Post-Game Notes

- The Tampa Bay Lightning lost 6-4 to the Detroit Red Wings on Saturday Night at Little Caesars Arena in Detroit.
- The Lightning moved to 1-1-0 this season as they lost in their first road game of 2023-24.
- Tampa Bay was outshot 42-26 by Detroit, including 21-7 shot deficit in the second period.
- Steven Stamkos led the Lightning with six shots on goal.
- Luke Glendening dished out three hits to lead the Bolts in his return to his home state of Michigan.
- Darren Raddysh blocked a game-high four shots.
- Tampa Bay won 28/50 (56%) of faceoffs and were led at the dot by Nick Paul who won 11/15 (73%)
- Steven Stamkos scored the 516th goal of his NHL career and passed Pierre Turgeon (515) for sole possession of 40th place on the League's all-time list.
- Steven Stamkos scored the 90th career multi-goal game to pass Jean Beliveau (89) and tie Glenn Anderson for 34th place on the League's all-time list. Stamkos' 90 multi-goal games are the most in franchise history.
- Kucherov has pointed in six consecutive games against the Red Wings (3-6—9 pts.) and in 21 of the last 25 meetings (19-23—42 pts.).
- Steven Stamkos has tallied points in eight of his last nine games against Detroit (7-8—15 pts.).

- ❑ Victor Hedman has picked up 13 points over his last eight meetings with the Red Wings (1-12—13 pts.).
- ❑ Tampa Bay scored four goals on Saturday night and have scored a total of 20 goals over their last five games at Little Caesars Arena.
- ❑ Jon Cooper coached in his 799th career NHL game.
- ❑ Daniel Sprong gave Detroit a 1-0 lead at 5:11 of the first period after he found a loose puck behind Johansson and tapped it in.
- ❑ Steven Stamkos notched his first goal of the season and evened the score with a one-time shot from the bottom of the left circle at 9:46 of the first.
- ❑ Victor Hedman (2) and Nikita Kucherov (1) each picked up assists on the game-tying goal.
- ❑ Brandon Hagel scored his second goal of the season after he received a stretch pass through center ice, leading him for a breakaway opportunity. Hagel gave the Lightning a 2-1 lead at 12:52 of the first period.
- ❑ Victor Hedman picked up his second assist of the period and third assist of the season, blocking a shot and ripping a pass from the defensive zone to Hagel for a breakaway goal.
- ❑ Alex Debrincat tied the game 2-2 at 14:35 of the first period, redirecting a shot from the point.
- ❑ Lucas Raymond scored unassisted just 2:01 into the second period to give Detroit a 3-2 lead.
- ❑ Steven Stamkos went bar-down from the right circle on a 2-on-1 to tie the game 3-3. Stamkos' second goal of the night and his third point of the season (2-1—3 pts.) came at 10:53 of the second period.
- ❑ Brandon Hagel (2-1—3 pts.) and Anthony Cirelli (0-1—1 pts.) each picked up their first assist of the season on Stamkos' goal.
- ❑ J.T. Compher regained a 4-3 lead for Detroit at 15:23 of the second period.
- ❑ Alex Debrincat scored his second goal of the night to extend the Red Wings' lead to 5-3 at 4:44 of the third period.
- ❑ Victor Hedman cut the Bolts' deficit to 5-4 with a power-play goal at 9:39 of third period. Hedman's shot from the point to the top-left corner of the net marked his

first goal of the season and his third point of the night.

- ❑ Nikita Kucherov tallied his second assist of the game and fourth point of the season (2-2—4 pts.) with the primary assist on Hedman's power-play goal.
- ❑ Steven Stamkos also posted his third point of the night (2-1—3 pts.) with the secondary assist on the play.
- ❑ Moritz Seider scored an empty net goal with less than a second remaining in regulation.
- ❑ The Lightning travel to Ottawa to take on the Senators at Canadian Tire Centre tomorrow night (7:00pm puck drop).
- ❑ Tampa Bay is 49-53-8 with two ties all-time against the Senators, including a 21-30-5 record on the road.
