- Lian Bichsel recorded the primary assist on Mason Marchment's goal, marking the first assist of his NHL career.
- Mikael Granlund and Cody Ceci played their first game with the Stars after being acquired yesterday via a trade with the San Jose Sharks. Granlund recorded his first point with Dallas with the primary assist on Logan Stankoven's goal.
- Wyatt Johnston (1-1-2) and Thomas Harley (0-2-2) both recorded two points in the win.
- Evgenii Dadonov scored two goals in the third period, including the game winner.

# **GAME NOTES**

### THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Tonight is the second of three games the Stars will play against the Ducks this season and the only time the teams are facing off in Anaheim this year. They will next play on March 18 in Dallas.
- A win tonight would give the Stars six consecutive victories for the second time this season after previously winning seven straight games from Dec. 29 to Jan. 11.
  - o The team's current five-game winning streak was the third-longest active win streak in the NHL entering play Monday.
- The Stars enter tonight's game with a 34-17-1 record for 69 points and a .663 points percentage. Their .663 points percentage was the third-best mark in the NHL this year entering play Monday.
  - Of the top five ranked teams, four of them are in the Western Conference: Winnipeg (.713), Dallas, Edmonton (.654) and Vegas (.642). The Washington Capitals (.721) top both the NHL and the Eastern Conference.
- Matt Duchene enters tonight's game one assist shy of totaling his 500th NHL assist. When he reaches the milestone, he will become the 27th active skater and the fourth player from the 2009 Draft class to tally 500 career assists.
- Entering play Monday, the Stars and the Washington Capitals were the only NHL teams this season that have not lost more than two consecutive games.

• The Stars have allowed only 2.48 goals against per game this season, which was the third-best mark in the NHL entering play Monday. Dallas has allowed two or fewer goals in 28 of the 52 games that they have played this year.

#### **DUCK HUNTING**

- Dallas is 83-39-15 all-time vs. Anaheim, including a 33-26-9 mark on the road.
- The Stars have won 12 of their last 15 games against the Ducks (12-3-0) dating back to Oct. 13, 2018.
- Casey DeSmith has a 4-2-0 career record against Anaheim, posting a .919 save percentage, a 2.36 goals-against
  average and one shutout in those games.
- Matt Duchene has 15 points (8-7—15) in his last 15 games against the Ducks dating back to Dec. 6, 2017. Duchene enters tonight's contest riding a three-game point streak against Anaheim, earning three points (2-1—3) in those games.
- Roope Hintz has registered eight points in his last eight games (3-5—8) against Anaheim. In all, Hintz has 11 points (5-6—11) in 12 career games against the Ducks.
- **Jake Oettinger** is undefeated in his career against the Ducks, posting an 8-0-0 record with a .930 save percentage, 1.85 goals-against average and one shutout in eight games.
  - o Oettinger's eight wins against Anaheim since the start of the 2020-21 season are tied for the most in the NHL.
- Jason Robertson has nine points (4-5—9) in 10 career games against the Ducks.
- Jamie Benn rides a two-game point streak against the Ducks (1-2—3) entering tonight's matchup. In all, Benn has 37 points (12-25—37) in 50 career games against Anaheim. His 37 points against the Ducks tops all active Stars skaters.
- Mason Marchment enters tonight's game riding a three-game point streak against the Ducks, earning three points (1-2—3) during those games. In all, Marchment has tallied five points (1-4—5) in nine career games played against Anaheim.

#### **BACK TO DECEMBER**

- Since Dec. 23, the Stars have posted a 15-4-1 record for 31 points and a .775 points percentage. Dallas' win total, point total and points percentage during that span all topped the NHL entering play Monday.
- During that span, the Stars have outscored their opponents 66-46. Their plus-20 goal differential was the second-best
  mark in the league since Dec. 23 entering play Monday, trailing only the Winnipeg Jets (plus-23)
  - o Only the Jets (67) had scored more goals that the Stars since Dec. 23 entering play Monday.
- Forty-five of the Dallas' 66 goals since Dec. 23 have been scored at 5-on-5, which was tied for second in the NHL entering play Monday, trailing only the Buffalo Sabres (48).
- The Stars have gone 619-for-10163 at the faceoff dot since Dec. 23 for a 53.2 percent success rate, which was the third-best mark in the league during that span entering play Monday.
- Entering play Monday, Jason Robertson was the team's leading scorer since Dec. 23, totaling 28 points (12-16—28) in 20 games played. Only Boston's David Pastrnak (30) has more points than Robertson during that span.
- Fifteen different Stars skaters have scored at least one goal since Dec. 23: Jason Robertson (12), Wyatt Johnston (9), Roope Hintz (8), Jamie Benn (7), Evgenii Dadonov (7), Matt Duchene (5), Mavrik Bourque (4), Thomas Harley (3), Logan Stankoven (3), Oskar Bäck (2), Esa Lindell (2), Colin Blackwell (1), Matěj Blümel (1), Miro Heiskanen (1) and Mason Marchment (1).
  - o Robertson's 12 goals since Dec. 23 were tied for the third-most in the NHL entering play Monday.

### **ROBO ON THE GOGO**

- Jason Robertson enters tonight's matchup having totaled 37 points (14-23—37) in his last 30 games played dating back to Dec. 1 against the Winnipeg Jets. His 37 points during that span are the most of any Stars skater and ranked seventh in the NHL entering play Monday.
  - o Robertson has multi-point efforts in nine of the last 17 games that he has played.
- Robertson's assist in Dallas' last game extended his point streak to five games, which was tied for the fourth-longest active point streak in the NHL entering play Monday.
- A goal or an assist tonight would give Robertson points in six consecutive games for the first time since he earned
  points in seven consecutive games from Dec. 18, 2023 to Jan. 2, 2024.
- Robertson had three points (1-2—3) in Dallas' game on Jan. 31 against the Canucks, his fourth three-point game of the season.
- Robertson scored two goals on Jan. 24 against Vegas including the game winner to bring his career total to 150. He is the 19th skater in franchise history to score 150 goals with the team.
- Robertson's second goal of the game on Jan. 24 was 358th career point (150-208—358), giving him sole possession of 19th on the franchise's all-time scoring list.
- Robertson factored in on all three of Dallas' goals in their Jan. 18 game against the Avalanche, scoring two goals and adding an assist to bring his season total to 40 points (14-26—40). Robertson has recorded at least 40 points in each of the five full NHL seasons that he has played.
  - His two goals came just 39 seconds apart, marking the fastest two goals by a Stars skater since Joe Pavelski on Nov. 26, 2021 (0:19) according to NHL Stats.
- Robertson scored the deciding goal in the shootout in Dallas' Jan. 11 game, a 2-1 victory over the Montréal Canadiens.
  - In his career, Robertson has gone 16-for-28 in shootout attempts. His 57.1 career percent success rate in the shootout is tied for the sixth-best mark among all active NHL skaters that have at least five shootout attempts.

- Robertson recorded two assists in Dallas' game on Jan. 2 against the Ottawa Senators for his 100th career multi-point game, becoming the 15th player in Stars/North Stars history to record 100 multi-point games according to NHL Stats.
   Only four players in franchise history have posted 100 multi-point games before age 26: Brian Bellows (151 GP), Mike Modano (126 GP), Bobby Smith (123 GP) and Dino Ciccarelli (101 GP).
- Robertson tallied three points (1-2—3) in Dallas' game on Dec. 31 against the Sabres to take sole possession of 21st on the franchise's all-time scoring list, passing Joe Nieuwendyk and Al MacAdam. Robertson has 344 career points (142-202—344) in 329 regular-season games.
- Robertson's second assist against the Sabres was the 200th of his career, making him the 27th player in Stars franchise
  history at the seventh player from the 2017 draft class to total 200 NHL assists.
- Additionally, Robertson who turned 25 on July 21 became the third player in Stars team history to register 200 career assists at age 25 or younger (all assists w/ DAL) according to NHL Stats.

#### **JANUARY MEN**

- The Stars finished the month of January with a 11-4-O record for 22 points and a .733 points percentage. Their 11 wins topped the league and their point total and points percentage were both tied for the best mark in the NHL in January.
  - o Dallas played 15 games in over the course of 30 days last month, which included three back-to-back sets.
- January of 2025 marked the Stars most wins in a single month since March of 2024 when they also had 11 wins and 22 points.
- It also marked the team's most wins in the month of January since the 2005-06 season when the team had an 11-3-1 record for 23 points and .767 points percentage in January 2006.
- Jason Robertson was the team's leading scorer in January, totaling 21 points (10-11—21) in 15 games. He tied for second in scoring in the NHL last month and his 10 goals tied for third.
- With three points in Dallas' last game, **Robertson** became the seventh player in franchise history to record at least 20 points in a single January according to NHL Stats. He joined Neal Broten (25 in 1984), Dino Ciccarelli (23 in 1984), Bobby Smith (22 in 1982), Joe Pavelski (21 in 2022), Mike Modano (20 in 2003) and Craig Hartsburg (20 in 1982).
- Robertson is the first Stars skater to have at least 20 points in a single month since both he (22) and Miro Heiskanen (23) did so in March of 2023.

#### **DADDY ISSUES**

- Evgenii Dadonov scored twice, including the game winner, in Dallas' last game on Feb. 2 against the Columbus Blue Jackets. He now has totaled six points (3-3—6) in his last five games.
- Dadonov's second goal of the night was the 350th point of his career, which ranks ninth among active, Russian skaters.
- His second goal was also his 15th of the season. Dadonov is the fourth-oldest player this season to have scored at least
   15 goals, trailing Alex Ovechkin (24), Sidney Crosby (17) and Brad Marchand (19).
- Dadonov's next point will be his 30th of the season and will give him the sixth 30-point season of his career.
- Dadonov is now on pace to finish the year with 24 goals and 46 points, both of which would be his highest totals since he had 25 goals and 47 points for the Florida Panthers in 2019-20.

### JOHNNY B. GOODE

- Wyatt Johnston scored a goal and added an assist in Dallas' last game and now has 38 points (13-25—38) in 35 games since Nov. 20. His 38 points during that span trail only Jason Robertson (42) for the team lead.
- **Johnston's** goal was the 150th point of his career, making him both the first player from the 2021 Draft class and the 63rd skater in franchise history to total 150 points with the Stars.
- Since Nov. 28, the Stars are outscoring their opponents 27-16 at 5-on-5 when **Johnston** is on the ice according to Natural Stat Trick. His 27 5-on-5 on-ice goals for since Nov. 28 are the most of any Stars skater.
- Johnston scored his second career hat trick in Dallas' Jan. 28 game a 4-3 overtime win over the Vegas Golden Knights.
   The first of Johnston's three goals was shorthanded, the second at even strength and the third was the overtime winner.
- Johnston's hat trick hit several league and franchise historical milestones according to NHL Stats:
  - Johnston (21 years, 259 days) became the youngest player in franchise history to score a natural hat trick, besting Tyler Seguin (21 years, 310 days on Dec. 7, 2013).
  - o He became the first player in Stars/North Stars history to record a hat trick which included a shorthanded goal and overtime-winning tally. **Johnston** became the eighth player on record to achieve the feat and second in over a decade (Elias Lindholm on Oct. 23, 2021).
  - He became the sixth player in Stars/North Stars history to cap a hat trick with an overtime-winning goal. The last player to do so for Dallas was Roope Hintz on Dec. 29, 2023.
  - Additionally, Johnston became one of eight players in NHL history to complete a natural hat trick in overtime.
     The only other active players to do so are Evander Kane (Nov. 15, 2023 w/ EDM), Kirill Kaprizov (Feb. 26, 2023 w/ MIN) and Tomas Hertl (Jan. 8, 2022 w/ SJS). Johnston (21 years, 259 days) is the youngest to do so.
- Johnston's shorthanded tally was the fifth of this career and second of the season. He joined former Star Brian Bellows
   (9) as the only player in franchise history to have at least five shorthanded goals at age 21 or younger according to NHL Stats.
- Johnston became the fifth active player to score at least five shorthanded goals before his 22nd birthday according to NHL Stats, joining Jordan Staal (10), Sebastian Aho (5), Anze Kopitar (5) and Anthony Cirelli (5).

- Johnston's first goal of the night was his 40th point of the season. He has now tallied at least 40 points in each of the
  three NHL seasons that he has played.
- **Johnston's** 45 points (15-30—43) this season were tied with Chicago's Connor Bedard for the most among players that are age 22 or younger entering play Monday.
- **Johnston** is now pacing to finish the year with 24 goals, 47 assists and 71 points. Forty-seven assists and 71 points would both be a career high for the forward.
  - He enters tonight's matchup against the Ducks just three assists shy of matching his career high (33) that he set last season.

#### **HEATING UP**

- **Jake Oettinger** has an 10-2-0 record in his last 12 games played dating back to Dec. 29, posting a .920 save percentage and a 2.07 goals-against average during that span.
  - His 10 wins since Dec. 29 were tied with Winnipeg's Connor Hellebuyck for the most in the NHL entering play Monday.
- Mikael Granlund has 10 points (4-6—10) in his last 10 games played, including tallying an assist in his first game as a member of the Stars on Feb. 2 against the Blue Jackets.
- Roope Hintz scored twice and added in an assist in Dallas' Jan. 31 game against the Canucks and now has 14 points (7–7–14) in his last 14 games dating back to Dec. 31 against the Buffalo Sabres.
- Matt Duchene has 19 points (5-14—19) in his last 19 games played dating back to Dec. 29 against Chicago.

#### **ROOKIE REPORT**

- Since Jan. 1, Mavrik Bourque has scored four goals including the Stars first of the game in their matchup on Jan. 28 against the Vegas Golden Knights. His four goals during that span were tied for the second-most among all NHL rookies entering play Monday.
  - o In all, **Bourque** has totaled seven points (4-3—7) during that span, matching his offensive output from the start of the regular season through Dec. 31. His seven points during that span were tied for fifth among all NHL rookies entering play Monday.
- Logan Stankoven scored his seventh goal of the season in Dallas' last game on Feb. 2 against the Columbus Blue Jackets, surpassing the six that he has in 24 games with the Stars last year.
- Lian Bichsel has recorded at least four hits in each of the five games that he has played since being recalled from Texas (AHL), including matching his single-game career high with six on Jan. 31 against Vancouver. In all this season, he is averaging 15.8 hits per 60, which tops the Stars roster and ranked 10th among all NHL rookies this season that had played in at least five games entering play Monday.
  - o Despite only playing in 13 games this season, Bichsel ranks fourth on the Stars roster with 50 hits.
- Oskar Bāck has gone 75-for-136 at the faceoff dot this season for a 55.2 percent success rate, which ranked second among rookies that have taken at least 20 draws this season entering play Monday.

### **JUST IN CASE**

- Casey DeSmith recorded his second shutout of the season in Dallas' Jan. 25 game a 2-0 win over the St. Louis Blues stopping all 33 shots he faced.
- According to MoneyPuck.com, DeSmith saved 2.73 goals above expected. The Stars were outshot 19-33 in the game.
- The shutout was the 12th of **DeSmith's** career, making him one of 32 NHL goaltenders to record at least 12 shutouts since the start of the 2017-18-season.
- **DeSmith** is now one shutout shy of tying his career high of three that he set in 2018-19 and matched in 2021-22, both while playing for the Pittsburgh Penguins.
- In all this season, **DeSmith** has a 8-6-0 record with a 2.46 goals-against average and a .912 save percentage. He has allowed two or fewer goals in nine of the 16 games he has played in.

# **IRON SHARPENS IRON**

- The Stars have four skaters that have played in at least 200 consecutive games: Jamie Benn (349), Jason Robertson (262), Esa Lindell (222) and Wyatt Johnston (216). Entering play Monday, Dallas was the only team in the NHL to have four players riding Iron Man streaks of at least 200 games.
- Dallas' last game on Feb. 2 against the Blue Jackets was the 349th consecutive game that **Benn** played in, which is the fifth-longest active Iron Man streak in the NHL. He is one of seven players to have an Iron Man streak of at least 300 games.
- Robertson's 262-game Iron Man streak is the 13th-longest in the NHL. The Stars and the Detroit Red Wings were the
  only teams to have two players ranked in the top 15 entering play Saturday.
- Lindell's 221-game Iron Man streak ranks eighth among all NHL defensemen.
- **Johnston's** Iron Man Streak began when he made his NHL debut on Oct. 13, 2022. He is one of 44 players in NHL history to begin their NHL career by playing in at least 200 consecutive games according to NHL Stats.

#### ONE FOR THE HISTORY BOOKS

- Jake Oettinger's next shutout will be the 12th of his career, which will tie Jon Casey for the sixth-most in franchise
  history.
- Jake Oettinger is two wins away from tying Gilles Meloche (141) for 5th most wins by a goaltender in franchise history.
- Thomas Harley is 15 assists shy of tying Gary Sargen (71) for 25th among all-time defensemen.
- Jason Robertson is two goals shy of tying J.P. Parise (154) for 17th-most goals in franchise history.
- Roope Hintz is eight points shy of tying Danny Grant (353) for 21st-most points in franchise history.
- Roope Hintz is seven goals shy of tying Danny Grant (176) for 15th-most goals in franchise history.

#### **CONNECT FOUR**

- Stars forwards Mikael Granlund (Finland) and Roope Hintz (Finland), defenseman Esa Lindell (Finland) and goaltender
  Jake Oettinger (United States) have all been selected to represent their home country at the 4 Nations Face-Off, which
  will be held in Montreal and Boston from Feb. 12 to 20, 2025.
  - Finland native Miro Heiskanen was also selected to represent his home country at the tournament but had to withdraw due to injury.
- Dallas is one of six NHL teams to have at least one forward, defenseman and goaltender from their roster to be selected for the 4 Nations Face-Off, with the others being Boston, Minnesota, Vancouver, Vegas and Winnipeg.
- All four players have previously represented their home countries in international competition.
  - Granlund has represented Finland at nearly every level of international competition: the Winter Olympics (2016), World Cup of Hockey (2016), IIHF World Championships (2011, 2012, 2013, 2016, 2018, 2022, 2024), IIHF U2O World Championships (2009, 2010, 2012) and the IIHF U18 World Junior Championships (2009, 2010). He has medaled six times, winning two golds, one silver and three bronzes.
  - Lindell suited up for the Fins at the 2014 IIHF World Junior Championship, where he won a gold medal. He
    again represented Finland at the 2015, 2016 (silver) and 2022 (gold) IIHF World Championships and at the
    2016 World Cup of Hockey.
  - Hintz previously played for Finland at the 2015 and 2016 IIHF World Junior Championships, winning a gold medal at the later tournament.
  - Oettinger has played for Team USA at the 2017 and 2018 IIHF World Junior Championships and at the 2021 IIHF World Championship. He medaled in all three tournaments, winning bronze in 2018 and 2021 and gold in 2017.
- The 4 Nations Face-Off will mark the first time that Granlund, Hintz and Lindell are playing for Finland together.
   Granlund and Lindell have previously represented Finland together three times: at the 2016 and 2022 IIHF World Championships and at the 2016 World Cup of Hockey.
- The Stars will also be well-represented among the 4 Nations staff, with Jim Nill (Associate GM), Pete DeBoer (Assistant Coach) and Misha Donskov (Assistant Coach) all set to join Canada's staff for the tournament. Additionally, former Star Jere Lehtinen will serve as Finland's General Manager.

- Stars forward Sam Steel was originally selected by Anaheim in the first round (30th overall) in the 2016 NHL draft. He played for the Ducks from 2018-19 to 2021-22.
- Stars defenseman Ilya Lyubushkin played in Anaheim during the 2023-24 season, appearing in 55 games.
- Stars forward Colin Blackwell and Ducks forward Ryan Strome played together in New York (Rangers) during the 2020-21 season.
- Stars goaltender Casey DeSmith and Ducks winger Brock McGinn shared the ice for two seasons in Pittsburgh from 2021-22 to 2022-23.
- Stars defenseman Brendan Smith and Ducks forward Ryan Strome both skated for the New York Rangers from 2018-19 to the 2020-21 season.
- Stars defenseman Nils Lundkvist and Ducks forwards Ryan Strome and Frank Vatrano were all members of the New York Rangers for the 2021-22 season.
- Stars forward Evgenii Dadonov and Ducks forward Frank Vatrano played together for the Florida Panthers during 2017-18 to 2019-20 seasons.
- Stars forward Mason Marchment and Ducks forward Frank Vatrano and Ducks defenseman Radko Gudas played together for the Florida Panthers during the 2020-21 and 2021-22 seasons.
- Stars goaltender Casey DeSmith and Ducks defenseman Brian Dumoulin shared the ice for DeSmith's tenure with Pittsburgh from 2017-18 to 2022-23.
- Stars Player Development Assistant **Jordie Benn** and Ducks assistant coach Rich Clue were both with the Toronto Maple Leafs organization during the 2022-23 season.
