

- Fifteen charities supported

- Supported 19,000 participants in youth programs

- Eleven different charities supported
- Helped support over 1,250 youth through 24/7 crisis phone and chat services
- Access to food, shelter and safety to more than 1,200 youth
- Over 2,400 newborns supported
- Leading medical equipment purchased
- Supported the construction of 22 new suites and common areas added to Ronald
 McDonald House Ottawa
- Supported more than 270 military dependents and nearly 150 with special

Wellness Through Access

- Seven charities supported
- More than 18,000 breakfasts donated to young students in need
- 16,000 snowsuits to Ottawa Children in need over the winter season
- Helped provide over 1,000 educational bursaries to youth involved with child welfare
- Supported 110 youth transitioning from foster care to independence
- Supported youth education across 200 schools in Ottawa
- Helped provide over 5,200 hours of social recreation and community engagement to Indigenous youth
- Support for over 100 children living in family foster care
