- Wyatt Johnston had two assists to bring his preseason points total to seven (3-4—7), leading all Stars skaters in scoring.

GAME NOTES

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Tonight marks the first Dallas Stars game of the 2025-26 season. A win tonight would give the Stars victories in six consecutive season openers dating back to the 2020-21 season.
 - The Stars are one of two NHL teams to have an active season opening win streak of at least five games, joining the Vegas Golden Knights who have won six straight season openers from to 2019-20 to 2024-25.
- Dallas has outscored its opponents 20-7 in its last five season openers.
- 2025-26 also marks the fifth time in the last six seasons that the Stars are beginning their season on the road. Dallas went 4-0-0 in those four games.
- Tonight's game will mark the first time that the Stars have played the Jets in a season opener since they relocated from Atlanta to Winnipeg. It also marks the fourth consecutive year in which the team is playing its first game of the season against a Central Division team.

- - Wyatt Johnston has recorded a point in all three of the season opening games that he has played in (1-2-3). A goal or an assist tonight would make him the ninth player in franchise history – and the first since Sergei Zubov (1996-97 to 2005-06; 9) – to record a point in at least four consecutive season openers according to NHL Stats. It would also make him the seventh active skater to record at least one point in each of the first season openers of his career according to NHL Stats.
 - He joins Max Domi, Mikael Granlund, Jonathan Huberdeau, Kirill Kaprizov, Dylan Larkin and Auston Matthews.
 - Roope Hintz has totaled six points (2-4—6) in season openers with Dallas over the course of his career, the most of any Stars skater on the active roster.

2024-25 REGULAR SEASON RECAP

- The Stars finished the 2024-25 regular season with a 50-26-6 record, ranking in the top five in the NHL this year in wins (tied fourth), points (fifth), goals for (275, tied third), goals for per game (3.35, tied third) and penalty kill (82.0 percent, tied fourth).
- The 2024-25 campaign marked the second straight year that Dallas had finished the regular season with at least 50 wins and the third consecutive year that the team concluded the regular season with a points percentage above .640.
- The 2024-25 season also sits near the top in the franchise record book in terms of single-season success with the team's 50 wins tying for the fourth-most in franchise history.
- The team's regular-season success last year came in spite of logging 190-man games lost to injury, which includes significant stretches playing without Tyler Seguin (62 games), Miro Heiskanen (32 games), Nils Lundkvist (40 games), Mason Marchment (20 games) and others.

GROUNDING THE JETS

- Dallas is 33-22-5 all-time vs. Winnipeg, with a 14-13-3 mark on the road.
- The Stars have earned points in five of their last 10 games against the Jets (4-5-1). Through those 10 games, Stars goaltenders hold a .896 save percentage and 2.9 goals-against average.
- Tyler Seguin has collected seven points (5-6—11) in his last 12 games against the Jets, dating back to December 5, 2018. Seguin also holds a plus-minus rating of +6 through his last 12 contests against Winnipeg.
 - In his career, Seguin has totaled 54 points (29-25—54) in 51 games played against the Jets, averaging over a point a game (1.06).
 - His 54 career points vs. Winnipeg rank fifth in the NHL among active skaters.
- Jason Robertson has 13 points (9-4—13) in 15 career games against Winnipeg.
 - Robertson's nine goals against the Jets since the start of the 2019-20 season are tied for the 10th-most in the NHL.
- Mikko Rantanen has registered 28 points (10-18—28) in 31 career games played against Winnipeg.
 - Rantanen's 28 points against the Jets since the 2016-17 rank tied for the 10th most in the NHL.
- Matt Duchene has recorded 36 points (17-19—36) in 47 career games against the Jets. His 36 points vs. Winnipeg rank third among active Stars skaters.
- Wyatt Johnston has five points (3-2-5) in 11 career games vs. Winnipeg.
- Jake Oettinger holds a 6-4-1 record in 11 career games against the Jets, with a .905 save percentage and 2.57 goals-against average.

WE MEET AGAIN

- Tonight marks the first time that the Stars will face the Jets since Game 6 of the Second Round of the 2025 Stanley Cup Playoffs with Thomas Harley scoring in overtime to secure the 2-1 win.
- Mikko Rantanen was the Stars leading scorer in the series, totaling seven points (4-3—7) in six games.
- Rantanen scored three goals in Game 1 to become the third player in NHL history to score a hat trick in consecutive Stanley Cup Playoff games according to NHL Stats, joining Jari Kurri who did so in 1985 and Doug Bentley who did so in 1944. He also did so in Game 7 against the Avalanche.
- All three of Rantanen's goals came in the second period, making him the first player in Stanley Cup Playoffs history with multiple three-goal periods in the same postseason and fourth to do so at any point during their career according to NHL Stats, joining Wayne Gretzky (3x), Maurice Richard (3x) and Tim Kerr (2x).
- Harley scored the game-winning goal 1:33 into overtime, making him the third defenseman in franchise history to score a seriesclinching goal and just the second ever to do so in overtime according to NHL Stats.
- At 23 years and 271 days, Harley became the third-youngest defenseman in NHL history to score a series-clinching goal according to NHL Stats, following Babe Pratt (21 years, 77 days; Game 2 of 1937 OF) and Bobby Orr (22 years, 51 days; Game 4 of 1970 SCF).
- Harley's goal was also the third-fastest, series-clinching overtime goal by a defenseman in NHL history according to NHL Stats, behind only Chris Tanev (0:11 in Game 4 of 2020 SCQ) and Bobby Orr (0:40 in Game 4 of 1970 SCF).
- Jake Oettinger started each game of the series, posting a 4-2 record with a .929 save percentage and a 2.02 goals-against average in the Second Round.

A NEW ERA

- Tonight will mark the first game that the Stars have played since Glen Gulutzan was named the team's head coach on July 1, 2025. It marks his second stint with the organization after serving as the team's head coach from 2011-12 to 2012-13, amassing a 64-57-9 record in 130 regular-season games.
 - In all, he holds a 146-125-23 record in 294 regular-season NHL games coached.
- Gulutzan spent the previous seven seasons as an assistant coach for the Edmonton Oilers, during which the Oilers led the NHL with a 26.8 power-play percentage in the regular season and a 29.8 power-play percentage in the postseason.

He also served as the head coach of the Calgary Flames for two seasons (2016-18), amassing an 82-68-14 record in 164 regularseason games.

NEW KIDS ON THE BLOCK

- If they dress, tonight's contest will mark the first game in a Stars uniform for 2025 free agent signings Nathan Bastian and Adam
- If either of them were to score tonight, they would become the 58th player in Stars team history (since 1993) to score in their first game with Dallas and the 26th to do so in a season opener according to NHL Stats.
 - Lian Bichsel (Dec. 12, 2024), Wyatt Johnston (Oct. 13, 2022) and Mikko Rantanen (March 8, 2025) are the only skaters on Dallas' active roster to have scored in their Stars debut.
- Tonight's game will also mark the first time that Lian Bichsel, Justin Hryckowian and Alexander Petrovic are on the team's opening night roster.
 - Bichsel made his NHL debut last season on Dec. 12, 2024, ultimately totaling nine points (4-5—9) in 38 regular-season games and leading the team with 15 hits. Bichsel appeared in all 18 Stanley Cup Playoff Games, notching one assist and recording 75 hits.
 - o Hryckowian debuted with the Stars on Dec. 29, 2024 and had one assist in five regular-season games, spending the remainder of the season with the Texas Stars (AHL).
 - Petrovic has appeared in six regular-season games for the Stars since signing with the team as a free agent on July 28, 2021, but has played in 24 Stanley Cup Playoff games for the team since the start of the 2024 postseason.

IRON SHARPENS IRON

- The Stars enter the 2025-26 campaign with three players on its roster that have played in at least 100 consecutive regular-season games: Jason Robertson (292), Wyatt Johnston (246) and Matt Duchene (108).
- Robertson's 292-game Iron Man streak was the eight-longest active such streak in the NHL entering play Tuesday.
- Johnston has not missed a regular-season game since making his debut in the 2022 season opener on Oct. 13, 2022, making him one of 26 players in NHL history to begin their NHL career by playing in at least 246 consecutive games according to NHL Stats. Entering play Tuesday, it was the 19th-longest active Iron Man streak in the NHL.
 - He is one of 21 players to appear in at least 246 regular-season games from 2022-23 to 2024-25. Only Will Borgen (248) and Charlie Coyle (247) have appeared in more.
 - Borgen played in 84 games and Coyle played in 83 games in 2024-25.

FIRST THING'S FIRST

- Dallas will open the 2025-26 season with 12 former first-round picks on its roster; Lian Bichsel (DAL; 2022), Mavrik Bourque (DAL; 2020), Matt Duchene (COL; 2009), Radek Faksa (DAL; 2012), Thomas Harley (DAL; 2019), Miro Heiskanen (DAL; 2017), Wyatt Johnston (DAL; 2021) Nils Lundkvist (NYR; 2018), Jake Oettinger (DAL; 2017), Mikko Rantanen (COL; 2015), Tyler Seguin (BOS; 2010) and Sam Steel (ANA; 2016)
- Tyler Seguin is the highest drafted player on Dallas' roster, selected by Boston with the second-overall pick in the 2010 NHL Draft. Seguin leads all 2010 draft picks in career scoring (809) and ranks second in both goals (360) and assists (449).
- There are three sets of Stars skaters that were taken with the same pick in different years: Matt Duchene and Miro Heiskanen were both taken with the third-overall pick, Duchene by Colorado in 2009 and Heiskanen by Dallas in 2017. Sam Steel and Mavrik Bourque were both drafted 30th-overall – Steel by Anaheim in 2016 and Bourque by Dallas in 2020. Finally, Dallas selected both Thomas Harley and Lian Bichsel with the 18th overall pick, Harley in 2019 and Bichsel in 2022.
- Four additional Stars draft picks are on Dallas' opening night roster this year: Oskar Bäck (2018; 3rd round), Roope Hintz (2015; 2nd round), Esa Lindell (2012; 3rd round) and Jason Robertson (2017; 2nd round).

- Stars forward Matt Duchene and Jets forward Mark Scheifele were teammates for the gold-medal-winning Team Canada at the 2016 IIHF World Championship.
- Stars forward Matt Duchene and Jets defenseman Dylan DeMelo were teammates on the Ottawa Senators for the 2018-19 season.

- - Stars forward Sam Steel and Jets defenseman Haydn Fleury were teammates for a short time in Anaheim during the 2020-21 season.
 - Stars forward Nathan Bastian and Jets defenseman Haydn Fleury both skated for the Seattle Kraken during the 2021-22 season.
 - Jets defenseman Colin Miller skated in six games for the Dallas Stars during the 2022-23 season.
 - Stars defensemen Thomas Harley and Jets defenseman Josh Morrissey were teammates during the NHL Four Nations Faceoff, where they won gold.
 - Stars goaltender Jake Oettinger and Jets defenseman Dylan Samberg represented Team USA during the 2018 IIHF World Junior Championship
 - Stars forward Jason Robertson and Jets defenseman Dylan Samberg skated for Team USA in the 2019 World Junior Championship.
 - Stars defenseman Ilya Lyubushkin and Jets goaltender Eric Comrie were teammates in Buffalo during the 2022-23 season.
 - Stars captain Jamie Benn and Jets defenseman Luke Schenn played for Team Canada at the 2012 IIHF World Championship.
 - Stars forward Matt Duchene played for Team Canada with Jets defenseman Luke Schenn at the 2011 IIHF World Championship.
 - Stars forward Sam Steel and Jets defenseman Luke Schenn both played for the Anaheim Ducks in 2018-19.
 - Stars Player Development Assistant Jordie Benn and VP of Cultural Growth & Strategy Al Montoya both played under Jets GM Kevin Cheveldayoff and VPs Craig Heisinger and Larry Simmons. Montoya in 2013-14 and Benn in 2020-21.
 - Stars GM Jim Nill and Jets head coach Scott Arniel both played for the Winnipeg Jets from 1984-85 to 1985-86.
 - Stars Player Development Coordinator Ben Bishop played under Jets assistant coach Davis Payne, when Payne was the head coach of the St. Louis Blues in 2010-11. They met again when Bishop played in Los Angeles in 2016-17 where Payne was an assistant coach for the Kings.
 - Stars Player Development Assistant Jordie Benn and Jets assistant coach Dean Chynoweth overlapped in Toronto in 2022-23 when Chynoweth was an assistant coach and Benn was a defenseman.
