COLORADO AVALANCHE

All-Time Wild Record: 59-52-13 (33-25-5 at Xcel Energy Center, 26-27-8 at Colorado)

2023-24: The Wild is 0-2-1 against the Avalanche this season...Colorado won the series-opening game, 3-2, at Xcel Energy Center (11/24), the second game, 2-1, in overtime at Ball Arena (3/8) and the third contest, 5-2, in St. Paul (4/4)...LW **Kirill Kaprizov** leads Minnesota with four points (1-3=4)... C **Joel Eriksson Ek** (1-1=2) and RW **Mats Zuccarello** (0-2=2) each have two points...G **Filip Gustavsson** has started all three contests for the Wild and is 0-2-1 with a 3.00 GAA and a .910 SV%...C **Nathan MacKinnon** leads the Avalanche with six points (1-5=6)...LW **Jonathan Drouin** owns three points (2-1=3)...G **Alexandar Georgiev** started the first two games and is 2-0-0 with a 1.47 GAA and a .941 SV%...G **Justus Annunen** started the third contest and saved 44-of-46 shots faced for Colorado.

WILD LEADERS: Zuccarello leads Minnesota with 28 points (5-23=28) in 29 career matches against Colorado...D **Alex Goligoski** has 21 points (4-17=21) in 45 games...Kaprizov has 19 points (11-8=19) in 17 games...C **Ryan Hartman** owns 17 points (9-8=17) in 34 contests.

WILD GOALIES: G Marc-Andre Fleury is 16-12-3 with a 2.53 GAA, a .915 SV% and three shutouts in 32 career games (31 starts) against Colorado... Gustavsson is 1-4-1 with a 3.71 GAA and a .900 SV% in six starts against Colorado...G Jesper Wallstedt has not faced the Avalanche.

AVALANCHE LEADERS: MacKinnon leads the Avalanche with 55 points (18-37=55) in 45 games against Minnesota...RW **Mikko Rantanen** owns 37 points (15-22=37) in 34 contests...C **Andrew Cogliano** owns 19 points (7-13=19) in 66 games.

AVALANCHE GOALIES: Georgiev is 5-3-0 with a 2.85 GAA and a .909 SV% in eight starts against Minnesota...G **Justus Annunen** is 1-0-0 with a 2.00 GAA and a .957 SV% in his lone start.

CONNECTIONS: Wild Assistant Coach **Darby Hendrickson** skated in 20 games with Colorado in 2003-04...RW **Brandon Duhaime** was selected by the Wild in the fourth-round (106th overall) of the 2016 NHL Draft and skated in 193 career games across three seasons for Minnesota (2021-24), collecting 35 points (19-16=35)...LW **Zach Parise** is a native of Minneapolis and skated in 558 games over nine seasons (2012-21) for Minnesota, recording 400 points (199-201=400)...C **Casey Mittelstadt** is from Eden Prairie and played one sewason (2017-18) at the University of Minnesota.

FAST FACTS: Minnesota has 59 wins and 131 points against Colorado alltime, second-most against any franchise...Minnesota defeated Colorado in seven games in the 2003 First Round and the 2014 First Round...The Avalanche won the 2008 First Round series in six games.

NOTES & MILESTONES

Matt Boldy: T-14th in the NHL with seven GWG this season...Currently third on the Wild with 61 points (26-35=61) this season, needs two points to match his single-season career high (31-32=63, 2022-23 season).

Jonas Brodin: With an assist vs. OTT (4/2), reached 237 career points and moved past Matt Dumba (79-257=236 with MIN) for third-most all-time among Wild defensemen...Needs one goal to tie Brent Burns and Ryan Suter (55 goals each with MIN) for third all-time among Wild defensemen.

Brock Faber: Leads all NHL rookies with 25:01 TOI per game and 144 blocked shots, is T-2nd with 36 assists and third with 43 points (7-36=43)...Sixth among all NHL skaters in TOI/game.

Marc-Andre Fleury: Needs one shutout to reach 76 for his career and tie Tony Esposito and Ed Belfour (76 career SO each) for 10th most in NHL history.

Filip Gustavsson: Is 2-2-1 with a 1.58 goals-against average, a .950 save percentage and one shutout in his last five starts.

Kirill Kaprizov: Owns an active seven-game point streak (5-7=12) and has found the scoresheet in 15 of his last 16 games (15-11=26)...Leads Minnesota in points (41-48=89) and goals and is second in assists this season...Ranks T-5th in the NHL with 16 PPG, T-6th with 38 PPP (16-22=38), T-9th with eight GWG, T-10th in goals and T-12th in points...Leads the NHL with 28 goals since Jan. 19 and is fifth with 53 points (28-25=53)...Has 65 points (33-32=65) and a plus-19 rating in his last 44 games played...With two goals and an assist at CHI (4/7), recorded his 10th three-point game of the season, matching his own franchise record (also 2021-22 season), and moved his career point total to 322 (154-168=322) to pass Andrew Brunette (119-202=321) for seventh place on the Wild's all-time scoring list...Scored his 55th career PPG at CHI (4/7), tying Andrew Brunette for fourth-most in franchise history...Notched his 22nd career GWG at CHI (4/7), tying Jason Zucker for fifth-most in franchise history.

Marco Rossi: Among NHL rookies is second in goals (21) and shots (161), T-2nd in GWG (two) and is fifth in points (21-17=38).

Mason Shaw: Scored his first goal of the season vs. Ottawa (4/2).

Jesper Wallstedt: Earned his first NHL win and shutout by stopping all 24 shots faced at CHI (4/7)...Is one of five Wild goaltenders to record a shutout as a rookie...Joined Josh Harding (2005-06 season) as the only Wild goaltenders to post a shutout in two career appearances or fewer.

Mats Zuccarello: First on the Wild with 49 assists this season...Needs one assist to reach 50 assist in a season for the second time in his career (also 2021-22, 55 assists).

HEAD COACH JOHN HYNES



John Hynes was named Head Coach of the Minnesota Wild on Nov. 27, 2023. Bringing eight seasons of NHL head coaching experience to the start of his Wild tenure, Hynes owns a career record of 316-276-68 (.530) in 660 regular season games with Minnesota, the Nashville Predators and New Jersey Devils.

Hynes, 48, is in his first season with Minnesota,

where he holds a 32-21-5 (.595) record in 58 games. Prior to joining the Wild, he served as Head Coach of the Nashville Predators for parts of four seasons (2020-23). He was named Head Coach of the Predators on Jan. 7, 2020, and recorded a 134-96-18 record in 248 games (.576) while qualifying for the Stanley Cup Playoffs three consecutive seasons (2020-22). Prior to his time with the Predators, Hynes spent four-plus seasons as Head Coach of the New Jersey Devils and went 150-159-45 in 354 games (2015-19).

Before his time in New Jersey, Hynes spent six seasons with the Wilkes-Barre Penguins in the American Hockey League, including five seasons as Head Coach (2010-15) and one season as Assistant Coach (2009-10). He led Wilkes-Barre to a record of 231-126-27 in 384 games (.636) and five consecutive appearances in the Calder Cup Playoffs while helping the team allow the fewest goals in the AHL in four of his five seasons. Hynes received the Louis A. R. Pieri Memorial Award, annually awarded to the AHL's most outstanding head coach, at the conclusion of the 2010-11 season.

In between assistant coaching positions at Mass-Lowell (2000-01) and the University of Wisconsin (2002-03), Hynes spent nine seasons on the coaching staff of USA Hockey's National Team Development Program, serving as an Assistant Coach (1998-2000, 2001-02) and Head Coach (2003-09). Team USA claimed four medals during his time with the National Team Development Program at the IIHF World Under-18 Championships, including gold medals in 2002 and 2006.

The native of Warwick, R.I., has also served as an Assistant Coach for Team USA at the 2004 IIHF World Junior Championship, where the Americans won gold for the first time and earned their first medal in the event since 1997. Hynes was also Head Coach of Team USA at the 2016 IIHF World Championship, an Assistant Coach at the 2016 World Cup of Hockey and an Assistant Coach at the 2019 IIHF World Championship.

He played forward at Boston University (1993-97) and helped the Terriers advance to four consecutive Frozen Four appearances and win the 1995 NCAA championship. Hynes was inducted into the Rhode Island Hockey Hall of Fame on August 23, 2023.

He and his wife, Sarah, have three daughters, Sophia, Julia and Anna.

KIRILL THE THRILL

- Kirill Kaprizov leads Minnesota in points (41-48=89) and goals and is second in assists this season.
- Ranks T-5th in the NHL with 16 PPG, T-6th with 38 PPP (16-22=38), T-9th with eight GWG, T-10th in goals and T-12th in points. Leads the NHL with 28 goals since Jan. 19 and is fifth with 53 points (28-25=53).
- Has 65 points (33-32=65) and a plus-19 rating in his last 44 games played.
- With two goals and an assist at CHI (4/7), recorded his 10th three-point game of the season, matching his own franchise record (also 2021-22 season), and moved his career point total to 322 (154-168=322) to pass Andrew Brunette (119-202=321) for seventh place on the Wild's all-time scoring list.
- Scored his 55th career PPG at CHI (4/7), tying Andrew Brunette for fourth-most in franchise history.
- Notched his 22nd career GWG at CHI (4/7), tying Jason Zucker for fifth-most in franchise history.
- Is the first player in franchise history to post three consecutive seasons with 40-plus goals. Is one of four NHL players (Matthews, Pastrnak, Draisaitl) with 40-plus goals in each of the last three seasons.
- With a two-point game (0-2=2) vs. SJS (3/28), became the first player in franchise history with multiple 80-point seasons.
- Scored his 150th career goal in his 265th career NHL game at ANA (3/19) to became the fourth-fastest active NHL skater to reach the mark, trailing only Auston Matthews (223 GP), Alex Ovechkin (234 GP) and Steven Stamkos (245 GP).
- With two goals and an assist vs. ARI (3/12), recorded his 25th career multi-goal game, tying Zach Parise for second-most in franchise history. Also posted the 29th three-point game of his career vs. ARI (3/12), tying Marian Gaborik for second-most in franchise history.
- Posted his 30th goal of the season at ARI (3/7), joining Marian Gaborik (2005-06 to 2007-08) and Brian Rolston (2005-06 to 2007-08) as the only Wild players with three consecutive 30-goal seasons.
- Recorded his third hat trick (3-0=3) of the season vs. SJS (3/3), tying Marian Gaborik (three hat tricks, 2002-03) and Zach Parise (three hat tricks, 2015-16) for the single-season franchise record. Ranks T-5th in the NHL with five hat tricks since entering the league in 2020-21.
- Reached 300 career points (143-157=300) vs. SJS (3/3) in his 258th career game, becoming the fastest player in franchise history and the fifth fastest active NHL player to reach the milestone (Crosby, 219; Ovechkin, 237; McDavid, 240; Malkin, 240).
- Kaprizov recorded the 28th three-point game of his career vs. SJS (3/3, 3-0=3). Only
 two players have more such games in a Wild sweater (Mikko Koivu, 34 and Marian
 Gaborik. 29).
- Was named the NHL's First Star of the Week for the period ending 2/26 after posting six goals and 12 points in four contests (6-6—12), marking his third First Star honor of the season. Became the first player in franchise history to earn NHL First Star of the Week honors three times in a single season (also 12/24/23 and 1/21/24).
- Kaprizov has now been named an NHL Star of the Week five times in his career, trailing only Devan Dubnyk (6x) for most in franchise history. He is the only Wild player to receive four First Star awards (also 1/18/21).
- With three points (2-1=3) at SEA (2/24), recorded his 80th career multi-point game to move past Zach Parise (79 MPG with MIN) for sole possession of third-most in franchise history.
- Kaprizov posted his fourth career regular-season hat trick vs. VAN (2/19) and finished with a career-high six points (3-3=6), which tied the single-game franchise record.
- With a 3-1=4 line in the third period vs. VAN (2/19), Kaprizov also tied the franchise records for single-period goals and single-period points.
- Became the first player in franchise history to reach 50 points in four consecutive seasons with an assist at ARI (2/14).
- Kaprizov received his third NHL All-Star honor on 1/4/24, becoming the second player in franchise history to be selected to three All-Star games and first to do so in three consecutive seasons.
- Was named the NHL's First Star of the Week for the period ending Jan. 21 after ranking T-1st in the NHL in scoring (4-4=8) and goals in four games.
- Notched his third career regular-season hat trick (3-0=3) at CAR (1/21).

HE'S GOING STREAKING

Owns an active seven-game point streak (5-7=12) and has found the scoresheet in 15 of his last 16 games (15-11=26). He recorded a season-long eight-game point streak (10-4=14) from 3/3 to 3/19.

CROWN JOEL

- Joel Eriksson Ek ranks second on the Wild with 12 PPGs, 62 points (30-32=62) and a career-high 30 goals this season.
- Has 37 points (15-22=37) in his last 35 games played.
- Became the 11th player in franchise history to record 30 goals in a single season, reaching the mark vs. SJS (3/28).
- Eriksson Ek posted an eight-game point streak (7-8=15) from 2/9 to 2/24, a career long.
- Posted a career-long four-game goal streak (7-4=11) from 2/12 to 2/19.
- The Swede posted his second career hat trick vs. VAN (2/19) and finished with a career-high six points (3-3=6), which tied the singlegame franchise record. With the hat trick, he reached 120 career goals and moved past Andrew Brunnette (119 goals with MIN) for sixth on the franchise goal list.
- Recorded a six-game point streak (6-5=11) from 1/15 to 1/25.
- Posted a career-best plus-4 rating at CAR (1/21).
- Recorded a career-high 25:30 in TOI at CBJ (1/6).
- Eriksson Ek tied his career high with eight shots on goal at WPG (12/30) and vs. VAN (12/16).
- Currently with 37 career PPGs, Eriksson Ek needs two PPGs to tie Brian Rolston (39 PPGs with MIN) for sixth on the franchise's all-time list.
- Eriksson Ek reached 100 career goals by scoring a PPG at BUF (11/10), becoming the 11th player in franchise history to reach the milestone.
- Won 19-of-23 faceoffs (83%) at BUF (11/10), tying his career high (10/19/21 vs. WPG, 19-of-25).
- Eriksson Ek has recorded 15 multi-point games this season, T-2nd on the team.

NEW GUY IN TOWN

- Marat Khusnutdinov made his NHL debut vs. ANA (3/14), skating 11:54
 of ice time.
- Tallied his first NHL point with an assist at ANA (3/19).
- The native of Moscow, Russia, won six-of-nine faceoffs taken (66.6 pct.), marking the highest faceoff percentage by a Wild player making his NHL debut (min eight faceoffs taken).
- Khusnutdinov also registered four blocked shots, becoming one of only three Wild players to post four-plus blocks in his NHL debut, and the only forward.
- Khusnutdinov recorded 20 points (6-14=20) and 10 penalty minutes (PIM) in 49 games with HK Sochi of the Kontinental Hockey League (KHL) during the 2023-24 season, ranking fifth on the club in assists, seventh in points and serving as the team's captain. Khusnutdinov began the season with SKA St. Petersburg of the KHL, skating in six games, before being traded to HK Sochi on Oct. 10.
- He totaled 41 points (11-30=41) and 18 PIM in 63 games for SKA St. Petersburg during the 2022-23 KHL season, ranking second on the team in assists, sixth in goals and T-7th in points. He tied Artemi Panarin for the seventh-highest single-season point total in KHL history by a player 20 years or younger and became the youngest player in SKA St. Petersburg history to reach 50 career points (20 years, six months and 13 days), doing so in his 116th career game.

BOLDY AND THE BEAUTIFUL

- Matt Boldy has 28 points (10-18=28) in his last 27 games.
- Boldy ranks third on the Wild with 26 goals this season and 61 points (26-35=61). Needs two points to match his single-season career high (31-32=63, 2022-23 season).

- Has recorded five games with 30-plus minutes of TOI this season, four of which came in a five-game span from 12/14 to 12/21. Became one of two NHL rookies since 1997-98 to play four games with 30-plus minutes of TOI in a single season.
- Skated a career-high 33:25 vs. MTL (12/21), the highest single-game total in the NHL this season and the third-highest by an NHL rookie since the start of the 2000-01 season.
- Owns four of the top eight single-game TOI totals by a rookie in Wild franchise history.
- Per NHL Stats, since time on ice began being tracked in 1997-98, Faber is only the 2nd rookie to record consecutive 30+-minute games (Atlanta's Toby Enstrom in March 2008), doing so vs. CGY (12/14) and vs. VAN (12/16).

- **Ryan Hartman** is fifth on Minnesota in goals, T-5th in shots (161) and sixth in points (19-23=42) this season.

- Goaltender Marc-Andre Fleury recorded his 50th win in a Wild sweater vs. OTT (4/2), joining Frederik Anderson (CAR, TOR, ANA) as the only active goaltenders to reach the mark with three different franchises (also PIT, VGK for Fleury).
- Fluery was named the NHL's Third Star of the Week for the period ending March 17 after going 2-0-1 with a 0.97 GAA, .961 SV% and one shutout in three games.
- Posted the 75th shutout of his NHL career vs. ANA (3/14) and needs one more to tie Tony Esposito and Ed Belfour (76 career SO each) for 10th most in NHL history.a
- Fleury recorded his 552nd career win with a 5-0 victory vs. NYI (1/15), moving past Patrick Roy (551 career wins) for second-most in NHL history.
- Fleury became the fourth goaltender in NHL history to reach 1,000 games played when he started vs. WPG (12/31).
- With his 20th save of the game vs. WPG (12/31), became the third goaltender in NHL history to reach 26,000 career saves.
- He made 24 saves at NYR (11/9) to reach 25,808 career saves and pass Roy (25,800 career saves) for third most in NHL history.

- Fleury notched the 65th shootout win of his career vs. NYR (11/4), further extending his all-time NHL record.
- Finished 24-16-4 for the 2022-23 season, Fleury recorded his 15th career season of 20-plus wins, tied for third-most in NHL history: Patrick Roy (17), Martin Brodeur (16) and Ed Belfour (15).
- Fleury has recorded a shutout against 29-of-32 NHL teams (St. Louis, Vegas and Minnesota), the most in league history.
- Fleury faced his 28th career penalty-shot attempt at MTL (10/25). Per NHL Stats, Fleury's 22 saves on 28 all-time attempts trail only Roberto Luongo (33 PS SA, 29 PS saves) for the all-time lead in both categories.
