- The Stars defeated the Wild 2-1 in Minnesota, giving the Stars consecutive road wins for the first time this season.
- Four different skaters recorded a point during the game. Both **Mason Marchment** and **Ilya Lyubushkin** had multi-point efforts.
- **Mason Marchment** put up two goals during the game, his sixth multi-point game of the season. Marchment (4-5—9 in 3 GP) has factored on nine of the Stars' 16 goals since Nov. 11. He became the eighth player in Stars team history (since 1993-94) with nine points in a three-game span. That lists also includes current Wild general manager Bill Guerin (Feb. 29 to March 5, 2004), according to NHL Stats.

GAME NOTES

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Tonight is the first of three games the Stars will play against the Ducks this season and the first of two games that the teams will play in Dallas this year.
- A Dallas victory tonight would give the Stars their second four-game win streak of the season.
- The Stars are 12-2-0 against the Ducks since the start of the 2018-19 season, outscoring Anaheim 48-29 in those contests. Dallas' .857 points percentage against Anaheim during that span is the third-best mark in the NHL.
- The Stars have allowed only 2.25 goals against per game this season, which was the best mark in the NHL entering play Sunday.
- Dallas has outscored its opponents 54-36 this season. Their plus-18 goal differential was tied for the fourth-best mark in the NHL this year entering play Sunday.
- **Tyler Seguin** is one assist away from bringing his total with the Stars to 380, which would tie him with Brian Bellows for fifth-most assists by a skater in franchise history.
- A goal or an assist tonight would give **Sam Steel** his first three-game point streak since Jan. 10 to 14, 2023.
- **Jamie Benn** has gone 82-for-130 at the faceoff dot this season. His 63.1 percent success rate was the third-best mark in the NHL this year among skaters to take at least 20 draws entering play Sunday.
- **Casey DeSmith** has posted a 1.79 goals-against average and a .929 save percentage in five games with the Stars this season. Entering play Sunday, he ranked in the top 10 in the NHL in both goals-against average (third) and save percentage (fourth) among goaltenders to play in at least two games this year.

IDES OF MARCH

- **Mason Marchment** scored both of Dallas' goals in its last game on Nov. 16, a 2-1 win over the Minnesota Wild. His two-point game brought his season total to 17 points (6-11—17), which ranks second on the team in scoring this season.
- **Marchment** has totaled nine points (4-5—9) over the Stars' last three games dating back to Nov. 11. His nine points during that span were the most in the NHL entering play Sunday.

- If **Marchment** were to score tonight, it would give him goals in four consecutive games for the first time since he did so from Jan. 25 to 31, 2022.
- If he were to have at least two points tonight, it would give him multi-point efforts in four consecutive games for the first time in his career.
- The 2024-25 season marks the first time in his career that **Marchment** has played at a point-per-game pace or better through his first 15 games played of a season.
- His 17 points are already 32.1 percent of his career high of 53 (22-31-53) that he reached last season in 81 games. **Marchment** is currently pacing to finish the year with 31, 56 assists and 87 points, all of which would be career highs.
- **Marchment** has a plus-12 on-ice, even-strength goal differential this season, which ranked third among all NHL forwards entering play Sunday.
- **Marchment** enters tonight's game one assist shy of total 100 NHL assists. When he reaches the milestone, he will become the 18th undrafted, active skater to tally 100 career assists.
- **Marchment** recorded five points (1-4-5) in Dallas' 7-1 win over the Pittsburgh Penguins on Nov. 11, making him one of four skaters this season to record a five-point game
 - It was the second-highest scoring game of his career, trailing only the six points (2-4-6) he had against the Columbus Blue Jackets on Jan. 31, 2022.
 - **Marchment** joined Artemi Panarin (5) as the only active undrafted players with multiple five-point games according to NHL Stats.
- **Marchment** (1-4-5) became the third Stars player in the last decade to record five points in a game, following **Wyatt Johnston** (March 5, 2024) and Joe Pavelski (Jan. 12, 2022) according to NHL Stats.

HOME COOKING

- The Stars enter tonight's matchup against Anaheim with a perfect 7-0-0 record while playing at the American Airlines Center this season.
 - Dallas' one "home" loss this season was played at Nokia Arena in Tampere, Finland.
- The Stars have allowed only eight goals against in total in five games at the American Airlines Center this year.
- Dallas has gone a perfect 17-for-20 on the penalty kill when playing at the AAC this season.

DUCK HUNTING

- **Casey DeSmith** has a 4-1-0 career record against Anaheim, posting a .932 save percentage, a 2.01 goals-against average and one shutout in those games.
- **Matt Duchene** has 14 points (7-7-14) in his last 13 games against the Ducks dating back to Feb. 1, 2018.
- **Miro Heiskanen** has 13 points (5-9-13) in his last 13 games against Anaheim and enters tonight's contest riding a three-game point streak against the Ducks.
- **Roope Hintz** has 11 points (5-6-11) in 11 career games against the Ducks.
- **Ilya Lyubushkin** has four assists in his last three games against Anaheim.
- **Jake Oettinger** is undefeated in his career against the Ducks, posting an 8-0-0 record with a .930 save percentage, 1.85 goals-against average and one shutout in eight games.
 - **Oettinger's** eight wins against Anaheim since the start of the 2020-21 season are tied for the most in the NHL.
- **Jason Robertson** has nine points (4-5-9) in nine career games against the Ducks.

COWBOY COUNTRY

- The Stars and the Cowboys are both set to play tonight - the Stars will take on the Anaheim Ducks at 7 p.m. and the Cowboys will face off against the Houston Texans at 7:15 with both games being played at home.
- Tonight marks the second of three instances this season in which the Stars and Cowboys will play on the same day.

- Tonight's game also marks the first time that both teams are playing on a Monday since Nov. 5, 2018 when the Stars fell 2-1 in overtime against the Boston Bruins and the Cowboys lost 47-16 to the Tennessee Titans.
- Since the start of the 2021-22 season, the Stars have a 7-2-2 record on days in which the Cowboys are also playing (regular-season games only).

FIRST THING'S FIRST

- The Stars have opened the scoring in 62.5 percent of the games that they have played this season, recording the first goal of the game in 10 of their 16 games.
- Dallas has gone on to win nine of the 10 games that they have scored first in. Their nine wins when scoring first were tied with the Rangers and the Wild for the best mark in the league this season entering play Sunday.
- Additionally, the Stars' .900 win percentage when scoring first this year was the third-best mark in the NHL entering play Sunday.

DOUBLE DUTCH

- **Matt Duchene** enters tonight's game having totaled 20 points (9-11–20) in 16 games this season, which includes recording seven multi-point efforts this year.
- 2024-25 marks the first time in **Duchene's** career that he has had 20 or more points through his first 16 games played of a season.
- With 20 points in 16 games, **Duchene** has already reached 30.8 percent of his total scoring from last year (25-40–65) despite only being 19.5 percent of the way through the 2024-25 season.
- **Duchene** has recorded a point in 11 of the 16 games he has played this season and enters tonight's game leading the Stars in both goals (nine) and points (20) and is tied for the team lead in assists (11).
- When **Duchene** has been on the ice this season during 5-on-5 play, the Stars have outscored their opponents 13-6 according to Natural Stat Trick.
- He is currently pacing to finish the year with 46 goals, 56 assists and 102 points, which would all be career highs for the 16-year veteran.

ROOKIE REPORT

- **Logan Stankoven** has 14 points (4-10–14) through his first 16 games played this season and enters tonight's game tied for third on the team in scoring.
- Entering play Sunday, **Stankoven** ranked second among all rookies in assists, points and points per game (0.88) this season.
 - His four goals ranked third among first-year players this season entering play Sunday.
- Three of **Stankoven's** goals this season have been game-winners, which led the Stars and topped all NHL rookies entering play Sunday. Only Minnesota's Matt Boldy (5) and Edmonton's Leon Draisaitl (4) have scored more game-winning goals than **Stankoven** this year.
- **Stankoven's** goal against the Bruins in Dallas' game on Nov. 14 was his 14th point of the season. His 14 points are tied with Danny Grant (10-4–14 in 1968-69) for the third most through 15 games in a season by a Stars/North Stars rookie behind only Neal Broten (10-7–17 in 1981-82) and Steve Christoff (8-7–15 in 1979-80) according to NHL Stats.
- **Stankoven** recorded his 10th assist of the season (12 GP) in Dallas' game on Nov. 7 against Chicago, establishing a franchise mark for fewest games to 10 helpers in a season by a Stars/North Stars rookie according to NHL Stats. The previous mark of 14 games was shared by Don Barber (1989-90 w/ MNS), Tim Young (1975-76 w/ MNS) and Danny O'Shea (1968-69 w/ MNS).
- **Stankoven** (8-18–26 in 36 GP) added an empty-net goal against Chicago to become the second-fastest player in Stars team history to record 25 career points, following **Jason Robertson** (33 GP) according to NHL Stats.
- With his assist on Oct. 15 against the Sharks, **Stakoven** became just the second rookie in Stars/North Stars history to record five or more assists through his first four games of a season, joining Marc Bureau (5 in 4 GP in 1990-91) according to NHL Stats.
- He recorded three assists in Dallas' 4-3 win over the Predators on Oct. 10, making him the only rookie to have a three-point game this season.
- According to NHL Stats, **Stankoven** became the second rookie in franchise history to record three points in the team's season-opening contest, alongside Roland Eriksson (0-4–4 w/ MNS) on Oct. 6, 1976.
- Originally selected by the Stars in the second round (47th overall) of the 2021 NHL Draft, **Stankoven** appeared in 24 regular-season games for Dallas last year, totaling 14 points (6-8–14) in those contests and adding eight points (3-5–8) in 19 Stanley Cup Playoff games.
- His 10 assists this season have already surpassed his total from last year and he is one point shy of surpassing his total from 2023-24.
- Despite only playing in 40 regular-season games in his career, **Stankoven** already ranks 12th in career scoring among skaters selected in the 2021 NHL Draft. His 0.70 career points per game also top 2021 draftees who have appeared in at least two regular-season games.
 - The 11 skaters ranked in front of him have all played in at least 90 career regular-season games.
- **Stankoven** is pacing to finish the year with 51 assists and 72 points. Fifty-one assists would be the third-most by a rookie in franchise history and 72 points would make him the fifth-highest scoring rookie in franchise history.
 - If he were to finish the year with 72 points, he would also become the highest scoring rookie since Mathew Barzal had 85 points (22-63–85) in 2017-18.

BENN THERE DONE THAT

- Stars captain **Jamie Benn** enters tonight's contest having played in 313 consecutive games.
- Dallas' Oct. 13 matchup against the Kraken marked the 300th consecutive game that **Benn** had played in, making him the fourth player in franchise history to play in 300 consecutive games for the team according to NHL Stats.
- He is one game shy of matching **Tyler Seguin** for the third-longest Iron Man streak in franchise history.

- **Benn's** current 313-game Iron Man streak is the fifth-longest active streak in the NHL.
- **Benn** is one of 18 players to have an active Iron Man streak of at least 200 games and is one of 11 NHL players to appear in each of his team's 246 regular-season games between 2021-22 and 2023-24.
- The Stars captain leads all Dallas players in career games played (1,128), goals (386), assists (529) and points (915). His 915 career points rank 13th among active NHL skaters, and he is the second-highest scoring fifth-round draft pick in NHL history (Alexander Mogilny; 1,032).

ONE FOR THE HISTORY BOOKS

- **Esa Lindell** has several franchise milestones withing reach:
 - He is two points shy of becoming the 49th player and 13th defenseman in franchise history to record 200 points with the Stars.
 - **Lindell** is two goals away from tying Philippe Boucher for 10th in franchise history in goals scored by a defenseman.
 - He is also 15 games shy of tying Lou Nanne (635) for ninth on the franchise's all-time games played list by defensemen.
- **Jake Oettinger's** next shutout will be the 12th of his career, which will tie Jon Casey for the sixth-most in franchise history.
- **Miro Heiskanen** is seven assists shy of tying Dennis Hextall (216) for 23rd on the franchise's all-time assists list. He's also eight assists shy of trying Brad Maxwell (217) for 7th on the all-time assists list by defensemen.

CONNECTIONS

- Stars forward **Sam Steel** was originally selected by Anaheim in the first round (30th overall) in the 2016 NHL draft. He played for the Ducks from 2018-19 to 2021-22.
- Stars defenseman **Ilya Lyubushkin** played in Anaheim during the 2023-24 season, appearing in 55 games.
- Stars forward **Colin Blackwell** and Ducks forward Ryan Strome played together in New York (Rangers) during the 2020-21 season.
- Stars goaltender **Casey DeSmith** and Ducks winger Brock McGinn shared the ice for two seasons in Pittsburgh from 2021-22 to 2022-23.
- Stars defenseman **Brendan Smith** and Ducks forward Ryan Strome both skated for the New York Rangers from 2018-19 to the 2020-21 season.
- Stars defenseman **Nils Lundkvist** and Ducks forwards Ryan Strome and Frank Vatrano were all members of the New York Rangers for the 2021-22 season.
- Stars forward **Evgenii Dadonov** and Ducks forward Frank Vatrano played together for the Florida Panthers during 2017-18 to 2019-20 seasons.
- Stars forward **Mason Marchment** and Ducks forward Frank Vatrano and Ducks defenseman Radko Gudas played together for the Florida Panthers during the 2020-21 and 2021-22 seasons.
- Stars goaltender **Casey DeSmith** and Ducks defenseman Brian Dumoulin shared the ice for DeSmith's tenure with Pittsburgh from 2017-18 to 2022-23.
- Stars player development assistant **Jordie Benn** and Ducks assistant coach Rich Clue were both with the Toronto Maple Leafs organization during the 2022-23 season.
