- Nine different Stars skaters recorded a point during the game and three had multi-point outings.
- Dallas extended its win streak to five games dating back to Dec. 29 and its overall point streak to seven contests (6-0-1 since Dec. 23).
- Dallas saw its first three-goal comeback win of the season, last accomplished the feat March 5, 2024 against the Sharks (7-6 OT) according to NHL Stats.
- **Jamie Benn** scored the overtime game winning goal, his 12th career overtime goal which extends the Stars franchise record.

GAME NOTES

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Tonight is the first of two games the Stars will play against the Flyers this season and the only time the two teams are facing off in Philadelphia this year. The two teams will next face off on March 22 in Dallas.
- Tonight is also the second game of a five-game road trip that will see the Stars play the Rangers, Flyers, Canadiens, Senators and Maple Leafs. It is the team's longest road trip of the season.
- The Stars have won eight of their last nine games against the Flyers dating back to April 2, 2019, outscoring Philadelphia 36-17 in those nine contests.
- Dallas has one each of its last two games in overtime. If tonight's matchup against the Flyers goes beyond regulation, it would mark the first time that the team has had three consecutive games go to overtime since Dec. 16 to 21, 2023.
 - During that stretch all three games resulted in a 4-3 overtime score, with the Stars falling to the Blues on Dec. 16 and then defeating the Kraken and Canucks on Dec. 18 and 20.
- **Arttu Hyry** has gone 10-for-13 at the faceoff dot in his first three NHL games for a 76.9 percent success rate. This includes going a perfect 6-for-6 in his NHL debut on Jan. 2 against the Ottawa Senators.
 - His 76.9 percent success rate at the faceoff dot ranked third in the NHL entering play Wednesday among NHL skaters that have taken at least 10 draws since Jan. 2.
- **Miro Heiskanen** is averaging 25:23 of ice time per game this season, which was the fourth-most in the NHL this year entering play Wednesday.

- Entering play Wednesday, the Stars and the Washington Capitals were the only NHL teams this season that have not lost more than two consecutive games.
- The Stars have allowed only 2.54 goals against per game this season, which was the fourth-best mark in the NHL entering play Wednesday. Dallas has allowed two or fewer goals in 22 of the 39 games that they have played this year.
 - The Stars (99) and the Los Angeles Kings (95) were the only teams to allow fewer than 100 goals against this season entering play Wednesday.

GOING STREAKING

- The Stars enter tonight's matchup against the Flyers having won each of their last five games played dating back to Dec. 29 at Chicago. A victory tonight would give the team their first six-game win streak since they won eight consecutive games from March 16 to April 3, 2024.
- A Stars victory tonight would also make Dallas the eighth team this season to have a win streak of at least six games, joining the Carolina Hurricanes, Colorado Avalanche, Florida Panthers, Los Angeles Kings, Ottawa Senators, Vegas Golden Knights and Winnipeg Jets,
 - The Jets are the only team to have two separate winning streaks of at least six games this season.
- If the Stars were to win tonight, it would also give them four consecutive wins to begin a calendar year for the third time in team history and for the first time since 2021 according to NHL Stats.
- Dallas' five-game winning streak was tied with Detroit and Toronto for the longest active winning streak in the NHL entering play Wednesday.
- A win or an overtime loss tonight would also extend the team's point streak to eight games for the first time since the team's eight-game winning streak last season. It would also make them sixth team this season to have a point streak of at least eight games, with the others being Carolina, Colorado, Utah, Washington and Winnipeg.
- Dallas' seven-game point streak was the second-longest active point streak in the NHL entering play Wednesday, trailing only the Colorado Avalanche, who have recorded at least a point in each of their last eight games played.

FLYERS FLY AWAY

- Dallas is 51-74-35 all-time vs. Philadelphia, including a 15-49-17 mark on the road.
- Dallas has won eight of their last 10 games vs. Philadelphia dating back to March 27, 2018. The Stars have also won three of their past four contests at Wells Fargo Center dating to Oct. 19, 2019.
- **Jason Robertson** has seven points (3-4-7) in six career games against the Flyers. He has recorded a point in five of those six games.
- **Matt Duchene** has totaled 19 points (10-9-19) in 22 career games vs. Philadelphia. He has also recorded 12 points (6-6-12) in 11 road games against the Flyers.
 - **Duchene** enters tonight's tilt have recorded eight points (3-5-8) in his last eight games against Philadelphia.
- **Wyatt Johnston** has four points (1-3-4) in four career games played against the Flyers.
- **Roope Hintz** has eight points (4-4-8) in eight career games vs. Philadelphia.
- **Jake Oettinger** is 3-1-0 with a 2.00 goals-against average and .940 save percentage in four career appearances vs. Philadelphia.

BIKER GANG

- **Thomas Harley** tallied three points (1-2-3) in Dallas' last game on Jan. 7 against the Rangers, matching his single-game career high that he previously set with three assists on April 7, 2024 against the Colorado Avalanche.
- If **Harley** were to score again tonight, it would give him goals in three consecutive games for the first time in his career.
- **Harley** now has seven points (2-5-7) in his last seven games played dating back to Dec. 23 against the Utah Hockey Club.
- With his goal against the Rangers, **Harley** is now one goal shy of tying Fred Barret (23) for 22nd on the franchise's all-time goal list by defensemen.
- **Harley** scored the overtime, game-winning goal – the fourth of his career – in Dallas' game on Jan. 4 against the Utah Hockey Club. The goal tied Jason Robertson, Mike Ribeiro, Brian Bellows and Neal Broten for the seventh most with the franchise according to NHL Stats. The only defenseman with more: John Klingberg (6).
- **Harley's** four overtime goals since the start of 2023-24 are also the most of any NHL defenseman and two more than the second-ranked blueliner (12 tied with two).
- Since the start of the 2023-24 season, only Leon Draisaitl (6), Sebastian Aho (5) and Bo Horvat (5) have scored more overtime goals than **Harley**.
- **Harley** recorded his third multi-point game of the season with two assists in Dallas' game on Dec. 31 against the Buffalo Sabres. **Harley's** second assist of the night was the 50th of his career, making him the fourth-fastest Stars/North Stars defenseman to reach the mark according to NHL Stats.
- **Harley** recorded a plus-four plus/minus rating for the first time in his career in Dallas' Dec. 29 game against Chicago,
 - In that game, the Stars outscored the Blackhawks 4-0 and outshot them 10-6 during 5-on-5 play when **Harley** was on the ice according to Natural Stat Trick.
- **Harley** enters tonight's matchup against the Flyers with a plus-22 on-ice, even-strength goal differential this season, which was tied for the fifth-best mark in the NHL this year entering play Wednesday. Only Jack Eichel (27), Leon Draisaitl (24), Kirill Kaprizov (23) and Kirill Marchenko (23) ranked higher.

BENN THERE DONE THAT

- **Jamie Benn** has totaled 13 points (5-8—13) in his last 13 games played dating back to Dec. 8 against the Calgary Flames. He has recorded at least a point in 11 of those 13 games.
- During that span, the Stars have outscored their opponents 14-5 at 5-on-5 when **Benn** has been on the ice according to Natural Stat Trick.
- **Benn** scored the overtime, game-winning goal in Dallas' last game on Jan. 7 against the New York Rangers to extend his goal streak to three games. If **Benn** were to score again tonight, it would give him goals in four consecutive games for the first time he scored a goal in six consecutive games from March 16 to 28, 2024.
- **Benn** has also scored in his last three road games. A goal tonight would give him his first four-game road goal streak since March 18 to April 7, 2018, when he scored in six consecutive road games.

HEATING UP

- **Wyatt Jonston** has 12 points (3-9—12) in his last 10 games played dating back to Dec. 16 against the Washington Capitals.
- **Evgenii Dadonov** has nine points (4-5—9) in his last nine games played dating back to Dec. 18 against the Toronto Maple Leafs.
- **Roope Hintz** has four points (3-1—4) in his last four games played.

ROBO ON THE GOGO

- **Jason Robertson** enters tonight's matchup having totaled 19 points (5-14—19) in his last 17 games played dating back to Dec. 1 against the Winnipeg Jets. His 19 points during that span are the most of any Stars skater.
 - **Robertson** also has six points (2-4—6) in his last five road games.
- **Robertson** scored a goal and tallied an assist in the Stars' last game on Jan. 7 against the Rangers and now has multi-point efforts in four of the last five games that he has played.
- **Robertson** recorded two assists in Dallas' game on Jan. 2 against the Ottawa Senators for his 100th career multi-point game, becoming the 15th player in Stars/North Stars history to record 100 multi-point games according to NHL Stats. Only four players in franchise history have posted 100 multi-point games before age 26: Brian Bellows (151 GP), Mike Modano (126 GP), Bobby Smith (123 GP) and Dino Ciccarelli (101 GP).
- **Robertson** tallied three points (1-2—3) in Dallas' game on Dec. 31 against the Sabres to take sole possession of 21st on the franchise's all-time scoring list, passing Joe Nieuwendyk and Al MacAdam. **Robertson** has 344 career points (142-202—344) in 329 regular-season games.
 - He now sits nine points shy of tying Danny Grant for 20th.
- **Robertson's** second assist against the Sabres was the 200th of his career, making him the 27th player in Stars franchise history at the seventh player from the 2017 draft class to total 200 NHL assists.
- Additionally, **Robertson** – who turned 25 on July 21 – became the third player in Stars team history to register 200 career assists at age 25 or younger (all assists w/ DAL) according to NHL Stats.

KILLING IT

- The Stars have had an 84.8 percent success rate on the penalty kill this season, which was the second-best mark in the NHL this year entering play Wednesday, trailing only the Carolina Hurricanes (84.9).
- Dallas has allowed only 16 power-play goals against this year, which was the fewest in the NHL this season entering play Wednesday. Their 0.41 power-play goals against per game also topped the NHL entering play Wednesday.
- Since Dec. 8, the Stars have gone 26-for-28 on the penalty kill for a 92.9 percent success rate, which was the best mark in the NHL during that span entering play Wednesday.
 - This stretch includes an eight-game streak (from Dec. 8 to 27) in which the Stars did not surrender a power-play goal.
- **Thomas Harley** has allowed 2.89 power-play goals against per 60, which was the fourth-best mark in the NHL entering play Wednesday among NHL skaters that have at least 50 minutes of shorthanded ice time this season.
- **Esa Lindell** has skated 133:33 minutes on the penalty kill this season, which was third-highest total of any NHL skater this season entering play Wednesday.

DOUBLE DUTCH

- **Matt Duchene** registered a goal in Dallas' last game on Jan. 7 against the New York Rangers and now has eight points (3-5—8) in his last five games played. Three of those contests have been multi-point efforts.
- **Duchene** earned his 100th point as a member of the Stars organization after tallying two points (1-1—2) on Jan. 2 vs. Ottawa, reaching the milestone in 117 games.
 - In his career, **Duchene** has tallied 847 points in 1,095 games placing him 18th among active NHL skaters.
- **Duchene** enters tonight's game having totaled 38 points (16-22—38) in 39 games this season, which includes recording 12 multi-point efforts this year. His 38 points top all Stars skaters this season.
- When **Duchene** has been on the ice this season during 5-on-5 play, the Stars have outscored their opponents 29-19 according to Natural Stat Trick.

IRON SHARPENS IRON

- The Stars have four skaters that have played in at least 200 consecutive games: **Jamie Benn** (336), **Jason Robertson** (249), **Esa Lindell** (209) and **Wyatt Johnston** (203). Entering play Wednesday, Dallas was the only team in the NHL to have four players riding Iron Man streaks of at least 200 games.
- Dallas' last game on Jan. 7 against the Rangers was the 336th consecutive game that **Benn** played in, which is the fifth-longest active Iron Man streak in the NHL. He is one of seven players to have an Iron Man streak of at least 300 games.
- **Robertson's** 249-game Iron Man streak is the 13th-longest in the NHL. The Stars and the Detroit Red Wings were the only teams to have two players ranked in the top 15 entering play Wednesday.
- **Lindell's** 209-game Iron Man streak ranks eighth among all NHL defensemen.
- **Johnston's** Iron Man Streak began when he made his NHL debut on Oct. 13, 2022. He is one of 44 players in NHL history to begin their NHL career by playing in at least 200 consecutive games according to NHL Stats.

CHEERS TO THE NEW YEAR

- Dallas finished 2024 with a 52-25-6 record for 110 points and a .663 points percentage. Their 52 wins tied for the third-most in franchise history in one calendar year according to NHL Stats.
 - The Stars ranked fifth in the NHL in points, points percentage and wins (tied) in 2024.
- 2024 marked the third consecutive calendar year in which the Stars finished with at least 100 points and a points percentage above .600.
 - In 2023 they had 104 points and a .658 points percentage, and 118 points and a .648 points percentage in 2022.
- **Jason Robertson** was Dallas' leading scorer in 2024 with 72 points (27-45-72) in 83 regular-season games. He was followed closely by **Wyatt Johnston** (32-37-69) and **Matt Duchene** (28-39-67).
- **Johnston's** 32 goals topped all Stars skaters in 2024, with **Roope Hintz** (31) and **Duchene** (28) ranking second and third, respectively.
- **Thomas Harley** posted a plus-38 plus/minus rating in 2024, which was the seventh-best mark in the NHL. **Harley** (10-37-47) was the Stars' highest scoring defenseman in 2024.
- **Jake Oettinger** posted a 41-16-3 record in 2024. His 41 wins ranked second to only Winnipeg's Connor Hellebuyck (44).
- **Oettinger's** 41 wins were the second-most by a Stars goaltender in a calendar year in franchise history, trailing only Marty Turco who had 42 in 2006.

WHAT IN THE WORLD

- Stars prospects **Emil Hemming** (Finland) and **Aram Minnetian** (United States) both represented their home countries at the 2025 IIHF U20 World Junior Championship, which was held in Ottawa from Dec. 26 to Jan. 5.
- **Hemming**, who was selected by Dallas **Hemming** with the 29th-overall pick in the 2024 NHL Draft previously represented Finland at the 2024 IIHF U20 World Junior Championship where he tallied two assists in seven games and has also played for Finland's national team in several U18 tournaments.
- The tournament marks **Minnetian's** first appearance at the World Juniors. The Woodcliff Lake, New Jersey native previously played for Team USA at the 2023 IIHF U18 World Junior Championship.
 - **Minnetian** was originally selected by the Stars in the fourth round (125th-overall) of the 2023 NHL Draft.
- **Hemming** and **Minnetian** faced off in the tournament championship, with **Minnetian** and the Americans taking home the gold and the Fins earning silver.
- Fifteen Stars skaters have previously played at the IIHF U20 World Junior Championships: **Oskar Bäck**, **Jamie Benn**, **Lian Bichsel**, **Evgenii Dadonov**, **Matt Dumba**, **Thomas Harley**, **Miro Heiskanen**, **Roope Hintz**, **Esa Lindell**, **Nils Lundkvist**, **Ilya Lyubushkin**, **Jake Oettinger**, **Jason Robertson**, **Logan Stankoven** and **Sam Steel**.

ONE FOR THE HISTORY BOOKS

- **Jake Oettinger's** next shutout will be the 12th of his career, which will tie Jon Casey for the sixth-most in franchise history.
- **Miro Heiskanen** is five assists shy of tying Darian Hatcher (218) for sixth on the franchise's all-time assists list by defensemen.
- **Esa Lindell** enters tonight's contest three assists shy of tying Alex Goligoski (155) for 25th all-time among Stars/North Stars defensemen.
- **Jason Robertson** is four assists shy of tying Loui Eriksson (207) for 25th on the franchise's all-time assists list. He is also seven goals shy of becoming the 19th player in franchise history to score 150 goals with the team.

CONNECT FOUR

- Stars forward **Roope Hintz** (Finland), defensemen **Miro Heiskanen** (Finland) and **Esa Lindell** (Finland), and goaltender **Jake Oettinger** (United States) have all been selected to represent their home country at the 4 Nations Face-Off, which will be held in Montreal and Boston from Feb. 12 to 20, 2025.
- Dallas is one of six NHL teams to have at least one forward, defenseman and goaltender from their roster to be selected for the 4 Nations Face-Off, with the others being Boston, Minnesota, Vancouver, Vegas and Winnipeg.
- Only six teams have had more players selected to a 4 Nations roster than the Stars: Colorado, Florida, Minnesota, Tampa Bay and Vegas. The full breakdown is as follows:

- All four players have previously represented their home countries in international competition.
 - **Heiskanen** has played for Finland at the 2017 and 2018 IIHF World Junior Championships, 2018 and 2022 (gold) IIHF World Championships and at the 2018 Winter Olympic Games.
 - **Lindell** suited up for the Fins at the 2014 IIHF World Junior Championship, where he won a gold medal. He again represented Finland at the 2015, 2016 (silver) and 2022 (gold) IIHF World Championships and at the 2016 World Cup of Hockey.
 - **Hintz** previously played for Finland at the 2015 and 2016 IIHF World Junior Championships, winning a gold medal at the later tournament.
 - **Oettinger** has played for Team USA at the 2017 and 2018 IIHF World Junior Championships and at the 2021 IIHF World Championship. He medaled in all three tournaments, winning bronze in 2018 and 2021 and gold in 2017.
- The 4 Nations Face-Off will mark the first time that all three of **Heiskanen**, **Hintz** and **Lindell** are playing for Finland together.
 - **Heiskanen** and **Lindell** previously won a gold medal together at the 2022 IIHF World Championship.
- The Stars will also be well-represented among the 4 Nations staff, with **Jim Nill** (Associate GM), **Pete DeBoer** (Assistant Coach) and **Misha Donskov** (Assistant Coach) all set to join Canada's staff for the tournament. Additionally, former Star **Jere Lehtinen** will serve as Finland's General Manager.

CONNECTIONS

- Stars goaltending coach **Jeff Reese** was the goaltending coach for the Flyers from 2009-10 to 2014-15.
- Stars Player Development Assistant **Jordie Benn** and VP of Cultural Growth & Strategy **Al Montoya** played with Flyers forward Nicolas Deslauriers in Montréal. The three were teammates in Montréal for part of the 2017-18 season.
- Stars forward **Sam Steel** and Flyers forward Nicolas Deslauriers played together in Anaheim during the 2019-20 to 2021-22 seasons.
- Stars defenseman **Matt Dumba** and Flyers forward Nicolas Deslauriers shared the ice in Minnesota for part of the 2021-22 season.
- Stars Player Development Assistant **Jordie Benn** and Flyers forward Ryan Poehling played together in Montréal for one game during the 2018-19 season.
- Stars forward **Evgenii Dadonov** and Flyers forward Owen Tippett played a handful of games together with the Florida Panthers in 2017-18.
- Stars forward **Sam Steel** and Flyers defenseman Jamie Drysdale played together in Anaheim during the 2020-21 and 2021-22 seasons.
- Stars defenseman **Ilya Lyubushkin** and Flyers defenseman Jamie Drysdale shared the ice in Anaheim for part for the 2023-24 season.
- Stars forwards **Colin Blackwell** and **Matt Duchene** were teammates with Flyers defenseman Ryan Ellis in Nashville. Blackwell played with Ellis from 2018-19 to 2019-20 and Duchene skated with Ellis from 2019-20 to 2022-23.

- Stars Player Coordinator **Ben Bishop** and Flyers defenseman Erik Johnson both played in St. Louis during the 2010-11 season.
- Stars forward **Matt Duchene** and Flyers defenseman Erik Johnson were teammates in Colorado from 2010-11 to 2017-18.
- Stars defenseman **Matt Dumba** and Flyers defenseman Nick Seeler were teammates in Minnesota from 2017-18 to 2019-20.
- Stars goaltending coach **Jeff Reese** and Flyers head coach John Tortarella were both on the coaching staff in Tampa Bay from 2000-01 to 2007-08. They won a Stanley Cup together in 2004.
- Stars forward **Matt Duchene** played under Flyers head coach John Tortarella and associate coach Brad Shaw following the trade deadline in Columbus during the 2018-19 season.
- Stars goaltending coach **Jeff Reese** and Flyers associate coach Brad Shaw were both on the coaching staff in Tampa Bay during the 1999-00 season.
- Stars defenseman **Brendan Smith** played under Flyers assistant coach Darryl Williams for the New York Rangers during the 2016-17 and 2017-18 seasons.
