The San Jose Sharks enter the **2025 NHL Draft** with **nine selections**, making a pair of first-round selections for the second consecutive season - second overall and 30th overall, the latter pick courtesy of a Feb. 1 trade with Dallas.

San Jose has previously made three picks at second overall in team history, including **Brad Stuart** (third in 1998), **Patrick Marleau** (second in 1997), **Andrei Zyuzin** (second in 1996), **Mike Rathje** (third in 1992) and **Pat Falloon** (second in 1991). Last year, the Sharks took **Macklin Celebrini** with the first-overall slot and chose **Sam Dickinson** at No. 11.

2024 SHARKS DRAFT RECAP

The Sharks made nine picks in the 2024 NHL Draft and the crop of new additions to the organization saw several players post strong seasons, headlined by the team's first-ever, first-overall pick **Macklin Celebrini**, who was named as a Calder Memorial Trophy finalist, and Sharks Prospect of the Year presented by Kaiser Permanente **Sam Dickinson**, selected 11th overall. San Jose made four picks in the first two rounds, adding winger **Igor Chernyshov** and defenseman **Leo Sahlin Wallenius** in the second round.

Celebrini became the fourth Calder nominee in Sharks history, joining Logan Couture, Evgeni Nabokov and Brad Stuart, with Nabokov the only winner in club history. He led NHL rookies in points per game (0.90; min. 3 GP) and ranked second in goals (25) and assists (38), tied-for second in points (63). He set a Sharks franchise record for rookie season scoring, finishing the year with 63 points, and topped all Sharks rookies with 38 assists.

Dickinson, named CHL and OHL Defenseman of the Year as well as being a finalist for the OHL's MVP award, set a London Knights record for single-season scoring by a defenseman with 91 points (29 goals, 62 assists), ranking second among league blue-liners in goals and points, third in assists for the year, while leading all league skaters with a plus-64 rating. He helped the Knights capture their second consecutive OHL crown, posting 31 points (nine goals, 22 assists) in 17 postseason contests and went on to tally six assists over five games at the Memorial Cup, leading the Knights to their second trophy of the season. In international competition, Dickinson represented Canada at the World Junior Championship, logging a pair of assists in five games.

Chernyshov missed most of the season rehabbing an upper body injury but returned to the ice on Jan. 30 and finished his season with Saginaw (OHL) with 55 points (19 goals, 36 assists) in just 23 regular season contests. He went on to add six points (two goals, four assists) in five postseason games. Chernyshov

also appeared in two games with the San Jose Barracuda, tallying an assist, and scored a goal in his lone playoff outing with the club.

Wetsch captained the Calgary Hitmen and was one of three skaters on the club to reach the 30-goal mark for the year, finishing fourth on the team with 52 points (33 goals, 19 assists). The forward finished the year with 10 multi-point efforts and two hat tricks - one in the regular season and one in the playoffs. He was traded to the Kelowna Rockets, who host the 2026 Memorial Cup, after the season.

Misskey finished second among Victoria defensemen in scoring with 47 points (10 goals, 37 assists) in 63 games, a 13-point leap in scoring from the 2023-24 campaign. The blue-liner finished the year with a plus-24 rating, fourth among Royals skaters and top among the team's defense corps.

2025 DRAFT NOTES TURNING THE CORNER

Since taking the helm in San Jose prior to the 2022-23 season, Sharks General Manager **Mike Grier** has turned over the roster and rebuilt the team's prospect pipeline to lay the foundation for another prolonged run of championship contention for the Sharks. The new era of Sharks hockey could be tangibly seen in the team's first game of the 2024-25 campaign as the team saw forwards **Macklin Celebrini** and **Will Smith** become the first draft picks of the Grier era to hit SAP Center ice for a regular season game. Celebrini went on to pace the Sharks in scoring with a club rookie record 63 points, finishing second on the team in goals (25) and assists (38). Smith enjoyed a strong first season in his own right, finishing fourth among league rookies with 45 points and 27 assists, sixth with 18 goals. In the second half of the campaign, defenseman **Luca Cagnoni** (fourth round, 123rd overall in 2023) and forward **Cam Lund** (second round, 34th overall in 2022) made their respective NHL debuts, with Cagnoni registering a pair of assists in six NHL contests and Lund logging three points (two goals, one assist) in 11 games. Cagnoni was the first defenseman from the 2023 NHL Draft to appear in the league.

Since taking the reins in San Jose, Grier has reshaped the roster with a series of high-profile trades, including sending out former franchise pillars in defenseman Brent Burns, forward Timo Meier, defenseman Erik Karlsson and forward Tomáš Hertl. In pick-for-pick swaps, Grier has added win value through expected wins (GSVA), using a study from *The Athletic* that analyzed draft slot values. In the 2022 draft, San Jose traded down to the 27th slot from 11 in addition to receiving the 34th and 45th overall selections, a move that netted a seven-year GSVA differential of +1.8 with **Filip Bystedt** (27th), **Cam Lund** (34th) and **Mattias Havelid** (45th) being selected by San Jose. The other first-round pick swap from Grier involved moving up from 14 to 11, also parting with the 42nd pick (originally a slot held by New Jersey) in the process, to acquire **Sam Dickinson**.

Throughout the process of the organizational overhaul, Grier has built what *The Athletic* deemed as the top prospect pipeline in the NHL during the 2024-25 season, a ranking that did not include 2024 first-overall selection Macklin Celebrini. At the time he took the helm, San Jose ranked 21st in the league. Beyond the first four Grier draft picks to dress for the Sharks in a regular season NHL contest, San Jose has seen:

- **Sam Dickinson** (London, OHL) was named OHL Defenseman of the Year, set a Knights record for single-season points by a defenseman with 91 in 2024-25
- **Kasper Halttunen** (London, OHL) made his AHL debut to start 2024-25 and returned to London, helping the club capture its second consecutive league championship as he was named OHL Playoffs MVP after scoring nine goals in the championship series, most by a skater since Jonathan Cheechoo also scored nine in 1999
- **Igor Chernyshov** (Saginaw, OHL) missed the first half of the season recovering from an upper-body injury and went on to light up the OHL upon his return, clicking for 55 points (19 goals, 36 assists) in 55 games. He went on to record an assist in two regular season games with the Barracuda and added a goal in his lone postseason contest
- **Quentin Musty** (Sudbury, OHL) posted another strong season in juniors with 59 points (30 goals, 29 assists) in 33 games and got his first taste of AHL action with the Barracuda toward the end of the season
- **Brandon Svoboda** (Boston Univ., Hockey East) helped the United States earn Gold at the World Junior Championship, posting six points (three goals, three assists) in seven games
- **Joey Muldowney** (UConn, Hockey East), **Cam Lund** (Northeastern, Hockey East), **Eric Pohlkamp** (Denver, NCHC), **Noah Beck** (Arizona State, NCHC) and **Reese Laubach** (Penn State, Big 10) all earned conference honors on the season

2025 DRAFT NOTES

THREE CRACKS AT THE FIRST FOUR

Entering the 2025 NHL Draft with the second overall selection, San Jose is poised to pick in the top four for the third consecutive season. At the top end of the draft is where teams consistently discover franchise-altering players that can provide a foundation to build around to become a consistent Stanley Cup Playoff contender, just as San Jose did for 20 years from the 1998 season through 2019.

Having the opportunity to add a top-four drafted player in the lottery era is rare - the Sharks and Chicago Blackhawks this year can become the sixth and seventh teams since the start of the lottery era (since 1995) to make a selection in the first four in three straight drafts.

This is the second time the Sharks can complete the top-four hat trick, previously doing so from 1996-98. Prior to San Jose's current run, the previous most recent clubs to make a top-four pick in three straight seasons were Edmonton (2010-12) and Pittsburgh (2003-06).

In those years, Pittsburgh chose Marc-Andre Fleury, Evgeni Malkin, Sidney Crosby, and Jordan Staal due to their low standings finishes, and from the start of the 2006-07 season after the Staal selection, Pittsburgh qualified for the postseason in 16 straight seasons, capturing three Stanley Cups in the process and qualifying for the Cup Final four times. Additionally, among team accolades, these players won four Art Ross Trophies, three Conn Smythe Trophies, three Hart Trophies, two Maurice 'Rocket' Richard Trophies, and one Calder Memorial Trophy.

In the previous run of three years picking in the top four, San Jose selected Andrei Zyuzin (second overall; 1996), Patrick Marleau (second overall; 1997) and Brad Stuart (third overall; 1998). Zyuzin appeared in 81 games over his Sharks tenure, finishing with 17 points (nine goals, eight assists) and a plus-13 rating before being dealt to Tampa Bay on Aug. 4, 1999. Marleau, the first player to have his number retired by the Sharks, concluded his career as the NHL's all-time leader in games played (1,779), 1,607 of which came in teal. He remains the Sharks' all-time leader in goals (522), points (1,111), power-play goals (163), shorthanded goals (17), game-winning goals (101), multi-goal games (67) and shots on goal (3,953). Stuart was a member of the NHL All-Rookie team and was a Calder Memorial Trophy Finalist in 1999-00 after tallying 36 points (10 goals, 26 assists) with a plus-3 rating in 82 games. In his Sharks career, Stuart logged 170 points (39 goals, 131 assists) in 486 games, finishing his time with the club with a plus-35 rating. He was part of the blockbuster trade in which San Jose acquired forward Joe Thornton, the second player to have his number retired in San Jose and the first-overall pick in the 1997 NHL Draft.

San Jose's first two selections of this current run both enjoyed strong rookie campaigns in 2024-25, with **Macklin Celebrini** and **Will Smith** both finishing in the top four in NHL rookie scoring. Celebrini was the only rookie in the NHL to lead his team in scoring and the second-ever Shark to pace the club in points in his first year in the league, the first since Pat Falloon in the team's inaugural season, 1991-92. Smith and Celebrini combined to form just the fourth pairing of rookie teammates to hit the scoring century mark since 2016-17.

The Sharks are the 10th team in the lottery era to make a top-two pick in back-to-back drafts, the second time San Jose has made selections in the first pair off the board in consecutive seasons. Prior to the most recent back-to-back top-two selections of Connor Bedard and Artyom Levshunov by Chicago in the past two years, the most recent top duos selected include Kaapo Kakko and Alexis Lafreniere (NYR; 2019-20), Sam Reinhart and Jack Eichel (BUF; 2014-15) and Aleksander Barkov and Aaron Ekblad (FLA; 2013-14), with Barkov and Ekblad going on to help the Florida Panthers capture back-to-back Stanley Cups in 2024 and 2025.

STRENGTH IN NUMBERS

For the third consecutive year, San Jose is poised to make a pair of selections in the draft's first round. The infusion of top-end talent to the prospect pipeline will continue with the Sharks entering the 2025 NHL Draft with the second-overall selection as well as the 30th pick of the first round, acquired from Dallas in a February deal that sent Mikael Granlund and Cody Ceci to the Stars in exchange for a first-round and a fourth-round selection in this year's draft.

Should the initial draft order hold through the opening round, the Sharks will have made seven first-round picks over the four drafts of the **Mike Grier** era, second-most in the NHL in that span. San Jose also stands with a pair of first-rounders in 2026, the second coming courtesy of a March deal with Edmonton that sent Jake Walman to the Oilers in exchange for a top-12-protected first-round selection.

Highlights from 2024-25 for the first five first-rounders selected by Grier include:

- **Macklin Celebrini** (first overall; 2024) was named a Calder Trophy finalist in 2024-25 after setting Sharks rookie records with 63 points and 38 assists. He led league rookies in scoring per game (0.90; min. 3 GP), was second in both even-strength points (41) and power-play points (22).
