MATCHUP NOTES

- CBJ have collected points in the last three matchups of the series against the Capitals (2-0-1).
- Columbus recorded the largest victory in the all-time series against Washington, 7-0, in the most recent game at Nationwide Arena on Apr. 12, 2025.
- The teams have combined for seven goals or more eight times in the past 13 meetings, including four instances of nine goals or more.
- CBJ have killed off 16-of-18 Washington power play chances in the past 10 contests (88.9 pct.).
- Seven of the past 10 games in the series have been decided by a single goal with four decided in overtime.
- The winning team has scored four-plus goals in 10 of the past 15 dating back to Nov. 12, 2021.



JACKET TO WATCH - LW Kent Johnson

Has posted 1-5-6 with two multi-point efforts in 8 career GP against the Capitals. Has notched points in each of the last three meetings against the club (1-3-4).





CAPITAL TO WATCH - LW ALEX OVECHKIN

NHL's all-time goal leader is 2 shy from 900. Has 27-16-43 with 13 multi-point efforts in 50 career GP against the Blue Jackets, including goals in his last four contests (4-3-7).



TEAM NOTES

- Columbus has won two-straight games, earning a 3-2 victory over Tampa Bay on Oct. 18 and 5-1 win at Dallas on Tuesday.
- CBJ finished a perfect 2-for-2 on the power play and penalty kill against Dallas. It marked the seventh time in club history - and second on the road - that the team was 100 pct. on both special teams in a game with multiple attempts.
- The club plays two back-to-back sets over the next six days. CBJ kick off their first of 15 back-to-backs on Friday against Washington before traveling to Pittsburgh on Saturday then visits Buffalo on Oct. 28 and hosts Toronto on Oct. 29.
- CBJ have scored first in four of the past five contests. The club scored the first goal 43 times in 2024-25 (10th-T in NHL).
- Friday's game against Washington closes out a stretch of six-straight against 2025 Stanley Cup Playoffs teams (3-2-0).

PLAYER NOTES

- Goaltenders Jet Greaves (1-2-0, 2.04 GAA, .928 SV%) and Elvis Merzlikins (2-1-0, 2.69 GAA, .927 SV%) have combined to stop 179-of-193 shots faced in the first six games (.927 SV%). They are one of two goaltending tandems in which each netminder has a .920 SV% or better (min. 2 GP; Washington).
- LW Zach Aston-Reese (48-51-99, 395 GP) sits one point shy of 100 for his NHL career and C Charlie Coyle (189-299-488, 956 GP) is one assist from 300.
- C Adam Fantilli notched his second consecutive multi-point game on the road with 1-1-2 on Tuesday at Dallas. He notched his 45th career goal and passed Nikolay Zherdev (44) for fourth-most by a CBJ skater before age 22.
- C Boone Jenner collected his 82th career multi-point game with 1-1-2 on Tuesday and passed Cam Atkinson for second-most in franchise history (Rick Nash, 137).
- RW Kirill Marchenko has recorded points in five-straight games (5-2-7) after being held off the scoresheet in the season opener on Oct. 9. He ranks eighth-T in the NHL in goals in 2025-26.
- LW Dmitri Voronkov posted a power play goal on Tuesday and has tallied points in five of the club's six games this season (3-3-6).
