- The Stars defeated the Blues 6-3 to sweep their season series 3-0. Dallas became the fifth team this season to score at least five goals in four consecutive home games.
- The Stars went a perfect 4-for-4 on the power play. It is the first time that they have scored four power-play goals in a game since Nov. 12, 2023.
- Mikael Granlund (0-1—1) factored on the game-opening goal and has now collected 0-7—7 through his first nine games with the Stars. He is the first player to have seven or more assists through their first nine games with the franchise since Jason Spezza (2-10—12 in 2014-15).
- Matt Duchene (1-1—2) scored his 50th career goal with the Stars since joining the club in in 2023-24 (50-76—126 in 140 GP).
- Wyatt Johnston (3-0-3) became the third player in Stars/North Stars history with 75 career goals before turning 22.

GAME NOTES

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Tonight is the final of two games the Stars will play against the Devils this season. Dallas won their previous meeting against New Jersey, defeating them 4-2 on Feb. 22.
- A win tonight would give the Stars their sixth season sweep of the season. They have previously won each game of their season series against Boston (2-0-0), NY Islanders (2-0-0), San Jose (3-0-0), St. Louis (3-0-0) and Utah (3-0-0).
- The Stars enter tonight's game with a 39-19-2 record for 80 points and a .667 points percentage. Their point total and points percentage ranked third in the NHL this season and their 39 wins were second entering play Monday.
- Jamie Benn enters tonight's game two goals shy of scoring his 400th career goal. When he reaches the milestone, he will become...
 - o The second player in franchise history to score 400 goals, joining Mike Modano (557). 438 of Modano's 557 goals were scored with the Star after the team relocated to Dallas.
 - o The second player drafted in 2007 to score 400 goals, with the other being Detroit's Patrick Kane (485).
 - o The 10th active skater to score 400 career goals.
- Entering play Monday, the Stars were the only NHL team this season to have not lost more than two consecutive games.

- Entering play Monday, the Stars ranked in the top five in the NHL this season in both goals for per game (3.40, fourth) and goals against per game (2.57, fourth).
 - o Dallas has allowed two or fewer goals in 31 of the 60 games that they have played this year.

DOWN GOES THE DEVILS

- Dallas is 62-44-13 all-time vs. New Jersey, including a 35-16-9 mark at home.
- The Stars have earned points in eight of their last 10 games against the Devils (7-2-1). Dallas has also earned points in nine of their last 11 games played at American Airlines Center vs. New Jersey (6-2-3).
- Matt Duchene has earned eight points (3-5—8) over his last seven games against New Jersey. Duchene ranks first among active Stars in goals (10), assists (16) and points (10-16—26) in 25 career contests vs. New Jersey. Duchene also paces the club in game-winning goals (4) against the Devils.
- **Jamie Benn** has 12 points (3-9—12) in 27 career games against the Devils. **Benn** enters tonight's contest riding a fourgame point streak against New Jersey, earning four points (0-4—4) during that span.
- Roope Hintz has eight points (5-3—8) in 10 career games vs. New Jersey.
- Wyatt Johnston enters tonight's matchup riding a four-game point streak vs. New Jersey. Johnston has earned six points (3-3—6) in five career games against the Devils.
- Thomas Harley has recorded one goal and three assists (1-3-4) in three career games against the Devils.
- Mikael Granlund has tallied 18 points (9-9—18) in 23 career games played against New Jersey.
- Matt Dumba has points in his last two games played against the Devils (1-1—2). In all, Dumba has registered four points (1-3—4) in 14 career games vs. New Jersey.

SEEING STARS

- Roope Hintz was named the NHL's Second Star of the Week for the week ending on March 2 after tallying nine points (2-7—9) in three games played. It is the second time in his career that he has earned Star of the Week honors after previously being named the NHL's Third Star of the Week on April 12, 2021.
- **Hintz** enters tonight's contest having recorded consecutive four-point games, notching four assists on Feb. 28 against the Kings, and then scoring one goal and adding three assists on March 2 against the Blues.
 - o Hintz has now recorded six four-point games in his career.
 - His four assists against the Kings were a single-game career high.
- According to NHL Stats, Hintz is just the second Stars/North Stars player in the past 40 years to post consecutive
 four-point games, following Tyler Seguin (2 GP in 2018-19). No player in franchise history has extended their streak to
 three.
- Roope Hintz' four points in Dallas' last game against St. Louis tied him with Loui Eriksson (357) for 20th-most points in franchise history.
- **Hintz** enters tonight's contest riding a four-game point streak, scoring two goals and adding nine assists during that span. A goal or an assist tonight would give him a point in five consecutive games for the first time since he had a point in six straight from Dec. 18 to 31, 2023.
- If **Hintz** were to have at least two points tonight, it would give him multi-point efforts for three consecutive games for the first time since Nov 1 to 5, 2022.
- Hintz has been playing at a point-per-game pace since Dec. 6, totaling 32 points (14-18—32) in 32 games.

JOHNNY B. GOODE

- Wyatt Johnston scored the third hat trick of his career and his second of the season in Dallas' last game, a 6-3 win over the St. Louis Blues. Johnston tied Steve Payne for the second-most hat tricks in franchise history by a player before turning 22 according to NHL Stats.
- According to NHL Stats, **Johnston's** hat trick also made him the ninth active player to score at least three career hat tricks before his 22nd birthday.
- All three of Johnston's goals came on the power play, making him the second player this season to score three powerplay goals in a game, joining Patrik Laine who did so on Dec. 17 against the Buffalo Sabres.
 - Johnston's performance against the Blues marked the eighth time in franchise history and first since Philippe Boucher on Nov. 24, 2006 – that a Stars/North Stars skater has scored three power-play goals in a single game.
- **Johnston's** first goal of the night was the 75th of his career, making him the third players in franchise history to score 75 career goals before turning 22 according to NHL Stats. The others are Bruan Bellows (133 in 311 games played) and Mike Modano (90 in 235 games played).
- His second goal of the night was his 20th of the season, which made him the third player in franchise history to record three 20-goal seasons before the age of 22 according to NHL Stats, joining Brian Bellows (4) and Mike Modano (3).
- Johnston's hat trick extended his point streak to six games. A goal or an assist tonight would give him points in seven consecutive games for the first time in his career.
 - o His six-game point streak was tied for the sixth-longest active point streak in the NHL entering play Monday.
- Johnston has also recorded a point in each of the last 12 games he has played at the American Airlines Center. He is the third player in franchise history to post a run of that length before age 22, joining Mike Modano (13 GP in 1990-91) and Tom McCarthy (11 GP in 1981-82) according to NHL Stats.

- Johnston's tallied his 34th assist of the season in Dallas' Feb. 25 game against the Columbus Blue Jackets, which set a
 career high for the forward. His assist was also the 84th of his career, which tied Buffalo's Owen Power for the most by
 a player selected in the 2021 NHL Draft.
 - o Johnston's 77 career goals and 161 career points are both the most of any player from the 2021 Draft class.
- **Johnston** now has 55 points (21-34—55) in 60 games this season, which ranks third on the Stars in scoring and makes the 2024-25 season his second-consecutive 50-point season. He's now on pace to finish the year with 75 points, which would be a career high.
- Johnston scored his third shorthanded goal of the season in Dallas' Feb. 22 game against the New Jersey Devils. Entering play Monday, his three shorthanded goals were tied for third in the NHL this year.
- The goal was also the sixth shorthanded tally of his career. Since **Johnston** made his NHL debut, his six shorthanded goals rank second on Dallas' roster (**Roope Hintz**; 7) and are tied for eighth in the NHL.
- Johnston has been playing at a point-per-game pace since Nov. 2, totaling 50 points (20-30—50) in 50 games played.

A TALE OF TWO SEASONS

- Prior to Dec. 1, the Stars had a 14-8-0 record for 28 points and a 0.636 points percentage. Their 0.636 points percentage was the seventh best mark in the NHL during that span.
- Since Dec. 1, the Stars have posted a 25-11-2 record in 38 games for 52 points and a 0.684 points percentage, which is the second-best mark in the league during that span.
- Special teams have also been a point of improvement for the Stars since Dec. 1. Prior to the start of December, the Stars power play was clicking at an 18.6 percent success rate and the team was killing off 81.5 percent of the penalties they took. Since Dec. 1, the Stars have a 25.5 percent and 87.6 percent success rate on the power play and penalty kill, respectively.
- Several Stars skaters have also seen significant spikes in their offensive production:

POWER UP

- The Stars went a perfect 4-for-4 on the power play in their last game on March 2 against the Blues, marking the first time that they have scored four power-play goals in a game since Nov. 12, 2023.
 - o Dallas' game against St. Louis marked one of four instances this year in which a team has scored four powerplay goals in a game. The Ottawa Senators (10/14 vs. LAK), Winnipeg Jets (10/18 vs. SJS) and Florida Panthers (12/5 at PHI) all previously did so.
- Their performance against the Blues also was the first time in Stars team history that the team had a 100 percent success rate on the power play in a single game while scoring at least four power-play goals.
- The Stars have scored at least one power-play goal in five of their last six games played. They have now scored multiple power-play goals in consecutive games for the first time since March 5 to 8, 2024.
- Since Jan. 1, the Stars have gone 23-for-62 on the power play for a 37.1 percent success rate, which ranked second in the NHL during that span entering play Monday.
- The team's 23 power-play goals since Jan. 1 were the second-most in the NHL entering play Monday, trailing only the Detroit Red Wings (26) for the league lead.

• Wyatt Johnston and Jason Robertson have each scored five power-play goals since Jan. 1, which was tied for the third-most in the NHL during that span entering play Monday. Only Detroit's Dylan Larkin (7) and Edmonton's Leon Draisaitl (6) have scored more power-play goals since the turn of the new year.

ROBO ON THE GOGO

- Jason Robertson enters tonight's contest riding a four-game point streak:
 - o He tallied an assist on March 2 against the Blues.
 - He scored a goal and added two assists on Feb. 28 against the Kings.
 - o He notched a goal and an assist on Feb. 25 against the Blue Jackets.
 - o He scored a hat trick on Feb. 23 against the Islanders.
- Robertson's assist against the Blues was his 60th point of the season. 2024-25 is now the third consecutive year in which he has recorded at least 60 points.
- Roberston's goal against the Kings was his 25th of the season, making the 2024-25 season the fourth consecutive season in which he has scored at least 25 goals. Roberston is sixth Dallas player in the past 30 years to record four or more consecutive 25-goal campaigns, joining Jamie Benn (6), Tyler Seguin (6), Mike Modano (5), Joe Pavelski (4) and Loui Eriksson (4).*
- Robertson's hat trick on Feb. 23 was the fourth of his career. Only three players in Stars/North Stars history have as many at age 25 or younger: Dino Ciccarelli (8), Tyler Seguin (7) and Steve Payne (6).*
- All three of Roberston's hat trick goals game in the second period, making him the first Stars skater to score three
 goals in a single period since Jamie Benn did so on April 7, 2018.*
- Robertson's three goals came within a 8:40 span, marking the fastest hat trick by a Stars player since April 7, 2018 when Jamie Benn scored three in 5:17.*
- Robertson's younger brother Nicholas also scored twice for the Maple Leafs on Feb. 23, making the Robertsons the
 first pair of brothers to score multiple goals on the same day since Pavel Bure and Valeri Bure on March 1, 2000.*

BIKER GANG

- Thomas Harley notched two assists in Dallas' last game a 6-3 win over St. Louis on March 2 to give him 12 points (3-9—12) in his last 10 games played dating back to Jan. 31. His 12 points during that span rank fifth on Dallas' roster.
- If Harley were to have at least two points again tonight, it would give him multi-point efforts in three consecutive games for the second time in his career after previously doing to from Jan 23 to 27, 2024.
- A goal or an assist tonight would give **Harley** points in four consecutive games for the first time this season. It would also match his career-long point streak that he has reached on two previous occasions.
- Harley's 12 points since Jan. 31 were tied with Pittsburgh's Erik Karlsson and Buffalo's Rasmus Dahlin for the most among all NHL defensemen during that span entering play Monday. All three players have three goals and nine assists since Jan. 31.
- When Harley had been on the ice during even-strength play this season, the Stars have outscored their opponents 69-39. Entering play Monday, his plus-30 goal differential was tied for the second-best mark in the NHL this year and his 69 on-ice goals for were tied for seventh.
 - Additionally, Harley has logged a plus-28 plus/minus rating this season, which was tied for seventh in the NHL entering play Monday.
- In all, **Harley** has totaled 35 points (10-25—35) in 58 regular-season games this season, which would put him on pace to finish the 2024-25 regular season with a career-high 34 assists and 48 points.
 - His 10 goals this season were tied for the 10th-most among all NHL defensemen this season entering play Monday.
- Since Jan. 31 Dallas' first game without **Miro Heiskanen Harley** has been averaging 25:24 of ice time per game, which tops all Stars skaters and ranked eighth in the NHL entering play Monday.
 - o Harley has logged at least 26 minutes of ice time in five of those 10 games during that span.

HEATING UP

- Matt Duchene enters tonight's game leading the Stars with 62 points (25-37—62) this season. It puts him on pace to finish the year with 34 goals, 51 assists and 85 points. Fifty-one assists would be a career high, and 34 goals and 85 points would both be the second-best marks of his career.
 - o If he were to finish the year with at least 85 points, it would make him the highest-scoring Star since Jason Robertson had 109 points in 2022-23. It would also make him the third Stars skater in the last 10 years to have at least 85 points in a season, joining Robertson and Jamie Benn in 2014-15 (87) and 2015-16 (89).
- Mikael Granlund has been playing at a point-per-game pace since Jan. 20, totaling 15 points (3-12—15) in 15 games, which includes tallying seven assists in nine games since being acquired by the Stars.
 - According to NHL Stats, his seven assists are tied for the fourth-most by a player in his first nine games with the team in franchise history.
- Logan Stankoven enters tonight's game riding a three-game point streak, scoring two goals and adding two assists
 during that span. A goal or an assist tonight would give him points in four consecutive games for the first time in his
 career.

NEW YEAR, NEW ME

- Since Jan. 1, **Jason Robertson**, **Wyatt Johnston** and **Matt Duchene** were all ranked in the top 10 in the NHL in scoring entering play Monday. **Robertson's** 32 points (16-16—32) were tied for fourth, **Johnston** (12-18—30) was tied for fifth and **Duchene** (11-18—29) ranked eighth.
- Entering play Monday, the Stars were the only team to have three players ranked in the top 10 in league scoring since the New Year.
- Robertson's 16 goals ranked third in the NHL since the start of the New Year entering play Monday.
- Thomas Harley has scored six goals since Jan. 1, which was tied for fourth among all NHL defensemen entering play Monday.

GOALIE GANG

- **Jake Oettinger** has an 13-4-1 record in his last 18 games played dating back to Dec. 29, posting a .915 save percentage and a 2.43 goals-against average during that span.
 - o His 13 wins since Dec. 29 were tied for the most in the NHL entering play Monday.
- Oettinger made a season-high 39 saves in Dallas' last game, a 6-3 win over the Blues. The Stars were outshot 42-21 in that game.
- Casey DeSmith has won each of the last four games that he has played dating back to Jan. 25 against the St. Louis
 Blues, posting a .935 save percentage and a 2.01 goals-against average in those contests.
 - o His save percentage was tied for the sixth-best mark in the NHL during that span entering play Monday.
- In all, Oettinger and DeSmith have combined for a .907 save percentage this season, which was tied for the third-best
 mark of any team in the NHL this season entering play Monday. Only Winnipeg (.917) and Tampa Bay (.908) ranked
 higher.
- The duo's 2.55 goals-against average last season ranked fourth in the NHL this year entering play Monday.

KILLING IT

- The Stars have had an 85.2 percent success rate on the penalty kill this season, which was the best mark in the NHL this year entering play Monday.
- No team in the league this season has allowed fewer power-play goals against than the Stars' 24, and their -18 goal
 differential on the penalty kill this year was also tied for the best mark in the NHL entering play Monday.
- If the Stars maintain this pace, it would make the 2024-25 season their best on the penalty kill since 2007-08, when the team finished the season with an 85.6 percent success rate on the penalty kill.
- Since the beginning of February, the Stars have an even goal differential on the penalty kill, allowing two power-play
 goals against and scoring two shorthanded goals. During that span, the Stars and the Canucks were the only teams in
 the NHL that has an even differential on the penalty kill entering play Monday.
- The Stars are also one of the least-penalized teams in the league, ranking 28th in the league in both total penalty minutes (406) and penalty minutes per game (6:46) entering play Monday.
- Entering play Monday, Esa Lindell was leading all NHL skaters in both total shorthanded ice time (210:44) and shorthanded ice time per game (3:31) this season.
- Among players that have played at least 100 minutes on the penalty kill this season, Thomas Harley and Sam Steel
 both ranked in the top five in the NHL in power-play goals against entering play Monday.
 - o Harley, who has played 103:55 of shorthanded ice time, ranked second with 3.46.
 - o **Steel** ranked third with 3.76. He has totaled 111:43 of shorthanded ice time and is averaging 1:56 of shorthanded ice time per game, both of which top all Dallas forwards this season.

DALLAS MAVRIK

- Stars rookie Mavrik Bourque has recorded a point in seven of the last eight games that he has played dating back to Feb.2, which includes a career-best six game point streak from Feb. 2 to 25.
- Bourque's point streak was the longest by a Stars rookie since Jason Robertson had a point in nine straight games from April 14 to 27, 2021.
- Bourque tallied an assist in Dallas' last game, which was his 20th point of the season. Bourque (20) and Logan Stankoven (29) are the first set of Stars rookies to have at least 20 points the same year since Miro Heiskanen (33) and Roope Hintz (22) did so in 2018-19.
 - o Dallas rookies have combined to score 70 points this season, which was tied for the second-most in the NHL entering play Monday, trailing only the San Jose Sharks (95).
- Since Jan. 1, **Bourque** has scored seven goals including the Stars fourth of the game in their game on Feb. 25 against the Columbus Blue Jackets. His seven goals during that span were tied for the second-most among all NHL rookies entering play Monday, trailing only Detroit's Marco Kasper (8).
 - o **Bourque's** seven goals since Jan. 1 are tied for fifth on Dallas' roster.
- In all, **Bourque** has totaled 13 points (6-7—13) since Jan. 1, which is six points better than the seven he had from the start of the regular season through Dec. 31. His 13 points since Jan. 1 were tied for sixth among all NHL rookies entering play Monday.
- Since Jan. 1, the Stars have outscored their opponents 12-9 when **Bourque** has been on the ice during even-strength play.

BACK TO DECEMBER

- Since Dec. 23, the Stars have posted an 20-6-2 record for 42 points and a .750 points percentage. Dallas' win and point total were both the best marks in the league during that span entering play Monday, and their points percentage were tied for first (Winnipeg; .750).
- During that span, the Stars have outscored their opponents 103-71. No team had scored more goals than the Stars since
 Dec. 23 entering play Monday. Their 3.68 goals per game during that span also ranked first in the NHL.
- The team's plus-32 goal differential was the best mark in the league since Dec. 23 entering play Monday, surpassing the Winnipeg Jets (plus-30).
- Sixty-nine of Dallas' 103 goals since Dec. 23 have been scored at 5-on-5, which was the best mark in the NHL during that span entering play Monday.
- Jason Robertson is the team's leading scorer since Dec. 23, totaling 38 points (18-20—38) in 28 games played. His 38 points during that span were tied for second in the NHL entering play Monday, trailing only Boston's David Patrnak (40) and Edmonton's Leon Draisaitl (38).
 - His 18 goals during that span were the third-most in the NHL entering play Monday.

IRON SHARPENS IRON

- The Stars have four skaters that have played in at least 200 consecutive games: Jamie Benn (357), Jason Robertson (270), Esa Lindell (230) and Wyatt Johnston (224). Entering play Monday, Dallas was the only team in the NHL to have four players riding Iron Man streaks of at least 200 games.
- Dallas' last game on March 2 against the Blues was the 357th consecutive game that Benn played in, which is the fifthlongest active Iron Man streak in the NHL.
- Robertson's 270-game Iron Man streak is the 12th-longest in the NHL. The Stars and the Detroit Red Wings were the only teams to have two players ranked in the top 15 entering play Monday.
- Lindell's 230-game Iron Man streak ranks eighth among all NHL defensemen.
- **Johnston's** Iron Man Streak began when he made his NHL debut on Oct. 13, 2022. He is one of 44 players in NHL history to begin their NHL career by playing in at least 200 consecutive games according to NHL Stats.

ONE FOR THE HISTORY BOOKS

- Jake Oettinger's next shutout will be the 12th of his career, which will tie Jon Casey for the sixth-most in franchise
 history.
- Thomas Harley is nine assists shy of tying Gary Sargen (71) for 25th-most by a defenseman in franchise history.
- Roope Hintz is five goals shy of tying Danny Grant (176) for 15th-most goals in franchise history.
- Esa Lindell is seven assists shy of tying Stephane Robidas (165) for 10th-most assists by a defenseman in franchise history.

CONNECT FOUR

- Five Stars players represented their home country at the recently completed 4 Nations Face-Off: Mikael Granlund
 (Finland), Thomas Harley (Canada), Roope Hintz (Finland), Esa Lindell (Finland) and Jake Oettinger (United States).
 Dallas defenseman Miro Heiskanen was originally selected to Finland's roster but had to withdraw from the tournament due to injury.
- The Stars were also well-represented among the 4 Nations staff, with Jim Nill (Associate GM), Pete DeBoer (Assistant Coach) and Misha Donskov (Assistant Coach) all joining Canada's staff for the tournament. Additionally, former Star Jere Lehtinen served as Finland's General Manager.
- Harley, Nill, DeBoer and Donskov won the 4 Nations Face-Off Championship after Canada defeated the United States 3-2 in overtime on Feb. 20.
- Harley, who was originally added to Canada's roster as an injury replacement, appeared in two games for his home country, both against the United States. He tallied one assist and averaged 20:07 of ice time per game.
- When Harley was on the ice during 5-on-5 play in the two games he played, the Canadians outshot the Americans 17-11. His plus-6 on-ice shot differential was the best mark of any Canadian defenseman in those two games.
- Granlund finished the tournament with four points (3-1—4) in three games for the Finns. His three goals were tied for the second-most among all skaters and his four points tied for fourth.
- Lindell and Hintz each appeared in three games for Finland, with Lindell scoring one goal.
- The 4 Nations Face-Off marked the first time that Granlund, Hintz and Lindell played for Finland together. Granlund
 and Lindell had previously represented Finland together three times: at the 2016 and 2022 IIHF World Championships
 and at the 2016 World Cup of Hockey.
- Oettinger started one game for the Americans, stopping 21 of the 23 shots he faced for a .913 save percentage and a 2.06 goals-against average.
