NEW YORK ISLANDERS

All-Time Wild Record: 21-11-2 (12-4-2 at Xcel Energy Center, 9-7-0 at New York)

2024-25: The Wild defeated the Islanders, 6-3, in the series-opening game in St. Paul (2/8)...**LW Matt Boldy** led Minnesota with three points (2-1=3)...**D Jared Spurgeon** notched two assists (0-2=2)...**G Filip Gustavsson** saved 32-of-35 shots faced to earn the victory...**C Brock Nelson** (1-1=2), **C Kyle Palmieri** (1-1=2) and **RW Maxim Tsyplov** (0-2=2) each had two points...**G Ilya Sorokin** stopped 27-of-32 shots faced for New York.

WILD LEADERS: **LW Marcus Johansson** leads Minnesota with 23 points (3-20=23) in 41 career games against the Islanders...**RW Mats Zuccarello** owns 20 points (5-15=20) in 39 matches...**C Gustav Nyquist** has 13 points (4-9=13) in 27 games...**C Joel Eriksson Ek** (5-5=10 in 11 games) and **Spurgeon** (3-7=10 in 20 games) own 10 points each.

WILD GOALIES: **G Marc-Andre Fleury** is 29-12-6 with a 2.38 GAA, a .919 SV% and six shutouts in 49 career games (47 starts) vs. the Islanders...**Gustavsson** is 3-1-0 with a 2.47 GAA and a .918 SV% in four starts.

ISLANDERS LEADERS: **Palmieri** leads the Islanders with 15 points (6-9=15) in 23 career games against the Wild...**C Bo Horvat** owns 14 points (9-5=14) in 24 matches...**LW Anders Lee** has 13 points (7-6=13) in 19 contests...**D Tony DeAngelo** has 11 points (2-9=11) in 12 matches.

ISLANDERS GOALIES: **G Semyon Varlamov** is 13-15-1 with a 2.33 GAA, a .926 SV% and one shutout in 30 career games (29 starts) against Minnesota...**Sorokin** is 0-4-1 with a 3.21 GAA and a .901 SV% in five starts...**G Marcus Hogberg** has not faced Minnesota.

CONNECTIONS: Minnesota President of Hockey Operations and General Manager **Bill Guerin** tallied 80 points (39-41=80) and 128 PIM in 142 games with the Islanders in two seasons (2007-09)...**Spurgeon** was drafted by New York in the sixth round of the 2008 NHL Draft (156th overall)...Minnesota Assistant Coach **Jack Capuano** served as Head Coach of the Islanders for parts of seven seasons (2010-17)...Islanders Special Assignment Coach **Jacques Lemaire** was the first Head Coach in Wild history and posted a record of 293-255-108 in 656 games over eight seasons (2000-09)...He is Minnesota's all-time leader in games coached and victories and was the recipient of the Jack Adams Award as the NHL's top coach in 2003...**Lee** hails from Edina and played high school hockey at Edina and St. Thomas Academy...**Nelson** is from Warrroad...**RW Hudson Fasching** is from Apple Valley and played three seasons at the University of Minnesota (2013-16)...**D Mike Reilly** played three seasons at the University of Minnesota (2012-15) and collected 18 points (4-14=18) in 84 games in parts of three seasons with Minnesota (2015-18)...**D Scott Perunovich** is from Hibbing and played three seasons (2017-20) at the University of Minnesota - Duluth.

FAST FACTS: The Wild has won seven consecutive games against the Islanders and is 10-2-1 in the last 13 meetings overall.

NOTES & MILESTONES

Team: Second in the NHL with 49 road points (22-11-5) and a .645 road point percentage while ranking T-3rd with 22 road wins...Fourth in the NHL with a .905 team save percentage this season...T-8th in the NHL with 36 goals scored by defensemen this season...Has scored first in 43 games this season, tied for second-most in the NHL.

Matt Boldy: Owns nine points (4-5=9) in his last nine games...Scored the 100th goal of his NHL career at NJD (3/31), his 25th goal of the season...Is the first player in Wild history to record three 25-goal seasons at age 23 or younger...T-2nd in the NHL with nine GWG this season...Currently tied for fifth in franchise history with 23 career GWG, needs one to move past Jared Spurgeon and Eric Staal for fourth...Ranks seventh in the NHL with 253 shots this season...Leads the Wild with 64 points (25-39=64), 25 goals and 39 assists with and six PPG.

Brock Faber: Tallied his second multi-point game (1-1=2) of the season at NYR (4/2)...He ranks fourth in the NHL at 25:21 TOI/G this season...Owns a 25:04 TOI/G average in 155 career games, the third-highest average by an NHL player prior to turning 23 (min. 100 games played) since 2000-01...Tied for first on the team with eight goals this season, needing one more to establish a new single-season career high.

Marcus Foligno: Skated a season-high 18:45 at NJD (3/31)...Finished with two points (1-1=2) and recorded the fourth Gordie Howe Hat Trick of his NHL career vs. NJD (3/29)...Ninth in the NHL with 234 hits this season.

Freddy Gaudreau: Won 13-of-19 face offs at NJD (3/31), the second-highest face off win total of his season and T-3rd most of his career...Ranks fourth on the team with 18 goals this season, one shy of tying his single-season career high set in 2022-23...Leads the team with 487 face off wins and ranks third with five PPG.

Filip Gustavsson: Since March 1, is 7-4-3 and ranks T-2nd in the NHL with two shutouts, third with a .925 SV%, T-6th in wins and eighth in with a 2.19 GAA (min. eight games played)...For the season, Gustavsson is 29-17-6 and ranks T-3rd in the NHL in shutouts (five), T-5th in SV% (.916) and T-6th in wins...Per NHL Stats, his five shutouts this season are tied for the second-highest single-season total in Wild history (Backstrom, eight in 2008-09).

Marcus Johansson: Recorded his second three-point game (1-2=3) of the season at NYR (4/2), including the fourth shorthanded goal of his NHL career.

Jake Middleton: T-1st among Wild defenseman in goals scored this season...Leads the Wild and ranks T-12th in the NHL with 153 blocked shots this season...Recorded three blocked shots vs. NJD (3/29) to reach 502 in a Wild uniform, becoming the 10th player in franchise history to reach 500 with the team.

Gustav Nyquist: Finished with two points (1-1=2) at NYR (4/2), including his first goal in a Wild sweater.

Marco Rossi: Ranks T-1st on the team in PPG (six), second in assists (33) and points (23-33=56), and T-2nd in goals (23)...Has played in 161 consecutive regular-season games dating back to the 2022-23 season, the longest such streak among Wild players.

Jared Spurgeon: Currently at 132 career power-play points (34-98=132), one shy of tying Pierre-Marc Bouchard (29-104=133) for fifth in franchise history...Leads Wild defensemen and ranks T-6th among Wild skaters with 30 points (7-23=30).

Yakov Trenin: Owns 219 hits this season, which ranks 15th in the NHL and establishes a new single-season career-high.

Mats Zuccarello: Currently at 898 career NHL games played.

TEAM NOTES



OUT IN FRONT

- The Wild is 28-0-0 when leading through two periods, the only NHL team with a perfect record when holding a lead after 40 minutes of play.
- Is 20-4-2 when leading through one period this season.
- The Wild has scored first in 42 games this season, tied for third-most in the NHL, and holds a 30-10-2 record when doing so.
- Minnesota began the season by not trailing in regulation for 391:31, the second-longest season-opening mark in NHL history (1969-70 Boston Bruins, 457:21) and the second-longest streak at any point in a season in franchise history (414:32, 2014-15).

- The run was also the second-longest streak at any point in Wild history, trailing only a 414:32 mark in 2014-15.

ROAD DAWGS

- Second in the NHL with 49 road points (22-11-5) and a .645 road point percentage while ranking T-3rd with 22 road wins.
- Reached 20 road wins in the 28th road game of the season, tying the 2022-23 Boston Bruins for the fourth fewest games in NHL history required to reach the mark.
- The Wild is 16-3-2 this season (.810) when scoring first in a road game, the third-best point percentage in the NHL in that situation.
- Recorded a nine-game road point streak (7-0-2) from 11/29 - 12/6, tied for the longest streak in the NHL this season and T-4th longest in franchise history.
- According to NHL Stats, the only teams with as many points through the first 15 road games of a season are the Kings in 2023-24 (13-1-1, 27 points), Blackhawks in 2012-13 (12-1-2, 26 points) and the Ducks in 2006-07 (12-1-2, 26 points).
- Reached 10 road wins in the team's 14th road contest of the season at BUF (11/27), besting the team's previous low mark of 15 games (2011-12).
- The Wild recorded a five-game road point streak from 10/13 - 10/24, tied for the longest in franchise history to start a season (also 2002-03 season, 3-0-2).
- Minnesota recorded five road wins and 11 road points in October, marking the first time in franchise history the club has reached either mark in that month.
- Minnesota recorded 12 road points in November (5-0-2), the highest total in franchise history in that month.

MAGIC NUMBERS

- The Wild is 33-3-3 (.885) when scoring three-plus goals in regulation this season, the fifth-best point percentage in the NHL in that situation.
- The Wild is 30-2-4 (.889) when allowing two or fewer goals in regulation this season.
- The Wild is 23-15-0 (.62=05) when allowing fewer than 30 shots on goal this season, the third-best point percentage in the NHL in that situation.



PLAYER NOTES

BOLDY AND THE BEAUTIFUL

- **Matt Boldy** owns nine points (4-5=9) in his last nine games.
- Scored the 100th goal of his NHL career at NJD (3/31), his 25th goal of the season.
- Is the first player in Wild history to record three 25-goal seasons before turning 24.
- Posted his 17th multi-point game of the season with two points (1-1=2) vs. WSH (3/27).
- Notched his ninth GWG of the season vs. WSH (3/27), establishing a new single-season franchise record.
- T-2nd in the NHL in game-winning goals this season. Ranks seventh in the NHL with 249 shots this season.
- Currently tied for fifth in franchise history with 23 career GWG, needs one to move past Jared Spurgeon and Eric Staal for fourth.
- Leads the Wild with 64 points (25-39=64), 25 goals, 39 assists and six PPG.
- Scored two goals (2-0=2) vs. SEA (3/19), his 14th multi-goal game of his career, to tie Nino Niederreiter for seventh-most in franchise history.
- Is the fourth player in franchise history to record three consecutive 60-point seasons (also Kaprizov, Koivu, Zuccarello).
- Posted a game-high eight shots on goal vs. BOS (3/2), tied for the second-highest total of his career.
- Recorded a four-game point streak (3-4=7) from 2/8 - 2/27.
- Is the second player in franchise history with three 30-assist seasons before turning 24, joining Pierre-Marc Bouchard (3x) Owns five points (3-2=5) in his last two games.
- Notched a game-high three points (2-1=3) vs. NYI (2/8), tying his season high.
- Boldy tied his single-game career high with three assists at CHI (1/26).
- Skated 26:35 of TOI at COL (1/20), the second-highest total of his season and NHL career.
- Skated a career-high 26:55 of TOI vs. EDM (1/15) and notched two points (1-1=2). He also registered seven shots on net, his second-highest total of the season and T-4th highest of his career, while his 15 shot attempts marked a season high and the second-highest total of his career.
- Tallied two points (1-1=2) and tied season-high plus-3 rating at SJS (1/11).
- Set a season-high with a plus-three rating at CAR (1/4) and tied his season high with three points (1-2=3).
- Scored the game-deciding goal in shootout at WSH (1/2), his second-such goal of the season and sixth of his career, and passed Matt Cullen for most game-deciding shootout goals in Wild history (Koivu, 18).
- Scored a goal vs. PHI (12/14) to reach 200 career points (88-112=200) in his 233rd career game, becoming the second-fastest Wild player to reach the mark (Kaprizov, 169 gp).
- Scored his fifth career game-deciding shootout goal at UTA (12/10), tying Matt Cullen for the second most in Wild history (Koivu, 18).
- Recorded a six-game point streak (3-4=7) from 11/10 - 11/23.
- Is the fourth NHL player since 2000-01 to record five GWG in a season's first 16 games, joining Fedorov (six, 2002-23), Draisaitl (five, 2021-22) and Matthews (five, 2020-21).
- Reached 100 career assists at CBJ (10/19), becoming the 26th player to reach 100 assists in a Wild sweater.

MARCO POLO

- **Marco Rossi** ranks T-1st on the team in PPG (six), second in assists (33) and points (23-33=56), and T-2nd in goals (23).
- Has played in 161 consecutive regular-season games dating back to the 2022-23 season, the longest such streak among Wild players.
- Won 9-of-11 draws taken (81.8 pct) at VAN (3/7), marking the third-highest faceoff percentage of his season (min. five face offs taken).
- Notched his 30th assist of the season at COL (2/28) to become the second Austrian player in NHL history to reach the 30-assist mark in a single campaign (Thomas Vanek, 7x).
- Recorded a three-game goal and point streak (3-1=4) from 2/8 - 2/25, tying his career-long goal streak established earlier this season.
- Scored the game-winning goal in overtime at DET (2/22).
- Is the third Austrian player with multiple 20-goal seasons in the NHL, joining Thomas Vanek (11x) and Michael Grabner (4x). Also the third Austrian player with 50 points in a season, joining Vanek (9x) and Grabner (1x).
- Notched three assists (0-3=3) vs. CGY (1/25), his fourth three-plus point performance this season and fifth of his career, to move his season point total to 43 (17-26=43) and surpass the 40-point total (21-19=40) he established as a rookie in 2023-24. Also finished with a plus-2 rating vs. CGY (1/25).
- Recorded a career-high 24:51 time-on-ice total vs. EDM (1/15) while also scoring a goal.
- Named the NHL's First Star of the Week after recording eight points (3-5=8) in three games for the period ending Jan. 5.
- Posted four assists at CAR (1/4), establishing new career highs for most assists and points in a game.
- Rossi posted three points (2-1=3) and tied his season and career highs with two goals, seven shots and a plus-3 rating vs. NSH (12/31). Also won a career-high 12 faceoffs vs. NSH (12/31) out of 15 total faceoffs taken.
- Notched a career-high four hits vs. CHI (12/23).
- Scored a game-tying goal with 46 seconds left in regulation at UTA (12/10), finishing the game with a career-best-tying plus-3 rating.
- Rossi recorded a career-long six-game point streak (3-4=7) from 10/12 - 10/24.
- Posted a three-game goal streak (3-0=3) from 10/12 - 10/22, also establishing a career-long mark.

PLAYER NOTES

OH CAPTAIN MY CAPTAIN

- **Jared Spurgeon** notched the 145th and 146th primary assists of his career vs. LAK (3/17) to overtake Mikael Granlund (145) for the second-most in franchise history (Koivu, 269).
- Currently at 132 career power-play points (34-98=132), one shy of tying Pierre-Marc Bouchard (29-104=133) for fifth in franchise history.
- Leads Wild defensemen and ranks sixth among Wild skaters with 30 points (7-23=30).
- Tied his season high with six blocked shots at VAN (3/7).
- Posted two points (1-1=2) at SEA (3/4) to record the 73rd multi-point game of his career and moved past Ryan Suter (72 mpg) for most multi-point games by a Wild defenseman. Now with 74 career multi-point games, ranks sixth all-time in multi-point games among all Wild skaters.
- Reached 401 career points (116-285=401) with an assist at MTL (1/30) and moved past Zach Parise (199-201=400) for third on the Wild's all-time points list.
- Reached 400 career points (116-284=400) with a goal at TOR (1/29) and became the fourth player and first defenseman to reach 400 points in a Wild sweater.
- Also notched his 23rd career game-winning goal at TOR (1/29), tying Eric Staal for fifth-most in franchise history.
- Played in his 900th career NHL game vs. UTA (1/23), joining Mikko Koivu (1,028 games) as the only players to play 900-plus games for the Wild.
- Spurgeon pushed his career TOI total to 19,726:58 with 24:08 skated at UTA (12/10), moving past Mikko Koivu (19,718:08 TOI) for most in franchise history.
- Spurgeon scored the GWG in overtime vs. NSH (11/30) to reach five career OTG, tied Brent Burns and Mikko Koivu for third in franchise history.
- Recorded the game-winning goal in consecutive contests for the first time in his career (11/29 vs. CHI, 11/30 vs. NSH).
- Tallied two goals (2-0=2) on his 35th birthday vs. CHI (11/29) and reached 112 career goals, moving past Eric Staal (111 goals) for eighth on the Wild's all-time goal list.
- Ranks first in franchise history in plus-minus rating (plus-123), blocked shots (1,600) and minutes skated (20,524:12), second in games played (928), third in assists (297), third in scoring (117-297=414) and fourth in shots (1,535).
- Since entering the NHL in 2010-11, has recorded the fewest PIMs (160) by a defenseman playing in 750-plus games.

- **Brock Faber** tallied his second multi-point game (1-1=2) of the season at NYR (4/2).
- Recorded a game-high six blocked shots at DAL (3/24), tying his single-game career high, and logged a game-high 29:45 of time on ice, his fifth-highest total of season.
- Ranks fourth in the NHL at 25:21 TOI/G this season.
- Owns a 25:05 TOI/G average in 156 career games, the third-highest average by an NHL player prior to turning 23 (min. 100 games played) since 2000-01.

- Tied for first on the team with eight goals this season, needing one more to establish a new single-season career high.
- With an assist at COL (2/28), became the fastest defenseman in Wild history to reach 70 career points (14-56=70), doing so in his 140th game of his career.
- Logged a game-high 30:05 in ice time at DET (2/22), marking the fourth game this season and ninth game in his NHL career he has skated 30-plus minutes.
- Skated 30:33 at CAR (1/4), his second consecutive game with 30-plus minutes of TOI and fifth-highest total of his career.

- Posted a 161:49 shutout streak from 3/17 - 3/22, the longest home shutout streak in franchise history and the sixth-longest shutout streak in the NHL this season and in franchise history.
- Recorded his 11th shutout with the Wild vs. SEA (3/19) and moved past Josh Harding (10 shutouts) for fifth-most in franchise history.
- Per NHL Stats, his five shutouts this season are tied for the second-highest single-season total in Wild history (Backstrom, eight in 2008-09).
