- Saturday's victory against the Predators was the Stars' eighth consecutive win, matching the franchise record that the team set from March 16 to April 3, 2024.
 - The team has won seven of the eight games by a one-goal margin.
- Dallas is now the fifth team this season to record a win streak of at least eight games.
- Saturday's win over Nashville was the Stars' sixth two-goal comeback win of the season, which is the second-most in the NHL this year according to NHL Stats.
 - This marks the second time this season that Dallas has erased a two-goal differential to defeat the Predators after also doing so on Oct. 26.
- **Jason Roberston** scored the sixth overtime goal of his career and the first of the season to secure Dallas' win.
 - After also notching an assist earlier in the game, **Robertson** now has 30 points (11-19—30) in 27 career games against the Predators. His 19 assists and 30 points are his most against a single opponent.
 - **Robertson's** six overtime goals are tied for the fourth-most in franchise history.
- **Thomas Harley** tallied the assist on **Nathan Bastian's** game-tying goal, which extended his point streak to a career-long five games.
- **Wyatt Johnston** scored his league-leading 20th power-play goal of the season during the game. His 20 power-play goals are the fourth-most in a single season in franchise history.
 - **Johnston** also extended his point streak against the Predators to three games, earning five points (2-3—5) during that span.
- **Miro Heiskanen** tallied an assist on the game-winning goal and surpassed Darryl Sydor (265) for the fourth-most assists among franchise defensemen.

GAME NOTES

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Tonight is the third and final game that the Stars will play against the Canucks this season. Dallas defeated Vancouver in their last game on Nov. 20, 2025 (4-2 W) while falling short against them in their first matchup of the season on Oct. 16, 2025 (5-3 L).
- Tonight's game against the Canucks and tomorrow's matchup against the Flames is the ninth of 12 back-to-back sets the Stars will play this season.
- **Wyatt Johnston** (121) enters tonight's game one goal shy of surpassing **Joe Pavelski** (121) for sole possession of 24th on the franchise's all-time goals list.
- **Johnston** is also just one goal shy of matching his career high of 33 that he set last season.
- The Stars ranked in the top five in the NHL in wins (36, fourth), points (81, fourth) and points percentage (.686, fourth) this year entering play Sunday. The team's success this season comes despite having 202 combined man games lost with **Oskar Bäck**, **Jamie Benn**, **Lian Bichsel**, **Matt Duchene**, **Adam Erne**, **Thomas Harley**, **Roope Hintz**, **Nils Lundkvist**, **Ilya Lyubushkin**, **Tyler Seguin** and **Mikko Rantanen** all missing multiple games with injury at various points this year.
- Seventy-three of the Stars' 196 goals this season have been scored in the third period, which was the sixth-most in the NHL entering play Sunday.
- **Roope Hintz** has gone 428-for-723 at the faceoff dot this season for a 59.2 percent success rate, which was the seventh-best mark in the NHL this season among skaters to take at least 500 draws entering play Sunday.
- **Colin Blackwell** is two points shy of notching 100 career points. We he reaches the milestone, he will become the ninth active, seventh-round pick to total 100 NHL points.
- The Stars have not lost in regulation in games in which **Justin Hryckowian** has scored this year. Dallas in 5-0-3 in those games.
- **Casey DeSmith** ranks sixth and eighth in the NHL, respectively, in goals saved above expected (14.1) and goals saved above expected per 60 (0.651) this season according to MoneyPuck.com entering play Sunday.

GOING STREAKING

- The Stars enter tonight's game having won each of the last eight games that they have played dating back to Jan. 23, which was the longest active winning streak in the NHL entering play Sunday.
 - Dallas has won seven of the eight games during the streak by a one-goal margin. In all, the team has won 20 games by a one-goal margin this season, which was the second-most in the NHL entering play Sunday.
- The team's eight-game win streak is tied for the longest in franchise history, which was originally set from March 16 to April 3, 2024.
- A Dallas victory tonight would make them the fourth team in the NHL this season to win at least nine consecutive games.
- Dallas has scored first in seven of the least eight games that they have played and have only trailed for 51:38 of game time during the eight-game win streak.
- The team has gone 10-for-27 on the power play over the course of this winning streak for a 37.0 percent success rate. Their 37.0 percent conversion rate and 10 power-play goals scored ranked third and tied for first, respectively, in the NHL since Jan. 23 entering play Sunday.
- **Matt Duchene** is the team's leading scorer during the streak, totaling 11 points (7-4-11) since the start of the streak on Jan. 23. In all, eight Stars skaters have played at a point-per-game pace over the course of the streak: **Duchene** (1.38), **Jason Robertson** (1.25), **Jamie Benn** (1.13), **Miro Heiskanen** (1.13), **Wyatt Johnston** (1.13), **Thomas Harley** (1.00), **Roope Hintz** (1.00) and **Mikko Rantanen** (1.00).
- **Duchene's** seven goals during that span were tied for the third-most in the NHL entering play Sunday.

WHALE WATCHING

- Dallas is 101-76-30 all-time vs. Vancouver, including a 46-42-15 mark on the road.
- The Stars have earned points in six of their last seven games played against the Canucks (5-1-1) dating back to Dec. 21, 2023.
 - Dallas has also won their last three matchups vs. Vancouver at Rogers Arena, outscoring them 11-4 during that span.
- **Roope Hintz** enters tonight's contest having totaled eight points (4-4-8) in his last six games played against the Canucks. In all, **Hintz** has registered 12 points (7-5-12) in 16 career games vs. Vancouver.
- **Jamie Benn** has registered 39 points (17-22-39) in 45 career games against the Canucks, carrying a plus-minus rating of +6.
 - He enters tonight's contest riding a two-game point streak vs. Vancouver, earning three points (0-3-3) during that span.
 - **Benn's** 39 points vs. Vancouver ranks first among active Stars skaters and tied for 14th among active NHL skaters.
 - His five game-winning goals against them are tied for the third most among active NHL skaters.
- **Jason Robertson** enters tonight's matchup riding a seven-game point streak against the Canucks, totaling 12 points (5-7-12) during that span, including four multi-point outings. In all, **Robertson** has 14 points (5-9-14) in 14 career games vs. Vancouver.
- **Matt Duchene** enters tonight's contest riding a three-game point streak against the Canucks, recording five points (1-4-5) during that span. In all, **Duchene** has 33 points (15-18-33) in 48 career games vs. Vancouver.
- **Miro Heiskanen** has recorded 11 points (1-10-11) in 15 career games against the Canucks, leading active Stars defensemen. **Heiskanen** is also averaging 25:38 of time on ice per game played against them which ranks fourth among all active NHL skaters.
- **Sam Steel** has eight points (8-0-8) in 15 career games vs. Vancouver, including his lone hat trick on March 26, 2019 at Vancouver (w/ Anaheim). **Steel** has goals in six of his 15 appearances against the Canucks.

- **Mavrik Bourque** enters tonight's contest riding a three-game point streak vs. Vancouver, collecting three goals during that span. It is his longest point streak against a single opponent in his career.
 - He has registered three goals in five career games played against the Canucks, averaging 12:48 of time on ice per game.
- **Esa Lindell** upholds a career plus-minus rating of +8 against Vancouver through 23 games played (2-4—6).
- **Colin Blackwell** tallied the game-winning goal in Dallas' last meeting against the Canucks on Nov. 20, 2025. He has totaled two points (1-1—2) in 10 career games played vs. Vancouver.
- **Thomas Harley** enters tonight's game riding a four-game point streak against the Canucks, earning four points (1-3—4) during that span. In all, **Harley** has totaled six points (2-4—6) in nine career games played vs. Vancouver, averaging 19:52 of time on ice per game.
- **Justin Hryckowian** recorded his first point (assist) against the Canucks in the teams' last meeting on Nov. 20, 2025.
- If plays tonight, **Arttu Hyry** will appear in his first career game vs. Vancouver.

JAKE AND BAKE

- **Jake Oettinger** has won the last seven games he has played dating back to Jan. 20, taking down the Blues (3x), Bruins, Golden Knights, Jets and Predators. It is the second-longest win streak of his career, trailing only the eight consecutive games he won from March 20 to April 9, 2024.
 - **Oettinger's** eight-game win streak during the 2023-24 season is the longest in Dallas Stars team history (since 1993-94).
 - His seven-game win streak was the second-longest active such streak in the NHL entering play Sunday.
- If **Oettinger** were to win the next game he plays, it would make him the seventh goaltender this season to win at least eight consecutive games.
- **Oettinger's** seven-game win streak is tied for the third-longest in franchise history and the second-longest in Dallas Stars team history (since 1993-94).
- In all, **Oettinger** has won 24 games this season, which was tied for the third-most in the NHL entering play Sunday.

BIKER GANG

- **Thomas Harley** has totaled 26 points (5-21—26) in 47 games this season. Despite missing 12 games with an injury, his 26 points rank second among Stars defensemen this year, trailing only **Miro Heiskanen's** 48 points (7-41—48).
- **Harley** enters tonight's contest having recorded 10 points (3-7—10) in his last 10 games played.
- **Harley** enters tonight's game riding a career-long five-game point streak, totaling six points (2-4—6) during that span. His five-game point streak was tied for the third-longest active point streak among NHL defensemen entering play Sunday.
- **Harley** has scored 37 goals in his career and enters tonight's game one goal shy of tying Richard Matvichuk (38) for the 14th-most in franchise history by a defenseman.
- When **Harley** was on the ice during 5-on-5 play in Dallas' game on Feb. 25 – a 4-1 win over the Seattle – the Stars outscored the Kraken 3-0 and outshot them 12-3 according to Natural Stat Trick. **Harley** tallied two assists in the win.
- **Harley** scored the sixth overtime goal of his career in Dallas' game on Feb. 2 against Winnipeg, which is tied for the fourth-most in franchise history. **Harley** and John Klingberg are the only two defensemen in franchise history to score six overtime goals.
 - **Harley** also scored the series-clinching overtime goal against Winnipeg in Game 6 of the Second Round of the 2025 Stanley Cup Playoffs.
- **Harley's** six overtime goals since the start of the 2023-24 season are tied for the ninth-most in the NHL and top all NHL defensemen during that span.
- Three of **Harley's** five goals this season have stood as game winners, which is tied for the most in his career in a single season. He also scored three game-winning goals in both 2023-24 and 2024-25.
- **Harley's** three game-winning goals this year were tied for the seventh-most among all NHL defensemen this season entering play Sunday.

HEATING UP

- **Matt Duchene** enters tonight's game having totaled 11 points (7-4—11) in his last eight games played.
- **Jamie Benn** has recorded nine points (2-7—9) in the Stars last six games, including a three-point showing (2-1—3) in Dallas' game on Feb. 4 against St. Louis.
- **Miro Heiskanen** has recorded 12 assists in his last 10 games played dating back to Jan. 20. If he were to tally an assist tonight, it would give him assists in six consecutive games for the first time this season.
 - **Heiskanen's** current five-game assist streak was tied for the second-longest such streak in the NHL entering play Sunday.
- **Roope Hintz** has eight points (1-7—8) in his last eight games played dating back to Jan. 20 against the Boston Bruins.
- **Jason Robertson** has recorded multi-point efforts in five of the last 10 games that he has played, totaling 12 points in all (6-6—12) during that span.
- **Robertson** scored the 200th goal of his career in Dallas' game on Feb. 4 against St. Louis, becoming the...
 - First player taken in the 2017 NHL draft to score 200 career goals.
 - Twenty-fifth active American, and 80th in NHL history, to reach the 200-goal milestone.
 - Twelfth skater in franchise history to score 200 goals with the team.

- Dallas' tilt against St. Louis was the 431st game of **Robertson's** career, making the second-fastest player to record 200 goals with the Stars/North Stars according to NHL Stats, trailing only Dino Ciccarelli (381 GP). **Robertson** also required the ninth-fewest games among U.S.-born players to reach 200 career goal according to NHL Stats.

POWER UP

- The Stars have gone 52-for-173 on the power play this season for a 30.1 percent success rate, which was the second-best mark in the NHL entering play Sunday.
- The Oilers (54), Stars (52) and Wild (52) were the only teams to score at least 50 power-play goals this season entering play Sunday.
- If the Stars were to score on the man advantage tonight, it would give them power-play goals in six consecutive games for the first time since the team scored a power-play goal in eight straight games earlier this season from Nov. 1 to 15.
- Dallas' 52 power-play goals are just three shy of the 55 they scored in 82 games last season. The team is currently on pace to finish the year with 72 power-play goals, which would tie for the sixth-most in Dallas Stars team history.
- Dallas has scored at least two power-play goals in a game 16 different times this season, most recently on Jan. 31 against the Utah Mammoth, a 3-2 win. The Stars had 12 multi-power-play-goal games in all of 2024-25.
 - Their 16 multi-power-play goal games are their most in a season since they scored at least two power-play goals in a game 17 times in 2022-23.
 - The Stars have scored two power-play goals in four of the last eight games that they have played.
- The Stars scored two power-play goals 14 seconds apart in their game on Nov. 1 at Florida, which set the franchise record for the fastest consecutive power-play goals for according to NHL Stats. They bested the previous record of 15 second set by Steve Payne and Mike Fidler on March 21, 1979 against the Philadelphia Flyers while the team was still located in Minnesota.
- Dallas' 52 power-play goals have been scored by 11 different skaters: **Wyatt Johnston** (20), **Jason Robertson** (11), **Roope Hintz** (6), **Mikko Rantanen** (5), **Matt Duchene** (4), **Mavrik Bourque**, **Thomas Harley**, **Miro Heiskanen**, **Justin Hryckowian**, **Tyler Seguin** and **Sam Steel**.
 - **Robertson's** 11 power-play goals are just two shy of matching his career high that he reached in both 2021-22 and 2022-23.
- **Johnston** (20-11—31) was tied for third in the NHL in power-play points this season entering play Sunday, followed by **Rantanen** (5-25—30), who ranked fifth, and **Robertson** (11-17—28), who was tied for seventh.
 - **Johnston's** 31 power-play points are already a career high. **Robertson's** 28 power-play points are the third-most of his career and **Rantanen's** 30 power-play points are the sixth-most of his career.
- **Johnston's** 20 power-play goals led the NHL entering play Sunday and were five more than the second-ranked skaters (three tied with 15).
- His 20 power-play goals are already a career high and are the most in a single-season in Dallas Stars team history (since 1993-94).
 - **Johnston's** 20 power-play goals are two shy of tying the single-season franchise record (Dino Ciccarelli with 22 in 1986-87).
- **Heiskanen** has totaled 19 points (1-18—19) on the power-play this season, which was tied for the fifth-most among all NHL defensemen entering play Sunday.

REWRITING THE RECORD BOOKS

- **Wyatt Johnston** scored his 19th power-play goal of the season in Dallas' game on Feb. 25 against Seattle, setting the Dallas Stars team record (since 1993-94) that Mike Modano previously held with 18 during the 1993-94 season, the Stars' first year playing in Texas.
- He scored on the power play again in the Stars' next game on Feb. 28, a 3-2 overtime win over the Nashville Predators.
- His 20 power-play goals are already tied for the fourth-most in a single season in franchise history and are two shy of tying the franchise record of 22 that Dino Ciccarelli set during the 1986-87 season.
- **Johnston** is pacing to score 28 power-play goals this year, which would be the most by a Stars skater in franchise history and would be the most by any NHL skater since Edmonton's Leon Drasaitl scored 32 power-play goals in 2022-23.
- Since the start of the 2024-25 season, **Johnston** has scored 31 power-play goals, which was tied with Draisaitl for the most in the NHL during that span entering play Sunday.

THE ROARING TWENTIES

- The line of **Mavrik Bourque**, **Roope Hintz** and **Jason Robertson** has played 206:30 together at 5-on-5 this season. During that time, the Stars have outscored their opponents 12-7, have a 67.7 expected goals for percentage, a 59.3 shots for percentage and a 60.0 Corsi rating according to Natural Stat Trick.
- According to MoneyPuck.com, the line has a 67.2 expected goals for percentage, which was the best mark of any forward line in the NHL to play at least 150 minutes together entering play Sunday.
- In Dallas' game on Jan. 20 against Boston, when the trio was on the ice the Stars outscored the Bruins 2-0 and outshot them 8-1 at 5-on-5 according to Natural Stat Trick.
 - All three players had two points in the game – **Robertson** scored two goals, **Hintz** had two assists and **Bourque** had a goal and an assist.
- The Stars owned a 60 percent Corsi rating and a 58.7 expected goals for percentage at 5-on-5 when the line was on the ice on Jan. 22 against the Blue Jackets.
- In the Stars' game on Jan. 29 against Vegas, the team had a 79.9 expected goals for percentage and a 59.1 Corsi rating when the trio was on the ice during 5-on-5 play according to Natural Stat Trick.

- On Feb. 2 against Winnipeg, the line had a 74.8 percent on-ice expected goals for percentage and a 68.8 Corsi rating.
- **Hintz** and **Robertson** both assisted on **Bourque's** goal on Feb. 4 against the St. Louis Blues. It marked the 200th time the two have factored in on the same goal according to NHL Stats, which is the third-most in Dallas Stars team history (since 1993-94). They trail only **Jamie Benn** and **Tyler Seguin** (272) and Mike Modano and Jere Lehtinen (242).
- Despite playing in only 59 games this season, **Bourque** (11-12—23) is two assists and two points shy of matching his totals from last season that he reached in 73 games. **Bourque** finished the 2024-25 campaign with 11 goals, 14 assists and 25 points.
 - He's currently pacing to finish the season with a career high 15 goals, 17 assists and 32 points.

CAREER YEARS ARE NEAR

- **Wyatt Johnston** is currently on pace to finish the year with 44 goals, 43 assists and 87 points, all of which would be career highs.
 - **Johnston** enters tonight's game just one goal shy of matching his career high of 33 that he set last season.
- **Johnston** is pacing to score 28 power-play goals this year, which would be the most by a Stars skater in franchise history and would be the most by any NHL skater since Edmonton's Leon Drasaitl scored 32 power-play goals in 2022-23.
- **Jason Robertson** (46) and **Johnston** (44) are both pacing to finish the season with at least 40 goals. If they were to maintain that pace, they would become the first pair of 40-goal Stars teammates since Brian Bellows (55) and Dave Gagner (40) in 1989-90.
 - There have been five instances in franchise history of Stars teammates scoring at least 40 goals in the same year, but none have occurred since the team relocated to Dallas in 1993-94.
- **Esa Lindell** has totaled 23 points (5-18—23) in 59 games this year, which is the third-most among Stars defensemen this season. It puts him on pace to finish the season with 25 assists, which would be a career high.
 - His 18 assists this season are only three shy of matching his career high that he's reached on four previous occasions, most recently last year.
- **Sam Steel** is currently on pace to finish the season with 11 goals and 31 points, both of which would be career highs.

IT'S NOT OVER 'TIL IT'S OVER

- The Stars scored a goal with less than a minute and a half in three straight games against the Blues to win in regulation. **Jason Robertson** scored with 60 seconds left on Jan. 23 to defeat the Blues 3-2, **Thomas Harley** scored with 67 seconds left on Jan. 27 to secure a 4-3 Stars win and **Jamie Benn** scored with 22 second remaining in Dallas' last game on Feb. 4 to beat the Blues 5-4.
- At the time, **Robertson's** goal was the latest game-winning goal in regulation for the Stars since **Harley** scored at 19:55 on March 4, 2025 to help Dallas defeat the New Jersey Devils 4-3.
- With his game-winning goal on Jan. 27, **Harley** became the first defenseman in franchise history with multiple go-ahead goals within the final 90 seconds of regulation according to NHL Stats.
- **Harley** became the fourth active defenseman with multiple go-ahead goals within the final 90 seconds of regulation according to NHL Stats, alongside Shea Theodore (3x), Drew Doughty (2x) and Charlie McAvoy (2x).
- **Benn's** goal on Feb. 4 was his second career go-ahead goal in the final minute of regulation, which tied Brian Lawton for the second-most in franchise history according to NHL Stats. Only Dino Ciccarelli (3) has more.

STAR SEARCH

- Three Dallas players have earned NHL Star of the Week honors this season: **Jason Robertson**, **Wyatt Johnston** and **Jake Oettinger**. Dallas is the only NHL team this season to have three different players be named a Star of the Week.
- **Robertson** was named the NHL's First Star of the Week for the week ending on Nov. 16 after leading the League in both goals (6) and points (9) in three games played. It marks the sixth time in his career that he has earned Star of the Week honors.
 - He was named the First Star of the Week for the week ending on Nov. 6, Nov. 27 and April 13 during the 2022-23 season and for the week ending on March 6 during the 2021-22 season.
 - He also earned Third Star of the Week honors for the week ending on Dec. 4, 2022.
- **Robertson** was then named the NHL's Second Star of the Month for November after leading the League with 13 goals and tying for the team lead with 26 points.
- **Johnston** was named the NHL's First Star of the Week for the week ending on Nov. 30 after totaling nine points (5-4—9) in four games played, tying for the league lead in goals and ranking second in points during that span. It marked the first time in his career that he earned Star of the Week honors.
- **Jake Oettinger** was named the NHL's Second Star of the Week for the week ending on Dec. 7. It marked the first time in his career that he earned Star of the Week honors.
 - He posted a 3-0-0 record with a .961 save percentage, 0.98 goals-against average and one shutout in three games that week.

IRON SHARPENS IRON

- The Stars have two players on their roster that have played in at least 100 consecutive regular-season games: **Jason Robertson** (351) and **Wyatt Johnston** (305).
- **Robertson's** 351-game Iron Man streak was tied the seventh-longest active such streak in the NHL entering play Sunday.
- **Johnston** has not missed a regular-season game since making his debut in the 2022-23 season opener on Oct. 13, 2022, making him one of 16 players in NHL history to begin their NHL career by playing in at least 305 consecutive games according to NHL Stats. Entering play Sunday, it was tied for the 11th-longest active Iron Man streak in the NHL.
- **Johnston** was one of 21 players to appear in at least 246 regular-season games from 2022-23 to 2024-25. Only Will Borgen (248) and Charlie Coyle (247) appeared in more.
 - Borgen (84) and Coyle (83), who were traded midseason, both played in more than 82 regular-season games in 2024-25.

THE FINNISH FOUR

- Dallas' roster currently houses four Finns: **Miro Heiskanen**, **Roope Hintz**, **Esa Lindell** and **Mikko Rantanen**. Dallas' four Finns all hail from different Finnish cities: Espoo (**Heiskanen**), Nokia (**Hintz**), Nousiainen (**Rantanen**) and Vantaa (**Lindell**).
- **Heiskanen**, **Lindell** and **Rantanen** were three of the six players selected to Finland's preliminary Olympic roster with **Hintz** expected to join them in Milan this year. Prior to their time together on the Stars, various combinations of the four Finns had played together in international competition.
 - All four players were selected to represent their home country at the Four Nations Face-Off last February before **Heiskanen** had to withdraw due to injury.
 - **Heiskanen** and **Lindell** won a gold medal together at the 2022 IIHF World Championship.
 - **Heiskanen** and **Rantanen** represented Finland together at the 2018 IIHF World Championship.
 - **Lindell** and **Rantanen** won a silver medal together at the 2016 IIHF World Championship.
 - **Hintz** and **Rantanen** played together at the 2015 and 2016 IIHF World Junior Championships, winning a gold medal in 2016.
- The four Finns, along with current Ducks forward and former Star Mikael Granlund, started Game 2 of the Western Conference Final against the Oilers during the 2025 Stanley Cup Playoffs. It marked the first time in a regular-season or playoff game since the NHL began tracking starters in 1997-98 that all five skaters starting were from Finland.
- In all, 34 Finnish players (28 skaters and six goalies) have appeared in at least one regular-season game for the Stars, the most of any NHL franchise in League history.

- Stars forward **Radek Faksa** and Canucks defenseman Pierre-Olivier Joseph were teammates for a brief time in St. Louis during the 2024-25 season.
- Stars defenseman **Ilya Lyubushkin** played alongside Canucks forward Conor Garland in Arizona from 2018-19 to 2020-21.
- Stars Player Development Assistant **Jordie Benn** and Canucks defenseman Derek Forbort played together in Winnipeg during the 2020-21 season.

- Stars forward **Colin Blackwell** and defenseman **Nils Lundkvist** were teammates with Canucks forward Filip Chytil on the New York Rangers. Chytil shared the ice with Blackwell in 2020-21 and then Lundkvist in 2021-22.
- Stars forward **Radek Faksa** and Canucks forward Filip Chytil skated for Team Czechia during the 2017-18 and 2018-29 IIHF World Championship.
- Stars goaltender **Casey DeSmith** and Canucks forward Conor Garland were teammates on Team USA at the 2023 IIHF World Championship.
- Stars forward **Colin Blackwell** and goaltender **Jake Oettinger** shared the ice with Canucks forward Conor Garland on Team USA during the 2021 IIHF World Championship.
- Stars defenseman **Nils Lundkvist** and Canucks forward Nils Högländer skated for Team Sweden during the 2020 IIHF World Junior Championship and IIHF U18 World Junior Championship.
- Stars forward **Jamie Benn** and Canucks forward Evander Kane both played for Team Canada during the 2008 IIHF World Junior Championship and 2012 IIHF World Championship.
- Stars forward **Matt Duchene** and Canucks forward Evander Kane were teammates on Team Canada during the 2010 IIHF World Championship.
- Stars goaltender **Casey DeSmith** and Canucks forward Drew O'Connor played together for the Pittsburgh Penguins from 2021-22 to 2022-23.
- Stars forward **Matt Duchene** and Canucks defenseman Tyler Myers both played for Team Canada during the 2010 IIHF World Championship and 2008 IIHF U18 World Junior Championship.
- Stars forwards **Mikko Rantanen** and **Roope Rintz** and defenseman **Esa Lindell** and Canucks goaltender Kevin Lankinen all skated for Team Finland at the 2025 NHL Four Nations Faceoff.
- Stars forward **Radek Faksa** and Canucks forward David Kampf and defenseman Filip Hronek represented Team Czechia during the 2026 IIHF Winter Olympic Games in Milan.
