## SAN JOSE BARRACUDA BIOS



## JON GUSTAFSON

**President/SVP Governor**

Jon Gustafson enters his sixth season as Senior Vice President of SAP Center and Sharks Ice. For the previous eight years, he served as Vice President of Sharks Ice LLC, Sharks Minor Holdings (San Jose Barracuda), and SSE Merchandise.

In his current role, Gustafson oversees all venues under the SSE umbrella, including operations for the Sharks Ice family of rinks in San Jose, Fremont, and Oakland, as well as SAP Center. He also serves as Governor of the San Jose Barracuda and as a member of the AHL Executive Committee, acting as the primary liaison between the Barracuda and the league.

Since 2000, Gustafson has also served as Vice President and General Manager of the Sharks Ice facilities. Under his leadership, the operation has grown from a single rink with two ice sheets to three facilities with 10 ice sheets, while revenues have increased tenfold. He played a key role in the 200,000-square-foot expansion of Sharks Ice at San Jose, which included construction of Tech CU Arena, the 4,200-seat home of the Barracuda.

In 2013, the Jr. Sharks youth hockey program, founded by Gustafson and based out of Sharks Ice, was named a USA Hockey Model Program, one of only a handful in the country to earn that distinction. Gustafson also serves on the USA Hockey Board of Directors and works closely with organizations such as USA Hockey, USHL, NAHL, ISI, and USF to bring national and international hockey events to San Jose. In 2016, Sharks Ice hosted the USA Hockey Boys Tier 1 U16 and U18 National Championships, continuing its long tradition of hosting major events.

Gustafson was named the International Ice Skating Institute's "Facility Operator of the Year" in 2009. From 1996-99, he served as General Manager and Vice President of Operations for the San Jose Rhinos of Roller Hockey International (RHI). The team, which played at SAP Center, won the Murphy Cup as league champions in 1995, and Gustafson was recognized as RHI's "Executive of the Year" in 1999.

A former goaltender, Gustafson spent five seasons playing with teams in the AHL, ECHL, CHL, WCHL, and IHL. On April 15, 1992, he dressed as the backup goaltender for Grant Fuhr with the Toronto Maple Leafs at Maple Leaf Gardens in a 4-2 win over the New York Rangers. The Fort Frances, Ontario native also played four collegiate seasons at Colorado College.



## JOHN MCCARTHY

**Head Coach**

On May 18, 2022, John McCarthy was named the second head coach in franchise history after spending two seasons as a development coach. In 2024-25, he guided the Barracuda to their first Calder Cup Playoff appearance since 2018-19 and their first playoff series win since 2017.

On December 27, 2019, McCarthy made his coaching debut as a Barracuda assistant against Stockton, just hours after announcing his retirement from professional hockey. Earlier that month, on December 10, he suffered an ischemic stroke caused by a previously undetected hole in his heart. Thanks to swift action from the team's medical staff and physicians at Kaiser Permanente, he made a full recovery.

Drafted by the Sharks in the seventh round of the 2006 NHL Draft, McCarthy holds nearly every major Barracuda franchise record, including games played (275), goals (62), assists (76), points (138), and shorthanded goals (5). He captained the Barracuda from 2016-20 and also wore the "C" for the Worcester Sharks in 2012-13.

Over 577 AHL games with Worcester, Chicago, and San Jose, McCarthy recorded 297 points (130 goals, 167 assists), 233 penalty minutes, and a plus-62 rating. He added 11 points (three goals, eight assists) in 27 playoff games with the Barracuda.

In the NHL, he appeared in 88 games with the Sharks between 2009-2016, tallying six points (three goals, three assists) and 22 penalty minutes. In total, McCarthy played 640 combined regular-season games across the Sharks' NHL and AHL affiliates.

Internationally, McCarthy represented Team USA at the 2018 Winter Olympics in Pyeongchang, appearing in five games. Collegiately, he spent four seasons at Boston University, serving as co-captain of the Terriers' 2009 NCAA Championship team.



## KYLE HAGEL

**Assistant Coach**

Hagel enters his third season as an assistant coach with the San Jose Barracuda in 2024-25. He spent the previous five seasons as an assistant coach with the Seattle Thunderbirds of the WHL after a nine-year pro-playing career between the ECHL and AHL. Hagel, who played mostly left-wing as a player, spent four years at Princeton before beginning his pro career. During his nine seasons as a professional, he spent time with the AHL's Rockford IceHogs, Peoria Rivermen, Hamilton Bulldogs, Portland Pirates, and Charlotte Checkers, amassing 43 points (15 goals, 28 assists) and 1,001 penalty minutes in 373 games. In the ECHL, he skated in 80 games between the Fresno Falcons, Reading Royals and Las Vegas Wranglers, totaling 28 points (14 goals, 14 goals).

The native of Hamilton, Ontario, won the 2015 Yanick Dupre Memorial Award, which is given out annually to the AHL's man of the year for service to his local community.

Kyle resides in San Jose with his wife Jes and kids Liv and Macx.



## SAN JOSE BARRACUDA BIOS

**LOUIS MASS****Assistant Coach**

Louis Mass is entering his fourth season as an assistant coach with the San Jose Barracuda. He brings more than 12 years of coaching experience across the ECHL, NCAA, and WHL.

Before joining the Barracuda in 2022-23, the Anchorage, Alaska native spent four seasons with the Everett Silvertips, serving as associate coach in 2021-22 after three years as an assistant. Primarily overseeing the defense, he helped the Silvertips become one of the most defensively sound teams in the Canadian Hockey League.

Prior to Everett, Mass coached four seasons at the University of Alaska-Anchorage and five seasons with the ECHL's Alaska Aces, where he won a Kelly Cup in 2006.

As a player, Mass was a defenseman who skated four years in the USHL with the Rochester Mustangs and Lincoln Stars, winning a Clark Cup with Lincoln in 1997. He then played four years at Bowling Green State University before a five-year professional career in the ECHL with Pensacola, Pee Dee, Louisiana, and Alaska. In 312 ECHL games, he recorded 51 points (nine goals, 42 assists), 452 penalty minutes, and a plus-17 rating.

**ERIC PINSKY****Video Coach and Coordinator of Hockey Operations**

Eric Pinsky, a San Jose native and former Jr. Shark, is entering his fourth season with the Barracuda after spending six years with the ECHL's Idaho Steelheads in various roles. Most recently, he served as the Steelheads' video coach and occasionally joined the bench during home games while completing his graduate studies at Boise State.

After his Jr. Sharks career, Pinsky played briefly in the NAHL with Aberdeen before skating four seasons of ACHA Division II hockey with Boise State.

He holds a bachelor's degree in production and a master's degree in athletic leadership, both from Boise State. With the Barracuda, Pinsky works closely with Head Coach John McCarthy and his staff, contributing in multiple capacities.

**JOSH WOODARD****Head Equipment Manager**

The 2025-26 season marks Josh Woodard's first as Head Equipment Manager for the Barracuda, following two years as the team's assistant.

A graduate of the University of Arizona's Eller College of Management, Woodard began his career in hockey on the business side with the San Diego Gulls in 2019 before transitioning into the equipment field as a locker room assistant in 2022.

He also gained experience in minor league baseball, serving as Assistant Clubhouse Manager for the Inland Empire 66ers, the Low-A affiliate of the Los Angeles Angels.

**JACKSON DOLGE****Assistant Equipment Manager**

The 2025-26 season will be Jackson Dolge's first with the Barracuda as Assistant Equipment Manager. He previously served as Head Equipment Manager for the NAHL's Maryland Black Bears.

A Washington, D.C. native and Penn State graduate, Dolge worked as a student equipment manager during his time in Happy Valley and also interned with the university's hockey operations and equipment staff.

**JAIME GARCIA****Head Athletic Trainer, Manager of Sports Medicine**

The 2025-26 season will be Jaime Garcia's second as the Barracuda's Head Athletic Trainer and Manager of Sports Medicine.

Garcia spent the three previous seasons (2020-23) as Assistant Athletic Trainer for the AHL's Milwaukee Admirals and three seasons (2017-20) in the same role with the Rochester Americans. Before his AHL tenure, he was Head Athletic Trainer for the ECHL's Allen Americans from 2014-17, where the Americans served as the Sharks' AA affiliate for his final two years.

A native of Houston, Texas, Garcia earned a Bachelor of Science from the University of Houston and a Master's in Athletic Training from Stephen F. Austin University. He works closely with Sharks Director of High Performance Mike Potenza, who was appointed to that role in June 2024.

## SAN JOSE BARRACUDA BIOS

**EMI TAKAHASHI****Assistant Athletic Trainer, Manager of Player Rehabilitation**

The 2025-26 campaign will be Emi Takahashi's fourth as the Barracuda's Assistant Athletic Trainer. She rejoined the team in 2022-23 after serving as an intern with the club during the 2016-17 season, the most successful year in franchise history.

From 2019 to 2022, Takahashi worked at Dartmouth College, where she supported women's ice hockey, lightweight rowing, and both men's and women's squash. She has also worked with USA Hockey (U18 Women's National Team, U18 Select Camp), Washington State University, the Portland Winterhawks (WHL), the University of Washington Medical School, and the Japan Paralympic Wheelchair Basketball Team.

A native of Osaka, Japan, Takahashi earned a bachelor's degree in physical education, a master's degree in athletic training from Texas Tech, and a doctorate in athletic training from the University of Idaho.

**MATT DURAN****Strength and Conditioning Coach**

The 2025-26 season will be Matt Duran's first as the Barracuda's full-time Head Performance Coach after serving in the role on an interim basis last year. He had previously been the team's Assistant Strength and Conditioning Coach since 2022.

Prior to his time in the Sharks organization, Duran's professional experience includes serving as an Intern Strength and Conditioning Coach at Stanford University (2023) and as Director of Strength and Conditioning for the San Jose Jr. Sharks from 2018-22.

A graduate of San Jose State University in 2020, Duran is also a Jr. Sharks alumnus.

**NICK NOLLENBERGER****Sr. Broadcast & Public Relations Manager**

2025-26 marks Nick Nollenberger's 10th season as the Senior Broadcast & Public Relations Manager for the Sharks' top affiliate. During his tenure, he has called more than 600 AHL games. On November 11, 2023, in Anaheim, he made his NHL regular-season debut on the radio, filling in for longtime Sharks broadcaster Dan Rusanowsky, who was inducted into the Hockey Hall of Fame that weekend.

In addition to his duties with the Barracuda, Nollenberger serves as a television analyst for select Sharks broadcasts on NBC Sports California and was the rinkside reporter for the 2024 AHL All-Star Classic on NHL Network. He also handles play-by-play for all Barracuda telecasts on NBCSCA.

A San Jose Jr. Sharks alum, Nollenberger previously worked as Director of Broadcast and Media Relations for the Odessa Jackalopes (NAHL) and as Assistant Director of Broadcast and Media Relations for the Kannapolis Intimidators, the Class A affiliate of the Chicago White Sox.

The Santa Cruz, California native graduated from the University of Arizona in 2014 with a degree in Broadcast Journalism. While in Tucson, he served as the radio voice of the Wildcats' hockey team for parts of three seasons and also called games for Arizona basketball, football, and baseball.

Beyond his work with the Barracuda, Nollenberger has called multiple NHL preseason games for the Sharks and has broadcast various sports on Pac-12 Network, NBC Sports Bay Area, and the Mountain West Network.

## TECH CU ARENA



Tech CU Arena opened in August of 2022 and is the crown jewel of a 200,000 square foot expansion of the Sharks Ice at San Jose public skating facility.

Tech CU Arena has a capacity of 4,200 and included training facilities and executive office space for the Barracuda, an in-arena video board and LED display, 12 premium suites, eight loge boxes, one theatre suite, a 46-person party deck, three bar locations including one at ice level, seven food concession stations, a press room and press box and two team merchandise stores.

In January 2020, the San Jose City Council unanimously approved the 200,000 square-foot expansion of Sharks Ice at San Jose, adding two additional recreational ice sheets to the facility, increasing the building's total ice sheets to six and doubling the facility's footprint to just under 400,000 square feet.

The Barracuda played its first seven season in San Jose at the SAP Center at San Jose.

## 2024-25 IN REVIEW



The 2024-25 season saw the Barracuda reach heights they had only experienced once before in their 10-year history. The club returned to the playoffs for the first time since 2021—when only the Pacific Division held a postseason due to COVID—and it marked their first appearance in the Calder Cup Playoffs since 2019. Their 2-0 opening-round sweep of the Ontario Reign was not only the team's first playoff series win since 2017, but also their first playoff sweep ever.

The Barracuda's 81 points and .563 winning percentage were the third-best in franchise history, and their best since 2018-19. The team's 21 home wins and .639 home winning percentage were also their best since 2019.

The success wasn't limited to the ice. The team set a franchise record with 10 sellouts at Tech CU Arena during the 2024-25 season.

Eighteen different players split time between the Sharks and Barracuda, including top prospects **Yaroslav Askarov** (G), **Collin Graf** (F), and **Luca Cagnoni** (D). The Barracuda used 45 players throughout the season, including five goalies, 14 defensemen, and 26 forwards.

Prospects **Quentin Musty** and **Igor Chernyshov** made their AHL debuts late in the season, each appearing in one Calder Cup Playoff game.

The Barracuda finished the regular season with the AHL's third-best offense, averaging 3.39 goals per game. Their 244 total goals were the most in a single season in team history. They also led the AHL in power-play percentage (24%), setting a franchise record with 69 power-play goals. **Danil Gushchin** led the league with 14 power-play goals, while **Andrew Poturalski** finished second with 13. Rookie **Luca Cagnoni** led the league in power-play points (34) and ranked second in power-play assists (23). The team also scored 10 shorthanded goals—their most since 2021-22 and the second-most in team history. From March 2 to March 26, the Barracuda scored power-play goals in a franchise-record 10 consecutive games and in 13 of 14 overall.

Fourteen different skaters reached double-digit goals—another franchise record—including Poturalski (30) and Gushchin (28), who now rank first and second for most goals in a single season by a Barracuda player.

### Player Highlights

**Hot Pot:** In his first season with the Barracuda, veteran forward Andrew Poturalski put together the best statistical campaign in franchise history. He was named the AHL's 2024-25 Les Cunningham Award winner as league MVP. Poturalski became just the third player in AHL history to lead the league in scoring three separate times, joining Hall of Famers Bill Sweeney (1960-63) and Peter White (1994-98). He previously led the league in 2020-21 and 2021-22. This season, he recorded a league-best 73 points (30 goals, 43 assists) in just 59 games. He also appeared in three NHL games with the Sharks, recording one assist. His 30 goals and 72 points are both single-season franchise records. He missed the final nine regular season games and the entire playoffs due to a lower-body injury.

**Do the Cagn Cagn:** Twenty-year-old defenseman Luca Cagnoni finished just three points shy of the AHL's defenseman scoring title, tallying 52 points in 64 games. The rookie led all skaters in power-play points (34), ranked second in power-play assists (23), and tied for fourth in power-play goals (11). Among defensemen, he ranked third in both points and goals (16), and tied for fifth in assists (36). He was named to the AHL's All-Rookie Team and set franchise records for goals and power-play goals by a defenseman. Cagnoni also played six games with the Sharks, recording two assists.

**Dan the Man:** The 2024-25 season was a breakout year for third-year pro Danil Gushchin, who posted career highs in goals (28), power-play goals (14), shots (218), and shooting percentage. From March 7 to 28, he recorded points in nine straight games—the second-longest streak in team history—and scored in five straight games (March 16-26), tying John McCarthy's franchise record. Gushchin is now the Barracuda's all-time leader in points (150), goals (70), and assists (80). He missed the first round of the playoffs due to illness but made his Calder Cup debut on May 2, scoring an overtime winner against Colorado on May 4—the team's only second-round victory.

**El Cap:** In his first season under contract with the Sharks, Jimmy Schuldt wore the "C" for the first time in his six-year pro career and made an immediate impact. He played eight NHL games and led the Barracuda in plus-minus (+22), ranking top-10 league-wide. Schuldt was named the team's Most Inspirational Player.

**White Balance:** Despite missing the final playoff game due to injury, Colin White led the team in postseason points (6), assists (5), and plus-minus (+3). After signing a two-way deal in January, he played three NHL games. He set AHL career highs in games played (48) and goals (12), and took over the top-line center role late in the season.

**Fil the Thrill:** In his first North American season, Filip Bystedt (Sharks 2022 first-rounder) posted 31 points (12 goals, 19 assists) in 50 games. He co-led the team in playoff goals (3) and led in power-play tallies.

**Sabs Sizzling:** Veteran Scott Sabourin scored 10+ goals (10) for a third straight year and hit 25 points for the fourth time in his career. He appeared in his 500th AHL game on Jan. 31 and skated in one NHL game. Sabourin recorded 111 PIMs and dropped the gloves seven times.



## 2024-25 IN REVIEW

**Full Deck:** Second-year forward Ethan Cardwell set career highs in points (48), assists (37), and shots (195). He made his NHL debut on Oct. 31 and scored his first NHL goal five days later.

**Bar Graf:** Rookie Collin Graf split time between the Sharks and Barracuda, posting 11 points in 33 NHL games and 35 points (8G, 27A) in 40 AHL games. He added five points (2G, 3A) in six playoff games, including a series-clinching goal vs. Ontario.

**Riled Regenda:** After being acquired from Anaheim in January, Pavol Regenda recorded 25 points in 36 games with the Barracuda, including seven power-play goals. He co-led the team in playoff goals (3).

**Yes Yaro:** Top goalie prospect Yaroslav Askarov had a strong first year in Teal, going 11-9-2 with a 2.45 GAA, .923 SV%, and four shutouts. He went 3-2 in the playoffs with a 1.68 GAA and .935 SV%, including one shutout. Askarov played 13 NHL games and became the first Barracuda goalie to record shutouts in his first two starts.

**Gabe Going:** Rookie Gabe Carriere impressed in 22 games with the Barracuda and was signed to an NHL deal on Mar. 7—the same night he posted a 35-save shutout. He also went 14-9-2 in 22 ECHL games with Wichita, earning three shutouts and a .922 SV%.

**Unsung Heroes:** Depth forwards Lucas Vanroboys, Anthony Vincent, and Donovan Houle combined for 31 goals and 59 points, almost exclusively at even strength or shorthanded. Vincent earned the team's Hard Hat Award for the second straight season, setting career highs in nearly every statistical category.

**Bords Boiling:** Third-year pro Thomas Bordeleau set career highs in assists (24) and PIMs (39), and matched his career high in game-winning goals (4). He skated in one NHL game on April 13 but suffered an upper-body injury that kept him out of the playoffs.
