- With the win, the Stars reached the 50-win mark for the third consecutive season, marking the team’s longest run in franchise history, surpassing back-to-back campaigns in 2005-06 and 2006-07 according to NHL Stats.
- **Mavrik Bourque** scored his 20th goal of the season. Six of his 20 goals were game openers, tied with **Jason Robertson** for the second most by a Dallas player this season – **Wyatt Johnston** paced the team with eight.

GAME NOTES

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Tonight marks the Stars’ 430th postseason game in franchise history. They enter the 2026 Stanley Cup Playoffs with a 217-212 all-time postseason record.
- The Stars enter the 2026 postseason ranked eighth all-time in playoff wins with 217.
- Dallas has a 34-33 all-time record in Game 1s including a 14-16 record on home ice.
- 2026 marks the first trip to the Stanley Cup Playoffs for rookies **Justin Hryckowian** and **Arttu Hyry**.

- **Mikko Rantanen** is the only player on Dallas' active roster who has previously won the Stanley Cup. He hoisted the Cup in 2022 with the Avalanche, finishing the postseason with 25 points (5-20—25) in 20 games, which was good for fifth in the NHL is scoring that year.
- 2026 marks the first trip to the Stanley Cup Playoffs for rookies **Justin Hryckowian** and **Arttu Hyry**.

WILD THINGS

- In the postseason, Dallas is 8-4 all-time vs. Minnesota, including a 4-2 mark on home ice.
 - In the regular season, the Stars are 56-29-13 all-time against the Wild, with a 35-8-7 mark at home.
- Dallas has a 34-33 all-time record in Game 1s including a 14-16 record on home ice, while Minnesota is 4-13 in Game 1s with a 4-9 record on the road.
- **Mikko Rantanen** is set to play in his first career playoff game against the Wild.
 - **Rantanen** has totaled 44 points (17-27—44) in 42 career regular-season games played vs. Minnesota, carrying a plus-minus rating of +18 and averaging 19:50 of time on ice per game.
 - He has registered 11 multi-point outings against them.
- **Wyatt Johnston** tied teammate **Esa Lindell** (1-4—5) for the team lead in scoring against the Wild during the regular season, collecting five points (2-3—5) in four games.
 - In six career playoff games vs. Minnesota, **Johnston** has tallied two points (1-1—2).
- **Jason Robertson** enters tonight's contest riding a three-game playoff point streak against the Wild, earning four points (1-3—4) during that span. In all, **Robertson** has registered seven points (2-5—7) in six career playoff games played vs. Minnesota, averaging 1.17 points per game.
 - In the regular season, **Robertson** has recorded 22 points (14-8—22) in 19 games played. He closed out the regular season against them riding a five-game point streak (4-1—5).
- **Matt Duchene** has put up three points (0-3—3) in two career playoff games against the Wild, averaging 20:15 of time on ice per game and 1.50 points per game.
- **Jamie Benn** has totaled 14 points (5-9—14) in 12 career playoff games vs. Minnesota, carrying a plus-minus rating of +7 and averaging 1.17 points per game.
 - His 14 career playoff points against them rank tied for third among all active NHL skaters.
 - Has posted 50 points (20-30—50) in 62 career regular-season games played against them with a plus-minus rating of +9.
- **Miro Heiskanen** has registered six points (0-6—6) through six career playoff games against the Wild, upholding a plus-minus rating of +4 and averaging 29:03 of time on ice per game.
 - His 29:03 of time on ice per game in the playoffs against them top all active NHL skaters.
 - In 22 regular-season games played vs. Minnesota, **Heiskanen** has put up 18 points (2-16—18) with a plus-minus rating of +10.
- **Roope Hintz** enters tonight's matchup riding a three-game playoff point streak against the Wild, collecting seven points (1-6—7) during that span. In all, **Hintz** has notched 12 points (5-7—12) in six career playoff games vs. Minnesota, carrying plus-minus rating of +3 and averaging 2.00 points per game.
 - His 2.00 points per game against them in the playoffs top all active NHL skaters.
 - **Hintz** has posted five points (1-4—5) in his last four regular-season games against the Wild. In all, he has totaled 24 points (10-14—24) through 25 career regular-season games against them, posting a plus-minus rating of +12.
- **Jake Oettinger** – a native of Lakeville, Minnesota – owns a 4-2 career playoff record against Minnesota, posting a .929 save percentage, 2.01 goals against average and one shutout.
 - His four playoff wins against them are tied for the second-most among all active NHL netminders.

PLAYOFF BOUND*

- The Stars clinched their berth to the 2026 Stanley Cup Playoffs with Utah's win over Los Angeles on March 22.
- The Stars are making their fifth consecutive postseason appearance, tied for the second-longest run in franchise history, behind seven straight playoff berths from 1980 to 1986.
- Dallas has made it to the Conference Finals in each of the past three postseasons. The Stars will look to become the third team in the past 40 years to reach the Conference Finals in four straight playoffs, following Colorado (4; 1999-2002) and Detroit (4; 1995-1998).
- The Stars have earned six series wins since 2023, the third most among all teams behind Florida (11) and Edmonton (7).

PARTY LIKE IT'S 1999

- The Stars enter the 2026 Stanley Cup Playoffs looking to win their second Stanley Cup in franchise history after defeating the Buffalo Sabres in six games to bring the team's first championship to Dallas in 1999.
- At the time of the Stars' first Stanley Cup win, 10 players on the team's current roster had yet to be born: **Oskar Bäck**, **Mavrik Bourque**, **Lian Bichsel**, **Thomas Harley**, **Miro Heiskanen**, **Justin Hryckowian**, **Arttu Hyry**, **Wyatt Johnston**, **Nils Lundkvist** and **Jason Robertson**.
 - **Heiskanen** (July 18, 1999) and **Robertson** (July 22, 1999) were both born about a month after the Stars hoisted the Stanley Cup.
- The Stars defeated the Sabres 2-1 on June 19, 1999 to secure the franchise's first-ever championship. On that day...
 - The number one song in the United States was "If You Had My Love" by Jennifer Lopez.

- o The number one movie was Disney's "Tarzan."
- o The 1999 FIFA Women's World Cup began the same day. The United States would ultimately go on to win the tournament, led by superstars Mia Hamm and Brandi Chastain.

FAMILIAR FOES

- The 2026 Stanley Cup Playoffs will mark the third time in franchise history that the Stars will face off against the Wild in a playoff series, owning a 2-0 record in their previous two postseason meetings.
- In all, the Stars have an 8-4 record against the Wild in 12 playoff games. The team's eight wins (tied) and .667 win percentage against the Wild are both tied for the fourth-best mark in NHL history.
 - o A series win in the first round would give the Stars 12 playoff wins against the Wild, which would tie Chicago for the most against Minnesota in NHL history.
- Dallas has outscored Minnesota 42-31 in their 12 playoff games against each other. The Stars' 3.50 goals per game is the best mark of any team against the Wild in the postseason.
- The Stars have gone 13-for-43 on the power play against the Wild in the postseason. Their 30.2 percent conversion rate is the best mark of any team that has played Minnesota in the playoffs.

PLAYOFF PROWESS

- **Mikko Rantanen** is a point-per-game player in the postseason in his career, totaling 123 points (43-80—123) in 99 Stanley Cup Playoff games.
 - o **Rantanen** had a career-best nine goals during the 2025 postseason, finishing the playoffs with 22 points (9-13—22) in 18 games. His 22 points tied for seventh in the NHL and tied for the 11th-highest scoring postseason in franchise history.
- His 123 career playoff points are the 11th-most among all active skaters and rank third in NHL history among Finnish players.
- **Miro Heiskanen** has notched 65 career playoff points (17-48—65) in 93 Stanley Cup Playoff games, which ranks 10th among all active defensemen.
- **Wyatt Johnston** has totaled 32 points (18-14—32) in 56 career postseason games, leading all players drafted in 2021 in career playoff games played, goals, assists, points, points per game (0.57), even-strength goals (13), even-strength points (22), power-play goals (4), power-play points (9), shorthanded goals (1), overtime goals (1) and game-winning goals (5).
- Since making his postseason debut in 2023, **Johnston's** 32 points are tied for third on Dallas' roster and his 18 goals are tied for the team lead.
- **Thomas Harley** leads all 2019 draftees in career playoff games played (57), assists (22), points (27), even-strength points (18), power-play points (8), overtime goals (1), and game-winning goals (1, tied).
- **Harley** had a career year during the 2025 Stanley Cup Playoffs, finishing the Stars' postseason run with 14 points (4-10—14) in 18 games, ranking second on both the team and among all NHL defensemen in postseason scoring.

REGULAR SEASON RECAP

- The Stars ended the regular season with a 50-20-12 record, 112 points and a .683 points percentage, finishing the year ranked third in the NHL in wins (tied), points and points percentage.
- The 2025-26 campaign marked the team's fifth-consecutive 40-win season and is the first time in franchise history that the team has won at least 50 games for three straight years.
- Their 112 points and .683 points percentage were both tied for the third-best mark in a single season in franchise history and makes the 2025-26 season the fourth consecutive year that the team has finished the regular season with at least 100 points.
- The team's success this season came despite logging 314 man games lost with **Tyler Seguin, Jamie Benn, Mikko Rantanen** and others all missing significant time with injury.

DYNAMIC DUO

- **Wyatt Johnston** and **Jason Robertson** both scored 45 goals in 2025-26, tying for fourth in the League in goals this season.
- **Johnston's** 45 goals were a career high and **Robertson's** 45 were one shy of matching his career best of 46.
- The duo's 90 combined goals this season were the second-most by any set of teammates this year, trailing Colorado's Nathan MacKinnon (53) and Martin Necas (38), who combined to score 91 goals this season.
- **Johnston** and **Robertson** are the sixth pair of teammates in franchise history – and first in Dallas Stars team history (since 1993-94) – to score at least 40 goals in the same season.
- The pair's 45 goals tied for the third-most in a single season in Dallas Stars team history (since 1993-94), trailing only **Robertson's** 46 goals in 2021-22 and Mike Modano's 50 goals in 1993-94.
- Both of **Johnston** (41) and **Robertson** (51) recorded at least 40 assists this year, making them the third set of teammates in Stars/North Stars history to each register 40 goals and 40 assists in a single season according to NHL Stats. They joined Dino Ciccarelli and Brian Bellows (1987-88) as well as Ciccarelli and Bobby Smith (1981-82).

POWER TRIP

- The Stars went 71-for-248 on the power play this season for a 28.6 percent success rate, which set a franchise record for best power-play conversion rate in a single season and was also the second-best mark in the NHL this year.
- The team's 71 power-play goals this year topped the League and was the Stars' most in a single season since they scored 79 times on the man advantage in 2006-07.

- Dallas scored at least two power-play goals in a game 18 different times this season, their highest total since they also scored at least two power-play goals in a game 18 times in 2007-08.
- The Stars scored two power-play goals 14 seconds apart in their game on Nov. 1 at Florida, which set the franchise record for the fastest consecutive power-play goals for according to NHL Stats. They bested the previous record of 15 second set by Steve Payne and Mike Fidler on March 21, 1979 against the Philadelphia Flyers while the team was still located in Minnesota.
- Fourteen different skaters scored at least one power-play goal for the Stars this year: **Wyatt Johnston** (27), **Jason Robertson** (15), **Roope Hintz** (6), **Mikko Rantanen** (6), **Matt Duchene** (5), **Miro Heiskanen** (2), **Justin Hryckowian** (2), **Jamie Benn** (2), **Mavrik Bourque**, **Michael Bunting**, **Thomas Harley**, **Esa Lindell**, **Tyler Seguin** and **Sam Steel**.
 - The Stars, Kraken and Blues were the only teams to have 14 unique power-play goal scorers during the regular season.
- **Johnston** (27-15—42) tied for fourth in the NHL in power-play points this year, followed by **Robertson** (15-26—41), who ranked fifth, and **Rantanen** (6-28—34), who was tied for eighth.
- **Johnston** scored his 23rd power-play goal of the season in Dallas' March 22 game, establishing a new franchise record for power-play goals in a season.
 - The record was previously held by Dino Ciccarelli, who scored 22 power-play goals for the Minnesota North Stars in 1986-87.
- He finished the season with 27 power-play goals, which were the second-most in a single-season in the NHL in the post-lockout era (since 2005-06).
- **Johnston's** 27 power-play goals this year topped the NHL and were seven more than the second-ranked skater (Vegas' Pavel Dorofeyev).
- **Heiskanen** totaled 28 points (2-26—28) on the power play this season, which tied for the fourth-most among all NHL defensemen.

IRON SHARPENS IRON

- Four players appeared in all 82 regular-season games for the Stars this season: **Mavrik Bourque**, **Wyatt Johnston**, **Esa Lindell** and **Jason Robertson**.
- The 2025-26 campaign is the fourth consecutive year that **Robertson** played in all 82 regular-season games. He finished the season riding a 374-game Iron Man streak, which is the second-longest such streak in franchise history and the eighth-longest active streak in the NHL.
- This is also the fourth-straight year that **Johnston** has played in all 82 games. He has not missed a regular-season game since making his NHL debut at the start of the 2022-23 season, making him one of 13 players in NHL history to begin their career by playing in at least 328 consecutive games according to NHL Stats.

THE FINNISH FIVE

- Dallas' roster currently houses five Finns: **Miro Heiskanen**, **Roope Hintz**, **Arttu Hyry**, **Esa Lindell** and **Mikko Rantanen**. Dallas' five Finns all hail from different Finnish cities: Espoo (**Heiskanen**), Nokia (**Hintz**), Nousiainen (**Rantanen**), Oulu (**Hyry**) and Vantaa (**Lindell**).
- **Heiskanen**, **Lindell** and **Rantanen** were three of the six players selected to Finland's preliminary Olympic roster with **Hintz** expected to join them in Milan this year. Prior to their time together on the Stars, various combinations of the Finns had played together in international competition.
 - All four players were selected to represent their home country at the Four Nations Face-Off last February before **Heiskanen** had to withdraw due to injury.
 - **Heiskanen** and **Lindell** won a gold medal together at the 2022 IIHF World Championship.
 - **Heiskanen** and **Rantanen** represented Finland together at the 2018 IIHF World Championship.
 - **Lindell** and **Rantanen** won a silver medal together at the 2016 IIHF World Championship.
 - **Hintz** and **Rantanen** played together at the 2015 and 2016 IIHF World Junior Championships, winning a gold medal in 2016.
- **Heiskanen**, **Hintz**, **Lindell** and **Rantanen**, along with current Ducks forward and former Star Mikael Granlund, started Game 2 of the Western Conference Final against the Oilers during the 2025 Stanley Cup Playoffs. It marked the first time in a regular-season or playoff game since the NHL began tracking starters in 1997-98 that all five skaters starting were from Finland.
- In all, 34 Finnish players (28 skaters and six goalies) have appeared in at least one regular-season game for the Stars, the most of any NHL franchise in League history.

- Stars goaltender **Jake Oettinger** and Wild forward Matt Boldy and defenseman Brock Faber played for Team USA in the 2025 Four Nations tournament.
- Stars goaltender **Jake Oettinger** and Wild forward Matt Boldy and defensemen Brock Faber and Quinn Hughes all won the gold medal with Team USA at the 2026 Winter Olympic Games in Milan.
- Stars goaltender **Jake Oettinger** and Wild defenseman Quinn Hughes represented Team USA during the 2018 IIHF World Junior Championship.
- Stars forward **Jason Robertson** and Wild defenseman Quinn Hughes skated on Team USA together during the 2019 IIHF World Junior Championship.
- Stars defenseman **Tyler Myers** and Wild forward Quinn Hughes were teammates in Vancouver from 2019-20 to 2025-26.
 - Stars goaltender **Casey DeSmith** joined the two in Vancouver during the 2023-24 season.
- Stars defenseman **Ilya Lyubushkin** and Wild forward Vinnie Hinostroza were teammates in Arizona for the 2018-19 and 2019-20 seasons. They also played together in Buffalo in 2022-23.
- Stars forward **Mikko Rantanen** and Wild forward Yakov Trenin played for Colorado during the 2023-24 season.
- Stars defenseman **Tyler Myers** and Wild defenseman Jacob Middleton both represented Team Canada during the 2023 IIHF World Championship
- Stars forward **Matt Duchene** and Wild forward Nick Foligno crossed paths in Columbus following the 2019 trade deadline.
- Stars forward **Colin Blackwell** and Wild forward Nick Foligno shared the ice in Chicago during the 2023-24 season.
- Stars forward **Radek Faksa** skated with Wild forward Robby Fabri in St. Louis during the 2024-25 season.
- Stars forward **Adam Erne** and Wild forward Robby Fabri were teammates in Detroit from 2019-20 to 2022-23.
- Stars defenseman **Tyler Myers** and Wild forward Marcus Foligno skated together in Buffalo from 2011-12 to 2014-15.
- Stars forwards **Michael Bunting** and **Matt Duchene** and Wild forward Michael McCarron all shared the ice in Nashville. Duchene skated with McCarron from 2020-21 to 2022-23 and Bunting skated with him from 2024-25 to the 2026 trade deadline.
- Stars goaltender **Casey DeSmith** and Wild defenseman Jeff Petry were teammates in Pittsburgh during the 2022-23 season.
- Stars Director of Player Personnel **Rich Peverly** and Wild defenseman Zach Bogosian played for the Atlanta Thrashers from 2008-09 to 2010-11.
- Stars VP of Cultural Growth & Strategy **Al Montoya** and Wild defenseman Zach Bogosian played for the Winnipeg Jets during the 2012-13 and 2013-14 seasons.
- Stars goaltending coach **Jeff Reese** and Wild associate coach Jack Capuano both played for the Toronto Maple Leafs in 1989-1990.
