# FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP December 2, 2025 – CALGARY FLAMES [1] vs. NASHVILLE PREDATORS [5]

**Game Summary I Event Summary** 

The Calgary Flames wrapped up a five-game road trip at Bridgestone Arena on Tuesday night, falling 5–1 to the Nashville Predators. Nashville built a 4–0 lead through 40 minutes on goals from Reid Schaefer, Steven Stamkos, Jonathan Marchessault and Ozzy Wiesblatt, then added a fifth early in the third when Michael Bunting converted at 2:59. Calgary got on the board on the power play at the 13:39 mark of the final frame after Morgan Frost buried his seventh of the season off a slick feed from Nazem Kadri on a three-way passing play started by Jonathan Huberdeau. That would be the Flames' lone breakthrough, and they will now shift gears and prepare to open a four-game homestand.

### **TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS**

This is the second of three meetings this season between the Flames and Wild. Calgary fell 2-0 in these clubs' first matchup on November 9 in Minnesota.

This is a Pacific Division versus Central Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 1-10-1 against Central Division teams and a record of 4-13-1 against Western Conference opponents.

#### **KILLER CONFIDENCE:**

The Calgary Flames have not surrendered a power-play goal in four straight games, killing off all 10 penalties they've faced over that span. Joel Farabee scored a shorthanded goal on Nov. 26 in Tampa Bay, and since that date the Flames have a league-best net penalty-kill percentage of 110%. Calgary has been perfect on the penalty kill in seven of their last eight outings and have operated at 96% efficiency — the best mark in the NHL since Nov. 16.

#### MAN OF THE MONTH:

Flames rearguard Rasmus Andersson finished the month of November with a team-leading 14 points, recording three goals and 11 assists in 15 games. The Malmo, SWE, native posted four multi-point outings, including a pair of three-point nights on Nov. 19 in Buffalo (1-2—3) and Nov. 23 in Vancouver (0-3—3). He was named the NHL's first star of the week for the period ending Nov. 23 after posting a league-high nine points from Nov. 18–23. Andersson added two assists in Florida on Friday to record his 13<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup> points of the month, giving him the most by a Flames defenceman in a single month since Noah Hanifin had 16 in April 2022.

Andersson registered 11 of his November points on the road, finishing two points shy of tying Gary Suter (2-11—13 in January 1988) and Paul Reinhart (3-10—13 in March 1981) for the most road points in a single calendar month by a Flames defenceman.

#### DOME SWEET DOME:

Since the 2019–20 season, Calgary and Minnesota have met at the Scotiabank Saddledome seven times, with the Flames holding a 5-2-0 record in those games. Rasmus Andersson leads all Flames skaters with eight points (1G, 7A) at the Saddledome against the Wild during that span.

#### **TIGHT CONTESTS:**

Through the last 10 meetings between Calgary and Minnesota, eight have been decided by two goals or fewer, with four one-goal games and three contests requiring extra time. Since Dec. 7, 2022, the Flames hold a 6-3-1 record against the Wild, with both teams scoring 26 goals apiece in that span.

#### A TRIP DOWN MEMORY LANE:

Flames assistant coach Dave Lowry scored the final goal of his 1,084-game NHL career as a member of the Calgary Flames against the Minnesota Wild on Dec. 29, 2003. That season, Lowry's teammates in Calgary included current Flames general manager Craig Conroy, special advisor to the GM Jarome Iginla and Martin Gelinas, who now serves as part of the club's player development staff.

#### **WEEGSY BABY:**

MacKenzie Weegar enters tonight's game with 196 assists in his NHL career and is four away from reaching the 200-assist mark. With four more helpers, Weegar would become just the sixth defenceman in NHL history drafted in the seventh round (FLA – 206<sup>th</sup> overall in 2013) to register 200 NHL assists, and the only active seventh-round–selected rearguard to achieve the milestone. Only one other active seventh-round selection has more career helpers than Weegar — Devils winger Ondrej Palat (TBL – 208<sup>th</sup> overall in 2011).

#### **HUBY DOO:**

With his assist on Tuesday night in Nashville, Johnathan Huberdeau registered his 795<sup>th</sup> NHL point and is now five shy of reaching the 800-point mark. Huberdeau ranks third in points among all skaters drafted in 2011, trailing only Nikita Kucherov (TBL: 2<sup>nd</sup> round – 58<sup>th</sup> overall) and Mark Scheifele (WPG: 1<sup>st</sup> round – 7<sup>th</sup> overall). There are 25 active skaters who have surpassed 800 points in the NHL.

#### **LOOK BACKS AT IT:**

Mikael Backlund is closing in on 1,100 NHL games, needing just six more to reach the milestone. Backlund was the Flames' first-round pick (24th overall) in the 2007 NHL draft and made his NHL debut on January 8, 2009, against the New York Islanders.

As Backlund developed in Calgary, he became known for his hockey IQ, defensive reliability, penalty-killing strength and ability to drive play at both ends of the ice. He represented Sweden at the 2016 World Cup of Hockey, following that tournament with a breakout season in 2016-17 in which he posted a then-career-high 53 points and earned Selke Trophy consideration. In 2022-23, he set a new career high with 56 points (19G, 37A) and a team-best plus-minus rating of +24, while appearing in all 82 games for the Flames. That summer, the Vasteras, SWE, product won the King Clancy Memorial Trophy for his leadership and humanitarian contributions, and on September 21, 2023, was named the 21st captain in franchise history.

Backlund became the 19<sup>th</sup> player of Swedish descent — and the 397<sup>th</sup> skater in NHL history — to reach 1,000 NHL games, hitting the mark Oct. 30 in Utah. He was also just the second player to skate his first 1,000 games with the Flames, joining Jarome Iginla. He now looks to join Iginla once again as the second skater in franchise history to reach 1,100 games played with Calgary.

#### **HEY DID YOU KNOW?**

Blake Coleman recorded his first NHL against the Minnesota Wild as a member of the New Jersey Devils with an assist on January 17<sup>th</sup>, 2017.

Nazem Kadri (56) and Matt Coronato (55) finished first and second, respectively, on the team in shots during the month of November. Kadri's 56 shots were tied for the sixth most in the league in November, while Coronato's 55 ranked eighth in the NHL for the month.


