

**FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP****March 20, 2026 – CALGARY FLAMES [4] vs. FLORIDA PANTHERS [1]**[Game Summary](#) | [Event Summary](#)

The Calgary Flames picked up a convincing 4–1 win over the Florida Panthers on Friday night at the Scotiabank Saddledome to start a six-game homestand with back-to-back victories. After a scoreless opening period, Calgary broke through in the second with a pair of goals just over two minutes apart, first from Joel Farabee, followed by Victor Olofsson's first with the Flames. The Flames carried that momentum into the third and after Florida briefly cut the deficit to one, Calgary responded late with a pair of powerplay markers. Morgan Frost restored the two-goal cushion with his 16th of the season at 16:59 of the third, and Matt Coronato followed just 31 seconds later with another man-advantage tally to put the game out of reach. Dustin Wolf was sharp in net, stopping 24 of 25 shots for a .960 save percentage and First Star honors.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the second of two meetings this season between the Flames and Lightning. Calgary fell 5-1 in their first matchup with Tampa Bay on November 26.

This is a Pacific Division versus Atlantic Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 5-8-2 against Atlantic Division teams and a record of 13-14-4 against Eastern Conference opponents.

MAGIC NUMBER:

With their four-goal outburst on Friday night against Florida, the Calgary Flames have now won 53-straight games when scoring four or more goals in a contest, dating back to December 16, 2023. This season, Calgary is 16-0-0 when reaching or surpassing the four-goal mark in a game. The Flames have the longest active four-plus goal win streak and have now tied for the fourth-longest streak in NHL history for wins when scoring four-or-more goals in a game.

THE BEEZ KNEES:

Joel Farabee skated in his 100th game with the Flames on Friday night against Florida, marking the occasion with a goal. He became the fourth Flames player in the past 10 seasons to score in his 100th game with the franchise:

Connor Zary (1-0—1 on Dec. 31, 2024)

Brett Ritchie (1-0—1 on Dec. 23, 2022)

Derek Ryan (1-0—1 on Nov. 7, 2019)

Farabee has totalled 15 tallies this season and sits five away from reaching the 20-goal mark for the third time in his career, along with the 2023-24 (24), and 2020-21 (20).

OLOF THE SNOWMAN:

Victor Olofsson scored his first goal as a member of the Calgary Flames on Friday night against Florida, a tally that would hold up as the game-winner. Olofsson now has four game-winning goals this season (3 with COL, 1 with CGY) which ties him with Marcus Johansson and Simon Holmstrom for the fourth-most among Swedish skaters in 2025-26. The only Swedes that have more GWG's this season are Adrian Kempe (7), Viktor Arvidsson (6), and Lucas Raymond (5).

SHARKNADO:

With his assist on Morgan Frost's third period marker against Florida on Friday, Yegor Sharangovich recorded his 222nd NHL point to tie Andrei Kostitsyn for the second-most points by a Belarusian in NHL history.

With one more point, Sharangovich would take sole-possession of second place on the all-time scoring list among Belarusian skaters in league history. He is currently 74 points away from Mikhail Grabovski's 296, which is the most by a Belarusian-born player ever in the NHL.



MÄÄTTÄ OF FACT:

With his helper on Victor Oloffson's game-winner on Friday against Florida, Olli Määttä recorded his fifth assist since making his Flames debut on March 7. Since that date, Määttä's five assists are the most on the team and he has found his way onto the scoresheet in five of his eight contests in Flames threads, averaging 22:18 of ice-time.

THE TEXAS TIGER:

Blake Coleman skated in his 600th NHL game against Tampa Bay last season, a club he spent two years with, from 2019 to 2021. During his tenure, he appeared in 64 regular-season contests, recording 14 goals and 18 assists for 32 points while posting a +17 rating. Coleman played a pivotal role in Tampa Bay's back-to-back Stanley Cup championships, in 2020 and 2021, contributing 13 points (5G, 8A) in 25 games during the 2020 NHL Bubble, followed by 11 points (3G, 8A) in the 2021 postseason, including two goals and two assists for four points in the 2021 Stanley Cup Finals, the second-most on the Lightning.

NEW KID ON THE BLOCK:

On March 12, the Calgary Flames announced the signing of college free agent centre Tyson Gross. Gross, a Calgary, AB native was a finalist for NCHC Player of the Year, Forward of the Year and earned NCHC Defensive Forward of the Year honours following his third season with St. Cloud State University, and first as captain. Gross registered a team-leading 41 points from 18 goals and 23 assists, sitting tied for fifth in NCHC scoring.

HEY DID YOU KNOW?

Thanks to Friday night's 4-1 victory over Florida, the Flames have now won seven-straight home games against the Panthers dating to the 2018-19 season which is their longest active home-win streak against a single opponent.

Lightning forward Brayden Point was born in Calgary and spent his early hockey years with the Calgary Bisons and Calgary Buffaloes before moving on to the AJHL's Canmore Eagles. He later starred with the Moose Jaw Warriors in the WHL, where he served as captain for two seasons.
