## STREAKIN' VS. CBJ

Pittsburgh enters tonight's game with 15-consecutive wins against the Columbus Blue Jackets at PPG Paints Arena dating back to December 21, 2015.

- Pittsburgh's 15-game home winning streak against Columbus is the longest active home winning streak against one team in the NHL:

- During Pittsburgh's 15-game home winning streak against Columbus, they have outscored them 61-30. In 15 games, the Penguins have scored three-plus goals in all but one game and four-plus goals in 11 games.
- Pittsburgh's current 15-game home winning streak is its second-longest home winning streak against one team in franchise history:

## HOW SWEDE IT IS

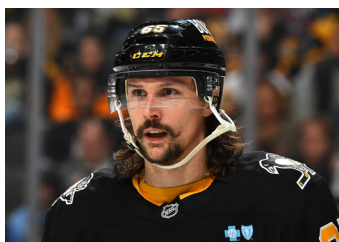
Erik Karlsson recorded a dazzling assist and scored the game-tying goal to earn the Penguins one point on Sunday in Carolina.

- Sunday marked Karlsson's sixth multi-point game of the season and 205th of his career. He ranks 13th in NHL history among defensemen in multi-point games and first among active blueliners:

- Karlsson has recorded 16 points (2G-14A) over his last 18 games dating back to November 27. In that span, the Penguins have earned points in 13 of their 18 games (10-5-3) and his 16 points rank fifth among all NHL defensemen.

## KING OF THE DOT

Sidney Crosby enters tonight's game just three face-off wins away from tying Patrice Bergeron for the most face-off wins in NHL history.

- Entering tonight's game, Crosby has 15,179 career face-off wins, while Bergeron won 15,182 face-offs in his career:

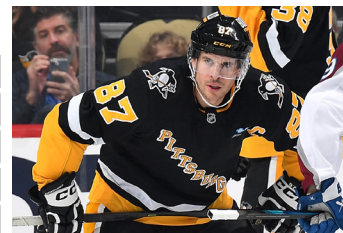


- This season, Crosby has the second-most face-off wins with 531 entering tonight's game:

## POWERED UP

The Penguins' power play has been clicking as of late, scoring on the man advantage in five of the last six games dating back to December 23, going 9-for-22 (40.9%).

- Stretching back further, the Penguins have 17 power-play goals over their last 16 games dating back to November 30. In that span, the Penguins' 32.7 power-play percentage and 17 goals lead the league:

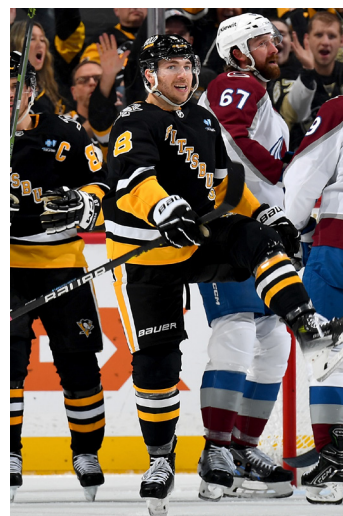
