

### TICKETS

The Buffalo Sabres' Ticket Office at Memorial Auditorium is located off the Terrace St. lobby, and sells home game tickets 10 games in advance. General public window sales take place Monday through Friday from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., Saturdays from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m., and on gamedays from 9 a.m. through the end of the second intermission. Mail orders also are accepted. Gift certificates and handicapped seating are available from the Sabres' ticket office.

Fans also may purchase tickets in person at any Ticketmaster outlet, including Movies Plus video stores and Record Theatre locations.

Outlet sales are on a cash only basis.

Customers who wish to use the phone and charge their ticket order through a major credit card can call Ticketmaster at (716) 852-5000.
Those in Rochester can call (716) 232-1900, while fans in Canada would use (800) 755-5589. Phone orders are taken Monday through Friday from 9 a.m. to 10 p.m., and on Saturdays and Sundays from 9 a.m. to 8 p.m. The Sabres' ticket office no longer accepts phone orders.







### Seymour

### Chairman of the Board and President

One of the founding owners of the Buffalo Sabres, Seymour H. Knox III heads the Club's management as Chairman of the Board and President and, at the league level, represents the Sabres as Club Governor of the National Hockey League Board of Governors. In addition, Seymour is a director of Pratt and Lambert Inc. and the Woolworth Corporation. Furthermore, he is

President of the Buffalo Fine Arts Academy and is a member of the Board of Trustees of the YMCA of Greater Buffalo and the Buffalo General Hospital. His brother Northrup, now Chairman of the Board of Marine Midland Bank N.A., remains a consultant to the team since his May 1988 resignation as Sabres' President. Son Seymour H. Knox IV serves in the capacity of Assistant to the President and Alternate Governor in the NHL.

The Knox brothers first made an attempt to bring the NHL to Buffalo when they applied for a franchise in September of 1965. When the city was passed over in the 1967 league expansion, Seymour and Northrup signed a contract in 1968 to purchase the Oakland franchise with the intent of moving it to Buffalo. The NHL Board of Governors decided to keep the Seals in Oakland. However, the Knox brothers continued to work towards their goal. Finally, their efforts were rewarded on December 2, 1969, when the City was granted an expansion franchise for the 1970-71 season.

More recently, Seymour has been instrumental in bringing two new major league sports franchises to Buffalo with the formation of the Buffalo Bandits of the Major Indoor Lacrosse League and the Buffalo Bizzard of the National Professional Soccer League, both of which also play in Memorial Auditorium. Presently, Seymour is concentrating his efforts on having a new sports and entertainment complex built at the Crossroads in downtown Buffalo.

Seymour and his wife, Jean, reside in Buffalo and have four children and four grandchildren.

### Vice-President and General Manager

With the changing times brought about by the 1990's and the National Hockey League comes the need for increased responsibility and dedication. Gerry Meehan has been a dedicated Bufato Sabre since the early '70's and his playing days here. So, last season he was rewarded with an increase in his front office duties with the addition

of the Vice-President's title. He has also gained respect at the league level, where he is Chairman of the General Managers' Committee.


Meehan enters his sixth full season as G.M. In his first full year on the job in 1987-88, the Sabres jumped from 21st place to a tie for seventh in the overall standings As a result, Meehan finished in a tie for second in voting by The Sporting News for the NHL's Executive of the Year. The club continued to climb, when, in 1989-90, they jumped to third overall. Meehan continued his goal of forming a club that would soar to the top of the league when he acquired the services of John Muckler as Director of Hockey Operations and superstar Pat LaFontaine within a five month span last year.

Meehan's commitment to restructuring the team can be summed up in two words, new direction. The changeover that the team has undergone under his leadership is evidenced in not only the two acquisitions sighted above, but in those such as trading within the division for Petr Svoboda, recognizing talent in the pleasant surprise that was goalie Tom Draper's rookie season, and securing a better draft position on draft day 1990 in the Dale Hawerchuk trade that enabled the Sabres to select forward Brad May.

By reaching an agreement this summer with John Muckler to stay behind the bench as head coach, Meehan has assured fans that he will continue to put forth a high-paced, exciting and entertaining team filled with speed, aggressiveness, and high-profile players with entertainment value.

Meehan was named the team's assistant general manager in the summer of 1984, the first ex-Sabre player to move into the club's front office. Since then he has developed the plan which, now implemented, will make the Sabres a successful team in the '90's.

### Director of Hockey Operations and Head Coach

John Muckler enters his second season with the Sabres, but has already made his presence known by establishing a new style of play in Buffalo that has become trademark of his teams.

Best known for coaching the Edmonton Oilers to the Stanley Cup during the 1989-90 season, Muckler has worked in virtually every level of hockey over his storied career. In his other season as Edmonton's head coach, the Oilers reached the Conference Finals. His experience behind the bench helped ease the decision of naming a new coach for the Sabres during last season when Muckler took over after the first 28 games, during which he was strictly the Director of Hockey Operations.

Muckler first joined the Edmonton organization in 1981, serving as coach of Wichita in the Central Hockey League. He was promoted to assistant coach of the Oilers in 1982 and was named co-coach under Glen Sather in 1985-86. Muckler received a great deal of the credit for Edmonton's capture of four other Stanley Cups in the 1980's.

He started his coaching career in 1959 as head coach of the New York Rovers of the EHL. In 1966, Muckler was named director of player personnel with the New York Rangers. That was followed by a six-year association as General Manager (and sometimes coach) of affiliates in the Minnesota North Stars' organization. He switched back to the Rangers' organization to coach their top affiliate in Providence for four seasons. Muckler joined Vancouver as general manager and coach of their minor league affiliate in Dallas in 1979 and the following year became their professional scout before moving to the Oilers.

Muckler has been named Coach of the Year in three leagues (EHL, 1964-65; AHL, 1974-75; CHL, 1978-79), and he won minor league titles in those same three years.

John and his wife Audrey have become residents of East Amherst.



### Assistant Coach

To help continue a winning tradition with the Sabres, General Manager Gerry Meehan has brought Don Lever back up to Buffalo after a successful 1991-92 season as head coach of the AHL affiliate Rochester Americans, in which the club went to the semi-finals. Lever is no stranger to the position, having served in the same capacity from 1987-98 to 1999-90

John Muckler will be the third head coach Lever will have worked under as a Sabres' assistant coach when this 1992-93 campaign begins. He has also worked with Ted Sator and Rick Dudley. Plus, Lever has gained plenty of experience from coaching and playing.

In 1990-91, Lever's first season as coach of the Amerks, he took Rochester to the Calder Cup finals. That club had already posted the league's best record during the regular season. Fittingly, AHL Coach of the Year honors went to Lever that summer. Previously, Lever was known there as a player in 1985-86 and 1986-87. He was also a player-coach there in his final pro season, helping the team win the Calder Cup.

Lever played his junior hockey in nearby Niagara Falls, Ontario. After scoring 126 points in 63 games for the Flyers, he was the first draft choice (and third pick overall) of the Vancouver Canucks in 1972. He spent almost eight full seasons there, and set his career-high of 38 goals in 1974-75.

Don was traded to Atlanta in February, 1980, and moved with the Flames to Calgary that summer. He was dealt to Colorado in 1981, and again he was a part of a franchise shift as the Rockies became the New Jersey Devils in 1982. The Sabres acquired his rights from the Devils on September 9, 1985, and he spent two seasons as a player in Buffalo's organization. During that time he played his 1,000th NHL game.

Don, his wife Karen and their children, Michael, Sarah and Caitlin, live in Amherst.





### Assistant Coach

Most hockey fans don't know what the assistant coach does. Some may not even know him. John Tortorella is tough to pinpoint. He can sometimes be seen behind the Buffalo bench, or he's in the press box. His role is also complex. He works on all of the following: practice planning, conditioning, and team and game analysis. John is the textbook Sabres' hockey deparment person. His background is all hockey!



A Boston area native, John started his college career at Salem State College and then transferred to the University of Maine. There he won three letters and was a two-time ECAC All-Star. After some time in Sweden, he played in the Atlantic Coast Hockey League for such teams as Virginia, Hampton Roads and Erie. Former Sabres' Coach Rick Dudley was a coach for Carolina in the ACHL during that time. Tortorella was Virginia's top scorer during the 1985-86 season.

In 1986, he was named General Manager and Head Coach of the Virginia Lancers of the ACHL. In two years he had an 87-31 record, and won the league championship and coach of the year honors both times. In 1988, Tortorella worked as an assistant coach for the Fort Wayne Comets of the International Hockey League. Dudley hired him to be his assistant in New Haven in 1988, and he brought Tortorella along when Dudley was hired as the Sabres' coach.

John and his wife Chris have two children, Brittany and Dominick. The family lives in East Amherst.

### Assistant to the General Manager

Craig Ramsay has been with the Buffalo Sabres organization for 20 years now and there's almost nothing he hasn't done, having played, coached, and now found his place in the hockey department in his current position.

The original "Rammer," Craig assists General Manager Gerry Meehan in many roles, notably immigration and the club's travel arrangements and game schedule. He also works closely with the Sabres' AHL affiliate, the Rochester Americans, and he keeps track of the future Sabres who have been drafted but are not yet professional players. Included in the duties with the Amerks is working closely with both clubs' coaches for organizational recalls. Craig also is very active in the Sabres' Alumni Association.

A left winger in his playing days, Ramsay was Buffalo's second round draft choice in 1971. He stayed through the 1984-85 season, making news in the league when he recorded a streak of 776 consecutive games played from March of 1973 to February 1983. He was a player-assistant coach in his final campaign, and he capped his career by winning the Frank Selke Trophy as the league's top defensive forward.

Ramsay retired to concentrate on his duties as assistant coach in the fall of 1985. He stayed in that post until November, 1986, when he was named Buffalo's head coach. He then moved to the front office in December, 1986 as part of a reorganization by Gerry Meehan.

### Director of Player Personnel

Don Luce rounds out a trio of former Sabres in the club's hockey department. It is fitting that his postplaying days are being spent with a team he played close to 90 percent of his NHL career with. What he's also earned should be a middle initial "T" for all the travelling he does.

Don is in charge of the team's scouting staff.

Together they search Canadian junior leagues, American high schools and colleges and European leagues in search of promising young players.

Luce became a Sabre as part of a trade with Detroit for Joe Daley in 1971. He went on to win the Masterton Trophy in 1974-75, the year of the only Sabres appearance in the Stanley Cup Finals. That season, he also achieved an incredible +61 to lead the squad's plus/minus rankings, a mark that is still a team record. He and Craig Ramsay ranked as two of the league's best penalty-killers throughout the 1970's.

After a trade to Los Angeles, Luce went on to play for Toronto where he retired in the 1981-82 season. He rejoined the Sabres' organization in 1984, and worked on special assignments and American scouting. In 1985-86, Don was an assistant coach. He took on his current role in 1987. One of his major accomplishments was his instrumental role in bringing Alexander Mogilny to America in 1989.

Don and his wife Diane, along with children Scott, Kim, Kelly, and Kristin live in Williamsville.



#### NHL NOTES OF INTEREST

SEASON AHEAD:

The 1992-93 season will be the 76th in the history of the National Hockey League, It marks the Sabres' 23rd. The league will also recognize the 100th Anniversary of the Stanley Cup this year.

ENTRY DRAFT:

The 1993 Entry Draft will be held in Quebec City on June 26th during the Annual Congress which will run from June 23-28.

GOALS-AGAINST AVERAGE:

To calculate for a player or team, divide goals against by minutes played and multiply by 60.

GOALS-FOR AVERAGE:

To calculate for a goalie, divide goals scored by his team while he played by minutes played and multiply

PLUS-MINUS RATING:

A player receives a "plus-one" when he is on the ice for an even-strength or short-handed goal by his team. He receives a "minus-one" when he is on the ice for an even-strength or short-handed goal by the other team. The overall season rating is determined by totaling all of the pluses and minuses for the

POWER PLAY RANKINGS:

When a team scores during a five minute power play situation, it is considered that a new situation is about to begin. Therefore, if a team scores one power play goal in five minutes it is considered one for two in the official league rankings. If it scores two goals in that time, it is considered two for three. If the team scores exactly five minutes after the penalty is called, it is one for one. If a team has a two man advantage of any kind, it is considered to be two separate power-play opportunities for statistical purposes.

ROOKIE:

In order to be considered a rookie, a player must not have played in 25 or more NHL games in any preceding season, nor in six or more NHL games in each of any two preceding seasons.

SCHEDULE:

With the addition this season of the expansion Ottawa Senators (to the Adams Division) and the Tampa Bay Lightning (to the Norris Division), each division now consists of six teams. All of the 24 teams will play 84 games this season, 41 at home, 41 on the road, and two at neutral sites.

SHOTS AGAINST AVERAGE:

To calculate for a player or team, divide shots against by minutes played and multiply by 60.

TIE-BREAKERS IN THE STANDINGS:

According to the NHL, the following is the official method of determining which team is higher in the standings if two or more clubs have the same number of points:

1. Overall wins.

2. Points in head-to-head competition.

3. Overall goals scored minus overall goals allowed.

4. Special emergency meeting or conference call of general managers.

There is no provision for a coin flip. The same procedure is used for determining the order of the Entry Draft.

TRADING DEADLINE:

March 20, 1993. The date also marks the last day for loans and recalls from minor league teams except in emergency (usually injury-related) situations.

WAIVER DRAFT:

October 4, 1992 at 2:00 p.m. EST.

Season passes are available only to those media members who report on the team on a regular basis. Those who need media credentials for an individual game should contact Steve Rossi or Bruce Wawrzyniak by 5 p.m. the day before a game, and by 5 p.m. on Friday before a Sunday game. Press box seats will be filled on a space-available basis.

The media entrance to Memorial Auditorium during Sabres' games is located on the Pearl Street side of the building at street level. Pearl St. runs along the west side of the Aud. There is no media parking area.

All requests for pre-game (such as live shots for newscasts at the dinner hour) and intermission interviews must be given to Steve Rossi by the pre-game skate that morning.

Press credentials can be picked up before 5 p.m. on game days from the public relations department. After the start of the game, credentials will be held at the main office for late-arriving media members.

The Sabres' press lounge opens two hours before game time. Beginning this season, it is now located at the northeast end of the Auditorium between the second and third level (near the city office, which is Suite B, and the Buffalo Blizzard office - prevously the Sabres' marketing department). Use Terrace St. lobby/Main St. side staircase (opposite elevators).

To reach the press box, take escalators on the west side of the building to the fifth and highest level, or take Terrace St. lobby elevator to "Suite Level." The entrance ramp is about 25 feet beyond and a few steps below the end of the escalator. Credentials should be displayed for admission to the press box, press lounge and dressing room areas.

Smoking is prohibited in both the press lounge and the press box. There are designated smoking areas throughout the auditorium.

A limited amount of credit card phones are available for use, as well as one pay phone.

Most practices will be held at Sabreland, the Sabres' practice facility on Niagara Falls Boulevard in Wheatfield. Practices are open to the media, and reporters should contact the public relations department to verify times or receive directions to the Facility.

#### DIRECTIONS TO MEMORIAL AUDITORIUM

Memorial Auditorium is at the intersection of Main and Terrace Streets in downtown Buffalo. Visitors to the city can come to the Aud by traveling on Interstate 190 and using the Elm Street exit. Take a left on Swan Street, then take a left on Pearl Street. The Aud is located two blocks down Pearl St. at Lower Terrace. There are several parking lots in that area. 
Despite having played parts of his NHL career in three other cities, John Van Boxmeer is very much a part of the Buffalo Sabres organization, past and present. The former NHL defenseman played for Buffalo, made two appearances with AHL affiliate


Rochester, coached the Americans, was "called up" to the parent team for two seasons as the Sabres' Associate Coach, and now heads back down the thruway again to take over as Amerks' bench boss.

Previously, "Boxy" coached five full seasons and part of a sixth with the Amerks, taking two of those clubs to the Calder Cup Finals, one of which emerged a winner. His tenure in Rochester is still the longest continuous stretch in the club's history, and his 226 career victories there rank second by just 35 to Joe Crozier's mark. He is one of only three men to guide the Amerks to an AHL championship. Van Boxmeer posted a .554 career winning percentage.

With the parent Sabres, Boxy began his relationship as a defenseman in 1979-80. A member of the 1975-76 Stanley Cup Champion Montreal Canadiens, John's productivity flourished with Buffalo. Despite playing just four full seasons with the Sabres, he scored more than half of his NHL career goals here. Handling out the assists also helped him to successful point totals, one of which (69 in 1980-81) was a team record for points in a season by a defenseman until Phil Housley notched one more in '88-'89. Van Boxmeer's NHL career began when he was tapped in the first round of the 1972 Entry Draft by the Canadiens.

John, his wife Judy, and children Ashley and Henry make their home in East Amherst. John likes to play golf in the off-season.

Martin began his relationship with the Sabres in 1975-76 after having been selected as the team's third round draft choice in '75. He then headed north after being taken by Quebec in the 1979 Expansion Draft, and also went on to play with Toronto, Edmonton and Minnesota. 




