Post-Game Notes

- The Tampa Bay Lightning lost 3-2 in overtime to the Winnipeg Jets on Wednesday night at AMALIE Arena.
- The Lightning picked up five of six possible points during the three-game homestand.
- The Bolts record dropped to 9-6-5 overall and to 6-2-3 on home ice.
- The Lightning are 1-5 in games decided in overtime this season.
- Tampa Bay has dropped nine of its last 10 regular-season games decided in overtime.
- The Bolts slid to 2-3-0 against Central Division opponents and 5-3-1 against Western Conference opponents.
- The Lightning moved to 3-6-1 over their last 10 games against the Jets and 4-5-1 over their last 10 matchups with Winnipeg at AMALIE Arena.
- The Lightning were outshot 32-31, including an 8-4 deficit in the third period and a 3-1 shot deficit in overtime.
- Tampa Bay has been outshot 17-1 in overtime this season.
- Brandon Hagel and Brayden Point led the Lightning with five shots on goal apiece.
- Tanner Jeannot dished out a team-high five hits.
- Nick Paul won eight of 10 faceoffs to lead the Lightning.

- Lightning goaltender Jonas Johansson made 29 saves on 32 shots as his record fell to 8-5-4.
- Josh Morrissey gave the Jets a 1-0 lead, scoring on a rebound at 5:29 of the first period.
- Mark Scheifele extended Winnipeg's lead to 2-0 with a power-play goal at 13:06 of the first period.
- Steven Stamkos cut the Jets' lead to 2-1 with a power-play goal from the left circle at 18:06 of the first period.
- The goal marked Stamkos' 21st point of the season (8-13—21) and his 12th on the power play (3-9—12).
- Stamkos has pointed in eight of his last nine games against the Jets (5-8—13) and in 22 of his 25 career matchups with Winnipeg (15-18—32).
- Stamkos' power-play goal was the 198th of his career, passing Jarome Iginla (197) to tie Brian Bellows (198) for the 20th most in NHL History (since PP goals were first tracked in 1933-34). Alex Ovechkin is the only active player with more (300).
- Stamkos extended his point streak to four games (3-3—6) and has scored a goal in three straight.
- Nikita Kucherov picked up the primary assist to tally his 29th point of the season (13-16—29) and his 14th power-play point (5-9—14).
- Kucherov extended his point streak and assist streak to four games (2-4-6).
- Kucherov has found the scoresheet in eight of his last nine games against Winnipeg (6-7—13).
- Victor Hedman notched the primary assist, registering his 21st point of the season (4-17—21) and his seventh power-play point (1-6—7).
- Hedman has tallied six points over his last four games against the Jets (1-5—6).
- Brayden Point leveled the score at two, tucking a shot short-side high from the bottom of the left circle at 6:13 of the second period.
- The goal marked Point's 24th point of the season (8-16—24).
- Brayden Point scored his 59th goal since the start of last season, surpassing Leon Draisaitl for the fourth most over that span. The only players with more are

David Pastrnak (73), Connor McDavid (70) and Mikko Rantanen (66).

- Brandon Hagel recorded the lone assist and picked up his 19th point of the season (9-10—19).
- Adam Lowry scored the game-winning goal at 1:38 of overtime, lifting the Jets to a 3-2 victory.
- The Tampa Bay Lightning will travel to Carolina to take on the Hurricanes on Friday night at PNC Arena in Raleigh (7:00pm puck drop).
- The Bolts are 70-52-11 with 10 ties all-time against the Hurricanes, including a road record of 27-30-8 with seven ties.
