VANCOUVER CANUCKS

All-Time Wild Record: 52-39-15 (30-18-6 at Grand Casino Arena, 22-21-9 at Vancouver)

2024-25: Minnesota went 2-1-0 against Vancouver...The Wild won the series-opening game, 3-2, in overtime in Saint Paul (12/3) before Vancouver won the second meeting, 3-1, at Rogers Arena (3/7) and Minnesota won the series finale, 3-2, in Vancouver (4/12)...D **Brock Faber** led Minnesota with four points (2-2=4)...LW **Marcus Foligno** (1-1=2), LW **Kirill Kaprizov** (1-1=2) and C **Marco Rossi** (0-2=2) all had two points...G **Filip Gustavsson** went 2-1-0 with a 1.93 GAA and a .908 SV% in three starts...C **Elias Pettersson** led Vancouver with three points (1-2=3)...D **Filip Hronek** (0-2=2), C **Teddy Blueger** (1-1=2), LW **Jake DeBrusk** (2-0=2) and D **Quinn Hughes** (1-1=2) all had two points...G **Kevin Lankinen** went 1-0-2 with a 2.25 GAA and a .930 SV% in three starts.

WILD LEADERS: RW **Vladimir Tarasenko** leads Minnesota with 29 points (12-17=29) in 31 games against Vancouver...RW **Mats Zuccarello** has 28 points (10-18=28) in 25 career contests...D **Jared Spurgeon** owns 19 points (4-15=19) in 43 games...Kaprizov has 18 points (9-9=18) in 11 contests...C **Ryan Hartman** owns 14 points (8-6=14) in 22 games.

WILD GOALIES: Gustavsson is 5-3-1 with a 2.49 GAA, a .908 SV % and one shutout in 10 career games (nine starts) vs. Vancouver...G **Jesper Wallstedt** has not faced the Canucks.

CANUCKS LEADERS: LW **Evander Kane** leads Vancouver with 22 points (13-9=22) in 33 games against Minnesota...Pettersson owns 12 points (7-5=12) in 16 career games against the Wild...RW **Brock Boesser** (3-8=11, in 19 games) and **Hughes** (1-10=11, in 14 games) have 11 points each... DeBrusk has 10 points (7-3=10) in 13 games.

CANUCKS GOALIES: G **Thatcher Demko** is 0-3-2 with a 3.40 GAA and a .900 SV% in five career starts against Minnesota...Lankinen is 1-1-3 with a 2.56 GAA and a .924 SV% in seven career games (five starts).

CONNECTIONS: Minnesota Associate Coach **Jack Capuano** played in three games with Vancouver in 1990-91...Wild Assistant Coach **Jason King** was selected by Vancouver in the seventh round (212th overall) of the 2001 NHL Draft and recorded 23 points (12-11=23) in 55 games in parts of two seasons with the Canucks (2002-04)...King also served as an Assistant Coach for Vancouver for three seasons (2020-23) and five seasons as an Assistant Coach with the Canucks AHL affiliate in Utica (2016-20)...Boeser is from Burnsville...D **Derek Forbort** is from Duluth...Canucks Assistant Coach **Brett McLean** was an Assistant Coach for the lowa Wild for three seasons (2017-20), spent three seasons as an Assistant Coach with Minnesota (2020-23) and two seasons as the lowa Wild Head Coach (2023-25).

FAST FACTS: The Wild set single-game franchise records for goals scored (10) and single-period goals scored (seven, third period) vs. Vancouver on 2/19/24...Minnesota is 15-4-1 in its last 20 games vs. Vancouver and 4-1-0 in the last five meetings...The Wild won eight consecutive meetings against Vancouver, out scoring the Canucks 28-16, before a 2-0 loss on 12/7/23...Minnesota is 12-5-0 in the last 17 games played in Vancouver (since 3/18/13)...The Wild is 12-5-1 in the last 18 games played in Saint Paul (since 3/10/13)...Minnesota's 52 wins and 119 points vs. the Canucks are its fourth-most against any franchise.

NOTES & MILESTONES

Team: Leads the NHL with 14 PPG (48 PPO) and ranks fourth with a 29.2 PP%...Through the first 12 games of a season, ranks first in franchise history in PP% and T-3rd in PPG.

Matt Boldy: Ranks T-6th in the NHL with three PPG, eighth with 43 shots, and T-12th with six PPP (3-3=6)...Has played in 167 consecutive games dating back to 11/2/23, the 29th-longest active streak in the NHL.

Zeev Buium: Ranks second among NHL rookies with six assists, T-2nd with eight points (2-6=8), third with a 19:36 TOI/G average and T-6th in shots (18)...Ranks T-3rd among NHL defensemen with four PPA and five PPP (1-4=5) and T-7th in points.

Joel Eriksson Ek: Leads the the NHL in faceoffs taken (263) and in faceoffs won (135).

Brock Faber: Owns five points (1-4=5) in his last three games...Finished with a game-high seven shots on goal vs. WPG (10/28), the second-highest single-game total of his career...Notched three assists (0-3=3) vs. SJS (10/26), tying his single-game career-high in assists and points...The total also tied the franchise single-game high for assists by a defenseman (23rd occurance).

Marcus Johansson: Owns an active four-game point streak (4-1=5), one game shy of tying his career-long streak (three occurances)...Is currently five games from 1,000 for his career.

Kirill Kaprizov: With a goal vs. PIT (10/30), became the third player in Wild history with a point in each of the team's first six home games to start a season (Zuccarello, 11 GP in 2023-24; Bouchard, 6 GP in 2005-06)...Owns an active four-game point streak (2-4=6)...Ranks T-2nd in the NHL in PPG (four) and PPP (4-4=8) and T-8th in points (7-9=16)...With a goal vs. WPG (10/28), reached 401 career points (191-210=401) and passed Zach Parise (199-201=400) for fourth-most points in franchise history...With three assists (0-3=3) vs. SJS (10/26), pushed his career point total to 400 (190-210=400) and tied Evgeni Malkin as the fourth-fastest active NHL player to reach the landmark, doing so in 329 games...Skated a season-high 27:08 of TOI vs. SJS (10/26), the highest total by an NHL forward this season...Notched the 10th career game with three-plus assists vs. SJS (10/26), moving past Mats Zuccarello for sole possesion of second-most games in Wild history...Notched a PPA vs. SJS (10/26) to reach 139 career PPP (66-73=139) and move past Ryan Suter (21-117=138) for third-most in Wild history...Currently ranks second in franchise history with 66 career PPG (Parise, 69).

Marco Rossi: Owns an active four-game point streak (1-5=6) and seven

points (1-6=7) in his last six games. Jared Spurgeon: With an assist vs. WPG (10/28), reached 300 assists for his career and joined Mikko Koivu (504 assists) and Ryan Suter (314 assists) as the only players to reach the landmark with the Wild.

Yakov Trenin: Leads the NHL with 60 hits this season...Currently at 99 career points (55-44=99).

Former goaltenders Niklas Backstrom, Devan Dubnyk and Josh Harding will attend the team's 25th anniversary celebration night on Tuesday, Nov. 4 when it hosts the Nashville Predators at 7:00 p.m. Fans who purchase a special 25th Anniversary Bobblehead ticket will receive a Mikko Koivu bobblehead and have the opportunity to get an autograph from Backstrom, Dubnyk or Harding at a special pre-game signing.

WILD AT THE OLYMPICS

Wild General Manager and President of Hockey Operations **Bill Guerin** is serving as the General Manager of the 2026 United States Men's Ice Hockey Team. He is joined on Team USA's staff by Wild Head Coach **John Hynes**, who will serve as an assistant coach; Wild Assistant General Manager **Chris Kelleher**, who will work on the management staff; Wild Head Athletic Trainer **John Worley** and Assistant Athletic Trainer and Massage Therapist **Travis Green**, who will work as athletic trainers, and Wild Orthopedic Surgeon **Joel Boyd**, who will serve as team physician.

Wild forward **Nico Sturm** was selected to Germany's preliminary roster. The native of Augsburg had eight points (six goals, two assists) in 10 games at the 2023 for silver-winning Germany at the 2023 Worlds, and he also competed at the tournament the following year.

TEAM NOTES



ON THE POWER PLAY

- Leads the NHL with 14 PPG (48 PPO) and ranks fourth with a 29.2 PP%.
 Through the first 12 games of a season, ranks first in franchise history in PP% and T-3rd in PPG.
- Scored nine consecutive power-play goals, the longest streak in franchise history and tied for the third-longest streak in the NHL since the 1933-34 season, from 10/11 - 10/14.
- Since the 1933-34 season, only the 1987-88 New York Rangers (11 PPG) recorded more power-play goals in a season's first four games. Since 1977-78, no team with 20-plus power-play opportunities recorded a higher power-play percentage.
- The Wild opened the season by scoring a power-play goal in four consecutive games, achieving the feat for the sixth time in franchise history. The run trailed only the 2010-11 season (six-game streak) and the 2022-23 season (five-game streak) for the longest season-opening runs in franchise history.



PLAYER NOTES



MARCO POLO

- **Marco Rossi** owns an active four-game point streak (1-5=6) and seven points (1-6=7) in his last six games.
- Saw his streak of 173 consecutive regular-season games played snapped when he did not play 10/20 at NYR due to injury. The streak was the longest among Wild players and T-30th among active NHL players.
- Notched his first career shootout goal vs. LAK (10/13), the game winner.
- Opened the season with two points (1-1=2) at STL (10/9).
- Led the team in PPG (seven), ranked second in assists (36) and points (24-36=60) and third in goals (24) last season.
- Reached 101 career points with two assists (0-2=2) vs. SJS (4/9/25).
- Scored the GWG in overtime vs. DAL (4/6/25), his third GWG of the 2024-25 season.
- Notched his 30th assist of the season at COL (2/28/25) to become the second Austrian player in NHL history to reach the 30-assist mark in a single campaign (Thomas Vanek, 7x).
- Is the third Austrian player with multiple 20-goal seasons in the NHL, joining Thomas Vanek (11x) and Michael Grabner (4x). Also the third Austrian player with 50 points in a season, joining Vanek (9x) and Grabner (1x).
- Named the NHL's First Star of the Week after recording eight points (3-5=8) in three games for the period ending Jan. 5, 2025.

TRICKS UP HIS ZEEV

- Zeev Buium ranks second among NHL rookies with six assists, T-2nd with eight points (2-6=8), third with a 19:36 TOI/G average and T-6th in shots (18).
- Ranks T-3rd among NHL defensemen with four PPA and five PPP (1-4=5) and T-7th in points.
- Per NHL Stats, is the first player in Wild history to record a point in each
 of the first four regular-season home games of his career, doing so from
 10/11 10/26
- Per NHL Stats, recorded his sixth career assist vs. UTA (10/25) and tied Nick Schultz for the second most by a Wild defenseman before age 20.
 Jonas Brodin leads the list with nine. He also became the fourth player in Wild history to record a point in each of the first three regular-season home games of his career. The others: Brent Burns (3 GP in 2003-04), Marian Gaborik (3 GP in 2000-01) and Maxim Sushinsky (3 GP in 2000-01).
- According to NHL Stats, is one of five NHL rookies since the 1933-34
 NHL season to record five-plus PPP in his team's first four games.
- Finished with two points (1-1=2) and scored his first career NHL goal (Merzlikins) vs. CBJ (10/11), becoming the fourth-youngest defenseman in Wild history to score a goal (19 years, 308 days).
- Finished with a career-high 24:39 of TOI vs CBJ (10/11), joining Jonas Brodin (18 occurrences) as the only players in Wild history to post 24plus minutes of TOI before turning 20 years old.
- Notched the first assist of his NHL career vs. VGK (4/24) to become the second-youngest player in Wild history (19 years, 138 days) to record their first Stanley Cup Playoff point, behind Pierre-Marc Bouchard (19 years, 19 days in Game 4 of 2003 CF).
- Became the 12th-youngest player (19 years, 134 days) in NHL history to make his League debut during the Stanley Cup Playoffs vs. VGK (4/20) and 152nd player overall.
- He was the 326th player (304th skater) to play in a regular-season or Stanley Cup Playoff game for the Wild.



KIRILL THE THRILL

- **Kirill Kaprizov** owns an active four-game point streak (2-4=6).
- With a goal vs. PIT (10/30), became the third player in Wild history with a point in each of the team's first six home games to start a season (Zuccarello, 11 GP in 2023-24; Bouchard, 6 GP in 2005-06)
- Ranks T-2nd in the NHL in PPG (four) and PPP (4-4=8) and T-8th in points (7-9=16).
- Scored a goal vs. WPG (10/28) and reached 401 career points (191-210=401) to pass Zach Parise (199-201=400) for fourth-most points in franchise history.
- With three assists (0-3=3) vs. SJS (10/26), pushed his career point total to 400 (190-210=400) and tied Evgeni Malkin as the fourth-fastest active NHL player to reach the landmark, doing so in 329 games. Among all-time NHL players born outside of North America, Kaprizov tied Malkin as the seventh-fastest to hit 400 points. Overall, Kaprizov and Malkin are tied as the 22nd-fastest players in NHL history to reach 400 career points.

- Notched the 10th career game with three-plus assists vs. SJS (10/26), moving past Mats Zuccarello for sole possesion of second-most games in Wild history.
- Notched a PPA vs. SJS (10/26) to reach 139 career PPP (66-73=139) and move past Ryan Suter (21-117=138) for third-most in Wild history.
- Ranks second in franchise history with 66 career PPG (Zach Parise, 69).

- Ranked second on the team in goals (25), third in points (25-31=56) and fourth in assists (31) in 2024-25.

 Kaprizov notched a point in 16-of-20 road games played in 2024-25 (11-20=31), including a franchise-record 11-game road point streak (8-16=24) from 10/15 - 11/21.

- Kaprizov posted a multi-point streak of eight games on the road (6-14=20) from 10/15 11/8/25, joining Steven Stamkos (8 GP in 2017-18) and Roman Josi (8 GP in 2021-22) as the only active players to achieve the mark.
- Kaprizov recorded seven-game multi-point and assist streaks (6-11=17) from 10/15 - 11/1/25.
- His streak of seven consecutive games with multiple points set a franchise record and T-4th longest in the NHL since the 2000-01 season.



BOLDY AND THE BEAUTIFUL

- Matt Boldy ranks T-6th in the NHL with three PPG, eighth with 43 shots, and T-12th with six PPP (3-3=6).
- Has played in 167 consecutive games dating back to 11/2/23, the 29th-longest active streak in the NHL.
- Posted a five-game point streak from 10/9-10/17, tied for the fifthlongest season-opening streak in franchise history.
- According to NHL Stats, became the sixth different Wild player to record a point in each of his team's first five games of a season.
- Posted a four-game goal streak from 10/9 10/14, becoming the first player in franchise history to achieve the feat in a season's first four games
- Recorded a career-high 10 shots on goal at DAL (10/14), tied for the fourth-highest single-game total in franchise history.
- Recorded the 20th three-point game (1-2=3) of his career vs. CBJ (10/11), one shy of tying Mats Zuccarello (21) for fourth in franchise history.
- Posted three points (1-2=3) at STL (10/9), moving his career total in season-opening games to nine points (4-5=9) in four games and marking the highest PPG average (2.25) in team history.
- Led the Wild with 73 points (27-46=73), 27 goals and 46 assists and ranked second with six PPG in 2024-25.
- Established single-season career highs in games played (82), points and assists in 2024-25.
- Currently fifth in franchise history with 24 career GWG, three behind Kirill Kaprizov (27).
- Became the eighth player in franchise history to record 70-plus points in a single season.
- Finished T-3rd in the NHL with 10 GWG (franchise record) and seventh with 271 shots in 2024-25.
- Is the first player in Wild history to record three 25-goal seasons before turning 24. THE GUS BUS IS ROLLING

- **Filip Gustavsson** is now 35-25-10 with a 2.56 GAA and a .915 SV% in road games since joining the Wild prior to the 2022-23 season. He ranks third in the NHL in road SV% and fourth in road GAA during that span (min. 50 gp).
- Posted a 26-save shutout at STL (10/9), reaching 12 for his career and tying Manny Fernandez for fourth-most in Wild history.
- Is the first goaltender in franchise history to post a shutout in multiple season openers (also 10/12/23) and is the only active goalie to accomplish the feat for any franchise.
- Is 75-52-18 in his career with the Wild since joining the franchise in 2022-23. Gustavsson ranks fourth in the NHL during that span with a .913 SV% and T-4th with 12 shutouts (min. 50 games).
- Posted a 31-19-6 record in 2024-25 and ranked T-4th in the NHL in shutouts (five), sixth in SV% (.914) and T-6th in wins.
- Is the fifth goaltender in franchise history to reach 30 wins in a single season.
- His five shutouts last season were tied for the second-highest singleseason total in Wild history (Backstrom, eight in 2008-09).
- Was named the NHL's First Star of the Week for the period ending March 23, 2025, going 3-0-0 with a 0.67 goals-against average, .976 save percentage and one shutout.
- Posted a 161:49 shutout streak from 3/17 3/22/25, the longest home shutout streak in franchise history and the sixth-longest shutout streak in the NHL this season and in franchise history.
