## GAME NOTES

### THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Tonight is the second of three games the Stars will play against the Avalanche this season and the first of two times the teams are facing off in Colorado this year.
- Tonight's game against the Avalanche and tomorrow's game against the Red Wings is the fifth of 11 back-to-back sets that the Stars will play this season.
  - The Stars also played a back-to-back set last weekend, defeating the Montreal Canadiens 2-1 on Saturday, Jan. 11 and falling to the Ottawa Senators 3-2 on Jan. 12.
- **Wyatt Jonston** has 15 points (4-11-15) in his last 15 games played dating back to Dec. 16 against the Washington Capitals. He is now pacing to finish the year with 41 assists, which would be a career high for the forward.
- **Matt Duchene** has eight points (3-5-8) in his last eight games played dating back to Jan. 2 against the Ottawa Senators.
- **Thomas Harley** enters tonight's matchup against the Canadiens with a plus-25 on-ice, even-strength goal differential this season, which was the third-best mark in the NHL this year entering play Friday. Only Leon Draisaitl (29), and Kirill Marchenko (29) ranked higher.
  - In all this season, **Harley** has a plus-22 plus/minus rating, which was the seventh-best mark among all NHL skaters and second among defensemen entering play Friday.
- **Miro Heiskanen** is averaging 25:22 of ice time per game this season, which was the fourth-most in the NHL this year entering play Friday.
- Entering play Friday, the Stars and the Washington Capitals were the only NHL teams this season that have not lost more than two consecutive games.
- The Stars have allowed only 2.45 goals against per game this season, which was the third-best mark in the NHL entering play Friday. Dallas has allowed two or fewer goals in 25 of the 44 games that they have played this year.

## BACK TO DECEMBER

- Since Dec. 23, the Stars have posted an 9-2-1 record for 19 points and an .792 points percentage. During that span, no team had more points than Dallas, and their win total was tied with Columbus for the most in the league entering play Friday.
  - Dallas' .792 points percentage trails only Columbus (.818) for the best mark in the NHL since Dec. 23 entering play Friday.
- During that span, the Stars have outscored their opponents 38-25. Their plus-13 goal differential was tied with Winnipeg for the second-best mark in the NHL entering play Friday, and their 38 goals for were tied for fourth.
- Twenty-eight of the Dallas' 38 goals since Dec. 23 have been scored at 5-on-5, which ranked second in the NHL entering play Friday, trailing only St. Louis (33).
- The team's 25 goals against were also tied for the sixth-fewest allowed since Dec. 23 entering play Friday.
- The Stars have gone 361-for-686 at the faceoff dot since Dec. 23 for a 52.6 percent success rate, which was the fifth-best mark in the league during that span entering play Friday.
- **Jason Robertson** is the team's leading scorer since Dec. 23, totaling 15 points (5-10-15) in 12 games played. His 15 points were tied for the sixth-most in the NHL since Dec. 23 entering play Friday.
- Thirteen different Stars skaters have scored at least one goal since Dec. 13: **Jamie Benn** (6), **Roope Hintz** (5), **Jason Robertson** (5), **Evgenii Dadonov** (4), **Matt Duchene** (4), **Wyatt Johnston** (4), **Mavrik Bourque** (2), **Thomas Harley** (2), **Logan Stankoven** (2), **Oskar Bäck** (1), **Colin Blackwell** (1), **Miro Heiskanen** (1) and **Esa Lindell** (1).
  - **Benn's** six goals since Dec. 23 were tied for the 12th-most in the NHL entering play Friday.
- Entering play Friday, the Stars and the Blues were the only teams in the NHL to have six different skaters score at least four goals since Dec. 23.

## SNOWPLOWS

- Dallas is 69-67-21 all-time vs. Colorado, including a 26-44-8 mark on the road.
- **Jamie Benn** has six points (2-4-6) in his last five games against the Avalanche.
- **Matt Duchene** has 18 points (12-6-18) in 17 career games against Colorado. He enters tonight's game having six points (1-5-6) in his last five games against the Avalanche. **Duchene** was a member of the Avalanche from 2009-10 until 2017-18, totaling 428 points (178-250-428) in 586 games.
- **Jason Robertson** has 13 points (5-8-13) in 12 career games against Colorado. Robertson also has totaled six points (1-5-6) in five career games played at Ball Arena, earning at least one point in all but one of those contests.
- **Wyatt Johnston** has six points (2-4-6) in nine career games against the Avalanche. He enters tonight's contest riding a three-game point streak vs. Colorado, registering five points (1-4-5) during that span.
- **Logan Stankoven** has recorded a point (1-1-2) in each of the two career games he has played against Colorado.
- **Casey DeSmith** is 2-0-1 in his career against the Avalanche, posting a .934 save percentage and a 2.61 goals-against average in those games.

## ROBO ON THE GOGO

- **Jason Robertson** enters tonight's matchup having totaled 24 points (7-17-24) in his last 22 games played dating back to Dec. 1 against the Winnipeg Jets. His 24 points during that span are the most of any Stars skater.
  - **Robertson** has multi-point efforts in five of the last nine games that he has played.
- **Robertson** scored the deciding goal in the shootout in Dallas' Jan. 11 game, a 2-1 victory over the Montréal Canadiens.
  - In his career, **Robertson** has gone 16-for-28 in shootout attempts. His 57.1 career percent success rate in the shootout is tied for the sixth-best mark among all active NHL skaters that have at least five shootout attempts.
- **Robertson** recorded two assists in Dallas' game on Jan. 2 against the Ottawa Senators for his 100th career multi-point game, becoming the 15th player in Stars/North Stars history to record 100 multi-point games according to NHL Stats. Only four players in franchise history have posted 100 multi-point games before age 26: Brian Bellows (151 GP), Mike Modano (126 GP), Bobby Smith (123 GP) and Dino Ciccarelli (101 GP).
- **Robertson** tallied three points (1-2-3) in Dallas' game on Dec. 31 against the Sabres to take sole possession of 21st on the franchise's all-time scoring list, passing Joe Nieuwendyk and Al MacAdam. **Robertson** has 344 career points (142-202-344) in 329 regular-season games.
  - He now sits seven points shy of tying Danny Grant for 20th.
- **Robertson's** second assist against the Sabres was the 200th of his career, making him the 27th player in Stars franchise history at the seventh player from the 2017 draft class to total 200 NHL assists.
- Additionally, **Robertson** - who turned 25 on July 21 - became the third player in Stars team history to register 200 career assists at age 25 or younger (all assists w/ DAL) according to NHL Stats.

## DADDY ISSUES

- **Evgenii Dadonov** has 11 points (4-7-11) in his last 11 games played dating back to Dec. 27 against the Minnesota Wild.
- During that span, the Stars have outscored their opponents 11-5 when **Dadonov** has been on the ice during 5-on-5 play according to Natural Stat Trick.
  - Only **Jamie Benn** (12), **Matt Duchene** (12), **Thomas Harley** (12) and **Wyatt Johnston** (12) have been on the ice for more 5-on-5 goals since Dec. 27 than **Dadonov** according to Natural Stat Trick.

- **Dadonov's** goal on Jan. 12 against the Senators was his 12th of the season, matching his total that he reached in 51 games last season. He is now pacing to finish the year with 22 goals, which would be his highest total since he scored 25 for the Florida Panthers in 2019-20.
- **Dadonov's** goal against Ottawa was also his fourth power-play goal of the year, which is tied with **Matt Duchene** and **Roope Hintz** for the team lead.

### THE KIDS ARE ALRIGHT

- **Logan Stankoven** tallied three points (2-1-3) in Dallas' Jan. 14 game against Toronto, a 4-1 win over the Maple Leafs.
- **Stankoven's** performance against the Leafs was his second three-point game of the season after tallying three assists in the season opener on Oct. 10 at Nashville. Entering play Friday, **Stankoven** was one of three rookies this season to have multiple three-point games, joining San Jose's Macklin Celebrini and Montreal's Lane Hutson.
- **Stankoven** now has 23 points (6-17-23) on the season, which ranks fourth among rookies in scoring this season and puts him on pace to finish the year with 44 points.
  - If that pace holds, it would make **Stankoven** the highest-scoring Stars rookie since **Jason Robertson** had 45 points (17-28-45) in 2020-21.
- **Mavrik Bourque** has tallied a point in four of the last six games that he has played dating back to Jan. 7 against the New York Rangers, scoring two goals and adding three assists during that stretch. This includes scoring the game-winning goal in Dallas' Jan. 14 game against the Maple Leafs.
- Since Jan. 7, **Bourque** has logged a 55.2 percent on-ice Corsi rating according to Natural Stat Trick, which is tied for third among Stars skaters to play in all of the team's six games during that span, trailing only **Miro Heiskanen** (60.2 percent) and **Stankoven** (58.3 percent).
- **Oskar Bäck** has gone 59-for-105 at the faceoff dot this season for a 56.2 percent success rate, which topped all rookies to have played in at least 15 games this season entering play Friday.
- **Bäck** has also totaled 51:46 of shorthanded ice time this season, which ranked second among all NHL rookies this season entering play Friday, trailing only Minnesota's Marat Khusnutdinov (61:49).

### KILLING IT

- The Stars have had an 85.6 percent success rate on the penalty kill this season, which was the best mark in the NHL entering play Friday.
- Dallas has allowed only 17 power-play goals against and .39 power-play goals against per game played this year, which were both the top marks in the NHL entering play Friday.
- **Thomas Harley** has allowed 2.48 power-play goals against per 60, which was the sixth-best mark in the NHL entering play Friday among NHL skaters that have at least 50 minutes of shorthanded ice time this season.
- **Esa Lindell** has skated 152:57 minutes on the penalty kill this season, which was the most of any NHL skater this season entering play Friday.
  - Since 2016-17 - his first full NHL season - no skater has spent more time on the penalty kill than **Lindell**, who has totaled 1933:42 of shorthanded ice time during that span.

### IRON SHARPENS IRON

- The Stars have four skaters that have played in at least 200 consecutive games: **Jamie Benn** (341), **Jason Robertson** (254), **Esa Lindell** (214) and **Wyatt Johnston** (208). Entering play Friday, Dallas was the only team in the NHL to have four players riding Iron Man streaks of at least 200 games.
- Dallas' last game on Jan. 16 against the Canadiens was the 341st consecutive game that **Benn** played in, which is the fifth-longest active Iron Man streak in the NHL. He is one of seven players to have an Iron Man streak of at least 300 games.
- **Robertson's** 254-game Iron Man streak is the 13th-longest in the NHL. The Stars and the Detroit Red Wings were the only teams to have two players ranked in the top 15 entering play Friday.
- **Lindell's** 214-game Iron Man streak ranks eighth among all NHL defensemen.
- **Johnston's** Iron Man Streak began when he made his NHL debut on Oct. 13, 2022. He is one of 44 players in NHL history to begin their NHL career by playing in at least 200 consecutive games according to NHL Stats.

### ONE FOR THE HISTORY BOOKS

- **Jake Oettinger's** next shutout will be the 12th of his career, which will tie Jon Casey for the sixth-most in franchise history.
- **Miro Heiskanen** is three assists shy of tying Darian Hatcher (223) for sixth on the franchise's all-time assists list by defensemen.
- **Esa Lindell** enters tonight's contest two assists shy of tying Alex Goligoski (155) for 25th all-time among Stars/North Stars defensemen.
- **Jason Robertson** is one assist shy of tying Loui Eriksson (207) for 25th on the franchise's all-time assists list. He is also six goals shy of becoming the 19th player in franchise history to score 150 goals with the team.

### CONNECT FOUR

- Stars forward **Roope Hintz** (Finland), defensemen **Miro Heiskanen** (Finland) and **Esa Lindell** (Finland), and goaltender **Jake Oettinger** (United States) have all been selected to represent their home country at the 4 Nations Face-Off, which will be held in Montreal and Boston from Feb. 12 to 20, 2025.
- Dallas is one of six NHL teams to have at least one forward, defenseman and goaltender from their roster to be selected for the 4 Nations Face-Off, with the others being Boston, Minnesota, Vancouver, Vegas and Winnipeg.
- Only six teams have had more players selected to a 4 Nations roster than the Stars: Colorado, Florida, Minnesota, Tampa Bay and Vegas. The full breakdown is as follows:

- All four players have previously represented their home countries in international competition.
  - **Heiskanen** has played for Finland at the 2017 and 2018 IIHF World Junior Championships, 2018 and 2022 (gold) IIHF World Championships and at the 2018 Winter Olympic Games.
  - **Lindell** suited up for the Fins at the 2014 IIHF World Junior Championship, where he won a gold medal. He again represented Finland at the 2015, 2016 (silver) and 2022 (gold) IIHF World Championships and at the 2016 World Cup of Hockey.
  - **Hintz** previously played for Finland at the 2015 and 2016 IIHF World Junior Championships, winning a gold medal at the later tournament.
  - **Oettinger** has played for Team USA at the 2017 and 2018 IIHF World Junior Championships and at the 2021 IIHF World Championship. He medaled in all three tournaments, winning bronze in 2018 and 2021 and gold in 2017.
- The 4 Nations Face-Off will mark the first time that all three of **Heiskanen**, **Hintz** and **Lindell** are playing for Finland together.
  - **Heiskanen** and **Lindell** previously won a gold medal together at the 2022 IIHF World Championship.
- The Stars will also be well-represented among the 4 Nations staff, with **Jim Nill** (Associate GM), **Pete DeBoer** (Assistant Coach) and **Misha Donskov** (Assistant Coach) all set to join Canada's staff for the tournament. Additionally, former Star **Jere Lehtinen** will serve as Finland's General Manager.

## CONNECTIONS

- Stars forward **Matt Duchene** was drafted by Colorado with the third pick in the 2009 NHL Draft, he played for Colorado from 2009-10 to 2017-18.
- Avalanche forward Joel Kiviranta played for the Dallas Stars from 2019-20 until the 2022-23 season.
- Avalanche forward Valeri Nichushkin played for the Dallas Stars from 2013-14 to 2015-16 then returned to Dallas for the 2018-19 season.
- Stars defenseman **Matt Dumba** and Avalanche forward Ross Colton both played for Tampa Bay during the 2023-24 season.
- Stars forward **Evgenii Dadonov** and Avalanche forward Jonathan Drouin played part of the 2022-23 season together with the Montréal Canadiens.
- Stars forward **Evgenii Dadonov** and Avalanche forward Parker Kelly played one game together as members of the Ottawa Senators during the 2020-21 season.
- Stars defenseman **Ilya Lyubushkin** and Avalanche forward Casey Mittelstadt were teammates in Buffalo during the 2022-23 season.
- Stars defenseman **Brendan Smith** and Avalanche forward Miles Wood skated together for the New Jersey Devils during the 2022-23 season.
- Stars defenseman **Matt Dumba** and Avalanche defenseman Calvin de Haan played together in Tampa Bay during the 2023-24 season.
- Stars forward **Sam Steel** and Avalanche defenseman Josh Manson both played for the Anaheim Ducks from 2018-19 to the 2021-22 season.
- Stars defenseman **Brendan Smith** and Avalanche goaltender Alexander Georgiev were members of the New York Rangers from 2016-17 to 2020-21. Stars forward **Colin Blackwell** also played for the Rangers in 2020-21 and defenseman **Nils Lundkvist** was a Ranger during the 2021-22 season while Georgiev was with the Rangers.
- Stars goaltending coach **Jeff Reese** and Avalanche assistant coach Nolan Pratt worked together and won a Stanley Cup in 2004 with the Tampa Bay Lightning when Pratt played for Tampa Bay in 2001-02 to 2003-04 and came back from 2005-06 and 2006-07.
- Avalanche skills coach Toby Petersen played for the Dallas Stars from 2007-08 to 2012-13. He also spent time as the Texas Stars (AHL) in 2012-13 and 2013-14 as the team's assistant captain.
