BUFFALO SABERS

All-Time Wild Record: 15-9-5 (5-6-3 at Xcel Energy Center, 10-3-2 at Buffalo)

2022-23: Minnesota went 1-0-1 againt Buffalo...The Sabres earned a 6-5 overtime victory in the series-opening game in Buffalo (1/7) and Minnesota beat the Sabres 3-2 in a shootout at Xcel Energy Center in the series finale (1/28)...C Joel Eriksson Ek led the Wild with three points (2-1=3)...C Ryan Hartman (1-1=2), C Frederick Gaudreau (1-1=2), LW Kirill Kaprizov (1-1=2) and D Calen Addison (0-2=2) tallied two points each...LW Marcus Foligno (1-0=1) and RW Brandon Duhaime (1-0=1) scored goals...G Marc-Andre Fleury stopped 60-of-68 shots faced for Minnesota...D Rasmus Dahlin led Buffalo with five points (2-3=5)...C Casey Mittelstadt tallied three assists...C Dylan Cozens (1-1=2), LW Victor Olafsson (2-0=2) and C Peyton Krebs (0-2=2) recorded two points each...G Ukko-Pekka Luukkonen stopped 72 of 79 shots faced for the Sabres.

WILD LEADERS: D **Alex Goligoski** leads Minnesota with 22 points (7-15=22) in 28 contests against Buffalo...LW **Marcus Johansson** has 19 points (12-7=19) in 28 games...RW **Mats Zuccarello** owns 17 points (5-12=17) in 24 matches...D **Jared Spurgeon** has 11 points (5-6=11) in 17 contests... Gaudreau owns nine assists in nine games.

WILD GOALIES: Fleury is 22-7-4 with a 2.22 GAA, a .920 SV% and four shutouts in 35 games (32 starts) vs. the Sabres...G **Filip Gustavsson** has not faced Buffalo.

SABRES LEADERS: RW **Kyle Okposo** leads the Sabres with 13 points (4-9=13) in 22 contests against Minnesota...D Erik Johnson owns 12 points (2-10=12) in 51 games... Dahlin owns 10 points (4-6=10) in seven games... LW **Jeff Skinner** has 10 points (5-5=10) in 18 matches...RW **Alex Tuch** owns eight points (4-4=8) in 18 games.

SABRES GOALIES: Luukkonen is 2-0-0 with a 3.25 GAA and a .938 SV% in one career start...G **Eric Comrie** is 0-1-0 with a 4.95 GAA and a .846 SV% in two games (one start).

CONNECTIONS: Wild Assistant Coach Bob Woods served as an assistant coach for Buffalo (2016-17)...LW Marcus Foligno is a Buffalo native and tallied 116 points (49-67=116) and 334 PIM in 347 games with the Sabres (2011-17)...He was drafted by Buffalo in the fourth round (104th overall) of the 2009 NHL Draft...Johansson tallied 30 points (9-21=30) in 60 games with Buffalo in 2019-20...D **Zach Bogosian** collected 67 points (13-54=67) and 234 PIM in 243 games in parts of six seasons with the Sabres (2014-20) LW **Jordan Greenway** was drafted 50th overall by the Wild in the 2015 NHL Draft and recorded 119 points (38-81=119), 227 PIM and a plus-18 rating in 317 games over a span of six seasons with Minnesota (2017-23)...C **Tyson Jost** collected nine points (2-7=9) in 33 games in parts of two seasons with the Wild (2021-23)...Mittelstadt is from Eden Prairie and played one season at the University of Minnesota (2017-18)... Okposo is from St. Paul and played one season at the University of Minnesota (2006-07)...Tuch was drafted 18th overall by the Wild in the 2014 NHL Draft and made his NHL debut with Minnesota, skating in six games in the 2016-17 season...D Erik Johnson is from Bloomington and played one season (2006-07) at the University of Minnesota.

FAST FACTS: Minnesota's 7-0 win at Buffalo (1/15/15) is tied for the largest margin of victory in franchise history...The Wild is 11-5-4 in its last 20 games against the Sabres, outscoring Buffalo 73-49 in those games, including shootout goals.

NOTES & MILESTONES

Jonas Brodin: Currently ranks T-6th in the NHL with a plus-10 rating for the season.

Marc-Andre Fleury: Made 24 saves at NYR (11/9) to reach 25,808 career saves and pass Patrick Roy (25,800 career saves) for third most in NHL history...Earned the 65th shootout victory of his career vs. NYR (11/4), further extending his own NHL record.

Joel Eriksson Ek: Currently owns 99 career goals. Will become the 11th player in franchise history to reach 100 career goals.

Ryan Hartman: Currently T-1st on Minnesota with seven goals this season... T-3rd in the NHL with six goals since Oct. 24... Awarded the NHL's Third Star of the Week for the week ending Oct. 29 after ranking second in the NHL with five goals (5-2=7) in four appearances.

Kirill Kaprizov: Currently at 118 career goals, needs one goal to tie Andrew Brunette (119 career goals) for fifth-most in franchise history.

Vinni Lettieri: Scored first goal in Wild uniform at NYI (11/7).

Marco Rossi: Ranks second among NHL rookies in goals (five), third in shots (30) and T-6th in points (5-2=7).

Jared Spurgeon: Set to appear in his 14th season in a Wild sweater (2010-24), second-most in franchise history behind Mikko Koivu (15 seasons, 2005-20)...Currently with 110 career goals, tied with Nino Niederreiter for eighth-most in franchise history, needs one goal to tie Eric Staal for seventh-most in franchise history.

Mats Zuccarello: Finished with two points vs. NYR (11/4) to record a point in his first six home games of the 2023-24 season, setting a new franchise record for a season-opening home-point streak.



TEAM NOTES



HOME SWEET HOME

- Dating back to Nov. 19th, 2022, Minnesota is 26-9-4 at home for a .718 point percentage, tied for the third-most wins and home point percentage in the NHL during that span.
- In home games since Nov. 19, 2022, the Wild has allowed 2.49 goals per game (fourth in NHL) and recorded a .916 save percentage (fourth in NHL).
- Minnesota ranked tied for sixth in the NHL with a .659 home point percentage and tied for seventh with 25 home victories during the 2022-23 season.

SHORT (HANDED) KINGS

- The Wild scored two shorthanded goals on the same first-period penalty kill at MTL (10/17), first from Brandon Duhaime at 9:20 and second from Connor Dewar at 9:45, marking the second time in franchise history scoring multiple SHGs on the same penalty kill, the third time in franchise history scoring two SHGs in the same period, and the sixth time in franchise history scoring multiple SHGs in a single game.
- Minnesota currently ranks tied for fourth in the NHL with two shorthanded goals this season.
- Minnesota ranked third in the NHL with 14 shorthanded goals (SHG) during the 2022-23 season.
- The Wild scored its 14th SHG of the season at CHI (4/10), breaking the franchise's previous single-season record set in the 2000-01 season.
- Minnesota recorded two SHG in a single game twice a 10-day span (3/29 at COL, 4/8 vs. STL) after doing so only three times previously in franchise history.

COOL UNDER PRESSURE

- Minnesota went 42-7-8 (.807) last season when obtaining a lead at any point in the game, the seventh-best point percentage in the NHL in such situations.
- The Wild was 31-0-3 (.956) last season when leading through two periods, the third-best point percentage in the NHL. Thus far in 2023-24 the team is 2-0-0 in such situations.
- Minnesota was 15-1-11 (.759) last season in games that became tied with less than five minutes left in regulation, tied for the fifth-most victories in the NHL.

FREE HOCKEY, PLEASE

- Last season Minnesota had 12 victories in games decided past regulation, tied for seventh-most in the NHL during the 2022-23 season.
- The Wild's seven shootout victories last season led the NHL.
- Minnesota skaters scored shootout goals on 21 of 44 attempts (47.7 pct.) in 2022-23, leading the NHL in total shootout goals and in shootout percentage (min. 10 shootout attempts).
- Freddy Gaudreau led the NHL with eight shootout goals last season, while Kirill Kaprizov and Mats Zuccarello were tied for second with five shootout goals each. Since the start of the 2021-22 season, Gaudreau is second in the NHL with nine shootout goals, while Zuccarello is tied for third with eight shootout goals.
- Since the start of the 2021-22 season, Minnesota leads the NHL with 29 victories in extra-session games, three more than the next-closest franchise (Colorado, 26).

HEAD COACH DEAN EVASON

- Since Dean Evason took over as head coach on Feb. 14, 2020, Minnesota is 147-73-25 and ranks seventh in the NHL in points (319) and wins.
- The Wild recorded 123 wins in the team's first 200 games under Evason, tied for the fourth-most by a first-time head coach in NHL history (all games coming with one franchise).

 Evason reached 100 career wins at CHI (Oct. 30, 2022), requiring the fifth fewest (159) games in NHL history to do so.



KIRILL THE THRILL

- Kirill Kaprizov ranks third on the Wild with 12 points this season (4-8=12)
- Currently with 42 career PPGs, Kaprizov scored the 40th PPG of his career at MTL (10/17) to become the fifth player in franchise history to reach 40 career PPGs. He joined Zach Parise (69), Mikko Koivu (60), Marian Gaborik (59) and Andrew Brunette (55).
- Kaprizov recorded the 22nd three-point game of his career vs. EDM (10/24, 0-3=3). Only two players have more such games in a Wild sweater (Mikko Koivu, 34 and Marian Gaborik, 29).
- Currently at 118 career goals, Kaprizov needs one goal to tie Andrew Brunette (119 career goals) for fifth-most in franchise history.
- Kaprizov led the Wild with 75 points (40-35=75) last season.
- The left winger led the Wild in both multi-goal games (seven) and three-point games (seven) was tied for first in multi-point games (18).
- Kaprizov recorded his 100th career goal at CAR (1/19/23), becoming the third-fastest active player to reach that mark (180 games), trailing Patrik Laine (179 games) and Alexander Ovechkin (167 games).
- Kaprizov was the first player in Wild history to record his first 200 career points with the franchise in fewer than 200 games.

STONE-COLD KIRILL-ER

- Kaprizov's game-winning goal in overtime vs. CBJ (2/26/23) marked his sixth overtime goal since entering the NHL in 2020-21. The total is tied for fifth-most in the league since the start of the 2020-21 season.
- Kaprizov currently stands at 10 career overtime points in a Wild sweater, tied with Pierre-Marc Bouchard and Marian Gaborik for second-most in franchise history.

 Kaprizov is tied for first in franchise history with six OT goals, matching teammate Matt Dumba. Six of his 13 career game-winning goals have come in overtime.



MATS-TER OF HIS CRAFT

- Mats Zuccarello is tied for first on the Wild with 13 points (3-10=13) this season
- Finished with two points vs. NYR (11/4) to record a point in his first six home games of the 2023-24 season, setting a new franchise record for a season-opening home-point streak.
- Zuccarello started the season on a six-game point streak, his longest point streak to open a season and tied for the second-longest seasonopening point streak in franchise history.
- The 36-year old Norwegian's 13 points this season rank tied for fourth in the NHL among players age 33 or older.
- Zuccarello posted 22-45=67 during the 2022-23 season, leading the team in assists, ranking second in points and fourth in goals.
- Zuccarello recorded four points (3-1=4) and his second career hat trick vs. CHI (12/16/23). His last hat trick came Oct. 30, 2015, vs. TOR as a member of the New York Rangers.
- At 35 years, 106 days old, Zuccarello became the oldest player in Wild history to notch a hat trick.
- The native of Oslo, Norway, became the first Norwegian-born NHL player with multiple career hat tricks.
- Zuccarello ranks second among active undrafted NHL players in career points (586), third in career goals (189) and third in career games played (779).



BOLDY AND THE BEAUTIFUL

- **Matt Boldy** led the team in takeaways (51), tied for first in multi-point games (18), was second in goals (31) and shots on goal (255) and third in points (63) during the 2022-23 season.
- Had 21 points (14-7=21) in his last 16 games and 23 points (15-8=23) in his last 19 games.
- Boldy scored his 31st goal of the 2022-23 season at CHI (4/10) to surpass Marian Gaborik (30 in 2002-03 and 2001-02) for most by a Wild player age 22 or younger.
- Collected his 100th career point (45-55=100) in the 125th game of his career at PIT (4/6). Among players to debut with the franchise, he required the second-fewest games to reach the mark behind Kirill Kaprizov (92 GP).
- Scored 12 goals in the month of March 2023, becoming the third Wild player with as many in a calendar month (Kaprizov, 14 in March 2022; E. Staal, 13 in Feb. 2018).
- Recorded his third career hat trick (3-0=3) vs. SEA (3/27), the first natural
 hat trick of his career and his second hat trick in a five-game span.
- Became the fourth U.S.-born NHL player to record three hat tricks before turning 22, joining Jimmy Carson (seven), Alex DeBrincat (four) and Jeremy Roenick (four).
- Recorded his second career hat trick vs. WSH (3/19), becoming the seventh player in franchise history to notch multiple hat tricks.
- Has joined Marian Gaborik (67 in 2001-02 & 65 in 2002-03) and Pierre-Marc Bouchard (59 in 2005-06) as the only Wild players to record a 50-point season before age 22.
- Boldy reached the 30-goal mark in the 94th game of his career, joining Kirill Kaprizov (30 goals in first 67 games) and Marian Gaborik (30 goals in first 93 games) as the only players to debut with the Wild and reach the mark in fewer than 100 games.



SPURGEON GENERAL

- Jared Spurgeon led the Wild with 179 blocked shots, 25.6 shifts per game and a plus-32 rating last season.
- His single-season blocked shot total ranked third in franchise history behind Greg Zanon (212, 2010-11 season; 196, 2009-10 season).
- He finished sixth in the NHL in blocked shots during the 2022-23 season.
- His plus-32 rating ranked 12th in the NHL and fourth in the Western Conference. Among defenseman, Spurgeon was sixth in the NHL and second in the Western Conference.
- His plus-112 career rating is first in Wild history.
- Spurgeon has played the second most games in franchise history sits third on the team's all-time assist list.

- The Edmonton native was named the second full-time captain in team history on Jan. 3, 2021.
- He is the franchise leader in goals, points, shots on goal, PPG, GWG and blocked shots by a defenseman and ranks second in assists, PPA, PPP, and hits among defensemen.





CROWN JOEL

- Joel Eriksson Ek scored the 97th goal of his career vs. EDM (10/24), moving past Brian Rolston (96 career goals) for sole possession of 11thmost in franchise history.
- Eriksson Ek is currently tied for first on the team lead in scoring (7-6=13) and goals and ranks second in shots on goal (40) this season.
- Eriksson Ek has recorded a team-leading four multi-point games this season.
- Eriksson Ek scored two PPGs at MTL (10/17), marking the second time in his career recording multiple PPG in a single game (two PPG vs. WPG, 10/19/21).
- Now with 28 career PPGs, Eriksson Ek is tied for ninth on Minnesota's all-time list with Nino Neiderreiter.
- Eriksson Ek ranked second on the Wild with 12 PPG and 38 assists, third with 247 shots and 23 goals and fourth with 61 points during the 2022-23 season.
- With 61 points (23-38=61) in 78 games last season, Eriksson Ek established a new single-season career high (previously 26-23=49, 2021-22 season).

MARCO POLO

- Marco Rossi is currently second among NHL rookies in goals (five), third in shots (30) and T-6th in points (5-2=7).
- Rossi recorded a point in three consecutive games (2-1=3) from 10/24 to 10/27, a career-long.
- He scored the first goal of his NHL career at TOR (10/14), becoming the ninth Austrian-born player to score a goal in a NHL regular-season game.
- Rossi joined Thomas Vanek (39 goals with Minnesota) and Christoph Brandner (four goals with Minnesota) as the only Austrian-born players to score goals for the Wild.

SHOT THROUGH THE HART

- Ryan Hartman is T-1st on Minnesota with seven goals this season and is fourth on the team with 11 points (7-4=11). He is tied for third in the NHL with six goals since 10/24.
- Hartman was awarded the NHL's Third Star of the Week for the week ending Oct. 29 after ranking second in the NHL with five goals (5-2=7) in four appearances.
- Recorded five points (3-2=5) vs. EDM (10/24), marking his second career hat trick (first with MIN) and tying his career-best in points in a game.
- Currently holds a 21.2 shot percentage (seven goals on 33 shots), tied for eighth among NHL players with 30 or more shots this season.

THE MOOSE IS LOOSE

- Marcus Foligno is third in the NHL with 43 hits this season. He led Minnesota with 237 hits last season.
- Foligno has recorded five 200-hit seasons in his career, including three with the Wild.
- His 3.6 hits per game played were tied for seventh-most in the NHL last season (min. 50 games played).
- Since entering the league in 2011-12, Foligno ranks eighth among NHL players with 2,225 hits.

PHONE BOOTH FREDDY

- Freddy Gaudreau finished tied for third in the NHL with four shorthanded goals and tied for sixth in shorthanded points during the 2022-23 season
- Became the first player in Wild history to record multiple shorthanded goals in a single game, netting two at COL (3/29).
- Gaudreau led the NHL with eight shootout goals last season, tied for the largest since-season total in Wild history (Mikko Koivu, 2006-07 season).

BROCKED AND LOADED

- Brock Faber leads all rookie skaters with 23:43 in time on ice per game and 24 blocked shots.
- Faber scored his first NHL goal and recorded his first NHL point with a first-period goal vs. FLA (10/12).
- Faber made his NHL debut with the Wild at CHI (4/10), leading the team in time on ice (21:49) and blocked shots (six) while recording a plus-one rating and one shot on goal.
- Faber's six blocked shots were tied for most among players making their NHL debut since the league began tracking the stat in 2005-06.
- He is one of 33 Minnesota-born players (31 skaters) to wear the Wild sweater in a regular-season game.
- Ranks T-1st among NHL rookies with a plus-seven rating on the season.





IN FULL BLOOM

- Goaltender Marc-Andre Fleury made 24 saves at NYR (11/9) to reach 25,808 career saves and pass Patrick Roy (25,800 career saves) for third most in NHL history.
- Fleury made his season debut at MTL (10/17), making 27 saves in the 5-2 win and improving his record to 27-13-6 all-time against the Canadiens.
- Currently at 247 career wins, needs four wins to tie (five to surpass)
 Roy (551 career wins) for second-most all-time.
- Fleury played 58:31 vs. LAK (10/19), moving his career minutes total to 57,164:32 and surpassing Terry Sawchuk (57,155:51) for fourth on the all-time list among NHL goaltenders.
- Fleury notched the 65th shootout win of his career vs. NYR (11/4), further extending his all-time NHL record.
- Finished 24-16-4 for the 2022-23 season, Fleury recorded his 15th career season of 20-plus wins, tied for third-most in NHL history: Patrick Roy (17), Martin Brodeur (16) and Ed Belfour (15).
- With 73 career shutouts, Fleury has recorded a shutout against 29-of-32 NHL teams (St. Louis, Vegas and Minnesota), the most in league history.
- Currently at 990 career games played, Fleury played in his 972nd career game vs. VGK (2/9) to move past Terry Sawchuk for fourth place in NHL history among goalies. Roy currently ranks third with 1,029 career game appearances.
- Fleury faced his 28th career penalty-shot attempt at MTL (10/25). Per NHL Stats, Fleury's 22 saves on 28 all-time attempts trail only Roberto Luongo (33 PS SA, 29 PS saves) for the all-time lead in both categories.
