GAME NOTES

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Tonight is the final of three games the Stars will play against the Kings this season and the only time the teams are facing off in Dallas this year.
- The Stars enter tonight's game with a 37-19-2 record for 76 points and a .655 points percentage. Their win total, point total and points percentage all ranked third in the NHL this season entering play Thursday.
 - Entering play Thursday, six of the top eight ranked teams in points percentage in the NHL this season were in the Western Conference: Winnipeg (.737), Dallas, Vegas (.638), Los Angeles (.625), Edmonton (.621) and Minnesota (.621). The Washington Capitals (.737) topped both the NHL and the Eastern Conference, and the Toronto Maple Leafs (.638) ranked fifth.
- Jamie Benn enters tonight's game two goals shy of scoring his 400th career goal. When he reaches the milestone, he
 will become...
 - The second player in franchise history to score 400 goals, joining Mike Modano (557). 438 of Modano's 557 goals were scored with the Star after the team relocated to Dallas.
 - The second player drafted in 2007 to score 400 goals, with the other being Detroit's Patrick Kane (485).
 - o The 10th active skater to score 400 career goals.
- Matt Duchene enters tonight's game leading the Stars with 59 points (23-36—59) this season. It puts him on pace to finish the year with 33 goals, 51 assists and 84 points. Fifty-one assists would be a career high, and 33 goals and 84 points would both be the second-best marks of his career.
 - o If he were to finish the year with at least 84 points, it would make him the highest-scoring Star since **Jason Robertson** had 109 points in 2022-23. It would also make him the third Stars skater in the last 10 years to have at least 84 points in a season, joining **Robertson** and **Jamie Benn** in 2014-15 (87) and 2015-16 (89).
- Entering play Thursday, the Stars and the Washington Capitals were the only NHL teams this season that have not lost more than two consecutive games.

• The Stars have allowed only 2.57 goals against per game this season, which was the fifth-best mark in the NHL entering play Thursday. Dallas has allowed two or fewer goals in 30 of the 58 games that they have played this year.

DETHRONING THE KINGS

- Dallas is 124-81-44 all-time vs. Los Angeles, including a 73-35-16 mark on home ice.
- The Stars have earned points in 10 of their last 13 contests against the Kings (9-3-1). Dallas has also recorded wins in their last five games played at American Airlines Center (5-0-0).
- Jamie Benn enters tonight's contest riding a three-game point streak (1-2—3) vs. Los Angeles. In all, Benn has registered 40 points (17-23—40) in 51 career games against the Kings.
- Evgenii Dadonov has five points (2-3—5) in his last five games against Los Angeles, dating back to March 19, 2022. In all, Dadonov has totaled 12 points (5-7—12) in 14 career games vs. the Kings.
- Roope Hintz has 10 points (4-6—10) in 13 career games against the Kings.
- Thomas Harley scored in Dallas' last game against the Kings on Feb. 7 and brought his career total vs. Los Angeles to four points (2-2—4) in six games.
- Wyatt Johnston enters tonight's game having tallied six points (4-2-6) in eight career games vs. Los Angeles.
- Jason Robertson has 13 points (5-8—13) in 10 career games against the Kings. He has recorded a point in all but two of the games he has played against Los Angeles.
 - Robertson's 1.30 points per game against the Kings is the second-best mark in the NHL among players to have played Los Angeles at least five times.
- Mikael Granlund has registered four points in his last four games played vs. Los Angeles (2-2-4). In all, Granlund has 21 points (7-14-21) in 33 career games against the Kings.
- Matt Duchene recorded a multi-point outing (2-1—3) in Dallas' last game vs. Los Angeles on Feb. 7. Duchene ranks second among active Stars skaters in points against the Kings (12-17—29, 36 GP).

BIKER GANG

- Thomas Harley has tallied eight points (3-5—8) in his last eight games dating back to Jan. 31 against the Vancouver Canucks. His eight points during that span rank fourth on Dallas' roster.
- Harley's eight points since Jan. 31 were also tied for the third-most among all NHL defensemen during that span
 entering play Thursday, trailing only Buffalo's Rasmus Dahlin (11) and Colorado's Cale Makar (8).
- When Harley had been on the ice during even-strength play this season, the Stars have outscored their opponents 68-37. Entering play Thursday, his plus-31 goal differential was the second-best mark among all NHL skaters this year and his 68 on-ice goals for ranked sixth.
 - Additionally, Harley has logged a plus-29 plus/minus rating this season, which was tied for sixth in the NHL and ranked fourth among all NHL defensemen entering play Thursday.
- In all, **Harley** has totaled 31 points (10-21—31) in 56 regular-season games this season, which would put him on pace to finish the 2024-25 regular season with 14 goals, 30 assists and 44 points, all of which would both be the second-highest totals of his career.
 - His 10 goals this season were tied for the seventh-most among all NHL defensemen this season entering play Thursday.
- In Dallas' last game, Harley skated 28:24, which topped all skaters on either team. It was the highest ice time in a single
 game in his career that did not go to overtime.
 - Harley previously skated 29:13 on Feb. 19, 2024 against the Boston Bruins, but 2:12 of that ice time came in overtime.
- Since Jan. 31 Dallas' first game without **Miro Heiskanen Harley** has been averaging 25:29 of ice time per game, which tops all Stars skaters and ranked eighth in the NHL entering play Thursday.

DALLAS MAVRIK

- Mavrik Bourque enters tonight's game riding a six-game point streak dating back to Feb. 2 against the Columbus Blue
 Jackets. A goal or an assist tonight would give him points in seven consecutive games for the first time in his career.
 - The only other rookie this season to have a point streak of at least seven games is Montreal's Lane Hutson, who has done so twice this year.
- If **Bourque** were to extend his point streak tonight, he would also become the first Stars rookie to have a point in at least seven consecutive games since **Jason Robertson** had a point in nine straight games from April 14 to 27, 2021.
- Bourque has notched an assist in each of Dallas' last three games. If he were to do so again tonight, it would give him assists in four consecutive games for the first time in his career.
- Since Jan. 1, **Bourque** has scored seven goals including the Stars fourth of the game in their game on Feb. 25 against the Columbus Blue Jackets. His seven goals during that span were the second-most among all NHL rookies entering play Thursday, trailing only Detroit's Marco Kasper (8).
 - o **Bourque's** seven goals since Jan. 1 are tied for fourth on Dallas' roster.
- In all, Bourque has totaled 12 points (6-6—12) since Jan. 1, which is five points better than the seven he had from the start of the regular season through Dec. 31. His 11 points since Jan. 1 were tied for fourth among all NHL rookies entering play Thursday.

• Since Jan. 1, the Stars have outscored their opponents 12-9 when **Bourque** has been on the ice during even-strength play.

NEW YEAR, NEW ME

- Since Jan. 1, **Jason Robertson**, **Matt Duchene** and **Wyatt Johnston** were all ranked in the top 10 in the NHL in scoring entering play Thursday. **Robertson's** 28 points (15-13—28) ranked fifth, and with 26 points each, **Duchene** (9-17—26) and **Johnston** (8-18—26) were tied for seventh.
- Entering play Thursday, the Stars were the only team to have multiple players ranked in the top 10 in league scoring since the New Year.
- Robertson's 15 goals ranked third in the NHL since the start of the New Year entering play Thursday.
- Thomas Harley has scored six goals since Jan. 1, which was tied for fourth among all NHL defensemen entering play Thursday.

DADDY ISSUES

- Thursday, Feb. 27 marked the two-year anniversary of Evgenii Dadonov's first game with the Dallas stars after being acquired in a trade from the Montreal Canadiens the previous day.
- During his Stars tenure, **Dadonov** has totaled 71 points (31-40—71) in 132 regular-season games. His 31 goals rank ninth of Dallas' roster during that span and his 71 points rank 11th.
- With 33 points (16-17—33) in 58 regular-season games this season, Dadonov enters tonight's game ranked sixth on the Stars is scoring and fifth in goals.
- The 2024-25 season is already tied for the fifth-highest scoring season of **Dadonov's** career, and he's on pace to finish the year with 47 points, which would be his highest point total in a single season since he also had 47 points for the Florida Panthers in 2019-20.
- Dadonov enters tonight's game five assists shy of totaling 200 career assists. When he reaches the milestone, he will become the ninth active, Russian skater to record at least 200 career assists.

POWER UP

- Since Jan. 1, the Stars have gone 17-for-55 on the power play for a 30.9 percent success rate, which ranked second in the NHL during that span entering play Thursday.
- The team's 17 power-play goals since Jan. 1 were the second-most in the NHL entering play Thursday, trailing only the Detroit Red Wings (24) for the league lead.
- Five of those 17 goals have been scored by Jason Robertson. Since Jan. 1, only Detroit's Dylan Larkin (7) and Edmonton's Leon Draisaitl (6) had scored more power-play goals than Robertson entering play Thursday.

JOHNNY B. GOODE

- Wyatt Johnston notched an assist in Dallas' last game and enters tonight's matchup riding a four-game point streak. A goal or an assist tonight would give him points in at least five consecutive games for the fifth time this season.
- Johnston's assist was his 34th of the season, which set a career high for the forward. His assist was also the 84th of his career, which tied Buffalo's Owen Power for the most by a player selected in the 2021 NHL Draft.
 - Johnston's 73 career goals and 157 career points are both the most of any player from the 2021 Draft class.
- **Johnston** now has 51 points (17-34—51) in 58 games this season, which ranks third on the Stars in scoring and makes the 2024-25 season his second-consecutive 50-point season.
- He's now on pace to finish the year with 72 points, which would be a career high for Johnston.
- Johnston's scored his third shorthanded goal of the season in Dallas' Feb. 22 game against the New Jersey Devils. Entering play Thursday, his three shorthanded goals were tied for third in the NHL this year.
- The goal was also the sixth shorthanded tally of his career. Since **Johnston** made his NHL debut, his six shorthanded goals rank second on Dallas' roster (**Roope Hintz**; 7) and are tied for eighth in the NHL.
- Johnston has been playing at a point-per-game pace since Nov. 10, totaling 45 points (16-29—45) in 45 games played.

KILLING IT

- The Stars have had an 85.2 percent success rate on the penalty kill this season, which was the best mark in the NHL this year entering play Thursday.
- No team in the league this season has allowed fewer power-play goals against than the Stars' 23, and their -18 goal differential on the penalty kill this year was tied for the second-best mark in the NHL entering play Thursday.
- If the Stars maintain this pace, it would make the 2024-25 season their best on the penalty kill since 2007-08, when the
 team finished the season with an 85.6 percent success rate on the penalty kill.
- The Stars are also one of the least-penalized teams in the league, ranking 28th in the league in both total penalty minutes (392) and penalty minutes per game (6:45) entering play Thursday.
- Entering play Thursday, Esa Lindell was leading all NHL skaters in both total shorthanded ice time (200:24) and shorthanded ice time per game (3:27) this season.
- Among players that have played at least 100 minutes on the penalty kill this season, **Thomas Harley** and **Sam Steel** both ranked in the top five in the NHL in power-play goals against entering play Thursday.
 - o Harley, who has played 100:53 of shorthanded ice time, ranked second with 3.57.

Steel ranked fourth with 3.97. He has totaled 104:04 of shorthanded ice time and is averaging 1:54 of shorthanded ice time per game, both of which top all Dallas forwards this season.

HEATING UP

- Jake Oettinger has an 11-4-1 record in his last 16 games played dating back to Dec. 29, posting a .912 save percentage and a 2.43 goals-against average during that span.
 - o His 11 wins since Dec. 29 were tied for the second-most in the NHL entering play Thursday.
- Casey DeSmith has won each of the last four games that he has played dating back to Jan. 25 against the St. Louis
 Blues, posting a .935 save percentage and a 2.01 goals-against average in those contests.
 - o His save percentage was the ninth-best mark in the NHL during that span entering play Thursday.
- Mikael Granlund has 14 points (3-11—14) in his last 13 games played, including tallying six assists in his first seven games as a member of the Stars.
- Roope Hintz has 12 points (4-8—12) in his last 11 games dating back to Jan. 24.

BACK TO DECEMBER

- Since Dec. 23, the Stars have posted an 18-6-2 record for 38 points and a .731 points percentage. Dallas' win and point total were both tied for the best marks in the league during that span entering play Thursday, and their points percentage ranked second (Winnipeg; .792).
- During that span, the Stars have outscored their opponents 91-66. No team had scored more goals than the Stars since Dec. 23 entering play Thursday.
- The team's plus-25 goal differential was the third-best mark in the league since Dec. 23 entering play Thursday, trailing
 only the Winnipeg Jets (plus-31) and Washington Capitals (plus-27).
- Sixty-four of Dallas' 91 goals since Dec. 23 have been scored at 5-on-5, which was tied with the Buffalo Sabres for the
 best mark in the NHL during that span entering play Thursday.
- Jason Robertson is the team's leading scorer since Dec. 23, totaling 34 points (17-17—34) in 26 games played. His 34 points during that span ranked fourth in the NHL entering play Thursday.
 - o His 17 goals during that span were the third-most in the NHL entering play Thursday.

IRON SHARPENS IRON

- The Stars have four skaters that have played in at least 200 consecutive games: Jamie Benn (355), Jason Robertson (268), Esa Lindell (228) and Wyatt Johnston (222). Entering play Thursday, Dallas was the only team in the NHL to have four players riding Iron Man streaks of at least 200 games.
- Dallas' last game on Feb. 25 against the Blue Jackets was the 355th consecutive game that **Benn** played in, which is the fifth-longest active Iron Man streak in the NHL.
- Robertson's 268-game Iron Man streak is the 13th-longest in the NHL. The Stars and the Detroit Red Wings were the
 only teams to have two players ranked in the top 15 entering play Thursday.
- Lindell's 228-game Iron Man streak ranks eighth among all NHL defensemen.
- **Johnston's** Iron Man Streak began when he made his NHL debut on Oct. 13, 2022. He is one of 44 players in NHL history to begin their NHL career by playing in at least 200 consecutive games according to NHL Stats.

ONE FOR THE HISTORY BOOKS

- Jake Oettinger's next shutout will be the 12th of his career, which will tie Jon Casey for the sixth-most in franchise history.
- Jake Oettinger is one win away from tying Gilles Meloche (141) for 5th most wins by a goaltender in franchise history.
- Thomas Harley is 13 assists shy of tying Gary Sargen (71) for 25th among all-time defensemen.
- Jason Robertson is four points shy of tying John Klingberg (374) for 18th-most points in franchise history.
- Roope Hintz is eight points shy of tying Loui Eriksson (357) for 20th-most points in franchise history.
- Roope Hintz is six goals shy of tying Danny Grant (176) for 15th-most goals in franchise history.
- Esa Lindell is eight assists shy of tying Stephane Robidas (165) for 10th-most assists by a defenseman in franchise history.

CONNECT FOUR

- Five Stars players represented their home country at the recently completed 4 Nations Face-Off: Mikael Granlund
 (Finland), Thomas Harley (Canada), Roope Hintz (Finland), Esa Lindell (Finland) and Jake Oettinger (United States).
 Dallas defenseman Miro Heiskanen was originally selected to Finland's roster but had to withdraw from the tournament due to injury.
- The Stars were also well-represented among the 4 Nations staff, with Jim Nill (Associate GM), Pete DeBoer (Assistant Coach) and Misha Donskov (Assistant Coach) all joining Canada's staff for the tournament. Additionally, former Star Jere Lehtinen served as Finland's General Manager.
- Harley, Nill, DeBoer and Donskov won the 4 Nations Face-Off Championship after Canada defeated the United States 3-2 in overtime on Feb. 20.
- Harley, who was originally added to Canada's roster as an injury replacement, appeared in two games for his home country, both against the United States. He tallied one assist and averaged 20:07 of ice time per game.

- When **Harley** was on the ice during 5-on-5 play in the two games he played, the Canadians outshot the Americans 17-11. His plus-6 on-ice shot differential was the best mark of any Canadian defenseman in those two games.
- Granlund finished the tournament with four points (3-1—4) in three games for the Finns. His three goals were tied for the second-most among all skaters and his four points tied for fourth.
- Lindell and Hintz each appeared in three games for Finland, with Lindell scoring one goal.
- The 4 Nations Face-Off marked the first time that Granlund, Hintz and Lindell played for Finland together. Granlund
 and Lindell had previously represented Finland together three times: at the 2016 and 2022 IIHF World Championships
 and at the 2016 World Cup of Hockey.
- Oettinger started one game for the Americans, stopping 21 of the 23 shots he faced for a .913 save percentage and a 2.06 goals-against average.
