

Signed by the Rangers as a free agent on July 13, 2022, Vincent Trocheck played his first season with the Blueshirts in 2022-23, finishing fourth on the team in points (64), assists (42) and goals (22 - tied) and tied for second in power-play goals (9). Trocheck has skated in 637 career NHL games, recording 442 points (170G, 270A) for the Florida Panthers, Carolina Hurricanes and New York. The Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, native represented his country at the 2013 IIHF World Junior Championship recording six points (3G, 3A) in seven games to help the U.S. capture the gold medal. He also suited up for Team USA at the 2014 IIHF World Championship and was part of Team North America at the 2016 World Cup.

- Went 16-for-17 (94%) on faceoffs on Nov. 27 vs. Buffalo, the best single-game faceoff win percentage by a Rangers player with 17+ faceoffs since the NHL began tracking the stat in 1997-98.
