FILLING THE NET

Egor Chinakhov scored his 11th goal as a member of the Penguins in Sunday's overtime win against Boston, increasing his season total to 14 goals, nine assists and 23 points in 2025-26.

- Chinakhov has 11 goals in 25 games with the Penguins after scoring three goals in 29 games with the Columbus Blue Jackets prior to his trade.
- Since his Penguins debut, no Penguin has more goals than Chinakhov's 11 tallies, while his 17 points are the fourth most:

DIVISIONAL SHOWDOWN

The top-two teams in the Metropolitan Division face off tonight as the Penguins visit the Carolina Hurricanes for the first of three games between the two teams in the next 13 days.

- Pittsburgh enters today's game with points in 16-consecutive games against Metropolitan Division opponents, going 9-0-7 since October 25.
- The Penguins' point streak against divisional opponents is the seventh-longest such streak in NHL history:

MO MONEY, MO PROBLEMS


Anthony Mantha recorded his fourth multi-goal game of the season in Sunday's overtime win against Boston, increasing his total to 23 goals on the season.
