TONIGHT'S GAME - BUFFALO vs. COLUMBUS - MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 23, 2024

Tonight's game marks Buffalo's second of six preseason games after the Sabres opened the preseason with a 7-3 victory over the Pittsburgh Penguins on Sept. 21. Tonight's matchup is being streamed on Sabres.com and broadcast on WWKB 1520AM in Western New York.

After wrapping up tonight's game, the Sabres will hit the road for three consecutive games against Pittsburgh on Sept. 24, Ottawa on Sept. 26 and Columbus on Sept. 28. Following their three-game road trip, Buffalo will return home for one final preseason tilt against the Detroit Red Wings on Sept. 30. Buffalo will also participate in an exhibition contest as part of the NHL Global Series Challenge against EHC Red Bull München in Germany at 2:30 p.m. ET on Sept. 27.

Buffalo and Columbus have played 25 preseason games against each other all-time. The Sabres are 13-12-0 in preseason contests against the Blue Jackets all-time. In their preseason history, the Sabres are 6-6-0 at Columbus and 5-4-0 against the Blue Jackets at home. Four of the 25 preseason games between the Sabres and Blue Jackets have been played at neutral site venues, with the Sabres going 2-2-0 in those games.

The Sabres and Blue Jackets will meet three times in the regular season, beginning with a matchup in Columbus on Oct. 17. Following their first trip to Columbus, the Sabres will play host to the Blue Jackets on Feb. 4 and hit the road to close the season series at Nationwide Arena on April 10.

The Sabres are 171-176-53 all-time in the preseason, including a 58-40-7 preseason record since the 2005-06 season. These totals only include games against NHL opponents; the Sabres also defeated Adler Mannheim 8-3 in an exhibition game as part of the 2011 NHL Premiere Series.

Buffalo will open the regular season with two neutral-site games in Czechia against the New Jersey Devils as part of the NHL Global Series. The Sabres will then return to Buffalo to play two home games at KeyBank Center on Oct. 10 (Los Angeles) and Oct. 12 (Florida), before heading out on their first standard road trip of the season with three consecutive away contests against Pittsburgh (Oct. 16), Columbus (Oct. 17) and Chicago (Oct. 19).

BLUE JACKETS OPEN EIGHT-GAME PRESEASON SCHEDULE: The Blue Jackets kick off their eight-game preseason schedule today with a game at the Buffalo Sabres at KeyBank Center. Columbus will play a pair of preseason games against the Sabres, Pittsburgh Penguins, St. Louis Blues and Washington Capitals. The Blue Jackets' eight exhibition contests occur in a span of 12 days and concludes with a home-and-home series against the Penguins on Oct. 3 (at Nationwide Arena) and Oct. 4 (at PPG Paints Arena). BLUE JACKETS HEADLINES

CHANGES AT THE TOP: The Blue Jackets have new leaders in the hockey operations department entering the 2024-25 campaign. Don Waddell was named president of hockey operations and general manager of the club on May 29, 2024 after serving as team president and general manager of the Metropolitan Division rival Carolina Hurricanes from 2018-24. Over the last six seasons, Carolina posted a 278-130-44 record to rank second in the NHL in points percentage (.664; Boston - .695) and third in wins (Boston - 289, Tampa Bay - 283). The Hurricanes won three division titles (2021-Central, 2022 and 2023-Metropolitan), advanced to the Stanley Cup Playoffs each year and earned trips to the Eastern Conference Finals twice (2019, 2023) during that time. Waddell hired Dean Evason as the team's new head coach on July 22, 2024. He amassed a 147-77-27 record in 251 games over parts of five seasons as head coach of the NHL's Minnesota Wild from 2020-23. His .639 points percentage ranks fifth among active NHL coaches with 250 or more contests behind the bench, while the Wild ranked eighth in the league in points percentage, seventh in goals-pergame (3.28) and 10th in wins during his tenure. He led the Wild to appearances in the Stanley Cup Playoffs in each of his fi rst four seasons behind the bench.

HONORING THE GAUDREAUS: Blue Jackets LW **Johnny Gaudreau** was tragically killed, along with his brother, Matthew, on Aug. 29, 2024. The team announced preliminary plans to honor and remember the Gaudreau brothers prior to and during the 2024-25 National Hockey League season on Sept. 18. Plans include wearing a special patch on jerseys and sticker on players helmets. Johnny tallied 243-500-743 in 763 games with Columbus and the Calgary Flames during his 10 NHL seasons and ranked ninth in the league in assists (500) and points (742) since 2014. He played in seven All-Star Games, was named to the NHL's First All-Star Team in 2021-22 with Calgary and won the Lady Byng Trophy in 2017-18. He led the Blue Jackets in assists and points in both of his seasons with the club (21-53-74, 80 GP in 2022-23; 12-48-60, 81 GP in 2023-24).

TRIO OF VETERANS ADDED: The club added three veterans to its locker room for the 2024-25 season with the trio combining for 632-871-1,503 in 2,962 career NHL outings. CBJ signed C **Sean Monahan** as a free agent on the first day of free agency on July 1 to a five-year contract. The sixth overall selection in the 2013 NHL Draft has totaled 244-294-538 in 764 career games with the Calgary

Flames, Montreal Canadiens and Winnipeg Jets. The forward, who totaled 26-33-59 in 83 outings split between Montreal and Winnipeg in 2023-24, has recorded eight 20-plus goals and six 50-point campaigns in his 11-year NHL career. Columbus signed Stanley Cup champion (2022 with Colorado) D Jack Johnson to a one-year contract two days later on July 3. He has collected 77-259-336 in 1,187 games with six different teams over his 18-year NHL career. In his second stint with the club, he ranks fifth on CBJ's all-time list among defensemen in games played, assists and points with 36-118-154 in 445 outings (2012-17). The Jackets signed veteran LW James van Riemsdyk to a one-year deal three days prior to the start of training camp on Sept. 15. He has totaled 311-318-629 in 1,011 career appearances with the Philadelphia Flyers, Toronto Maple Leafs and Boston Bruins over his 15-year NHL career.

AT THE DRAFT: The Blue Jackets selected six players in the 2024 NHL Draft held at Sphere in Las Vegas from June 28-29. The team drafted C **Cayden Lindstrom** in the first round fourth overall from the Western Hockey League's Medicine Hat Tigers. Lindstrom was awarded the Canadian Hockey League's Top Draft Prospect Award after posting 27-19-46 with 66 penalty minutes in 32 games with the Tigers. Overall, the club selected one forward, four defensemen and one netminder.

BUFFALO PROSPECT CHALLENGE RECAP: It was a new experience for the Blue Jackets when it comes to prospects tournaments. After playing in the annual Traverse City (Michigan) Prospects Tournament in 21 of its first 22 seasons, Columbus took part in the Prospects Challenge in Buffalo, New York for the first time from September 13-16. The club finished 2-1-0 after falling to the host Sabres, 3-1, in its opening game on Sept. 13 before rallying to earn a 4-3 overtime victory over the Boston Bruins on Sept. 14 and 4-1 win over the Ottawa Senators on Sept. 16. Invite C **Pano Fimis** led the club with three goals, including two with the game-winner in the win over Ottawa. RW **Gavin Brindley** notched goals in two of the contests and C **Luca Del Bel Belluz** tallying the overtime winner against the Bruins. **Nolan Lalonde** (stopped 38-of-41 shots vs. Buffalo), **Evan Gardner** (stopped 33-of-36 shots vs. Boston) and invite **Jacob Oster** (stopped 14-of-15 shots vs. Ottawa) each played well in goal for the Jackets.

2023-24 SEASON RECAP

COLUMBUS BLUE JACKETS COMPLETE 23RD NHL SEASON: The Columbus Blue Jackets completed their 23rd NHL season with a 27-43-12 record (66 pts./.402 pct.)... The club finished eighth in the Metropolitan Division, 16th in the Eastern Conference and 29th in the NHL... Columbus recorded a season-high four-game regulation unbeaten streak (2-0-2) from Oct. 20-26 (3-1 W vs. CGY, 5-4 W at MIN, 2-3 OTL vs. ANA, 3-4 OTL at MTL) and won three-of-four games (3-1-0) on three occasions (Nov. 22-27, Mar. 2-7, Mar. 30-Apr. 6)... Since the start of the 2012-13 season, the Blue Jackets have gone 425-386-101 (.521) with seven winning seasons and five Stanley Cup Playoffs berths during that span.

BLUE JACKETS AT HOME: The Blue Jackets went 17-19-5 (39 pts./.476) at home this season, scoring 123 goals (3.00 per game) and allowing 136 goals (3.32) in 41 games... The Jackets finished the season with a 7-3-1 mark over their final 11 home contests from Mar. 4-Apr 16, including wins over playoff qualifers Vegas, Edmonton, Colorado and Carolina... The club picked up points in three consecutive home games (2-0-1) from Dec. 1-8 (4-2 W vs. OTT, 3-4 OTL vs. LAK, 5-2 W vs. STL)... In 23 seasons, Columbus is 444-357-107 (.548) in 908 home games.

COLUMBUS ON THE ROAD: Columbus went 10-24-7 (27 pts./.329) on the road this season, scoring 111 goals (2.71 per game) and allowing 162 goals (3.95) in 41 games... The Blue Jackets went 8-6-3 on the road from Dec. 14-Mar. 2, including a five-game regulation unbeaten streak (3-0-2) from Dec. 14-Jan. 4 (6-5 W at TOR, 9-4 W at BUF, 3-4 OTL at NJD, 2-3 OTL at BUF, 3-2 W at PHI)... In 23 NHL seasons, Columbus is 323-470-113 (.419) in 906 road games.

GOALS FOR/GOALS AGAINST: Goals For: The Blue Jackets scored 234 goals in 82 games (not including SO goals), which was an average of 2.85 goals per game (24th-T, NHL)... The club scored a season-high nine goals on Dec. 19 at Buffalo (9-4 W) and posted two seven-goal contests on Nov. 22 vs. Chicago (7-3 W) and Feb. 21 at Anaheim (7-4 W)... Columbus scored four or more goals (not incl. SO goals) 26 times (21-3-2) and five or more on 14 occasions (14-0-0)... **Goals Against:** The Blue Jackets allowed 298 goals in 82 games, averaging 3.63 goals-against per game (31st, NHL)... The team surrendered two goals or fewer in 20 games (15-4-1) and one goal or fewer in four contests (4-0-0).

MISCELLANEOUS NEWS & NOTES: The Blue Jackets average age to start the campaign was 25.9, tied for the third-youngest team in the NHL (Arizona and New Jersey) and trailing only Buffalo (25.0) and Ottawa (25.7)... The club saw 11 players make their team debuts, including six making their NHL debuts... A season after seeing franchise highs in total players (47) and goaltenders (6) play a game, the club had 42 different players (skaters/goaltenders) and five different goaltenders see action for the club in 2023-24... Columbus played 13 back-to-back sets during the 2023-24 season and posted an overall record of 9-14-3 with a 5-7-1 mark in first games and 4-7-2 in second contests... CBJ blueliners combined for 39-148-187 in the 82 games and led the league in assist (38.1 pct.) and point percentage (30.0 pct.) and ranked 10th-T in points, 11th in assists and 12th in goals by a team's defense... Columbus scored the first goal of the game 45 times, tied for the ninth-most in the NHL and finishing with the fourth-most in a season in franchise history... The Blue Jackets averaged 30.0 shots on goal per game (20th, NHL) and allowed 34.4 shots-against (31st, NHL)...

Reached the 40-assist and 50-point marks for the first time in his career and set a new franchise record for most assists by a blueliner in a single season, surpassing James Wisniewski (44 - 2013-14)... JENNER BECOMES FRANCHISE LEADER IN GAMES PLAYED, MAKES ALL-STAR GAME DEBUT: C Boone Jenner ranked second on the team in goals and fourth in points with 22-13-35 in 58 outings despite missing 24 games, including 15 from Dec. 10-Jan. 15 due to a fractured jaw... Notched his third consecutive – and fourth career – 20-goal campaign, becoming the fourth player in franchise history to record four or more 20-goal seasons (Rick Nash-8, Cam Atkinson-6, R.J. Umberger-4)... Played in his 675th career game on Nov. 18 at Washington, surpassing LW Rick Nash (674) and becoming the franchise's all-time leader in games played... Scored a pair of goals in his All-Star Game debut at Toronto on Feb. 3... Posted his second career hat trick - and first natural hat trick - on Oct. 14 vs. the Rangers (3-0-3)... Skated in his 700th career game at Madison Square Garden on Feb. 28... Has served in a leadership role with CBJ since 2015, first as an alternate captain (2015-21) prior to being named as the team's captain before the 2021-22 season... Ranks third on the club's all-time lists in goals and points with 192-172-364 in 715 contests.

KIRILL THE THRILL: RW Kirill Marchenko set single-season career highs and led the team in goals and ranked third in points with 23-19-42 in 78 outings after notching 21-4-25 in 59 outings as a rookie in 2022-23... Became just the second Jacket (Pierre-Luc Dubois) to record back-to-back 20-goal seasons to begin his NHL career... Posted 35-14-49 in his first 100 contests with the club, tying Rick Nash for the most goals through the first 100 games of an NHL career in CBJ history... Scored his second career hat trick with three consecutive goals on Dec. 19 at Buffalo in a span of 8:07 to record the second fastest hat trick in franchise history (Jeff Carter, 3:18 on Dec. 22, 2011 at Nashville).

ROOKIE REPORT: CBI's rookies totaled 34-44-78 this season, leading the league among team rookie classes in goals (tied) and ranking fifth in points and seventh in assists... The club was one of three teams (Anaheim and Minnesota) to have two rookies record at least 26 points (Voronkov-34, Fantilli-27)... C Adam Fantilli, the third overall pick in the 2023 NHL Draft, finished his rookie campaign with 12-15-27, 16 penalty minutes and 115 shots on goal in 49 games... Missed the final 33 games of the season due to a calf laceration suffered on Jan. 28 at Seattle...
