

 - Dadonov's hat trick marks his third-multi goal game this season and the 20th of his career.
- Matt Duchene added an assist (0-1-1) and now has points in five-straight games (2-5-7).

GAME NOTES

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Today is the fourth and final game that the Stars will play against the Wild this season and the second time they are playing in Minnesota this year. Dallas leads the season series: Defeating the Wild with a 2-1 win on Nov. 16. Falling short to Minnesota in a 3-2 OT loss on Dec. 27. Earning a 3-0 win against the Wild on March 24.
- Yesterday's game against the Penguins and today's game against the Wild is the final of 11 back-to-back sets that the Stars will play this season.
 - The Stars have an 8-2 record in the second game of a back-to-back this year.
- The Stars enter today's game with a 50-22-4 record for 104 points and a .684 points percentage. Their 50 wins were the second-most in the NHL and their point total and points percentage ranked third in the NHL this season entering play Saturday.
- In 21 games since the Four Nations break (since Feb. 22), the Stars have outscored their opponents 26-11 at even strength when Cody Ceci has been on the ice. His plus-15 on-ice even-strength goal differential was tied for the fifthbest mark in the NHL during that span entering play Saturday.
- Entering play Saturday, the Stars were the only team this season to have not lost more than two consecutive games.
- Entering play Saturday, the Stars ranked in the top five in the NHL this season in goals for per game (3.42, third) and in goals against per game (2.53, third).

PLAYOFF BOUND

Dallas became the third team to clinch a berth to the 2025 Stanley Cup Playoffs with their 5-1 win over the Kraken in their game on March 29.

- 2024-25 season marks the 37th postseason appearance in franchise history and their fifth time in the past five seasons - tied for the most among all teams in that span according to NHL Stats.
- The Stars have made the Conference Finals in each of their past two postseasons and can become the fifth team in the past 20 years to do so in three straight (also TBL, CHI, LAK & DET) according to NHL Stats.
- The Stars have won nine series in the past 10 years, tied with the Penguins for the third most in the NHL in that span according to NHL Stats behind only the Lightning (18) and Golden Knights (11).

WILD THINGS

- Dallas is 54-28-11 all-time vs. Minnesota, including a 21-20-4 mark on the road.
- Jamie Benn has eight points (3-5-8) in his last nine games against the Wild dating back to Dec. 29, 2022. In all, Benn has 50 points (20-30—50) in 58 career regular-season games against Minnesota, which is the fifth-highest total of any active player.
- Matt Duchene has 15 points (6-9-15) in his last 12 games against Minnesota dating back to Oct. 24, 2021. Additionally, he has posted six multi-point efforts in his last 12 games against the Wild.
- Roope Hintz has 21 points (9-12-21) in 21 career games against the Wild. 18 of those points (7-11-18) have come in 14 games since the start of the 2021-22 season, which is the seventh-most in the NHL during that span.
- Wyatt Johnston enters today's contest riding a two-game point streak against the Wild, earning three points (2-1-3) in those games. In all, Johnston has 10 points (5-5-10) in 10 career games against Minnesota.
- Mason Marchment has 12 points (7-5—12) in 11 career games against Minnesota.
- Jake Oettinger a native of Lakeville, Minnesota has a 7-0-2 career record against the Wild, posting a .922 save percentage and 2.13 goals-against average in those games.
- Casey DeSmith has a 5-1-1 career record in seven career games against the Wild, posting a .915 save percentage, 2.53 goals-against average and one shutout in those contests.
- Jason Robertson has 17 points (10-7—17) in 14 career games against the Wild.
 - Robertson's 17 points against Minnesota since the start of the 2021-22 season are the ninth-most in the NHL.
 - His 1.21 points per game against the Wild is the 10th-best mark of any active NHL skater that has played Minnesota at least five times in their career.
- Mikko Rantanen has recorded 40 points (16-24-40) in 38 career games vs. Minnesota. His 40 points against the Wild rank third among Stars skaters and 11th in the league.
- Mikael Granlund has tallied seven points (2-5-7) in his last six games played against the Wild. In all, Granlund has 14 points (3-11-14) in 19 career games vs. Minnesota.

DADDY ISUES

- Evgenii Dadonov scored the second hat trick of his career with three goals against the Penguins in Dallas' last game. Dadonov's first career hat trick also came against Pittsburgh on Feb. 24, 2018.
 - o It made him the third Stars skater to score a hat trick this season, joining Wyatt Johnston and Jason Robertson who have each scored two hat tricks this year.
- Dadonov's third goal of the day was his 19th of the season, which makes 2024-25 the fifth-highest ranking season of his career in terms of goal scoring.
 - Dadonov's next goal will give him his fifth career 20-goal season.
- Dadonov is the sixth-oldest player this season to score at least 19 goals this year, joining Alex Ovechkin (41), Sidney Crosby (30), Anze Kopitar (19), Brad Marchand (21) and Patrick Kane (20).
- Dadonov enters today's game one point shy of recording the fifth 40-point season of his career.

SEEING STARS

- Roope Hintz was named the NHL's Second Star of the Week for the week ending on March 30 after tallying nine points (2-7—9) in four games played.
- It is the third time in his career that he has earned Star of the Week honors after previously being named the NHL's Third Star of the Week on April 12, 2021 and the Second Star of the Week on March 3, 2025.
- Hintz is one of 10 players this season to earn Star of the Week honors on multiple occasions.
- Hintz joins Matt Duchene (week ending on Oct. 27, 2024) and Mason Marchment (week ending on Nov. 17, 2024) as the three Dallas players to earn Star of the Week honors this season.
- Hintz has totaled 29 points (6-23-29) in 19 games played since the Four Nation Break. Since Feb. 22, his 23 assists were tied for the most in the NHL entering play Saturday and his 29 points were tied for second.
- According to Natural Stat Trick, when Hintz has been on the ice during 5-on-5 play since Feb. 22, the Stars have outscored their opponents 15-7.
- Hintz recorded his 200th career assist in Dallas' March 29 game against Seattle. With the assist he became...
 - o The 28th skater in franchise history to total 200 assists with the team.
 - The 18th skater selected in the 2015 NHL Draft to reach the 200-assist milestone.
 - The 30th Finnish player in NHL history to have 200 career assists.
- In all this season, Hintz has totaled 65 points (28-37-65) in 70 regular-season games, making the 2024-25 campaign his fourth consecutive 60-point season.

HEATING UP

- Matt Duchene enters today's game riding a five-game point streak, recording seven points (2-5-7) during that span. A goal or an assist today would give him his second six-game point streak this season.
 - Duchene's second assist in Dallas' April 3 game against the Predators was his 48th assist of the season, which set a career high for the forward.
- Mikael Granlund has five points (3-2-5) in his last five games dating back to Mach 27 against Calgary.
- Mason Marchment has been playing at a point-per-game pace since March 14, totaling 12 points (5-7—12) in 12 games.
- Mikko Rantanen has totaled 13 points (4-9—13) in 14 games with the Stars since being acquired by Dallas from Carolina prior to the NHL Trade Deadline.
- A goal or an assist tonight would give Lian Bichsel points in three consecutive games for the first time in his career.

THIRTY, FLIRTY AND THRIVING

- The Stars enter today's game with three players that have scored at least 30 goals this season: Jason Robertson (33), Mikko Rantanen (31) and Wyatt Johnston (30).
- Entering play Saturday, the Stars were one of three teams this season to have at least three 30-goal scorers on its roster, joining the Tampa Bay Lightning (4) and the Washington Capitals (3).
- Entering today's game, Matt Duchene and Roope Hintz are one and three goals shy, respectively, of reaching the 30goal mark. If they were both to score 30 goals by the end of the regular season, it would mark the first time in franchise history that the Stars would have five 30-goals scorers on its roster.
- Additionally, the Stars could become the first team to have five 30-goal scorers on its roster since the Pittsburgh Penguins and Detroit Red Wings, who both did so during the 1992-93 season according to NHL Stats. Please note that this includes players who did not score all 30+ of their goals with one team.

IT TAKES TWO

- Jake Oettinger has an 20-6-2 record in his last 28 games played dating back to Dec. 29, posting a .916 save percentage and a 2.45 goals-against average during that span.
 - o His 20 wins since Dec. 29 were tied for the most in the NHL during that span entering play Saturday.
- Oettinger made a season-high 41 saves in Dallas' March 26 game, a 4-3 win over the Oilers. The Stars were outshot 44-24 in that game.
- Oettinger made 33 saves for his 12th career shutout in Dallas' March 24 game, a 3-0 win over Minnesota, which tied Jon Casey for the sixth-most shutouts in franchise history.
 - **Oettinger** saved 5.74 goals above expected in the game according to MoneyPuck.com.
- Oettinger's shutout was also the 12th of his career, which tied teammate Casey DeSmith for the fifth-most by a U.S.born goaltender in NHL history according to NHL Stats.
- The Stars' victory over the Wild was also the 146th win of Oettinger's career, which passed Cesare Maniago (145) for the fourth-most wins by a goaltender in franchise history.
- Oettinger earned his 30th win of the season in Dallas' game on March 6, a 3-2 overtime win over the Calgary Flames. According to NHL Stats, he became the fourth goaltender in Stars/North Stars history with four or more 30-win seasons, joining Marty Turco (6x), Ed Belfour (4x) and Kari Lehtonen (4x). He also joined Turco (6 from 2002-03 to 2008-09) and Belfour (4 from 1997-98 to 2000-01) as the only netminders to do so in four consecutive campaigns with the franchise.
- Casey DeSmith has posted an 8-1-1 record in his last nine games played dating back to Jan. 25 against the St. Louis Blues, posting a .937 save percentage and a 2.09 goals-against average in those contests.
 - Among netminders that have played at least five games since Jan. 25, DeSmith ranked second and tied for ninth, respectively, in the NHL in save percentage and goals-against average.
- DeSmith made 46 saves in Dallas' March 27 game against the Flames, a 5-2 Stars win. His 46 saves were the most by a Dallas netminder this season and the third-most in a single game in DeSmith's career.
- In all this season, DeSmith has saved .731 goals above expected per 60, which was the best mark in the NHL this season entering play Saturday among netminders that have played in more than five games.
- In all, Oettinger and DeSmith have combined for a .911 save percentage this season, which was the second-best mark of any team in the NHL this season entering play Saturday. The duo's 2.52 goals-against average this season ranked third in the NHL this year entering play Saturday.

ROAD WARRIORS

- The Stars enter today's matchup with the Wild having won each of the last four games that they have played on the road. A Dallas victory tonight would give the team their second five-game road win streak of the season.
- A win or overtime loss would give the Stars points in six consecutive road games for the first time since the team won seven consecutive road games from March 5 to 30, 2024.
- In all, the Stars have a 22-14-2 record when playing on the road this year, which is tied for the seventh-most road wins in a single season in franchise history.
- Matt Duchene leads the Stars in road scoring this season, totaling 44 points (17-27-44) in 38 games. His 44 road points were tied for seventh in the NHL this season entering play Saturday.

- Duchene's 27 road assists this season are already a career high and his 44 road points are the second-most of his 16-year NHL career, two shy of his career high that he set in 2021-22.
- Mikael Granlund has recorded 41 points (14-27—41) in 34 road games this season, which includes notching 11 points (3-8-11) in 14 road games with this Stars.
 - Granlund's 14 goals, 27 assists and 41 points on the road this season are already career bests.
- Mikko Rantanen has 42 points (16-26-42) in 38 road games this season, including tallying 10 points (4-6-10) in eight road games since being acquired by the Stars.
- Rantanen and Granlund tied for 11th and ranked 13th in road scoring this season entering play Saturday, and Duchene's and Granlund's 27 road assists this year were tied for 11th.
- Jason Robertson has been playing at a point-per-game pace on the road since Nov. 3, totaling 33 points (16-17—33) in 33 games played.
 - Robertson's 19 road goals this year were tied for sixth in the NHL entering play Saturday.
 - Since Jan. 10, Robertson has scored 14 goals on the road, which topped the NHL during that span entering play Saturday.
- Wyatt Johnston has been playing at a point-per-game pace on the road since Jan. 12, totaling 19 points (10-9—19) in 19 games played.
- Roope Hintz has 17 points (3-14—17) in the last 16 games he has played on the road dating back to Jan. 12.
- Thoams Harley has nine points (4-5-9) in his last 13 games played on the road dating back to Feb. 7. His nine road points during that span were tied for the sixth-most among all NHL defensemen entering play Saturday.
- Mason Marchment has eight points (2-6-8) in his last eight road games played and enters today's game riding a threegame road point streak.
- Casey DeSmith has won each of the last six games that he has played on the road dating back to Jan. 25, posting a .955 save percentage and a 1.50 goals-against average during that span. His save percentage and goals-against average on the road since Jan. 25 ranked second and third, respectively, in the NHL entering play Saturday.
 - His six road wins since Jan. 25 were tied for the most in the NHL entering play Saturday.
 - DeSmith's six-game road win streak is the longest such streak of his career.

BIKER GANG

- Thomas Harley tallied an assist in Dallas' last game and now has 25 points (8-17—25) in his last 26 games played dating back to Jan. 31, which ranks fifth on Dallas' roster during that span.
- Harley's helper against Pittsburgh was his 33rd assist and 48th point of the season, both of which set career highs for the defenseman.
- Harley's 25 points (8-16-24) since Jan. 31 were the second-most during that span among all NHL defensemen entering play Saturday, trailing only Colorado's Cale Makar (34).
- Since Jan. 31 Dallas' first game without Miro Heiskanen Harley has been averaging 24:59 of ice time per game, which tops all Stars skaters and ranked ninth in the NHL entering play Saturday.
 - Prior to Jan. 31, Harley was averaging 22:27 of ice time per game.
 - Harley skated a career-high 31:11 in Dallas' game on March 20 against the Tampa Bay Lightning. It was the highest time on ice total by a Stars skater in a regular-season game since Heiskanen skated 32:01 on April 11, 2021 against the Nashville Predators.
- In all, Harley has totaled 48 points (15-33-48) in 74 regular-season games this season. His 15 goals this season were tied for the sixth-most among all NHL defensemen this season entering play Saturday.
 - His 15 goals this year are also tied for the eighth-most by a Stars defenseman in a single season in franchise
- When Harley has been on the ice during even-strength play this season, the Stars have outscored their opponents 91-54. His plus-37 on-ice even-strength goal differential was tied for the best mark in the NHL this season entering play Saturday.
- Harley recorded the 100th point of his NHL career with an assist in Dallas' March 26 game against the Oilers, making him the third defenseman drafted in 2019 to reach the 100-point milestone, joining Detroit's Moritz Seider and Buffalo's Bowen Byram. He also became the 24th defenseman in franchise history to total 100 points with the Stars.
- Harley's 100th career point came in his 188th career regular-season games, making him the fourth-fastest defenseman in Stars/North Stars history to record 100 career points according to NHL Stats, following John Klingberg (145 GP), Craig Hartsburg (170 GP) and Brad Maxwell (170 GP).
- Harley matched his single-game career high with three points (1-2-3) in Dallas' March 18 game against the Ducks, surpassing Larry Murphy (93) for the 25th-most points by a defenseman in team history.
 - In that game, the Stars outshot the Ducks 15-2 when Harley was on the ice during 5-on-5 play according to Natural Stat Trick.
- Harley's game-winning goal in Dallas' March 22 game against the Flyers came just nine seconds into overtime, which set a record for the quickest overtime goal in franchise history according to NHL Stats.
- Harley is one of four defensemen this season to score two overtime goals. In total, he has scored five overtime goals since the start of 2023-24, which leads all NHL defensemen and is tied for fifth in the NHL.
- Harley's two-goal performance against the Flyers brought his season total up to 15, matching his career high that he set last season. He is the third defenseman in franchise history to record consecutive 15-goal seasons according to NHL Stats, joining Phillippe Boucher (2 from 2005-06 - 2006-07) and Lou Nanne (1971-72 - 1972-73).

KILLING IT

- The Stars have had an 84.6 percent success rate on the penalty kill this season, which was tied with Carolina for the best mark in the NHL this year entering play Saturday.
- No team in the league this season has allowed fewer power-play goals against than the Stars' 32, and their -26 goal differential on the penalty kill this year was the third-best mark in the NHL entering play Saturday.
- If the Stars maintain this pace, it would make the 2024-25 season their best on the penalty kill since 2007-08, when the team finished the season with an 85.6 percent success rate on the penalty kill.
- The Stars are also one of the least-penalized teams in the league, ranking 27th in the league in both total penalty minutes (525) and penalty minutes per game (6:54) entering play Saturday.
- Entering play Saturday, Esa Lindell was leading all NHL skaters in both total shorthanded ice time (270:24) and shorthanded ice time per game (3:33) this season.

- Thomas Harley is one assist shy of tying Gary Sargen (71) for 25th-most assists by a defenseman in franchise history.
- Roope Hintz is one goal shy of tying Danny Grant (176) for 15th-most goals in franchise history.
- Esa Lindell is four assists shy of tying Stephane Robidas (165) for 10th-most assists by a defenseman in franchise history.
- Esa Lindell is 10 points shy of tying Lou Nanne (225) for 10th most points by a defenseman in franchise history.
- Jason Robertson is one assist shy of surpassing Miro Heiskanen (225) the 20th-most assists in franchise history.
- Jason Robertson is 10 goals shy of tying Danny Grant (176) for 15th-most goals in franchise history.
- Wyatt Johnston is two goals shy of tying Radek Faksa (89) for 30th-most goals in team history.

- Stars forward Sam Steel and defenseman Matt Dumba both played together for one season in Minnesota during the 2022-23 season and was joined by Wild forward Gustav Nyquis.
- Stars Player Development Assistant Jordie Benn and Stars defenseman Matt Dumba both played together in Minnesota during the 2021-22 season.
- Stars forwards Colin Blackwell and Mikael Granlund and Wild forwards Ryan Hartman and Frederick Gaudreau were all members of the Nashville Predators during the 2018-19 season.
- Stars goaltender Casey DeSmith and defenseman Cody Ceci played alongside the Wild's Frederick Gaudreau during the 2020-21 season with the Pittsburgh Penguins.
- Stars forwards Matt Duchene and Colin Blackwell played with Wild forward Yakov Trenin in Nashville during the 2019-
- Stars forward Evgenii Dadonov and Wild goaltender Filip Gustavsson played together in Ottawa in 2021-22.
- Stars forward Colin Blackwell and Wild forward Marcus Johansson were both members of the Seattle Kraken during the 2021-22 season.
- Stars defenseman Brendan Smith and Wild forward Mats Zuccarello both played for the New York Rangers from 2016-17 until 2018-19.
