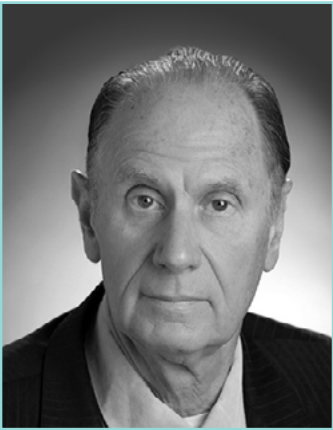

TPG manages more than \$120 billion in assets under management across a wide range of asset classes, including private equity, growth, impact investing, real estate, and market solutions. Mr. Bonderman serves on the board of a number of private and public companies, as well as several philanthropic institutions, some of which include: Allogene Therapeutics, Inc.; The Rise Fund; The Rock and Roll Hall of Fame Foundation; the American Himalayan Foundation, The Wilderness Society, The Grand Canyon Trust, and funds the Wildcat Foundation. Mr. Bonderman is a 1963 graduate of the University of Washington and a Magna Cum Laude graduate of Harvard Law School, 1966, where he was a Sheldon Fellow and a member of the Harvard Law Review.



SAMANTHA HOLLOWAY

Samantha Holloway is Co-Owner and Chair of the Seattle Kraken. She is an entrepreneur and generalist investor focused on next-generation B2B software and consumer brands. She currently serves as Co-Founder & Managing Partner of Hat Labs, a software startup studio. She also serves as Co-Founder & Managing Partner of 2nd & Fillmore, a boutique private investment company that invests in early-stage companies. Prior to starting Hat Labs and 2nd & Fillmore, Sam was the Co-Founder and Chief Customer Officer of GoSpotCheck, an enterprise software company that was acquired in 2020.



TOD LEIWEKE

Tod Leiweke is the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of the Seattle Kraken and NHL Alternate Governor. Leiweke is responsible for building a world-class NHL expansion team. He is also responsible for the redevelopment of Climate Pledge Arena. This \$1.6B enterprise has been transformative to Seattle Center and is the largest private investment in the history of sports in Seattle. Prior to being appointed CEO in April 2018, Tod served as the NFL's Chief Operating Officer from 2015-2018; CEO of Tampa Bay Lightning from 2010-2015; CEO of Seattle Seahawks/Sounders from 2002-2010; President of Minnesota Wild from 1997-2002; Executive Director of The First Tee from 1994-1997; and Golden State Warriors from 1987-1994.



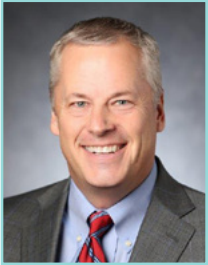
VICTOR DE BONIS

Victor de Bonis is the President of the Seattle Kraken and NHL Alternate Governor. De Bonis has been at the forefront of establishing the Seattle Kraken as the NHL's 32nd team and has led the strategic operations across the organization, including the Kraken Community Iceplex (KCI) and development of both Climate Pledge Arena and KCI. Prior to joining the Kraken as Chief Operating Officer in October of 2018, de Bonis worked for the Vancouver Canucks, serving as the Chief Operating Officer (COO) from 2006 to 2016, and NHL Alternate Governor from 2009 to 2017.



LANCE LOPES **EXECUTIVE VICE PRESIDENT & GENERAL COUNSEL**

Lance has been with the enterprise since December of 2016. He is now focused on development of areas surrounding Climate Pledge Arena and Monorail infrastructure improvements in addition to his legal role with the team's business operations.



STEVE MATTSON **EXECUTIVE VICE PRESIDENT, OVG FACILITIES & GENERAL MANAGER**

Steve joined OVG in 2017 as EVP and General Manager for Climate Pledge Arena - Steve has full responsibility for the day-to-day management of 18,000-seat multi-purpose facility. Prior to joining OVG, Steve spent 27 years at Target Center in Minneapolis, the final 16 years as VP and General Manager of the City-owned venue. He and his wife, Marissa, live in Mercer Island, WA with three sons.



RYAN BRACH **EXECUTIVE VICE PRESIDENT, OVG GLOBAL PARTNERSHIPS**

As the EVP of Global Partnerships at Oak View Group, Ryan is responsible for managing multiple staffs and developing worldclass partnerships for a wide portfolio of OVG across sports, music, and live entertainment. Currently, his primary focus is leading partnership strategy efforts for the Seattle Kraken, Climate Pledge Arena, Coachella Valley Firebirds and Acrisure Arena, Moody Center, home of Texas Longhorns Men's and Women's basketball team and Mullett Arena, home of ASU Sun Devil Men's Hockey and NHL Arizona Coyotes. He will also lead global partnership efforts for the newly-announced OVG Las Vegas Arena project.



ERIC BRESLER **SENIOR VICE PRESIDENT, PROGRAMMING**

Eric Bresler is leading the programming and entertainment development for Climate Pledge Arena and Oak View Group. In this role he and the programming team are tasked with maximizing all date opportunities for concerts, family shows, sporting events and special events that lead to Climate Pledge Arena securing its place as top five concert destination. Previously, Bresler spent three years as Executive Director of Chase Center, the Golden State Warriors' state-of-the-art sports and entertainment complex in San Francisco's Mission Bay neighborhood. In this role, he led the overall opening and activation of Chase Center; including programming and content development and engaged in arena event marketing and arena public relations activities.

Nick has almost twenty years of industry experience leading revenue teams in all four major sports leagues - NBA, MLB, NFL, and now the NHL with the Seattle Kraken. Todd joined the Kraken in 2019 and brings 20+ years' experience building technology companies across multiple industries. Todd's teams are responsible for the Kraken mobile app, team technology, retail and merchandise operations, and delivering innovative partnerships. Todd is also the Kraken representative on the Seattle Sports Commission. He is a graduate of Western University, a former professional hockey player, and the proud father of two daughters.



ERIC JAEGER **SENIOR VICE PRESIDENT, FINANCE**

A life-long Seattle sports fan, Eric has led finance teams in various industries including building management, banking, and technology. Kendall is responsible for overseeing the financial affairs, strategic planning, and data management of the Kraken and its affiliates. JEFF WEBSTER CHIEF COMMERCIAL OFFICER

Jeff Webster serves as Chief Commercial Officer overseeing partnership operations, corporate development, and premium events for the Seattle Kraken and Climate Pledge Arena within OVG's Global Partnerships division. Jeff's prior role at AEG focused on revenue generation for some of the most iconic properties in sports and entertainment. Overall, his career experience includes nearly \$1B worth of deals spanning the NFL, NHL, NBA, MLS and Motorsports. Jeff is originally from Seattle and is proud to have taken part in launching a world class franchise in his hometown.



RON FRANCIS

GENERAL MANAGER

Continuing the momentum built through the Kraken's first two seasons and a franchise-first playoff appearance, Francis made 10 selections in the 2023 NHL Draft, half of which were in the top 50. He made key off-season signings, including Washington-native Kailer Yamamoto from the Edmonton Oilers and defenseman Brian Dumoulin from the Pittsburgh Penguins, and re-signed defenseman Vince Dunn, who is coming off a record season, to a four-year contract extension. After a first-ballot Hall of Fame playing career, he worked his way up the Carolina Hurricanes organization, working in player development, scouting, coaching and operations over his 12 years with the team. In 2014, Francis was named GM. While at Carolina, he drafted Carolina superstar Sebastian Aho, rising scorer Martin Necas, 2021 rookie-of-the-year candidate/goalie Alex Nedeljkovic, among others. He signed standout D Jacob Slavin and D Brett Pesce to team-friendly contracts and traded for playoff performer Teuvo Teravainen. He was named the first General Manager in Kraken franchise history on July 18, 2019.

Fun Facts: Second all-time in NHL assists behind Wayne Gretzky, including 110 assists on goals by legendary Jaromir Jagr. Fifth all-time in scoring (549 G, 1,249 A-averaging more than a point per game) and fifth all-time games played (1,731). Scored 44 points in 45 playoff games during back-to-back Stanley Cup wins (1991, 1992) with Pittsburgh. First player to win Lady Byng and Selke in same season (1995). Led Carolina to surprise appearance in 2002 Cup Final in his 21st season. King Clancy Trophy and NHL Foundation Player Award winner (2002).



RICKY OLCZYK

VP & ASSISTANT GENERAL MANAGER

Ricky Olczyk enters his fifth season in the Vice President & Assistant General Manager roles with the Kraken and serves as the Kraken's lead expert on contract negotiations, managing the salary cap, and the NHL collective bargaining agreement. Previously, Olczyk was the Assistant GM to Ron Francis for four years in Carolina, where he played an integral role in transforming the player development system from the lower third to a top third team across the NHL. He was a driving force in founding Oklahoma City's AHL franchise when he was the Assistant GM for the Edmonton Oilers (seven seasons). He was a key member of the management team for Team Europe's 2016 World Cup, which won silver after a tight best-of-three final vs. Canada.

Fun Facts: Pronounced "ohl-check." Played defense four seasons on Brown University NCAA D-I team, captain senior year. Captained USA Under-17 team to a silver on team with NHL Jeremy Roenick and Tony Amonte. Earned Cornell Law degree, worked as Associate Counsel for NHL Players' Association, and was a player agent. Served as full-time scout for Toronto (2018-19). Competitive trail runner and dedicated vegan. Brother is Kraken broadcaster Eddie Olczyk. Wrote Honors Thesis in Philosophy: Life Is Essentially Competition.



JASON BOTTERILL

ASSISTANT GENERAL MANAGER

Prior to joining the Kraken for their inaugural season, Botterill was the General Manager of the Buffalo Sabres from 2017 to 2020 after spending a decade working for the Pittsburgh Penguins front office, helping construct a Penguins roster that would ultimately win three Stanley Cups (2009, 2016, 2017). He was part of the three-manager leadership team with Kraken GM Ron Francis for the 2019 silver-medalist Team Canada at World Championships. The former NHL left wing was selected 20th overall in 1994 Draft as a freshman at the University of Michigan (scored 104 goals, 82 assists for 186 points in 150 NCAA games).

Fun Facts: Born in Edmonton but raised in Winnipeg. Only Canadian to win three straight gold medals at World Junior Championship. But higher bar for bragging rights in his family: sister Jennifer won three straight Olympic gold medals (2010, 2006, 2002) and one silver (1998 as youngest player) for Canada's national women's team. His mom was an Olympic speed skater for Canada in the 1964 and 1968 Games. His father is a renowned sports psychologist who has worked with several NHL teams and Canadian Olympians in basketball, hockey and cross-country skiing. Wife Andrea was an All-American gymnast at the University of Michigan.



ALEXANDRA MANDRYCKY

ASSISTANT GENERAL MANAGER

Entering her second season as Assistant General Manager and fifth season with the organization, Alexandra oversees the Kraken Amateur Scouting group and Research & Development team. Previously, Mandrycky worked for four seasons with the Minnesota Wild as a hockey operations analyst. The Atlanta native earned a B.S. in industrial engineering from Georgia Tech in 2013.

Fun Facts: Named No. 4 in Sportsnet's 2021 ranking of "25 Most Powerful Women in Hockey" and No. 4 in The Athletic's 2020 ranking of "Hockey's 40 under 40." As Wild analyst, she regularly "commuted" between Minneapolis and Seattle, where her husband was completing his doctorate in bioengineering at U of Washington.



DAVE HAKSTOL HEAD COACH

Hakstol enters his third year with Seattle after leading the team to a record-breaking sophomore season, in which the Kraken went to the playoffs for the first time and posted a regular season record of 46-28-8 (a record-setting 19-win increase from the prior season). Before joining the Kraken, he was head coach of the Philadelphia Flyers for three-plus seasons from 2015 to 2018, qualifying for playoffs two of three full seasons, including his first year. He joined the Kraken from Toronto where he served as an assistant coach. In 2020-21, the Leafs were the league's fifth-best team in preventing shots against per 60 minutes of 5-on-5 play. As U of North Dakota head coach, he took his alma mater to NCAA Frozen Four in his first year and seven times total in 11 seasons, finishing with a 289-143-43 record. He captained two seasons as player at UND. He also had a five-season IHL pro career before knee injury prompted him to become a USHL head coach.

Fun facts: More than 30 of his UND players became NHLers, totaling nearly 8,500 games. Seventy players reached at least the AHL, seven named Hobey Baker Award finalists. Born and raised outside Warburg, Alberta. He and wife Erinn have two children - daughter Avery is a freshman at Gustavus Adolphus College and son Brenden is a sophomore attending Shattuck-St. Mary's.



JAY LEACH ASSISTANT COACH

Leach returns for his third season as assistant coach with the Kraken after helping the team to a franchise-first playoff appearance in the 2022-23 season. Previously, he served as head coach for the AHL's Providence Bruins, compiling a 136-77-26 record over four seasons as head coach. There, they qualified for the playoffs each season and finished the last two AHL shortened seasons in first place of the Atlantic division. The former NHL defenseman played 70 NHL games for five teams (BOS, NJD, SJS, MON, TBL) and captained three different AHL teams. He wore the "C" for Providence College as senior. When his playing career ended, Leach sought an opportunity to coach in Germany.

Fun Facts: Played for five NHL teams, eight AHL teams (including Providence), four ECHL teams over 11-season pro career. His uncle, Steve Leach, played five seasons in Boston during his 11-year NHL career. Calls Seattle "one of the best cities" based on last decade of exploring the Pacific Northwest with his sister, who moved west to Bend, OR and now lives in Stayton, OR.



DAVE LOWRY ASSISTANT COACH

Lowry enters his second season with the Kraken as an assistant coach. Prior to joining Seattle's coaching staff in 2022, he served as head coach of the Winnipeg Jets, where he was elevated from assistant coach for the 2021-22 season. Upon his appointment to head coach, the Jets went from a 13-11-5 record to finishing out the season with a 26-22-6 record. Prior to his time in Winnipeg, Lowry spent five seasons as an NHL assistant coach with Calgary and Los Angeles. Lowry began his coaching career with the WHL's Calgary Hitmen for the 2005-06 season, following a 19-year playing career in the NHL. Lowry became a head coach in 2007, where the Hitmen won a division title and made a playoff run. Along with the Hitmen, he held head coaching positions with the Victoria Royals and Brandon Wheat Kings, posting a 303-155-37 record in WHL games. Lowry was drafted by the Vancouver Canucks in the 1983 draft, and through his long career played for the St. Louis Blues, Florida Panthers, San Jose Sharks and Calgary Flames.

Fun Facts: Lowry is no stranger to expansion teams. In 1993, he was selected by the Florida Panthers to join their inaugural roster and was nicknamed "Mr. Playoff" during the 1996 cup run, leading the team with 10 goals and seven assists. He is the father of Winnipeg forward Adam Lowry.



PAUL MCFARLAND ASSISTANT COACH

McFarland is entering his third season with the Kraken as an assistant coach. Prior to joining the Kraken's inaugural season, McFarland spent three seasons as an NHL assistant coach in Florida (2017-18 and 2018-19) and Toronto (2019-20), where he coached together with Dave Hakstol as assistant. He helmed the OHL Kingston Frontenacs, where he returned as head coach and general manager (2020-21 season canceled). In his first tour with Kingston, his teams notched a record of 111-71-22 and secured three straight OHL playoff berths. He played four years at Acadia (NS) University, where he served as captain three years.

Fun Facts: First break in coaching as assistant to D.J. Smith (now Ottawa Senators head coach) for junior OHL Oshawa Generals. Played most of OHL juniors career for Kitchener Rangers, winning a Memorial Cup in 2003 under Peter DeBoer, head coach of the Dallas Stars.



STEVE BRIERE GOALTENDING COACH

Briere enters his second season as Seattle's goaltending coach after spending the prior seven seasons (2015-16 to 2021-22) with the Toronto Maple Leafs. During his tenure with the Leafs, he worked alongside Dave Hakstol (from 2019-20 to 2020-21) and two of the team's goaltenders, Frederik Andersen (2020) and Jack Campbell (2022), were each named to the NHL All-Star Game. He played three seasons of collegiate hockey at University of Alabama-Huntsville and played parts of 10 seasons as pro goaltender in the AHL, ECHL, among others.

Fun Facts: Returned to coach at alma mater, University of Alabama-Huntsville, winning the 2009 CHA Championship with now-pro goaltender Cam Talbot.



TIM OHASHI VIDEO COACH

Ohashi returns for his third season with the Kraken. He began as an intern with the Washington Capitals' coaching staff in 2014. Then-head coach Barry Trotz created and offered Ohashi a full-time video analyst role for the 2015-16 season. He also won a Stanley Cup as a member of the Capitals' coaching staff in 2018. He played club hockey at Bates College in Lewiston, ME.

Fun Facts: Major back issue caused him to return home to Maryland for surgery where mother persuaded him to pursue career in sports by taking graduate courses in sports management at Georgetown University. Avid fan of baseball. Wife grew up in Bellevue, WA and father lives in Washougal, WA.



BRADY MORGAN VIDEO ASSISTANT

Morgan returns to Seattle for a third season with the Kraken after five years with the AHL's Tucson Roadrunners, where he served as video coach and hockey operations assistant since the franchise's early days operating in southern Arizona. There, he also served in a pre-scouting role for coaching staff. Prior to his AHL position, Morgan worked as a hockey ops assistant with the WHL's Seattle Thunderbirds, with duties that included recording and logging video for coaches' use between periods and post-game, plus managing players' arrangements with billet families. While attending Arizona State University, he served as a hockey operations intern with the Arizona Coyotes for two seasons (2013-15).

Fun Facts: Raised in Phoenix, earned business degree at Arizona State. Childhood hero is Hockey Hall of Famer Steve Yzerman.

- Enters the 2023-24 campaign ranked third all-time among German-born goaltenders in career wins (144) and games played (308) and second in career save percentage (.912).
- Finished the 2022-23 season with Seattle with a 17-14-4 record, a 2.85 goals-against average and a .895 save percentage.

CAREER SPLITS

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- Enters the 2023-24 season owning the seventh-longest active Iron Man streak in the NHL with 268 consecutive regular-season games played. He is the only player in franchise history to play in every Kraken game (both regular season and playoffs).
- Also enters the year with 1,858 career hits, which ranks seventh among active NHL defensemen.
- Since the start of the 2015-16 season, when he made his NHL debut, only five players in the NHL have totaled more blocked shots than his 1,099.
- Had 33 points (eight goals, 25 assists) in 82 regular-season games for the Kraken in 2022-23, setting career highs in goals (tied), assists, points, plus/minus (plus-27), points per game (0.40), on-ice even-strength goals for (99), on-ice even-strength goal differential (plus-25), total time on ice (1993:28) and time on ice per game (23:38).
- Led the Kraken in hits (222), blocked shots (173), total time on ice and time on ice per game played in 2022-23. His 173 blocked shots were a career best and marked the eighth time in the last nine seasons that he eclipsed 100 blocked shots.
- Started 81 games on a pair with Vince Dunn in 2022-23. The two led all NHL pairs in 5-on-5 ice time (1369:22), on-ice goals for (81) and on-ice shots for (709) according to Natural Stat Trick.
- Ranked sixth in the NHL with 99 on-ice, even-strength goals for in 2022-23.
- Was one of four players in 2022-23 to have at least 170 blocked shots and 200 hits.
- Had an assist in five consecutive games, a career best, from Dec. 18, 2022 vs. Winnipeg to Dec. 30, 2022 vs. Edmonton.
- Set a career best with a point in seven consecutive games from Dec. 18 vs. Winnipeg to Jan. 3 at Edmonton. At the time, his seven-game point streak set a franchise record for longest point streak by a defenseman and tied the franchise record for individual point streak. Both marks would later be surpassed by Vince Dunn.
- Became the first player since Sergei Gonchar on Jan. 11, 2003 to have a plus/minus rating of seven or better in a single game with a plus-seven mark at Chicago on Jan. 14, 2023. He tied for the highest plus/minus rating by an individual player in a single period since 1959-60, when the stat was first tracked, with a plus-six in the first period according to NHL Stats.
- Added four points (two goals, two assists) in 14 playoff games with the Kraken in 2022-23, leading the team in postseason time on ice per game (25:11) and ranking second on Seattle's roster in both hits (57) and blocked shots (31). His 57 hits and 31 blocked shots were both playoff career bests.
- Finished the 2021-22 season with the Kraken with eight goals and 25 points - which at the time were career highs - in 82 regular-season games. His 17 assists tied for the second-most in his career.
- Led Seattle skaters in both hits (183) and blocked shots (140) in 2021-22.
- Was one of only four NHL skaters in 2021-22 (Andrew Peeke, Alexander Romanov, Jacob Trouba) to record at least 180 hits and 140 blocked shots.
- Also led all Kraken skaters in total time on ice (1827:02), average time on ice (22:17), even-strength ice time per game (19:38) and shorthanded ice time per game (2:33) in 2021-22.
- Finished the 2021-22 regular season as the Kraken's lone Iron Man - the only player to skate in all 82 games. Was one of 45 skaters and only 15 defensemen in the NHL to play in every one of his team's 82 regular-season games in 2021-22.
- Was named an alternate captain for the Kraken on Oct. 11, 2021.
- Scored the game-winning goal in overtime to give the Kraken their first overtime win in franchise history on Jan. 27, 2022 at Pittsburgh.
- Was one of only five players on Edmonton's roster to play in all 56 regular-season games during the 2020-21 season.
- Led the Oilers and ranked second in the NHL with 128 blocked shots in 2020-21.
- Topped Edmonton skaters and ranked sixth in the NHL in 2016-17 with 253 hits.
- Led the New Jersey Devils with 163 hits and ranked second on the team in blocked shots (148) in 2015-16.
- Ranked fifth in scoring (18) and tied for second in assists (16) among rookie defensemen in 2011-12.

HOME PRACTICES

If in Seattle, the Kraken will typically practice at 10:30 a.m. local time, unless it is a day after a game, in which they will practice at 11 a.m. All home practices will take place at Kraken Community Iceplex unless specified otherwise. The length of practice varies depending on the day and can last anywhere from 30 minutes to an hour.

Sharing line combinations, injury updates, photos and videos from practice is all permissible.

Head Coach Dave Hakstol and Kraken players will be made available to the media at the conclusion of practice in the team's locker room. Media members are encouraged to make their way to the locker room as soon as the first player leaves the ice. Any requests for one-on-one interviews should be made in as far advance as possible to ensure greater chance they can be fulfilled.

The Kraken PR staff will take requests for players, but the media is not limited to speaking with just those players while in the locker room. Every player in the locker room is available to be interviewed unless otherwise specified by the Kraken PR staff.

MORNING SKATE - HOME GAMES

The Kraken will hold a morning skate prior to each home game at 10:30 a.m. at Kraken Community Iceplex. If the game is on the second day of a back-to-back, the Kraken may not hold a morning skate and will instead hold media availability in the early evening prior to that night's game at Climate Pledge Arena.

The media is encouraged to arrive at KCI by 10 a.m. local time in the event that morning skate is optional. A member of the Kraken PR staff will communicate if a skate is optional to the media as soon as it has been decided on. Head Coach Dave Hakstol and players will be made available to the media at the conclusion of morning skate or after their team meeting if morning skate is optional. Morning skate media availabilities will be held in the locker room at Kraken Community Iceplex.

Media requests - whether for a scrum or a one-on-one - should be made to Kraken no later than 10 a.m. local time to ensure that all requests can be fulfilled. Visiting teams will hold morning skates at CPA at 11:30 a.m. Morning skates may be optional or cancelled, especially if the team is playing the second game of a back-to-back. Please note that with the Kraken skating at a different venue, there is a high chance some visiting teams may elect to skate early, and any schedule questions should go to the visiting team's PR department to ensure accuracy. Visiting teams can change their schedule at a moment's notice, so it is best to reach out directly to that team.

Media requests for the visiting team should be made directly to that team's PR department. Please reach out to Kraken PR or visit the NHL's media site if you need their contact info.

CREDENTIALS

Media members who do not have a season credential can request a single-game credential by visiting the Kraken press site. Credentials will be approved based on need and availability in the press box. Media members will be notified if their credential request has been approved no later than the morning of the game..

If approved, credentials can be picked up the day of the game at the Climate Pledge Arena media entrance. The media entrance is located at the southwest corner of CPA, just north of Alaska Airlines Atrium, and is open from 8 a.m. until 8:30 p.m. Please note that these times may change in the event that the game does not have a 7 p.m. start time. On Jan. 2, 2023, the National Hockey League announced that the 2024 Discover NHL Winter Classic® would feature the Seattle Kraken hosting the Vegas Golden Knights on Monday, Jan. 1, 2024, at T-Mobile Park, home of the Seattle Mariners.

The 2024 Discover NHL Winter Classic® will match the NHL's two most recent franchise additions. The Kraken, who began play in the 2021-22 season, will be playing in their first regular-season outdoor game and will become the 29th team to participate in such a game. It will be the second outdoor appearance for the Golden Knights, whose first season of play was 2017-18. In their first outdoor contest, on Feb. 20, 2021, the Golden Knights fell to the Colorado Avalanche by a score of 3-2, in the 2021 NHL Outdoors at Lake Tahoe™ at Edgewood Tahoe Resort. The 2024 Discover NHL Winter Classic® continues the tradition the League established in 2008 of hosting a regular-season outdoor game at the onset of the new year, with the 2024 edition marking the 16th anniversary of the first NHL Winter Classic® in Buffalo.

The 2024 Discover NHL Winter Classic® is the next in a string of major sporting events to be held at T-Mobile Park, the most recent being the 2023 MLB All-Star Game. It will also mark the second outdoor game held in the Seattle Area. The Spokane Chiefs and the Kootenay Ice faced off in the Rockstar Outdoor Hockey Classic on Jan. 15, 2011 at Avista Stadium in Spokane, the first outdoor game in both Western Hockey League and Canadian Hockey League history, with the Chiefs defeating the Ice 11-2.



Climate Pledge Arena, located at Seattle Center, is the complete redevelopment of an historic landmark, originally built for the 1962 Seattle World's Fair. The arena is home to the NHL's Seattle Kraken, WNBA's Seattle Storm, and the world's biggest performers of live music and events. Climate Pledge Arena serves as a long-lasting and regular reminder of the urgent need for climate action and will be the first net zero carbon certified arena in the world. The Climate Pledge, which was founded by Amazon and Global Optimism in 2019, is a commitment from companies globally to be net zero carbon by 2040. Climate Pledge Arena opened October 22, 2021.

YOUTH ACCESS TO HOCKEY

But while all kids want to play, the opportunity to participate is largely dictated by zip code, household income, and primary language spoken at home. One Roof Foundation and the Seattle Kraken leverage our resources to break down barriers to all forms of hockey so that all kids can play. We work in and with historically underserved and BIPOC communities to bring ball hockey to schools, nonprofits, and community centers. We will also ensure broad and equitable access to ice time and programming at Kraken Community Iceplex. With your support, we can continue to provide pathway programming for Learn to Skate and Learn to Play programs, Recreational Hockey, Adaptive and Inclusive Hockey organizations, Field Trips, Public Skates, and more.

YOUTH HOMELESSNESS

Forging a holistic and long-term partnership with YouthCare to help end youth homelessness in our region.

No one grows up wanting to be homeless. In Washington alone over 40,000 public school students were homeless or facing housing insecurity last year. Founded in 1974, YouthCare was one of the first shelters to serve runaway and homeless youth on the West Coast. YouthCare now provides shelter, housing, education, and employment training to over 1,500 deserving young people a year so that they have the hope, skills, and self-confidence needed to thrive. One Roof Foundation, Seattle Kraken, and Climate Pledge Arena raise funds for YouthCare, amplify YouthCare's message to our fans and the broader community, and provide job training, internships, and employment opportunities at our different facilities, to help move the needle in the fight against youth homelessness.

ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE

Elevating the voices of and supporting communities disproportionately impacted by climate change.

Low-income and predominantly BIPOC neighborhoods in our region face a higher degree of environmental risk factors such as proximity to polluted waterways, busy highways, and industrial sites. The negative impacts are compounded by the lack of adequate access to safe fields, courts, and open spaces. One Roof Foundation partners with and support these communities to both offset the impacts of climate change and provide access to safe places to play.



ROOT SPORTS TV BROADCAST TEAM



JOHN FORSLUND

John Forslund is the play-by-play announcer for the Seattle Kraken's TV broadcasts on ROOT SPORTS and is known for coining the iconic phrase "That's Kraken Hockey, Baby!". He joined the Kraken for its inaugural season in 2021 after spending 25 years as the voice of the Carolina Hurricanes/Hartford Whalers. During his tenure with the Hurricanes, Forslund was named the North Carolina Sportscaster of the Year by the National Sports Media Association in both 2018 and 2019. In addition to his responsibilities with the Hurricanes, Forslund also served as the play-by-play announcer for ESPN National Hockey Night, NHL on Versus, NBCSN and NBC Sports. His broadcasting career has also seen him call ACC and SEC men's basketball games on Fox Sports Net.



EDDIE OLCZYK

Eddie Olczyk joined the Kraken booth prior to the 2022-23 season as one of Kraken's TV color analysts after spending the 2021-22 season as Turner Sports' lead color commentator on TNT while also continuing his work as a color commentator for local Chicago Blackhawks broadcasts. Prior to joining the TNT crew, Olczyk began what would ultimately be a 15-year tenure with NBC at the start of the 2006-07 season, serving as the lead color commentator for NHL on NBC and tangentially serving as a color commentator for the Chicago Blackhawks throughout his tenure at NBC. Prior to making his broadcast debut, Olczyk spent 16 seasons in the NHL playing for the Chicago Blackhawks, Toronto Maple Leafs, Winnipeg Jets (now the Arizona Coyotes), New York Rangers, Los Angeles Kings and Pittsburgh Penguins. He was a member of the Rangers 1994 Stanley Cup-winning team and was inducted in the United States Hockey Hall of Fame in 2012.



JT BROWN

JT Brown is a TV color analyst for all Kraken broadcasts on ROOT SPORTS. Brown was in the booth with John Forslund for the Kraken's inaugural season in 2021. He previously spent 11 seasons as a collegiate and professional hockey player, recording 72 points (23 goals, 49 assists) in 365 career NHL regular season games with Tampa Bay, Anaheim and Minnesota. Prior to turning pro, he played two seasons with the University of Minnesota-Duluth Bulldogs, where he won the 2011 National Championship and was named the Frozen Four's Most Outstanding Player.



PIPER SHAW

Piper Shaw works as a host and reporter for Kraken broadcasts on ROOT Sports. She joined the Kraken broadcasts for the team's inaugural season after spending five years with Rush Media where she served as a sideline reporter covering University of Wisconsin hockey, where she shared stories rink side as well as produced intermission and multi-media content for the broadcasts. She also covered high school sports for the network, in addition to reporting for the Big East Conference on BEDN and FS1. A Minnesota Native, Shaw graduated from St. Cloud State University in 2017.



ALISON LUKAN

Alison Lukan joined the Kraken TV broadcast team full-time prior to the 2022-23 season as a color analyst after freelancing for the Kraken and ROOT SPORTS during the team's inaugural year. She became an instant hit with fans for her clever and easy-to-understand use of data. In conjunction with her role at ROOT, Lukan is a contributing analyst and reporter for Kraken digital channels and for the Seattle Kraken app. Before her time with the Kraken organization, Lukan covered the Columbus Blue Jackets and Ohio State men's and women's hockey for The Athletic while also spending time with Fox Sports Ohio.



NICK OLCZYK

Nick Olczyk is a contributing analyst on ROOT SPORTS. He joined the Kraken prior to the 2022-23 season after spending the 2021-22 season with the Chicago Blackhawks where he worked as a TV and radio color analyst while also creating behind-the-scenes content for NBC Sports Chicago's Blackhawks pre and postgame shows. Prior to his time with the Blackhawks, Olczyk acted as the lead color analyst for the Indy Fuel of the East Coast Hockey League (ECHL) from 2018-19 to 2021-22. In addition to his responsibilities on the broadcast, Olczyk also hosts the "Signals from the Deep," the official podcast of the Seattle Kraken.

EVERETT FITZHUGH

Everett Fitzhugh is the play-by-play announcer for the Kraken's radio broadcasts on KJR. Previously, Fitzhugh spent five seasons with the Cincinnati Cyclones of the East Coast Hockey League, a developmental pro league for the NHL. He held the dual role as the Cyclones' director of media relations and broadcasting. His time in Cincinnati included Fitzhugh quest-broadcasting his first NHL game for the Washington Capitals as well as serving on the broadcast crew for the 2018 CCM/ECHL All-Star Classic.



AL KINISKY

Al Kinisky was named the color analyst for Kraken broadcasts on KJR prior to the start of the 2023-24 season. He first came to Seattle to play for the Seattle Thunderbirds in 1989 after spending a year in Northern Saskatchewan playing for the Nipawin Hawks. With the Thunderbirds he totaled 83 points (27 goals, 56 assists) in 149 regular-season games. After his playing career came to an end, Kinisky worked in the tech industry whilst also playing, coaching, and working as the Color Analyst for the Everett Silvertips radio broadcasting team for a decade.

On October 1, 2022, the Seattle Kraken introduced the newest member of the team to fans: Buoy, a six-foot-tall blue sea troll and the official Kraken mascot.

- Buoy is a sea troll from Seattle, who lives in the caverns of Climate Pledge Arena.
- Buoy loves hockey and people, not necessarily in that order.
