PHI, TOR), and **Jeff Carter** (PHI, LAK).
- On Nov. 2, 2023 at Edmonton, Pavelski (1-2—3) factored on three consecutive goals in Dallas' 4-3 win to become the fourth different player age 39 or older with a three-point game for the franchise. It marked his 236th career contest with multiple points, surpassing **Neal Broten** (235) for sole possession of the 10th-most by a U.S.-born player in NHL history.
- Pavelski's currently tied with **John LeClair** (67) for sole possession of the sixth most multi-goal games by a U.S.-born player in NHL history. The list is topped by **Pat LaFontaine** (96), **Mike Modano** (92), **Joe Mullen** (85), **Keith Tkachuk** (75) and **Jeremy Roenick** (74).

#### ONE BY ONE, HIDDEN UP MY SLEEVE

- For the second consecutive season, forward **Jason Robertson** led the Stars in points, this time with 80 points (29-51—80). Appearing in all 82 games, Robertson paced the club in assists (51) and points and ranked third in goals (29).
- He became the third Stars player to record consecutive 80-point seasons, a feat achieved by only **Jamie Benn** (2 from 2014-15 to 2015-16) and **Mike Modano** (multiple times) since the club began play in Texas.
- On April 3 vs. Edmonton, Robertson notched his second consecutive 50-assist season and became just the sixth player in franchise history to accomplish the feat, joining **Bobby Smith** (4 from 1979-80 – 1982-83), **Dennis Hextall** (3 from 1972-73 – 1974-75), **Mike Ribeiro** (2 from 2007-08 – 2008-09), **Neal Broten** (2 from 1989-90 – 1990-91) and **Craig Hartsburg** (2 from 1981-82 – 1982-83).
- With a goal on Feb. 29 vs. Winnipeg, Robertson (1-0—1) recorded his third consecutive 20-goal season. Only five players have recorded a longer stretch with the Stars since they relocated to Dallas: **Mike Modano** (8), **Jamie Benn** (6), **Tyler Seguin** (6), **Joe Pavelski** (4) and **Loui Eriksson** (4).
- Robertson registered his 20th career game of 3+ points or more with two goals and an assist (2-1—3) on Nov. 12, 2023 at Minnesota.
- He logged a regular season career-high 26:17 TOI on Nov. 6, 2023 vs. Boston. (His career-high TOI is 29:34 in Game 1 of the Western Conference First Round vs. Minnesota on April 17, 2023; 2OT).
- Robertson, who won't celebrate his 25th birthday until July 22, 2024, currently has the seventh most goals by a player age 25 or younger in franchise history.

## THE TANK

- In his first NHL season, forward **Logan Stankoven** recorded 14 points (6-8—14), 51 shots and a +10 rating while averaging 14:40 TOI/G.
- On March 20 vs. Arizona, Stankoven (6-4—10 in 12 GP) became the third-fastest player in franchise history (tied) to record 10 career NHL points, trailing only **Mike Modano** (9 GP) and **Alex Chiasson** (10 GP).
- He was a catalyst in Dallas' 7-6 comeback victory over San Jose on March 5, recording his first career four-point outing (2-2—4).
- Stankoven had goals in three straight games (Feb. 26-29) to become the fifth Stars rookie in the past five years to record a three-game goal streak, joining **Wyatt Johnston** (2x: 5 GP & 3 GP in 2022-23), **Jason Robertson** (3 GP in 2020-21), **Denis Gurianov** (2x: 3 GP in 2019-20) and **Roope Hintz** (3 GP in 2018-19).
- He made his NHL debut on Feb. 24 at Carolina and led Stars forwards with three shots on goal in 15:20 TOI. Two nights later, Stankoven tallied his first career NHL goal as part of a multi-point performance (1-1—2) on Feb. 26 vs. the New York Islanders.
- A native of Kamloops, British Columbia, Stankoven was selected by Dallas in the second round (47th overall) of the 2021 NHL Draft.

## ELEVATING HIS GAME

- Defenseman **Miro Heiskanen** paced Stars blueliners in assists (45) and points (9-45—54) and ranked second in goals (9) in 71 GP.
- Heiskanen recorded his fifth game of the season with three or more points after scoring a goal and tallying two assists (1-2—3) on April 13 vs. Seattle. His third point of the game also placed him in seventh place for points among defensemen in franchise history.
- With an assist on March 26 at San Jose, Heiskanen became the fifth defenseman in franchise history to record multiple 40-assist seasons, joining **Sergei Zubov** (6), **Craig Hartsburg** (4), **John Klingberg** (3) and **Gordie Roberts** (2).
- After his four-point outing March 5 at San Jose (more on that below), Heiskanen (0-2—2 on March 8 at Anaheim) became the third Stars defenseman in the past 20 years with six points in a two-game span joining **John Klingberg** (6 from Jan. 29-31, 2015) and **Sergei Zubov** (6 from Dec. 10-12, 2007).
- On March 5 at San Jose, Heiskanen (0-4—4) established a new career high for points in a game with four points (all assists). It marked his 56th multi-point outing of his career and moved past **Darryl Sydor** for the fifth most by a defenseman in franchise history.
- On Jan. 25 vs. Anaheim, Heiskanen (49-183—232) passed **Trevor Daley** (231) for sole possession of eighth place for points by a defenseman in franchise history.
- Heiskanen holds the mark for the most assists (205) before age 25 by a defenseman in franchise history.

## THERE'S A SPARK, THERE'S A LIGHT

- Forward **Roope Hintz** concluded the 2023-24 campaign ranking second on the Stars in goals (30), sharing third in points (30-35—65) and ranking sixth in assists (35). He also ranked third in power-play goals (8), shared fourth in even-strength goals (19) and ranked fifth in power-play points (8-11—19).
- With a goal on April 7 at Colorado, Hintz became the 11th player in franchise history to score 30 goals in three consecutive seasons. Since 1993-94 when the team relocated to Dallas, the only other players to achieve the feat are **Mike Modano** (4; 1998-99 – 2001-02), **Jamie Benn** (3; 2013-14 – 2015-16) and **Tyler Seguin** (3; 2013-14 – 2015-16).
- On Jan. 23 at Detroit, Hintz tied his career high for points in a game with four (2-2—4).
- With two goals on Jan. 20 at New Jersey, Hintz became the fourth Stars player in the past 10 years to record three straight 20-goal campaigns, joining **Jamie Benn**, **Tyler Seguin** and **Joe Pavelski**.
- Hintz tallied his 11th career shorthanded goal on Jan. 20 at New Jersey. Since he entered the NHL in 2018-19, only two players have more: **Sebastian Aho** (16) and **Blake Coleman** (14).
- On Dec. 29, 2023 vs. Chicago, Hintz (3-0—3) became the fifth player in franchise history to complete a hat trick with an overtime goal, joining **Jason Robertson** (March 4, 2022), **Dino Ciccarelli** (March 17, 1986), **Tom McCarthy** (March 12, 1984) and **Neal Broten** (Nov. 26, 1983). It was his fourth career hat trick and first by a Stars skater in 2023-24.
- He had three consecutive multi-point games from Oct. 30-Nov. 2, 2023, recording three goals and seven points (3-4—7) over that span.

## THE CREATOR

- Despite missing 11 consecutive games (Feb. 24-March 16) with a lower-body injury, Seguin shared fifth on the club in goals (25) and ranked ninth in points (25-27—52) and 10th in assists (27) in 68 GP. He also shared fifth in even-strength points (22-20—42).
- On Feb. 15 at Nashville, Seguin scored to record his ninth 20-goal season with the Stars – the fourth most in franchise history behind **Mike Modano** (16), **Jamie Benn** (11) and **Brian Bellows** (10).
- He registered his 50th game-winning goal with the Stars on Feb. 10 at Montreal to become just the third player in franchise history with as many (**Mike Modano**: 92; **Jamie Benn**: 58).
- With an assist on Jan. 25 vs. Anaheim, Seguin recorded his 652nd point (287-365—652) with the Stars to move him into sole possession of fifth place all-time in franchise history.

- He had goals in four consecutive games Jan. 1-10 (5-1—6), one shy of his career high (five games; Feb. 1-9, 2018).
- Seguin had two separate point streak of five games: Jan. 4-12 (5-2—7) and Dec. 11-21, 2023 (1-4—5), and had multi-point performances in four consecutive games (Nov. 12-20, 2023; 4-4—8)
- On Jan. 4 vs. Colorado, Seguin recorded his 47th career multi-goal game with Dallas, moving into a tie with **Bill Goldsworthy** for the fourth most in franchise history.

## MY MIND IS SET ON OVERDRIVE

- In his first full NHL season, defenseman **Thomas Harley** led Stars blueliners in goals (15) and ranked second in assists (32) and points (15-32—47) in 79 GP.
- On April 7 at Colorado, Harley (0-3—3) assisted on each of the Stars' three goals in the second frame to tie the franchise record for most helpers in a period.
- Then, two nights later against Buffalo, he posted two assists (0-2—2) for his 13th career multi-point game - the fourth most by a defenseman at age 22 or younger in franchise history behind only **Craig Hartsburg** (32), **Brad Maxwell** (28) and **Miro Heiskanen** (24).
- On March 16 vs. LA, he became the third blueliner in franchise history with 15 goals in a season at age 22 or younger, joining **Brad Maxwell** (18 in 1977-78) and **Craig Hartsburg** (17 in 1981-82).
- With an assist on Feb. 19 at Boston, Harley (15-25—40 in 93 GP) became the fourth-fastest defenseman in franchise history to record 40 career NHL points behind **Brad Maxwell** (64 GP), **John Klingberg** (65 GP) and **Craig Hartsburg** (69 GP).
- Harley (2-0—2) scored his third overtime goal of 2023-24 (and his second OT winner in consecutive games) on Jan. 27 vs. Washington and tied **Tyler Seguin** (3 in 2019-20) and **John Klingberg** (3 in 2015-16) for the most by a player in a single season in franchise history.
- He became the sixth defenseman in NHL history with an overtime goal in consecutive games, joining **Harry Cameron** (1918-19 w/ SEN), **Greg De Vries** (2002-03 w/ COL), **Tom Poti** (2003-04 w/ NYR), **Brent Burns** (2006-07 w/ MIN) and **Dougie Hamilton** (2022-23 w/ NJD).
- Harley was the only defenseman in the NHL to have a power-play goal, shorthanded goal and an overtime goal this season.
- On Dec. 18, 2023 vs. Seattle, Harley (22 years, 121 days) became the fourth-youngest defenseman in franchise history to score an overtime goal, following **Julius Honka** (21 years, 122 days on April 4, 2017), **Bob Rouse** (21 years, 233 days on Feb. 6, 1986) and **Miro Heiskanen** (22 years, 88 days on Oct. 14, 2021).

## MARCH-ING ON

- It was a career-setting season for Stars forward **Mason Marchment**, who set personal bests in goals (22), assists (31) and points (22-31—53) in a career-high 81 GP.
- Marchment ranked seventh on the Stars in goals, eighth in points (22-31—53) and ninth in assists (31). He also shared fifth in even-strength points (16-26—42) and sixth in even-strength goals (15).
- He became the seventh Stars player in 2023-24 to reach the 20-goal mark on March 26 at San Jose.
- Marchment had points in a career-best nine consecutive games (4-9—13) Jan. 23-Feb. 17.
- He had 13 multi-point games on the season, including a three-goal, four-point performance (3-1—4) Dec. 31, 2023 vs. Chicago.
- Marchment's three-goal output on New Year's Eve was the second hat trick of his career (also 3-0—3 on Feb. 18, 2022). It also marked the fifth hat trick on New Year's Eve by a player in franchise history. He joined **Loui Eriksson** (Dec. 31, 2009), **Joe Nieuwendyk** (Dec. 31, 2000), **Brian Bellows** (Dec. 31, 1991) and **Dino Ciccarelli** (Dec. 31, 1988).
