- The Stars are now 30-1-1 when leading after two periods, joining the Jets (34-0-1) as the second team with 30 wins in that scenario this season according to NHL Stats.
- **Matt Duchene** (0-2–2) became the fourth player in Stars team history to record 40 assists in each of his first two seasons (25-41–66) according to NHL Stats.

GAME NOTES

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Tonight is the third of four games the Stars will play against the Jets this season and the last time that they will play in Winnipeg this year. The teams face each other once more this season on April 10 in Dallas.
 - Dallas and Winnipeg split their first two games, with the Jets winning 4-1 on Nov. and the Stars 3-1 on Dec. 1.
- The Stars enter tonight's game with a 42-20-2 record for 86 points and a .672 points percentage. Their point total, points percentage and 42 wins ranked third in the NHL this season entering play Thursday.
- **Jamie Benn** enters tonight's game one goal shy of scoring his 400th career goal. When he reaches the milestone, he will become...
 - The second player in franchise history to score 400 goals, joining Mike Modano (557). 438 of Modano's 557 goals were scored with the Star after the team relocated to Dallas.
 - The second player drafted in 2007 to score 400 goals, with the other being Detroit's Patrick Kane (485).
 - The 10th active skater to score 400 career goals.
- A goal or an assist tonight would give **Cody Ceci** points in three consecutive games for the first time this season.
- Entering play Thursday, the Stars were the only NHL team this season to have not lost more than two consecutive games.
- Entering play Thursday, the Stars ranked in the top five in the NHL this season in both goals for per game (3.42, fourth) and goals against per game (2.58, third).
 - Dallas has allowed two or fewer goals in 33 of the 64 games that they have played this year.

FROM START TO FINNISH

- Prior to the 2025 NHL Trade Deadline, the Stars acquired forward **Mikko Rantanen** from the Carolina Hurricanes in exchange for forward Logan Stankoven, a 2026 first-round pick, a 2026 third-round pick, a 2027 third-round pick and

a 2028 first-round pick. Once the trade was completed, **Rantanen** signed an eight-year, \$96 million extension with the Stars.

- **Rantanen**, who averaged 1.13 points per game in 2024-25 at the time of the trade, was scoring at the highest rate of any player dealt on the NHL trade deadline since Joe Juneau (1.14) in 1994 according to Sportsnet Stats.
- **Rantanen** scored a goal and added an assist in his first game with Dallas on March 8 at Edmonton, making him the fifth player in the past 10 years to record multiple points in their Stars debut according to NHL Stats. The others are **Mason Marchment** (2-0—2 on Oct. 13, 2022), Mats Zuccarello (1-1—2 on Feb. 24, 2019), Connor Carrick (0-2—2 on Oct. 4, 2018) and Adam Cracknell (1-1—2 on Oct. 13, 2016).
- **Rantanen's** goal was also his 250th career power-play point. He became the seventh Finnish player in NHL history to reach the mark according to NHL Stats, behind Teemu Selanne (588), Jari Kurri (395), Kimmo Timonen (332), Saku Koivu (290), Teppo Numminen (274) and Mikko Koivu (251).
- **Rantanen** scored again in his second game with the Stars, becoming the sixth player in Stars team history to score in each of their first two games with the club according to NHL Stats. He joined Pelle Eklund in 1993-94, Lane MacDermid in 2012-13, Brett Ritchie in 2014-15, Mattias Janmark in 2015-16 and **Mason Marchment** in 2022-23.
- If **Rantanen** were to score again tonight, it would make him the first player in Stars team history to score in each of his first three games with the club according to NHL Stats.
- Entering play Thursday, **Rantanen** was tied for 11th in the NHL in scoring this season with 73 points (29-44—73) in 64 regular-season games with the Colorado Avalanche, Carolina Hurricanes and Stars. His goal, assist and point totals top all Stars skaters this season.
- **Rantanen** has totaled 690 points (291-399—690) in 634 regular-season games. Among Finnish-born players in NHL history, he ranks fourth in goals (291), seventh in points (690) and 10th in assists (399).
 - **Rantanen** is now one of five Finnish players on Dallas' roster, joining **Mikael Granlund**, **Miro Heiskanen**, **Roope Hintz** and **Esa Lindell**.
- **Rantanen** enters tonight's contest one assist shy of totaling 400 career assists. When he reaches the milestone, he will become the 46th active skater and third player from the 2015 draft class (Connor McDavid, Mitch Marner) to record 400 NHL assists.

GROUNDING THE JETS

- Dallas is 33-20-5 all-time vs. Winnipeg, including a 14-12-3 mark on the road.
- The Stars have earned points in 11 of their last 15 games against the Jets (9-4-2). Dallas has also recorded wins in two of their last three games played at Canada Life Centre.
- **Jason Robertson** has 13 points (9-4—13) in 13 career games against Winnipeg.
 - **Robertson's** nine goals against the Jets since the start of the 2019-20 season are tied for the seventh-most in the NHL.
- **Mikko Rantanen** has registered 28 points (10-18—28) in 29 career games played against Winnipeg.
 - **Rantanen's** 28 points against the Jets since the 2016-17 rank as the 10th most in the NHL.
- **Thomas Harley** enters tonight's contest riding a two-game point streak vs. Winnipeg (0-3—3), including putting up two assists in the two teams last matchup on Dec. 1. In all, **Harley** has recorded five points (1-4—5) in nine career games against the Jets.
- **Wyatt Johnston** has five points (3-2—5) in nine career games vs. Winnipeg.
- **Mason Marchment** has eight points (4-4—8) in 12 career games vs. Winnipeg.
- **Matt Duchene** has recorded 36 points (17-19—36) in 45 career games against the Jets. His 36 points vs. Winnipeg rank third among active Stars skaters.
 - **Jamie Benn** tops active Stars skaters in points against the Jets with 43 (19-24—43) in 47 career games.
- **Jake Oettinger** has posted a 6-2-1 record in nine career games against Winnipeg, posting a 2.23 goals-against average and a .916 save percentage in those contests.

ROBO ON THE GOGO

- **Jason Robertson** enters tonight's contest riding an eight-game point streak:
 - He registered a goal on March 9 against the Canucks.
 - He tallied an assist on March 8 against the Oilers.
 - He scored two goals, including the overtime winner, on March 6 against the Flames.
 - He recorded two assists on March 4 against the Devils.
 - He tallied an assist on March 2 against the Blues.
 - He scored a goal and added two assists on Feb. 28 against the Kings.
 - He notched a goal and an assist on Feb. 25 against the Blue Jackets.
 - He scored a hat trick on Feb. 23 against the Islanders.
- A goal or an assist tonight would give **Robertson** points in nine consecutive games for the first time since he had a point in 18 straight games from Oct. 27 to Dec. 4, 2022. It would also match **Wyatt Johnston** (2/8/2025 – 3/8/2025) for the longest streak by a Stars skater this season.
- **Robertson's** streak was tied for the second-longest active point streak in the NHL entering play Thursday.
- **Robertson's** assist against the Blues was his 60th point of the season. 2024-25 is now the third consecutive year in which he has recorded at least 60 points.

- **Roberston's** goal against the Kings was his 25th of the season, making the 2024-25 season the fourth consecutive year in which he has scored at least 25 goals. **Roberston** is sixth Dallas player in the past 30 years to record four or more consecutive 25-goal campaigns, joining **Jamie Benn** (6), **Tyler Seguin** (6), Mike Modano (5), Joe Pavelski (4) and Loui Eriksson (4).*
- **Robertson's** hat trick on Feb. 23 was the fourth of his career. Only three players in Stars/North Stars history have as many at age 25 or younger: Dino Ciccarelli (8), **Tyler Seguin** (7) and Steve Payne (6).*
- All three of **Roberston's** hat trick goals came in the second period, making him the first Stars skater to score three goals in a single period since Jamie Benn did so on April 7, 2018.*
- **Robertson's** three goals came within a 8:40 span, marking the fastest hat trick by a Stars player since April 7, 2018 when **Jamie Benn** scored three in 5:17.*
- **Robertson's** younger brother Nicholas also scored twice for the Maple Leafs on Feb. 23, making the Robertsons the first pair of brothers to score multiple goals on the same day since Pavel Bure and Valeri Bure on March 1, 2000.*

ROAD WARRIORS

- **Matt Duchene** leads the Stars in road scoring this season, totaling 39 points (14-25—39) in 32 games. His 39 road points were tied for the fifth-most in the NHL this season entering play Thursday.
 - **Duchene's** 25 road assists this season are already a career high and his 39 road points are the second-most of his 16-year NHL career.
- **Mikael Granlund** has recorded 37 points (12-25—37) in 36 road games this season, which includes notching seven points (1-6—7) in eight road games with this Stars. Entering play Thursday, he was tied for eighth in the NHL in road scoring this season.
 - **Granlund** enters tonight's game riding a three-game road point streak, scoring one goal and adding three assists during that span.
 - **Granlund's** 25 assists and 37 points on the road this season are already career bests, and his 12 goals scored on the road are tied for the most of his career.
- **Duchene's** and **Granlund's** 25 road assists this year were tied for ninth in the NHL entering play Thursday.
- **Wyatt Johnston** has been playing at a point-per-game pace on the road since Dec. 4, totaling 20 points (9-11—20) in 20 games played.
- **Evgenii Dadonov** enters tonight's game having tallied an assist in each of Dallas' last three road games. A goal or an assist tonight would give him points in four consecutive road games for the first time since March 2 to 13, 2023.
- **Jason Robertson** is riding a four-game road point streak dating back to Feb. 23 against the Islanders. A goal or an assist tonight would extend his road point streak to five games for the second time this season.
 - **Robertson** has been playing at a point-per-game pace on the road since Nov. 16, totaling 25 points (11-14—25) in 25 games played.
- **Thoams Harley** has seven points (4-3—7) in his last seven games played on the road and enters tonight's game riding a three-game road point streak. A goal or an assist tonight would give him points in four consecutive road games for the second time this season.
 - His seven road points since Feb. 7 were tied for the fourth-most among all NHL defensemen entering play Thursday.
- **Cody Ceci** has four assists in his last four games played on the road.
- **Casey DeSmith** has won each of the last four games that he has played on the road dating back to Jan. 25, posting a .948 save percentage and a 1.50 goals-against average during that span.

BIKER GANG

- **Thomas Harley** scored the team's opening goal in their last game – a 4-1 win over the Vancouver Canucks on March 9 – and now has 16 points (4-11—16) in his last 14 games played dating back to Jan. 31. His 16 points during that span rank fifth on Dallas' roster.
- **Harley's** 16 points since Jan. 31 were tied for the second-most during that span among all NHL defensemen entering play Thursday, trailing only Colorado's Cale Makar (19) for the league lead.
- Since Jan. 31 – Dallas' first game without **Miro Heiskanen** – **Harley** has been averaging 25:18 of ice time per game, which tops all Stars skaters and ranked seventh in the NHL entering play Thursday.
 - **Harley** has logged at least 26 minutes of ice time in seven of those 13 games during that span.
 - Prior to Jan. 31, **Harley** was averaging 22:27 of ice time per game.
- When **Harley** has been on the ice during even-strength play this season, the Stars have outscored their opponents 72-44. Entering play Thursday, his plus-28 goal differential was tied for the eighth-best mark in the NHL this year and his 77 on-ice goals for tied for 11th.
- In all, **Harley** has totaled 39 points (12-27—39) in 62 regular-season games this season, which would put him on pace to finish the 2024-25 regular season with a career-high 35 assists and 50 points.
 - His 12 goals this season were tied for the seventh-most among all NHL defensemen this season entering play Thursday.

A TALE OF TWO SEASONS

- Prior to Dec. 1, the Stars had a 14-8-0 record for 28 points and a 0.636 points percentage. Their 0.636 points percentage was the seventh best mark in the NHL during that span.
- Since Dec. 1, the Stars have posted a 28-12-2 record in 42 games for 58 points and a 0.690 points percentage. The team's win total during that span topped the NHL entering play Thursday and their point total and points percentage were tied for second.
- Special teams have also been a point of improvement for the Stars since Dec. 1. Prior to the start of December, the Stars power play was clicking at an 18.6 percent success rate and the team was killing off 81.5 percent of the penalties they took. Since Dec. 1, the Stars have a 25.2 percent and 86.4 percent success rate on the power play and penalty kill, respectively.
- Several Stars skaters have also seen significant spikes in their offensive production:

- Robertson** (fifth) and **Johnston** (tied 10th) both ranked in the top 10 in the NHL in scoring since Dec. 1 entering play Thursday.

JOHNNY B. GOODE

- On March 8, **Wyatt Johnston** signed a five-year, \$42 million contract extension with the Stars that will begin next season and carry an average annual value (AAV) of \$8.4 million.
- Johnston** has 60 points (24-36—60) in 64 games this season, which ranks fourth on the Stars in scoring and makes the 2024-25 season his second-consecutive 60-point season. He's now on pace to finish the year with 78 points, which would be a career high.
- Johnston** has also recorded a point in each of the last 14 games he has played at the American Airlines Center, making him the third player in franchise history to have a point in at least 14 consecutive home games according to NHL Stats, joining Mike Modano (16 games; Jan. 31 to April 3, 2000) and Neal Broten (18 games; Oct. 5 to Dec. 14, 1989).
- Johnston** scored the third hat trick of his career and his second of the season in Dallas' March 2 game, a 6-3 win over the St. Louis Blues. **Johnston** tied Steve Payne for the second-most hat tricks in franchise history by a player before turning 22 according to NHL Stats.
- According to NHL Stats, **Johnston's** hat trick also made him the ninth active player to score at least three career hat tricks before his 22nd birthday.
- All three of **Johnston's** goals came on the power play, making him the second player this season to score three power-play goals in a game, joining Patrik Laine who did so on Dec. 17 against the Buffalo Sabres.
 - Johnston's** performance against the Blues marked the eighth time in franchise history – and first since Philippe Boucher on Nov. 24, 2006 – that a Stars/North Stars skater has scored three power-play goals in a single game.
- Johnston's** first goal of the night was the 75th of his career, making him the third players in franchise history to score 75 career goals before turning 22 according to NHL Stats. The others are Bruan Bellows (133 in 311 games played) and Mike Modano (90 in 235 games played).
- His second goal of the night was his 20th of the season, which made him the third player in franchise history to record three 20-goal seasons before the age of 22 according to NHL Stats, joining Brian Bellows (4) and Mike Modano (3).
- Johnston's** tallied his 34th assist of the season in Dallas' Feb. 25 game against the Columbus Blue Jackets, which set a career high for the forward.
- Johnston** scored his third shorthanded goal of the season in Dallas' Feb. 22 game against the New Jersey Devils. Entering play Thursday, his three shorthanded goals were tied for fifth in the NHL this year.
- The goal was also the sixth shorthanded tally of his career. Since **Johnston** made his NHL debut, his six shorthanded goals rank second on Dallas' roster (**Roope Hintz**; 7) and are tied for 10th in the NHL.

POWER UP

- Since Jan. 1, the Stars have gone 26-for-75 on the power play for a 34.7 percent success rate, which was the second-best mark in the NHL during that span entering play Thursday.
- The team's 26 power-play goals since Jan. 1 were also the second-most in the NHL entering play Thursday, trailing only the Detroit Red Wings (30) for the league lead.
- Wyatt Johnston** has scored six power-play goals since Jan. 1, which was tied for the third-most in the NHL during that span entering play Thursday.
 - In all this season, **Johnston** has scored a career-high eight power-play goals, which is five more than he had in both 2022-23 and 2023-24.
- The Stars went a perfect 4-for-4 on the power play in their game on March 2 against the Blues, marking the first time that they have scored four power-play goals in a game since Nov. 12, 2023.
 - Dallas' game against St. Louis marked one of four instances this year in which a team has scored four power-play goals in a game. The Ottawa Senators (10/14 vs. LAK), Winnipeg Jets (10/18 vs. SJS) and Florida Panthers (12/5 at PHI) all previously did so.
- Their performance against the Blues also was the first time in Stars team history that the team had a 100 percent success rate on the power play in a single game while scoring at least four power-play goals.

GOALIE GANG

- Jake Oettinger** has an 14-5-1 record in his last 20 games played dating back to Dec. 29, posting a .911 save percentage and a 2.54 goals-against average during that span.
 - His 14 wins since Dec. 29 were tied for the second-most in the NHL entering play Thursday.
- Oettinger** earned his 30th win of the season in Dallas' game on March 6, a 3-2 overtime win over the Calgary Flames. According to NHL Stats, he became the fourth goaltender in Stars/North Stars history with four or more 30-win seasons, joining Marty Turco (6x), Ed Belfour (4x) and Kari Lehtonen (4x). He also joined Turco (6 from 2002-03 to 2008-09) and Belfour (4 from 1997-98 to 2000-01) as the only netminders to do so in four consecutive campaigns with the franchise.
- Oettinger** made a season-high 39 saves in Dallas' March 2 game, a 6-3 win over the Blues. The Stars were outshot 42-21 in that game.
- Casey DeSmith** has won each of the last six games that he has played dating back to Jan. 25 against the St. Louis Blues, posting a .931 save percentage and a 2.01 goals-against average in those contests.

- o Among netminders that have played at least five games since Jan. 25, DeSmith ranked fifth in both goals-against average and save percentage entering play Thursday.
- **DeSmith's** six-game win streak is the longest such streak of his career and was the longest active such streak in the NHL entering play Thursday. If he were to win the next game that he plays, he would become the seventh goaltender this season to have a win streak of at least seven games.
- In all, **Oettinger** and **DeSmith** have combined for a .906 save percentage this season, which was tied for the second-best mark of any team in the NHL this season entering play Thursday. Only Winnipeg (.917) ranked higher.
- The duo's 2.56 goals-against average this season was ranked fourth in the NHL this year entering play Thursday.

BISCH BETTER HAVE MY MONEY

- Stars rookie **Lian Bichsel** has played in 14 games for Dallas since being recalled from Texas (AHL) on Jan. 23. In those games, the Stars have outscored their opponents 14-10, outshot them 101-81 and have 98 scoring chances to their 79 when **Bichsel** has been on the ice during 5-on-5 play according to Natural Stat Trick.
 - o His 55.5 shots for percentage tops all Stars skaters during that span.
- **Bichsel** has recorded at least four hits in 11 of the 14 games that he has played since being recalled from Texas (AHL). In all this season, he is averaging 16.41 hits per 60, which tops the Stars roster and ranked eighth among all NHL rookies this season to play in at least five games entering play Thursday.
- Despite only playing in 22 games this season, **Bichsel** is tied with **Jamie Benn** for the team lead with 90 hits. His 89 hits also ranked eighth among all NHL rookies this season entering play Thursday.
- There have been eight instances of a Stars skater recording six hits in a single game this season, with **Bichsel** owning seven of them.
- **Bichsel** is the only rookie this season to have recorded at least six hits in a game seven times. No other rookie had done it more than four times this season entering play Thursday.

KILLING IT

- The Stars have had an 84.5 percent success rate on the penalty kill this season, which was the best mark in the NHL this year entering play Thursday.
- No team in the league this season has allowed fewer power-play goals against than the Stars' 26, and their -20 goal differential on the penalty kill this year was tied for the best mark in the NHL entering play Thursday.
- If the Stars maintain this pace, it would make the 2024-25 season their best on the penalty kill since 2007-08, when the team finished the season with an 85.6 percent success rate on the penalty kill.
- The Stars are also one of the least-penalized teams in the league, ranking 30th in the league in total penalty minutes (420) and 29th in penalty minutes per game (6:33) entering play Thursday.
 - o Dallas' game on March 8 against the Oilers marked the second time this season that the Stars were not assessed a penalty in a game.
- Entering play Thursday, **Esa Lindell** was leading all NHL skaters in both total shorthanded ice time (217:30) and shorthanded ice time per game (3:24) this season.
