FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP February 15, 2024 – CALGARY FLAMES [3] vs. SAN JOSE SHARKS [6]

Game Summary I Event Summary

The Calgary Flames welcomed the San Jose Sharks to the Scotiabank Saddledome on Thursday night. Nazem Kadri would open the scoring just 4:19 into the contest and the Flames led 1-0 through 20. The Sharks would score three unanswered in the second, before Mikael Backlund responded for the Flames and the home side trailed 3-2 through two periods of play. In the final frame, the Sharks would add three more to knock off the Flames 6-3.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the second of two meetings this season between the Flames and Red Wings. The Flames suffered a 6-2 setback in their first meeting on October 22nd.

This is a Pacific Division versus Atlantic Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 6-3-1 against Atlantic Division teams and a record of 10-10-3 against Eastern Conference opponents.

FIRST MEETING:

The Calgary Flames and Detroit Red Wings met on October 22nd for their first of two matchups this season. Yegor Sharangovich scored his first as a Flame while Andrew Mangiapane also found the back of the net, but the Flames would fall 6-2. Six different Flames would record points in the losing effort as they look to knock-off the Red Wings for the seventh time in their last eight meetings at the Scotiabank Saddledome.

MARKY MARK:

Jacob Markstrom was named the NHL's First Star for the week ending on February 11th. The Gavle, SWE native started all four games for the Flames during their four-game road swing, going 3-1-0 with a .945 save-percentage and a 1.76 goals-against average and registered two assists over the trip. Since Feb. 1, Markstrom has made 121 saves which ranks second in the NHL and has seen the sixth-most ice time among goaltenders at 238:19. Over his last five starts, Markstrom is 4-1-0 with a shutout and a .956 save-percentage. With a record of 99-68-25 in 197 games as a Flame, Markstrom is just one win shy of becoming the fifth goaltender in Flames history to record 100 victories with the franchise.

WEEGSY BABY:

MacKenzie Weegar is in the midst of a career season, and his 15 goals on the campaign lead all defensemen in the NHL. Weegar is looking to join Al MacInnis (28 in 1993-94 & 1990-91) and Dougie Hamilton (17 in 2017-18) as the third Flames skater to conclude a season as the League leader in goals among defenseman (outright or tied). Weegar also has 17 helpers for 32 points which ranks him fourth on the Flames in scoring.

HUBY DOO:

With his assist on Andrei Kuzmenko's third period marker against San Jose, Jonathan Huberdeau recorded his 700th NHL point. Huberdeau has become the third skater to reach the 700-point plateau from the 2011 draft class along with Nikita Kucherov (822), and Johnny Gaudreau (718).

ON THE HUNT:

Dryden Hunt was recalled from the AHL's Calgary Wranglers on Friday morning and is looking to play his first game with the Flames since November 1st against Dallas. The Cranbrook, BC native skated in 23 games with the Calgary Wranglers in the American Hockey League, notching seven goals and 15 assists for 22 points along with 19 penalty minutes. At the time of his recall, Hunt's 22 points were the sixth-most on the Wranglers and the 28-year-old has skated in 206 NHL contests in his career. Hunt was acquired by the Flames from Toronto in exchange for Radim Zohorna on March 3rd, 2023.

DEFENSIVE SCORING:

After MacKenzie Weegar's hat trick last Saturday in Long Island, Calgary Flames defenceman have now scored 35 goals which is the second-most by a defensive core in the league so far this season, trailing only Colorado (46). Weegar leads the charge with 15 tallies, while Noah Hanifin (9), and Rasmus Andersson (7) are currently second and third in scoring among blueliners on the Flames.

MEMORY LANE:

Dryden Hunt recorded his first NHL goal against the Detroit Red Wings as a member of the Florida Panthers back on March 10th, 2019. MacKenzie Weegar recorded an assist on Hunt's first big-league tally, along with another helper for a two-point night. Jonathan Huberdeau was also a member of the Florida Panthers on that night and registered a goal and an assist for a two-point night of his own.

HEY DID YOU KNOW?

Jordan Oesterle spent two seasons with the Detroit Red Wings, playing in 97 games with the franchise during the 2021-22 and 2022-23 campaigns. In their first meeting this season, Oesterle skated in 13:12 of ice-time with one shot.

Jacob Markstrom has recorded four assists this season and only four different goaltenders in Flames history have recorded more helpers in a season, with the most recent being Roman Turek who registered five during the 2001-02 campaign.


