AT A GLANCE

CALIFORNIA DREAMIN'

Thousand Oaks, Calif. native Trevor Moore skates into Denver on a career-long six-game point streak (2-5=7) after scoring his third tally of the season last night in Calgary. Moore returns to the Centennial State for the ninth time in his professional career after spending three seasons at the University of Denver. Through 121 collegiate contests with the Pioneers, Moore tallied 120 points (47-73-120) where he captured an NCAA National Championship in 2014 and was a Second-Team All-American as a sophomore. On Saturday against the Blue Jackets, Moore potted the 11th shorthanded goal of his career to surpass **Ziggy Palffy** for sole possession of the seventh-most in team history. Since making his Kings debut on Feb. 8, 2020, Moore's 11 shorthanded goals is tied with Adrian Kempe and paces both Kings and League skaters alike.


55 PUSHING FOR 5

Forward **Quinton Byfield** skates into Ball Arena with five points (3-2=5) in his last four contests against the Avalanche, dating back to March 9, 2023. In his last game against Colorado, Byfield tallied two goals—including the game-winner—to push his point streak against the franchise to a fourth game on Dec. 3, 2023. With an assist on Moore's tally last night in Calgary, Byfield now has four points (2-2=4) in as many games entering tomorrow's matchup.

KOPI-STAR

With 61 points (18-43=61) in 64 appearances, Anze Kopitar has the most points against the Colorado Avalanche of any active skater in the League. The Kings' captain is the franchise leader in both assists and points against the organization and ranks second in team history in goals scored against the Nordiques/ Avalanche franchise behind only Luc Robitaille (32). Kopitar enters tomorrow's matchup at Ball Arena with eight assists in his last five matchups against the Avalanche. The two-time Selke winner currently leads the Kings with 18 points (5-13=18) through the first 17 games of the season and has three points (0-3=3) in his most recent pair of contests. Kopitar is set to play his 1,391st game tomorrow, which would tie **Dough Mohns** for the 45th most in NHL history.
