## **Post-Game Notes**

- The Tampa Bay Lightning defeated the Edmonton Oilers 6-4 at AMALIE Arena on Saturday night.
- The Lightning improved to 8-6-4 overall this season and to 4-4-2 at home.
- The Bolts won their first game in which they trailed headed into the third period, moving to 1-5-2 in those situations.
- The Lightning improved to 5-2-1 against the Western Conference and 3-0-1 against the Pacific Division.
- The Bolts have won 10 of their last 11 home games against the Oilers.
- The Lightning were outshot 43-24, including a 20-10 deficit in the first and an 8-3 deficit in the second.
- The Bolts' penalty kill went 5 for 5, keeping the Oilers' power play off the board.
- The last time the Oilers went 0 for 5 or worse was January 9, 2023 at Los Angeles.
- The Bolts improved to 2-3-4 when they are outshot by their opponent.
- Nikita Kucherov paced the Lightning with six shots on goal.
- Erik Cernak dished out a game-high five hits.
- Mikhail Sergachev blocked a team-high four shots.
- Nick Paul won 11 of 15 faceoffs to lead the Lightning.
- Lightning goaltender Jonas Johansson made 39 saves on the 43 shots he faced to improve to 7-4-4 this season.

- Derek Ryan scored a shorthanded goal at 3:39 of the first period to give Edmonton a 1-0 lead.
- James Hamblin scored his first NHL goal to extend the Oilers' lead to 2-0 at 8:31 of the first period.
- Nikita Kucherov scored a power-play goal to cut the Bolts' deficit in half with 51 seconds remaining in the first period.
- The goal marked Kucherov's 25<sup>th</sup> point of the season (12-13—25) and his 12<sup>th</sup> power-play point (5-7—12).
- Steven Stamkos notched the primary assist on the goal to tally his 17<sup>th</sup> point of the season (5-12—17) and his ninth on the power play (1-8—9).
- Brayden Point also collected an assist to register his 22<sup>nd</sup> point of the season (7-15—22) and his ninth on the power play (4-5—9).
- Nikita Kucherov scored his second goal of the night to tie the game 2-2 at 12:56 of the second period.
- Kucherov picked up his 26<sup>th</sup> point of the season with the goal (13-13—26).
- Mikhail Sergachev recorded his 11<sup>th</sup> point of the season (1-10—11) with the primary assist.
- Darren Raddysh tallied his sixth assist and point of the season with the secondary helper on the game-tying goal.
- Derek Ryan scored his second goal of the night and of the season to give Edmonton a 3-2 lead at 15:55 of the second period.
- Tanner Jeannot capitalized on a 2-on-1 rush to tie the game 3-3 for the Lightning at 3:52 of the third period.
- The goal marked Jeannot's seventh point of the season (3-4-7).
- Mikey Eyssimont tallied the primary assist to record his sixth point of the season (4-2—6).
- Mikhail Sergachev tallied his second assist of the night, marking his 12<sup>th</sup> point of the season (1-11—12).
- Sergachev has recorded a multi-point effort in back-to-back games.

- Evan Bouchard scored with the teams at 4-on-4 to give the Oilers a 4-3 lead at 8:03 of the third period.
- Steven Stamkos scored a power-play goal from the left circle at 9:27 of the third period, tying the game for the third time.
- Stamkos has pointed in seven of his last eight home games against the Oilers (6-7—13).
- Nikita Kucherov notched his third point of the night and 27<sup>th</sup> point of the season (13-14—27) with the primary assist.
- Kucherov recorded his 71<sup>st</sup> career three-point game, the third-most in Lightning history behind Marty St. Louis (73) and Steven Stamkos (97).
- Kucherov has pointed in each of his eight caeer home games against Edmonton (9-9—18).
- Brayden Point found the scoresheet for the second time in the game, registering his 23<sup>rd</sup> point of the season (7-16—23) with the secondary assist on the game-tying goal.
- Point has recorded multi-point efforts in three consecutive games against the Oilers (2-4—6) and has found the scoresheet in eight of his last nine games against Edmonton (4-9—13).
- Luke Glendening gave the Bolts their first lead of the game, redirecting a pass from Cole Koepke at 10:07 of the final frame.
- Glendening's goal was his second of the season (2-0-2).
- Cole Koepke recorded his first NHL assist and his second NHL point in his first game with the Lightning this season after being recalled from AHL Syracuse.
- Darren Raddysh also notched an assist on the play, his second of the night and seventh of the season.
- Mikhail Sergachev scored an empty-net goal from behind the Bolts' goal line to make the score 6-4 Lightning.
- Sergachev tallied his third point of the game with the goal (1-2—3).
- Nick Paul notched the lone assist, winning the faceoff to Sergachev to earn his 10<sup>th</sup> point of the season (7-3—10).

- The Lightning continue their three-game homestand on Monday night against the Boston Bruins (7:00pm puck drop).
- Tampa Bay is 34-61-10 with nine ties all-time against the Bruins, including a home record of 23-24-6 with three ties.
