- Six Stars skaters recorded a point during the game and two had multi-point outings.
- **Roope Hintz** potted a season-high two goals (2-0–2) and now has a seven-game point streak (6-4–10) against the Capitals, with 12 points (7-5–12) in 11 career contests against them.
- **Jake Oettinger** stopped 25 of the 26 shots he faced and improved to a perfect 5-0-0 in his career against the Capitals. **Oettinger** now has earned a 16-7-0 record in 23 regular season this season.
- With his victory tonight, **Jake Oettinger** (50-23-2) joins Ryan Miller (51 in 2006 w/ BUF) and Ben Bishop (50 in 2015 w/ TBL) as the third U.S.-born goaltender to record 50 wins in a calendar year (including playoffs).
- **Lian Bichsel** recorded his first career game-winning goal (1-0–1) and now has goals in two of his first three NHL games (2-0–2). The blueliner (20 years, 212 days) became the club's second-youngest defenseman with a game-winning goal, behind only **Miro Heiskanen** (4; youngest: 19 years, 99 days on Oct. 25, 2018).

GAME NOTES

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Tonight is the first of two games the Stars will play the Maple Leafs this season and the only time the two teams are facing off in Dallas this year. The teams will face each other next on Jan. 14 in Toronto.
- Tonight is the fifth of six consecutive home games the Stars will play, their longest such stretch of the season.
- Entering play Tuesday, the Stars, Minnesota Wild and Washington Capitals were the only NHL teams this season that have not lost more than two consecutive games.
- The Stars have allowed only 2.50 goals against per game this season, which was tied with Los Angeles for the best mark in the NHL entering play Tuesday. Dallas has allowed two or fewer goals in 17 of the 28 games that they have played this year.
- **Jamie Benn** enters tonight's game riding a four-game assist streak. If he were to record and assist again tonight, it would give him assists in five consecutive games for the first time since April 3 to 10, 2022.
 - A point of any kind would give him his first five-game point streak of the season.
- **Roope Hintz** scored twice in Dallas' last game and now has four points (2-2–4) in his last four games played.
- The Stars have had four different rookies score a goal for them this season: **Logan Stankoven** (4), **Lian Bichsel** (2), **Mavrik Bourque** (2) and **Oskar Bäck** (2). Entering play Tuesday, Dallas, San Jose and Winnipeg were they only NHL teams to have four different rookies score at least one goal this season.

RUNNIN' THROUGH THE 6

- Dallas is 93-98-33 all-time vs. Toronto, including a 54-43-13 mark at home.
- The Stars enter tonight's matchup having earned points in two of their last five contests against Toronto (0-3-2).
- **Mason Marchment** began his NHL career with Maple Leafs, signing as an undrafted free agent on March 17, 2018. In his career against Toronto, Marchment has tallied five points (1-4-5) in seven games. He enters tonight's contest riding a two-game point streak (1-1-2).
- In his career, captain **Jamie Benn** has registered 15 points (7-8-15) in 23 games against the Maple Leafs, including two multi-point games, one being a four-point night (1-3-4) Jan. 23, 2014.
- Among active Stars, forward **Matt Duchene** ranks second in assists (11) and points (5-11-16) in 23 career games vs. the Maple Leafs.

HOME COOKING

- The Stars enter tonight's matchup against Toronto with an 13-3-0 record while playing at home this season.
 - Only two of Dallas' "home" losses this season were American Airlines Center, with the first coming at Nokia Arena in Tampere, Finland.
 - Currently the Stars are tied with the Vegas Golden Knights and Winnipeg Jets for the second fewest losses at home this season (3).
 - With a win tonight, the Stars could tie the Toronto Maple Leafs for the most wins at home this season (14).
- Dallas' .813 points percentage at home this season topped the NHL entering play Tuesday and their 13 home wins ranked second.
- The Stars have allowed only 2.00 goals against and 32 goals in home games this year, which were the second- and third-best marks in the NHL this season entering play Tuesday.
- Dallas has gone 38-for-42 on the penalty kill at home this year. Their 90.5 percent success rate when playing a man down at home this year was the best mark in the NHL entering play Tuesday.
 - No team has allowed fewer power-play goals against at home this year than Dallas' four.
- Dallas' next home win will be their 14th of the season. Last year, the Stars won their 13th home game of the season on Jan. 16, 2024 against the Los Angeles Kings.
- **Jason Robertson** is the team's leading scorer at home this year, totaling 15 points (4-11-15) in 16 games.
- **Jamie Benn** as 12 points (4-8-12) in his last 12 home games dating back to Nov. 1 and enters tonight's matchup riding a four-game home point streak.
- **Roope Hintz** has eight points (6-2-8) in his last seven home games dating back to Nov. 20.

BICHS BETTER HAVE MY MONEY

- Dallas' game against the Predators on Dec. 12 marked the first NHL game of defenseman **Lian Bichsel's** career.
- In making his NHL debut, **Bichsel** became:
 - The 33rd player and 13th defenseman selected in the 2022 NHL Draft to appear in an NHL regular-season game.
 - The eighth player drafted by the Stars between 2017 and 2024 to play in at least one regular-season game for Dallas.
 - The 46th Swiss player and 15th Swiss defenseman in league history to appear in an NHL regular-season game.
- **Bichsel** scored his first NHL goal in the game, making him the third defenseman in franchise history to score in his NHL debut according to NHL Stats, joining Daniel Poulin (Dec. 12, 1981) and Bryan Maxwell (Feb. 16, 1987). **Bichsel's** goal came exactly 43 years to the day after Poulin's.
- Additionally, **Bichsel** recorded five hits in the game, which is tied for the most by a Stars skater in a single game this season.
- **Bichsel** scored the second goal of his NHL career in Dallas' last game (and his third NHL game) on Dec. 16 against the Washington Capitals, making him the second defenseman in franchise history to score two goals within his first three NHL games according to NHL Stats, joining Minnesota North Stars blueliner Derian Hatcher (2 in 1991-92).
- **Bichsel's** goal was the eventual game winner, making him the club's second-youngest defenseman with a game-winning goal according to NHL Stats, behind only **Miro Heiskanen** (4; youngest: 19 years, 99 days on Oct. 25, 2018).
 - **Bichsel** was 20 years and 212 days old on Dec. 16.
- **Bichsel's** two goals this season were just one shy of tying New Jersey's Seamus Casey for the league lead among rookie defensemen entering play Tuesday.
 - **Bichsel** and Casey were the only two rookie defensemen to score a game-winning goal this season.
- When **Bichsel** was on the ice during 5-on-5 play in his first three NHL games, the Stars have outscored their opponents 3-1 and outshot them 18-12 according to Natural Stat Trick.
 - **Bichsel's** 66.7 percent on-ice Corsi rating in his NHL debut was the best mark of any defenseman to take the ice (Stars or Predators) during the game.
- Standing at 6'7", there are only four players to appear in a regular-season game this year that are taller than **Bichsel**: New York's Matt Rempe (6'9"), Vancouver's Tyler Myers (6'8"), Chicago's Louis Crevier (6'8") and Calgary's Adam Klapka (6'8").
- **Bichsel** was originally selected by the Stars with the 18th-overall pick of the 2022 NHL Draft, the only Swiss player to be drafted that year. It made him the seventh-highest drafted Swiss player in NHL history, behind Nico Hischier (first

overall, 2017), Nino Niederreiter (fifth overall, 2010), Timo Meier (ninth overall, 2015), Kevin Fiala (11th overall, 2014), Sven Bärtschi (13th overall, 2011) and Michel Riesen (14th overall, 1997).

- Defenseman Mirco Müller was also drafted 18th overall, taken by San Jose in 2013.

KILLING IT

- Entering play Tuesday, the Stars had the fifth-ranked penalty kill in the NHL this season with an 83.9 percent success rate.
 - They have gone a perfect 10-for-10 on the penalty kill and scored one shorthanded goal during their current homestand.
- Dallas has allowed only 14 power-play goals against this season, which was tied for the fourth-best mark in the NHL this season entering play Tuesday. Their 0.47 power-play goals against per game were also ranked fifth in the NHL entering play Tuesday.
- The Stars have not allowed a power-play goal against in four consecutive games, going 10-for-10 on the penalty kill during that span.
 - If they were to remain perfect on the penalty kill tonight, it would mark the second time this season that they have gone at least five games without surrendering a power-play goal against (previous: six straight from Oct. 12 to 22).
- Thomas Harley** has allowed 3.65 power-play goals against per 60, which was the fifth-best mark in the NHL entering play Tuesday among defensemen that have at least 40 minutes of shorthanded ice time this season.
- Esa Lindell** has skated 106:58 minutes on the penalty kill this season, which was third-highest total of any NHL skater this season entering play Tuesday.
 - Lindell**, who skated 7:58 of shorthanded ice time, was on the ice for all but two seconds of Dallas' eight penalty kill minutes in their last game on Dec. 16.

ROBO ON THE GOGO

- Jason Robertson** has been playing at a point-per-game pace since Nov. 20, totaling 13 points (3-10-13) in 13 games. He has recorded multi-point efforts in three of the last four games that he has played.
- During the Stars current homestand, the Stars have outscored their opponents 4-1 and outshot them 30-21 when **Robertson** has been on the ice during 5-on-5 play according to Natural Stat Trick.
- With two assists in Dallas' last game, **Robertson** now ranks 23rd on the franchise's all-time scoring list with 335 (140-195-335) career points. He sits five points shy of Al MacAdam for 22nd all-time.
- Robertson** enters tonight's game five assists shy of recording 200 career assists. When he reaches the milestone, he will become the 27th player in Stars franchise history at the sixth player from the 2017 draft class to total 200 NHL assists.

ONE FOR THE HISTORY BOOKS

- Jake Oettinger's** next shutout will be the 12th of his career, which will tie Jon Casey for the sixth-most in franchise history.
- Miro Heiskanen** is one assist shy of tying Brad Maxwell (217) for 7th on the all-time assists list by defensemen.
- Matt Duchene** is five points away from recording his 100th point with the Stars.
- Esa Lindell** is one game shy of tying Lou Nanne (635) for ninth on the franchise's all-time games played list by defensemen.
- Lindell** also enters tonight's contest four assists shy of tying Alex Goligoski (155) for 25th all-time among Stars/North Stars defensemen.

CONNECT FOUR

- Stars forward **Roope Hintz** (Finland), defensemen **Miro Heiskanen** (Finland) and **Esa Lindell** (Finland), and goaltender **Jake Oettinger** (United States) have all been selected to represent their home country at the 4 Nations Face-Off, which will be held in Montreal and Boston from Feb. 12 to 20, 2025.
- Dallas is one of six NHL teams to have at least one forward, defenseman and goaltender from their roster to be selected for the 4 Nations Face-Off, with the others being Boston, Minnesota, Vancouver, Vegas and Winnipeg.
- Only seven teams have had more players selected to a 4 Nations roster than the Stars: Colorado, Florida, Minnesota, NY Rangers, Tampa Bay and Vegas. The full breakdown is as follows:

- All four players have previously represented their home countries in international competition.

- **Heiskanen** has played for Finland at the 2017 and 2018 IIHF World Junior Championships, 2018 and 2022 (gold) IIHF World Championships and at the 2018 Winter Olympic Games.
 - **Lindell** suited up for the Fins at the 2014 IIHF World Junior Championship, where he won a gold medal. He again represented Finland at the 2015, 2016 (silver) and 2022 (gold) IIHF World Championships and at the 2016 World Cup of Hockey.
 - **Hintz** previously played for Finland at the 2015 and 2016 IIHF World Junior Championships, winning a gold medal at the later tournament.
 - **Oettinger** has played for Team USA at the 2017 and 2018 IIHF World Junior Championships and at the 2021 IIHF World Championship. He medaled in all three tournaments, winning bronze in 2018 and 2021 and gold in 2017.
- The 4 Nations Face-Off will mark the first time that all three of **Heiskanen**, **Hintz** and **Lindell** are playing for Finland together.
 - **Heiskanen** and **Lindell** previously won a gold medal together at the 2022 IIHF World Championship.
- The Stars will also be well-represented among the 4 Nations staff, with **Jim Nill** (Associate GM), **Pete DeBoer** (Assistant Coach) and **Misha Donskov** (Assistant Coach) all set to join Canada's staff for the tournament. Additionally, former Star **Jere Lehtinen** will serve as Finland's General Manager.

- Stars coaches **Pete DeBoer**, **Misha Donskov** and **Steve Spott** coached Maple Leafs forwards Max Pacioretty and Ryan Reaves as part of the Vegas Golden Knights organization. Pacioretty was there from 2019-20 to 2021-22, and Reaves from 2019-20 to 2020-21.
- Stars Player Development Coordinator **Ben Bishop** and Maple Leafs forward Ryan Reaves were teammates in St. Louis during the 2010-11 season.
- Stars Player Development Assistant **Jordie Benn** and Maple Leafs defenseman Chris Tanev were teammates in Vancouver for part of the 2019-20 season.
- Stars forward **Jason Roberston's** brother Nick Robertson has played for the Maple Leafs since the 2020-21 season.
- Stars forward **Wyatt Johnston** is a Toronto native, growing up he played for the Toronto Marlboros Hockey Club in the Greater Toronto Hockey League (GTHL).
- Stars forwards **Mason Marchment**, **Colin Blackwell** and defenseman **Ilya Lyubushkin** all played for the Maple Leafs. Marchment played four games during the 2019-20 season, Blackwell and Lyubushkin played in Toronto during the 2021-22 season, before Lyubushkin returned after the trade deadline in the 2023-24 season.
- Stars goalie coach **Jeff Reese** played for Toronto from 1987-88 to 1991-92 before rejoining the team for a short time in 1998-99.
- Stars Player Development Assistant **Jordie Benn** played for the Maple Leafs during the 2022-23 season.
- Stars assistant coach **Steve Spott** was an assistant coach in Toronto during the 2014-15 season.
- Maple Leafs forward Max Domi played 20 games for the Stars during the 2022-23 season.
- Maple Leafs defenseman Jani Hakanpää played for the Stars from 2021-22 to 2023-24.
- Maple Leafs defenseman Chris Tanev played 19 games with the Stars during the 2023-24 season.
- Stars defenseman **Matt Dumba** and forward **Sam Steel** played alongside Maple Leafs forwards Connor Dewar and Ryan Reaves in Minnesota. Dumba and Dewar were teammates from 2021-22 to 2022-23 while Steel and Reaves joined the team in 2022-23.
- Stars Player Development Assistant **Jordie Benn** and Maple Leafs forward Max Domi were teammates in Montreal during the 2018-19 season.
- Stars forward **Colin Blackwell** and Maple Leafs forward Max Domi, and defenseman Jack McCabe played together in Chicago for the 2022-23 season.
- Stars forwards **Matt Duchene** and **Colin Blackwell** played with Maple Leafs forward Calle Järnkrok in Nashville. Blackwell and Järnkrok were there from 2018-19 to 2019-20, while Duchene joined the two in 2019-20 and continued to play with Järnkrok in Nashville until 2020-21.
- Stars forward **Colin Blackwell** and Maple Leafs forward Calle Järnkrok crossed paths in Seattle during the 2021-22 season.
- Stars defenseman **Brendan Smith** and Maple Leafs forward Steven Lorentz both played for the Carolina Hurricanes during the 2021-22 season.
- Stars Player Development Assistant **Jordie Benn** and VP of Cultural Growth & Strategy **Al Montoya** played with Maple Leafs forward Max Pacioretty in Montreal during the 2016-17 and part of the 2017-18 season.
- Stars forward **Evgenii Dadonov** and Maple Leafs forwards Max Pacioretty and Ryan Reaves were teammates in Vegas during the 2021-22 season.
- Stars goaltender **Casey DeSmith** and Maple Leafs forward Ryan Reaves played together in Pittsburgh during the 2017-18 season.
- Stars defenseman **Nils Lundkvist** and Maple Leafs forward Ryan Reaves shared the ice with the New York Rangers during the 2021-22 season.
- Stars VP of Cultural Growth & Strategy **Al Montoya** played with Maple Leafs forward John Tavares as members of the New York Islanders from 2010-11 to 2011-12.
- Stars forward **Sam Steel** and Maple Leafs defenseman Simon Benoit were both members of the Anaheim Ducks during the 2020-21 and 2021-22 seasons.

- Stars defenseman **Ilya Lyubushkin** and Maple Leafs defenseman Oliver Ekman-Larsson were teammates on the Arizona Coyotes from 2018-19 to 2020-21.
- Stars forward **Sam Steel** and Maple Leafs defenseman Jani Hakanpää were teammates in Anaheim from 2019-20 to 2020-21.
- Stars forward **Matt Duchene** and Maple Leafs defenseman Philippe Myers both played in Nashville for part of the 2021-22 season.
- Stars forward **Sam Steel** and Maple Leafs goaltender Anthony Stolarz both played in Anaheim from 2019-20 to 2021-22.
- Stars goaltending coach **Jeff Reese** and Maple Leafs President Brendan Shanahan played together with the Hartford Whalers during the 1995-96 season.
