

A second-round draft selection (60th overall) of the Rangers in 2020, Will Cuylle played his first full season with the Hartford Wolf Pack of the American Hockey League (AHL) in 2022-23, finishing first on the team in goals (25) and second in points (45). He made his NHL debut with the Rangers on Jan. 25 at Toronto and skated in four games. The 6-foot-3, 211-pound left wing skated in 184 career Ontario Hockey League games with the Windsor Spitfires from 2018-22, totaling 163 points (91G, 72A). He served as team captain in 2021-22 and earned a selection to the Second OHL All-Star Team. The Toronto, Ontario, native helped Canada earn a gold medal at the 2022 IIHF World Junior Championship.
