



Requests for information and materials should be directed to the Sabres' Public Relations Department, c/o Buffalo Sabres, Memorial Auditorium, Buffalo, New York 14202. Phone: (716) 856-7300. Public Relations Director, John Gurtler.

Applications for press credentials for an individual game must be made by noon latest on game days to the public relations office only. They will be filled on a space available basis. The media entrance to Memorial Auditorium for Sabres hockey is located on the Pearl Street side of the building at street level. Pearl St. runs along the west side of the Aud.

Press credentials will be held at this entrance until faceoff time, or can be picked up earlier on game days from the public relations department.

The Sabres press lounge opens two hours before game time, and is located on the west side of the Auditorium between Level Two and Level Three. While meals are served before games, the use of food for any other purpose such as throwing, sculpture or macrame is strictly prohibited by New York State law and NHL regulations.

To reach the press box, take escalators on the west side of the building to Level Five. The entrance ramp is located about 25 feet off the end of the escalator to the right. Please display your press credentials at all times for admission to the press box, press lounge and dressing room areas.

Two credit card phones are provided in the press box and one pay telephone.

# Seymour H. Knox III

### Chairman of the Board and Chief Executive Officer

Although he shuns the limelight, it was the quiet drive and determined effort by Seymour H. Knox III and his brother Norty that brought a National Hockey League franchise to Buffalo 16 years ago.

For the hockey fans of Western New York and Southern Ontario, it was a blessing that the Knox brothers did not give up their fight for an NHL franchise after being rejected in 1966. Their efforts were rewarded in December, 1969 when the NHL announce-

ed expansion teams would be placed in Vancouver and Buffalo,

Seymour served as the Sabres' Chairman and President during the organization's first 12 years of operation. He still remains extremely active as Chairman and as the Sabres' Governor on the NHL Board of Governors and as a member of its Advisory Committee.

Formerly a nationally-ranked squash racquets player and ex-president of the United States Squash Racquets Association, Seymour had his hockey career ended as a schoolboy with a football injury. He is currently a vice president of Kidder, Peabody and Co., members of the New York Stock Exchange, a director of F.W. Woolworth Co. and Pratt & Lambert, Inc., and is a leader in a variety of community organizations.

He is Chairman of the Board of Trustees of the YMCA of Buffalo and Erie County; President of the Board of Directors of the Albright-Knox Art Gallery; Chairman of the National Board of Smithsonian Associates, he is a member of the Board of Directors of the Buffalo Area Chamber of Commerce, and the Advisory Council of MMB, Inc.

Seymour and his wife, Jean, reside in Buffalo. Jean is actively involved in the Sabres' community relations, which included the first three Sabres Super Carnivals.



# Northrup R. Knox

### President

Like his brother Seymour, Northrup R. Knox prefers to work behind the scenes and away from the public attention in an effort to bring a Stanley Cup winner to Buffalo.

On May 23, 1982, the Sabres' Board of Directors elected Norty as president of the club. During the club's first 12 NHL seasons, he served as the organization's vice-chairman of the board as well as the Sabres' Alternate Governor on the NHL Board of Governors.

A former goalie at Yale University, Norty was an undefeated world champion in court tennis for ten years, and captain of the U.S. Polo teams that played Argentina in 1966 and 1969. At one time, he was chairman of the U.S. Polo Association.

Currently, he is Chairman of the Board of Marine Midland Bank — Western Region, and a director of Marine Midland Banks, Inc. He is vice president of the Albright-Knox Art Gallery and he is also a member of the Board of Directors of the University at Buffalo Foundation, and the Niagara Share Corporation.









### William Scott Bowman

### Director of Hockey Operations, General Manager and Coach

Much like Lou Gehrig's 2,130 consecutive games played streak in baseball has stood the test of time, so, too, could Scott Bowman's career coaching record of 736 regular season wins.

On December 19, 1984 in Chicago, the Buffalo Sabres outscored the Black Hawks, 6-3, giving Scott his 691st coaching win, one more than Hall of Famer Dick Irvin and it made him the winningest coach in NHL history. Since joining the Sabres in 1979 as the club's

director of hockey operations and general manager, Scott has worn many hats, including that of head coach.

Following the 1983-84 season, when the Sabres showed a 14-point improvement, both of Scott's jobs were rewarded. He finished second in NHL Coach of the Year balloting and he was named The Hockey News Executive of the Year.


During his tenure with the Sabres, Scott has been a tireless worker. If he's not found on the found discussing ideas or trades with fellow general managers, he might be on the ice working with the players. If not there, he could be in Rochester evaluating younger players in the Sabres' system or he could be scouting potential draftees anywhere from Buffalo to Sweden. You might also find him checking out an upcoming opponent or he could be working towards improving the game of hockey for spectators and players, as he had been one of the leaders among NHL General Managers in the move to add speed and even more excitement to the game.

But it is his coaching record that is truly remarkable. He served as coach and general manager of the St. Louis Blues from 1967 to 1971 and guided the Blues to three consecutive Stanley Cup appearances. He moved on to Montreal, where he worked from 1971 to 1979 and led the Canadiens to five Stanley Cup titles, including four straight (1976-79). Scott then took over the Sabres' hockey department operations in 1979.

In all, Bowman-coached teams have won 10 division titles, 40 or more games on ten occasions, 50 or more games five times and earned 100 or more points eight times. During a 12-season period (1967-68 to 1978-79), Bowman-coached teams appeared in eight Stanley Cup Finals. And, in a nine-year span (1971-72 to 1979-80), Bowman-led teams earned 108 or more points eight times.

Bowman has also served as head coach of Team Canada in the 1981 Canada Cup tournament; he was chief coach of Team Canada, winner of the 1976 Canada Cup tournament and coach of the 1979 NHL All-Stars in the three-game series against the Soviet Union. In 1977, he was named NHL Coach of the Year.

Scott and his wife, Suella, and children Alicia, 16, David, 14, Stanley, 13, Bobby, 10, and Nancy, 10, reside in Williamsville.



# Gerry Meehan

### Assistant General Manager/ Corporate Secretary

A center in the Sabres' first NHL game in 1970, Gerry Meehan became the franchise's second captain in 1971 and, in 1984, became the first former Sabre to move into the Sabres front office.


Meehan, 40, works directly under Sabres Director of Hockey Operations and General Manager Scott Bowman and handles many of the hockey department's administrative duties.


Gerry spent 10 seasons in the NHL at the playing level. In addition to the Sabres, he played for Toronto, Philadelphia, Vancouver, Atlanta and Washington. In 670 NHL games, the former center scored 180 goals, added 243 assists and totaled 423 points. He joined the Sabres on June 10, 1970 and remained with the club until he was traded along with Mike Robitaille to Vancouver in exchange for Jocelyn Guevremont and Bryan McSheffrey on October 14, 1974.

Appointed team captain prior to the 1971-72 season, Gerry served in that capacity until he was traded. He scored 94 goals and totaled 208 points in 306 career games with the Sabres. Gerry is perhaps best remembered for scoring a dramatic goal with four seconds remaining in the final regular season game of 1972 against Philadelphia to knock the Flyers out of a playoff position.

After retiring from hockey in 1979, Gerry completed his undergraduate degree from Canisius College and went on to law school at the University of Buffalo. Upon graduation in 1982, he joined the law firm of Cohen, Swados, Wright, Hanifan, Bradford & Brett where he was involved in some of the Sabres' legal work.

Gerry, his wife Mirella and children — Danny, 17, Adam, 12, and Katie, 6 — live in Amherst.





# Craig Ramsay

### **Assistant Coach**

Considered one of the top defensive forwards in hockey throughout his playing career, Craig Ramsay was recognized following his final season as the best defensive forward in the NHL during the 1984-85 campaign.

On that note, Craig, a player/assistant coach last season, announced his retirement from the playing ranks to concentrate on his assistant coaching duties with the club.

As well as being a top defensive performer, Ramsay proved to be one of the most durable players in NHL history. In 14 NHL seasons, Ramsay missed just 23 regular season games. Between March 27, 1973 and February 10, 1983, Ramsay did not miss a regular season game, appearing in 776 consecutive regular season games, an NHL record for most consecutive games played with the same club. It is the third longest streak in NHL history, behind Garry Unger and Doug Jarvis.

A second round draft pick in 1971, Ramsay also chalked up impressive offensive statistics during his playing career. He had a string of eight consecutive 20-goal seasons from 1973-74 to 1980-81 and he recorded his 250th NHL career goal in Philadelphia on February 2, 1985. He has 420 career assists and is only the second player in Sabres' history to record more than 400 assists. He is third on the Sabres' all-time scoring list with 672 points, 23 behind Richard Martin.

On October 28, 1984, Ramsay joined Gil Perreault as the only Sabres to have played in 1,000 or more regular season games. In 1973-74, Ramsay was named the club's most improved player. After the 1978-79 season, he was selected the team's most valuable player. Ramsay played in the 1976 NHL All-Star Game. He scored three career hat tricks, including one on December 5, 1971 against Minnesota when he scored his first three NHL goals.

Teamed with Don Luce throughout many of his early seasons, Ramsay was a part of the best pair of penalty-killing forwards in the NHL during the mid-70's. In 1984-85, Ramsay was also one of the Sabres' primary penalty killers on a penalty killing unit that led the NHL with an 82.4% efficiency. Ramsay holds the club's career record of 27 shorthanded goals.

Craig was also one of the five finalists for the Bill Masterton Memorial Trophy last year, which is awarded annually to the player who best exemplifies the qualities of perserverance, sportsmanship and dedication to hockey.

Throughout his career in Buffalo, Craig and his wife Susan have been active in community relations. Craig has been affiliated with the Arthritis Foundation while Susan was Co-chairman of the first Sabres' Super Carnival in 1980.

The Ramsays have three children — Travis, 11, Jad, 8, and Brendon, 3.



# **Barry Smith**

### Assistant Coach

The first Buffalo area native to join the coaching staff of the Buffalo Sabres was 35-year-old Barry Smith, who joined the Sabres March 3, 1986.

Smith returned to North America from coaching duties in Scandinavia as head coach of a top level club in Norway. He spent the past five seasons in Europe, three coaching in Sweden and the last two in Norway. For the past two years Smith provided evaluation reports on some European players to the Sabres organization.

A native of Buffalo, he is a graduate of Kenmore West Senior High School. He played amateur hockey in Western New York in various programs until enrolling at Ithaca College where he was on both the varsity hockey and football teams.

After graduation with a physical education degree in 1972, he took graduate work at Ithaca, then taught and coached at a private high school in the Philadelphia area for two years.

He joined the faculty of Elmira College and earned his master's degree in education there while serving as varsity hockey coach. His Elmira teams were in the playoffs five times in six years, three times ECAC champions and twice were NCAA finalists. He was nominated for coach of the year twice at Elmira.

Smith later studied coaching techniques in the Soviet Union, Czechoslovakia, Norway and Sweden and coached both elite level and top junior teams in those countries. He was assistant coach of the Norwegian team in both World Championships and Olympic competition.

A former semi-pro wide receiver with the Twin City Geminis, he worked as the head of a hockey school here for five recent summers.

Smith conducts development of on-ice and off-ice conditioning programs and technical skill improvement.





The hero (or the villain in the Bruins' case): A rangy center whose scoring exploits have already made him one of the top guns in Sabres history.

For it was this night that Dave scored a club record five goals as his Sabres blasted the Bruins 8-6 in the finest single scoring exploit by a Buffalo player in NHL history. And all five of the goals would easily classify as the "pretty" variety as he drove Bruins goalie Doug Keans from the net with the quintet in the first two periods.

To date in his career, Dave is the league's most effective goal scorer per game played of fowards drafted in 1982, and he's led the club in goals two of his first four seasons, finishing second to Mike Foligno's 41 in 1985-86.

Dave was the Sabres third of three first-round draft picks in 1982, picked 16th overall, and joined the Sabres early in the 1982-83 season from his Oshawa junior team, scoring 18 goals in 43 games as a rookie.

He scored a goal in his first NHL game against Quebec on October 6, 1982 and has been a consistent scorer ever since. He and team mate John Tucker, share bachelor quarters during the season, and Dave returns to his Hamilton, Ont. home during the summer months.




"A change of scenery should be the best thing for Scott," he said. "A fresh start may just be the spur to lift his game up to an even higher level, and it couldn't happen to a better guy."

The record on Arneil shows consistent effort and consistent point totals since he turned pro during the 1981-82 season after an outstanding junior career with the Cornwall Royals and a slot on the Canadian team which won the World Junior Hockey Championship that winter.

Few goaltenders have ever made as much impact on the NHL in their first three seasons as 21-year-old Barrasso. Drafted by the Sabres fifth overall in 1983 after a sensational career at Acton-Boxboro High School near Boston, Mass., Tom faced many questions about his ability to play in the big leagues at the ripe old age of 18 and after a high school playing career, plus a stint on the U.S. Junior team,

He wasted no time answering the questions, starring as a rookie with a league-best 2.84 goals against average in 42 games, two shutouts, and a crowd-pleasing, aggressive style in the nets.

He was voted the NHL's rookie-of-the-year that following spring, yoted first All Star goalie, won the Vezina trophy and obviously chosen for the NHL All-Rookie team.

His second season continued the record blitz. Tom was named to the second All-Star team, finished second for the Vezina, shared the Jennings Trophy with Bob Sauve, and notched five shutouts.

Last season, as the Sabres slid from the playoffs for the first time in more than a decade, Tom's numbers weren't as impressive as his first two campaigns, but he took on even more of the brunt of goaltending duties, and had established himself as a proven veteran, all before he was old enough to legally order a beer in nearly every state.

Tom changed his state during the off season, from single to married. He and his wife, Meigan, live in suburban Williamsville.

Performance plus desire translates into leadership, and Jacques has been nothing but a leader in his first six professional seasons.

But injuries have taken their toll on the slight native of Noranda, Que., who's one of the smallest goalies in pro hockey. Hurt much of last year, he came on in the season's second half to play 15 games with the Sabres, post one shutout and a solid 3.37 goals against average. He was recalled from Rochester where he had a sparkling 2.73 goals against in 14 starts, following a long off season recuperation from a knee injury suffered early in the 1984-85 schedule. In 1982 a broken collarbone also put him out of the lineup for a lengthy stretch.

Jacques also played one other game for the Sabres last season, keeping the Sabres in the thick of the contest against Moscow Dynamo in that January exhibition game in the Aud, won 7-4 by the Soviets.

He was Buffalo's third round pick in the 1979 draft, turned pro in 1980, and has split season with Rochester and Buffalo every year but one since then. In 1983, his performance in the American League playoffs led the Amerks to the Calder Cup. He was the Quebec Major Junior Hockey League's all-star goalie in 1978-79.

A pepper pot of enthusiasm on and off the ice, Jacques has one of the better glove hands among NHL goalies and challenges shooters more than when he came out of junior hockey.



At the age of 21, Adam appears to have filled out physically and in experience from the gangly youngster who was chosen in the first round ([1th overall) by the Sabres in the 1983 Entry Draft.

His junior credentials were impeccable, as Creighton led the Ottawa 67's to the Memorial Cup in 1984 and was named the Cup tournament's Most Valuable Player after an astounding 18 goals and 39 assists in 21 Cup games. In that same season he also played in Sabres colors for seven games before being returned to his junior club.

The next season (1984-85) Adam began the year with Buffalo, was loaned to the Team Canada side for their World Junior Hockey Championships, and was an outstanding player as the Canadians won the title. Dave spent his first full two seasons with Rochester, and most of his third and fourth pro campaigns, leading the Amerks in plus/minus in 1983-84. He started in the 1984-85 schedule with that club, but was recalled after nine games and played a regular turn with the Sabres for the rest of the year. For his steady efforts, Dave was voted the Sabres' Booster Club Tim Horton Memorial Award as the Unsung Hero at season's end.

He plans to complete his degree after his hockey career ends. Dave scored his first NHL goal on March 8, 1985 in a game against the Chicago Black Hawks, his only goal in 141 big league outings.

While the Olympic high jump record isn't in any jeopardy, the hockey high jump record (unofficial) must belong to the Sabres most volitaile player, who's coming off his best season as a pro.

Sometimes the question is whether Mike's goals are more exciting, or the leap in the air he makes in celebration of scoring. Whatever the answer, Foligno's contributions to Buffalo hockey can be easily catalogued since he came to the Sabres in the December 2, 1981 trade which also brought Dale McCourt and Brent Peterson in exchange for Jim Schoenfeld, Derek Smith and Danny Gare.

Last season Mike led the Sabres in goals, scoring, points and high jumps, and was voted the team's Most Valuable Player and Most Popular Player, the latter for the second time. He scored a career high 41 goals, and his aggressive style in the corners also sent Mike to the penalty box for 168 minutes of cooling off.

Drafted first by Detroit and third overall in 1979, he was second to Ray Borque as the NHL Rookie-of-the-Year in 1980 and scored 77 goals in less than 2½ seasons with the Wings before the trade to Buffalo.



Bill enters his 15th pro season as the oldest active Sabre in terms of service and games played. Only Gil Perreault and Craig Ramsey have played more games in Buffalo colors than the quiet westerner who returns to his family's Saskatchewan farm every summer.

Bill has quietly moved into second place on the all-time scoring list of Buffalo defensemen, but he'll never be known as a goal scorer, although one of his prettiest goals came to win a game against Philadelphia in the 1975 Stanley Cup finals.

A stay-at-home type of defense, he sometimes seems to be all arms and legs to opposing forwards. Twice he was chosen to play in the mid-season NHL All-Star Game (1981 and 1985) but couldn't participate on either occasion due to injuries.

His biggest thrills in hockey came in the Sabres wins over Soviet opposition in their first two international meetings. Drafted originally in 1971, Bill stayed in college for a year before turning pro, and is continuing work on a degree in commerce.

Capping his junior career with the London Knights with selection as the Ontario Major Junior Hockey League's best defenseman, Bob reported to the Sabres a year ago touted as a potential big offensive threat from his backline post.

In that first full NHL season some of the potential revealed itself, as skating ability and strength were evident when the 20-year-old native of Toronto got ice time.

But much of the season Bob spent watching from an unaccustomed spot in the press box, as the coaching staff went with a more experienced defense corps. When he got to play, Bob exhibited a scrappy temprament which saw him total 115 penalty minutes in only 37 games, the highest ratio of minutes per game on the Sabres.

He'll have to learn to curb his tendency to end up in the penalty box too often to make a better contribution to the Sabres fortunes. But the potential which saw him compared in raw talent to the Oilers Paul Coffey still remains, and Bob won't even turn 21 until the end of this season.

At London in the OHA, he scored 14 goals and 54 assists enroute to his selection as the league's defenseman and he has a hard, accurate shot from the point and the speed to make and take offensive openings. His first NHL action was against the Quebec Nordiques for four games during the 1984-85 Stanley Cup playoffs.

Gates is a perfect example of patience paying off for the Buffalo organization. Drafted at the end of his freshman year at Providence College in June of 1981, Gates returned to finish both his collegiate career and his bachelor's degree before trying the pro game in the latter part of the 1983-84 schedule.

He joined the Rochester Americans after course work was completed that spring and tallied 8 goals and 7 assists in 11 games, adding 4 more goals and 10 assists in 14 games of Calder Cup playoff action.

He spent most of the next season with the Amerks where he continued to score at more than a point-a-game clip and led Rochester in plus/minus. He saw brief service with Buffalo in 11 more games. Last season Gates was with the Sabres except for a short Rochester stint, and had 13 goals and 12 assists in limited ice time here.

He is single, a native of Montreal, and makes his off-season home in






No Buffalo goalie has been on a hotter spot than the rangy Puppa was in his first regular season start, facing the offensively-awesome Edmonton Oilers in their own Northlands Coliseum. Daren was more than equal to the task, shutting out the Gretzky-led Oilers with as fine a performance as was turned in during the 1985-86 schedule and earning NHL player-of-the-week honors for the whitewashing.

Daren started six other games in Buffalo during the season and was sent to Rochester for steady work, but a knee injury with the Amerks sidelined him until late in the regular season. His knee is reportedly back to normal and he gives the Sabres even greater depth at the critical goalie position.

A fourth round pick in the 1983 NHL entry draft, Daren passed on major junior hockey and enrolled at RPI for engineering studies. He led the RPI club to the NCAA hockey championship in the spring of 1985 with a 30-1-1 mark, topping his freshman record of 24-6-0, and was the first goalie in ECAC history to win 30 games in a year, surpassing Ken Dryden's win record at Cornell. He was never beaten by more than one goal in his college career, and only once lost two consecutive games. He is continuing his studies toward and engineering degree in the off-season.


The "miracle on ice" may have been the first time North American hockey fans first heard of Mike Ramsey, but his part of the historic United States victory over the Soviet Union at the Lake Placid Olympics in 1980 was just a prelude to an exceptional pro career.

Nearly every knowledgeable fan now realizes that Mike's heart is slightly bigger than his talent, and that talent has made him into one of the best defensive players in the league. He's a fine skater, excellent passer and occasionally works the power play, but it's in his own end of the ice that the 25-year-old Minneapolis native really shines.

Mike is rugged and relentless, dealing out stiff checks and always making the extra effort. He blocks shots with what sometimes seems thoughtless abandon, but is not injury prone despite his penchant for physical play.

Mike played in the NHL All-Star game the past two seasons and finished fifth in the end-of-year all star balloting in 1984. He has played in four of the past five All-Star games, and has been chosen at times as the Sabres most popular and most valuable player, as well as the team's unsung hero.

Mike was a member of Team USA for the 1984 Canada Cup Tournament, and has won the Sabres plus/minus Emery Edge award twice in the past four years. He is single, lives in suburban Amherst during the season, and at a lake-side home in Minnesota during the summer.

And sometimes his style of play hurts him as much as the opposition. A shoulder injury body checking knocked Lindy out of the lineup after 54 games last season at the peak of his best season in the NHL, the first time he had hit the 20-goal mark, and with a real shot at 30-plus.

More importantly, Lindy's absence hurt the Sabres on every level. He's a hyper-aggressive forechecker, diligent scrapper and a leader in the "give 'em hell" school of hockey needed to win in the tough Adams Division.

Last season's injury resulted in shoulder surgery for the second consecutive year, and brings his games missed due to injuries in the regular season to 152 in his first seven NHL seasons.

Lindy never played a game in the minors after he was selected by the Sabres as a second round draft pick (32nd overall) in 1979. He was rated much higher that year by Central Scouting, but a severe leg injury during his final junior season at Lethbridge left a question if he would ever even be able to play effectively again.

Lindy proved that point quickly the next fall, and his game has progressed steadily since. He came into the NHL as a defenseman, served two seasons on the back line, and moved to the left wing in 1981. He still takes an occasional shift as a defenseman when the Sabres are in a pinch.

Lindy and his wife, Gaye, live in Amherst, and they've shown exceptional taste by picking a golden retriever as a pet.


An examination of NHL records over the past 16 seasons reveals that the Sabres have traditionally been at or near the top of the league in killing off penalties successfully.

During those years some of the finest penalty killers in league history, Masterton Trophy winner Don Luce and Selke Trophy winner Craig Ramsay, thrived at what some players regard as a chose. Add Ric Seiling to the list of the league's finest in frustrating the opposition power play as he enters his 10th NHL season.

Ric never played a game in the minors after being selected in the first round of the 1977 draft. Following an outstanding junior career with the St. Catharines Fincups. He has played more games than any other right winger in Sabre history (664 and counting) and has won a number of club awards during his career. His consistent play is a given, and it really showed in 1981-82, when he won the Star of Stars award for three-star home selections despite the fact that he was far from the club's top scorer.

Ric suffered a serious eye injury in a game at Calgary on January 30, 1982 and has played wearing a protective eye shield since that time. He is active in his family's harness racing business in the off-season and has indicated a desire to enter broadcasting or public relations after his playing career ends. Ric's older brother, Rod, played 18 seasons in the NHL, most with the New York Rangers.


Doug couldn't have written a more exciting script for his debut with the Sabres after being traded along with Brian Engblom to Buffalo on January 29, 1986.

He took the ice at center for the opening faceoff against the New York Rangers, received a return breakaway pass from Paul Cyr after winning the draw, and raced in to score on Glen Hanlon at the 13-second mark with the first shot on goal. He assisted on Buffalo's final goal in the 5-3 win, was first star, and easily the best player on the ice that night.


Smith continued to add new spark and speed to the Sabres through the next 29 games, and soon earned popular accolades from the home crowds through the season's final day.

The second overall pick and the Kings first draft choice in 1981 after an outstanding junior career, he became the youngest player ever to perform in the LA lineup in the fall of 1981. The 1983 amateur draft was one rich in talent for the Sabres organization, and John is substantial proof of that. Rated by many scouts as a sure first-round pick, John somehow lasted until Buffalo was able to choose in the second round (31st overall!) and has justified his selection, and then some.

Playing part of the 1983-84 campaign in Buffalo, but most with his junior team at Kitchener, John scored an awesome 40 goals and 60 assists for 100 points in only 39 junior games, and for that feat was named the Ontario Hockey League's Player of the Year. In his 21 Buffalo starts that season, he quickly showed a goal-scoring knack at the big league level with an even dozen.

In his first full NHL season John followed up with 22 goals and 27 assists in 64 games, though missing 15 games with a broken ankle, and was voted the Fred T. Hunt Trophy as the Sabres outstanding rookie.

Last season, John took another quantum leap, notching a pro career high of 31 goals and 34 assists in 75 games, and was one of the Sabres most productive forwards on the power play.

He's the nephew of another former CFL wide receiver Whit Tucker, and spends his off season in his parents Windsor, Ont. home. John is single and has shared bachelor digs with Dave Andreychuk for the past few seasons. He's the only Sabre ever to have two penalty shots in one season, and scored on one of them back in the 1984-85 campaign.

# John Van Boxmeer

Head Coach Rochester Americans

A veteran of 12 professional seasons, former Sabres defenseman John Van Boxmeer enters his second full term at the helm of the Sabres top farm club, the American Hockey League's Rochester Americans.

Van Boxmeer, 33, got his coaching start in the organization during the 1984-85 season when he was named assistant coach in Rochester for Jim Schoenfeld. When Schoenfeld returned to the active ranks with the Sabres in December of that year, Van Boxmeer was

named interim coach. Under his tutelage for the remaining 55 games of the regular season, the Amerks finished third in the AHL's rugged Southern Division and were eliminated in the first round of playoff competition.

The 1985-86 season marked Van Boxmeer's first full term of office and he guided an explosive Amerks' squad to a typical fast start, jumping out in front of the rest of the league with a 20-6-3 mark. From that point on, injuries decimated both Van Boxmeer's charges and the Sabres, necessitating recalls of healthy Amerks, compounding the problems of the Amerks' skipper.

Faced with the prospect of playing with four rookies on the blue-line for the remainder of the year and a pair of goalies with exactly one-half year of professional experience behind them, Van Boxmeer's troops staggered through the remainder of the season and finished with a 34-39-7 mark, leaving them in sixth place and out of playoff contention for the first time in five years. Overall, the Amerks lost an unbelievable 324 man games with injuries. Van Boxmeer never gave up on the season, however, spending countless hours pouring over the list of available European talent, trying to find aid for his team. It nearly worked, as the Amerks staged a final week comback and missed fourth place by a scant four points.

John's playing career began in hockey's mecca, Montreal, as the Canadiens made him their first pick in the 1972 NHL draft. He spent four years in the organization before being traded to Colorado in 1976. When former Canadiens' coach Scott Bowman came to Buffalo in 1979, his first major deal was the acquisition of Van Boxmeer for Rene Robert in October of 1979.

Van Boxmeer enjoyed four productive seasons with the Sabres, registering a career high of 69 points in 1980-81, and was selected to play in the 1982 NHL All-Star Game, though he was unable to play because of a hand injury.

In 1983, Van Boxmeer was dealt to the rival Quebec Nordiques where he spent part of the 1983-84 season, the other half being with the Nordiques AHL affiliate in Fredericton. He rejoined the Sabres organization prior to the 1984-85 season.

Van Boxmeer and his wife, Judy, have one daughter, Ashley Marie.


