# AT A GLANCE

#### **THE LOS ANGELES PHIL-HARMONIC**


Center Phillip Danault (2-0=2) scored his first two goals of the 2025 Stanley Cup Playoffs on Monday night, marking his eighth and ninth career playoff tallies. Since his debut with the Kings in the 2021-22 campaign, Danault's seven playoff goals rank second among team skaters in that time frame, trailing only Adrian **Kempe** (12G). Danault netted his second tally of the evening with just 42 seconds remaining in the contest to reestablish the Kings' lead in Game 1 of the First Round. Per NHL PR, the tally marked the latest go-ahead goal in a playoff game for Los Angeles, besting the previous mark set by Trevor Lewis during Game 2 of 2013 Conference Semifinals (58:39). Danault has now recorded two career game-winning goals against the Oilers in the postseason, last doing so on May 2, 2022 (1-1=2). His pair of game-winners are tied with **Trevor Moore** for the most among Kings skaters over the Victoriaville, Quebec, native's tenure with the franchise.

#### **DR. DREI**

Forward Andrei Kuzmenko started the party just 2:49 into his playoff debut at Crypto.com Arena on Monday. Kuzmenko's tally marked the Kings' fastest game-


opening goal in the postseason since Marian Gaborik (0:34) in Game 2 of the 2014 Second Round. The 29-year-old finished the night by factoring on half of the Kings' six goals (1-2=3), becoming just the second player in franchise history to record a three-point effort in their first career Stanley Cup Playoff game. He joins current Kings broadcaster **Daryl Evans** (2-2=4), who did so on April 7, 1982, in Edmonton. Kuzmenko is the 36th player in NHL history to post a three-point night in his postseason debut, just the sixth to do so in the 21st century, and the first since **Dominik Kubalik** recorded five points (2-3=5) for the Blackhawks against the Oilers in the Qualifying Round of the pandemic-adjusted 2020 Stanley Cup Playoffs. The native of Yakutsk, Russia, finished the regular season 15 points (5-10=15) in as many contests played in the building since the trade deadline, tied with linemate Anze Kopitar (6-9=15) and trailing only Quinton Byfield (9-7=16) for the most home points among Kings skaters since joining the team.


