PLAYER NOTES

- **William Nylander** scored for the Maple Leafs 35 seconds into the first period, posting his 18th goal of the season. Nylander also recorded the lone assist on Maccelli's goal and the primary assist on Stecher's goal, improving to 33 assists recorded this season. Nylander marked his 10th multi-assist game of the season, his 17th multi-point game of the season and his sixth game of the season with three or more points. Per NHL Stats, "Nylander (1-2—3) posted his 46th career three-point game. He passed Borje Salming and tied Doug Gilmour for eighth most in Maple Leafs history."
- **Matias Maccelli** scored for Toronto at 7:17 of the second period, posting his eighth goal of the season.
- **Troy Stecher** scored the game-winning goal for the Maple Leafs at 9:10 of the second period, posting his third goal of the season. Stecher scored the second game-winning goal of his NHL career.
- **Bobby McMann** capitalized on Calgary's empty net at 19:35 of the third period, posting his 18th goal of the season. McMann has recorded a point in back-to-back games (1G, 1A).
- **Auston Matthews** registered the secondary assist on Stecher's goal, posting his 21st assist of the season. Matthews has posted an assist in back-to-back games (2A) and has recorded five points (1G, 4A) in his last four games.
- **Joseph Woll** stopped 28 of 30 shots he faced in tonight's win.
- **Philippe Myers** was on the ice for a team-high 19 Toronto shot attempts-for at 5-on-5.
- **John Tavares** and **William Nylander** finished the game with a team-high 5-on-5 shot attempt percentage of 62.07 percent (18 for, 11 against).

TEAM NOTES

- Toronto has earned a win in back-to-back games.
- The Maple Leafs have earned eight-straight wins against Calgary, the club's longest active winning streak against a single opponent.
- The Maple Leafs were 1-for-1 on the penalty kill tonight.
- Toronto has posted a 10-12-3 record on the road this season.
- The Maple Leafs have posted a 4-5-0 record in the first game of a back-to-back this season.
