April 6, 2024 – CALGARY FLAMES [2] vs. EDMONTON OILERS [4]

The Calgary Flames welcomed the Edmonton Oilers to the Scotiabank Saddledome on Saturday night for Hockey Night in Canada. Edmonton would score the only marker of the opening frame to take a 1-0 lead into the first intermission. In the second, the teams would trade tallies with Yegor Sharangovich reaching the 30-goal mark for the first time in his career, but the Flames trailed 2-1 through 40. Nazem Kadri drew Calgary level in the third, but Edmonton would score later in the final stanza and add an empty netter to win 4-2.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the second of three meetings this season between the Flames and Sharks. Calgary fell 6-3 in these clubs first meeting back on February 15th.

This is a Pacific Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 10-10-1 against Pacific Division teams and a record of 20-22-2 against Western Conference opponents.

FIRST MEETING:

The Calgary Flames welcomed the San Jose Sharks to the Scotiabank Saddledome for the first time this season back on February 15th. Nazem Kadri would open the scoring just 4:19 into the contest and the Flames led 1-0 through 20. The Sharks would score three unanswered in the second, before Mikael Backlund responded for Calgary and the home side trailed 3-2 through two periods of play. In the final frame, the Sharks would score three to knock off the Flames 6-3.

WEEGSY BABY:

With 19 goals on the campaign, MacKenzie Weegar is just one tally away from becoming the first Flames rearguard to post a 20-goal season since Mark Giordano did during the 2015-16 campaign. Recently, Weegar recorded his 200th NHL point and became just the ninth defenceman drafted in the seventh-round to reach 200 points in NHL history, and the only one to do so with less than 500 games played over their career (463).

SHARKNADO:

With his tally on Saturday night against Edmonton, Yegor Sharangovich has joined Kent Nilsson (40 in 1979-80), Michael Cammalleri (39 in 2008-09), Lanny McDonald (34 in 1981-82), Bob MacMillan (31 in 1977-78) and Hakan Loob (30 in 1983-84) as the sixth player in Flames history to record 30 or more goals in their first season with the club. Sharangovich has now scored the most goals in a single season by a Belarussian skater in NHL history, beating Mikhail Grabovski's 29-goals during the 2010-11 campaign. With two more points, Sharangovich can tie Grabovski for the most points in a single season by a Belarussian native.

RED SOLO CUP:

On Monday morning, the Calgary Flames announced the recall of defenceman Ilya Solovyov from the AHL's Calgary Wranglers. In 50 games in the American Hockey League, Solovyov has five goals and nine assists for 14 points along with 34 penalty minutes. The Mogilev, BLE native has also skated in six games with the Flames this season, registering his first NHL point with an assist on December 5th against the Minnesota Wild. Solovyov is also one of just three players drafted in the seventh round of the 2020 NHL draft to skate in NHL action this season along with Louis Crevier (CHI) and Adam Raska (MIN).



COLTS CONNECTIONS:

Flames forward Andrew Mangiapane and defenseman Rasmus Andersson along with Sharks winger Kevin Labanc and goaltender Mackenzie Blackwood were all teammates on the Barrie Colts for two seasons in 2014-15 and 2015-16. The three skaters were all in the top five of Colts scoring in both seasons, with Andersson leading all Colts defenders in scoring over the two-year span with at least 60 points on both campaigns. Blackwood would lead the charge in the blue paint, topping all Barrie netminders in games played in both 2014-15 and 2015-16. Labanc and Mangiapane would both break the 100-point plateau in the two campaigns and in 2015-16, Mangiapane would be tied for second in goals (51) with fellow NHLer Alex DeBrincat while Kevin Labanc led the OHL in assists (88). Mangiapane, Labanc and Blackwood also played together in Barrie in the 2013-14 season while Andersson was a member of the Malmo Redhawks (SHL).

HEY DID YOU KNOW?

In these clubs' first meeting, Jonathan Huberdeau recorded his 700th NHL point with an assist. Huberdeau became the third skater to reach the 700-point plateau from the 2011 draft class, joining Nikita Kucherov and Johnny Gaudreau.

CALGARY WRANGLERS (AHL): 35-25-8
