The Stars extended their winning streak against the Sharks to four games with a 3-2 shootout win over San Jose.

- Matt Duchene scored Dallas' first goal of the game and then added the deciding goal in the shootout. His goal in the shootout was the 32nd of his career and his 17th game-deciding goal.
- Duchene's 17 shootout-deciding goals are tied with Los Angeles' Anze Kopitar for the fourth-most among active skaters. Only Patrick Kane (22), T.J. Oshie (21) and Sidney Crosby (20) have scored more.
- Jason Robertson extended his point streak against the Sharks to seven games with an assist and now has 12 points (6-6–12) in 10 career games against San Jose.

GAME NOTES

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Entering play Wednesday, Dallas (4-0-0) was one of four undefeated teams in the NHL this season, joining Calgary (4-0-0), Winnipeg (3-0-0) and Tampa Bay (2-0-0).
- If the Stars were to win tonight, it would give them five consecutive wins to begin a season for the first time since the 2006-07 season.
- A Stars victory tonight would give Dallas wins in each of their first two road games of the season for the first time since the 2010-11 season.
 - Last season, the Stars led the league in road points (57), road points percentage (.695) and tied the Florida Panthers for the league lead with 26 road wins.
- The Stars have won each of the last five games they have played against the Capitals.
- Each of the two games that Dallas and Washington played last season went to extra time The Stars beat the Capitals 5-4 in a shootout on Dec. 7, 2023 with Jason Robertson scoring the deciding goal and then defeated them in overtime on Jan. 27, 2024 with Thomas Harley scoring the game winner.
- **Roope Hintz** enters tonight's game one goal shy of becoming the 18th skater in franchise history to score 150 goals with the team.
- Through three games played this season, Jake Oettinger has saved 4.6 goals above expected according to MoneyPuck.com, which was tied with Winnipeg's Connor Hellebuyck for the third-highest mark in the NHL entering play Wednesday.
- The Stars have had seven different forwards score a goal through their first three games of the season: Roope Hintz (2), Mason Marchment (2), Tyler Seguin (2), Jamie Benn, Matt Duchene, Wyatt Johnston, Jason Robertson and Sam

Steel. Entering play Wednesday, only the Calgary Flames (9) and New York Rangers (9) have had more forwards score a goal this season.

NO CAP

- Jamie Benn has 13 points (4-9–13) in 12 career road games against the Capitals and has recorded a point (1-2–3) in each of the last three games he has played against Washington.
- Matt Duchene enters tonight's game riding a three-game point streak against Washington, totaling four points (1-3-4) in those games.
- **Roope Hintz** has nine points (5-4–9) in nine career games against the Capitals and enters tonight's matchup riding a five-game point streak (4-3–7) against Washington.
- Mason Marchment has totaled five points (2-3–5) in five career games against Washington.
- Jake Oettinger is undefeated in his career against the Capitals, posting a 4-0-0 record with a .950 save percentage, 1.60 goals-against average and one shutout.
- Jason Robertson has five points (1-4-5) in his last five games against Washington.

JOHNNY BE GOOD

- With an assist on **Roope Hintz's** goal on Tuesday, **Wyatt Johnston** extended his point streak to four games (1-3-4) and now has a point in each game the Stars have played this season.
- Johnston became the first player in Stars team history and third player in franchise history to record a point in each of his team's first four game of a season at age 21 or younger according to NHL Stats. The others are Steve Payne (6 GP in 1979-80), Bobby Smith (6 GP in 1979-80) and Tim Young (4 GP in 1976-77).
- The 2024-25 season is already the first time in **Johnston's** career that he has opened a season with a point in four consecutive games.
- If Johnston were to extend his point streak tonight, it would give him points in five consecutive games for the third time in his career, which would tie his career high. He previously recorded a five-game point streak from Feb. 25 to March 4, 2023 and again from March 13 to 21, 2023.
- A goal or an assist tonight would also make **Johnston** the first Stars player to have a point in five straight games to begin a season since John Klingberg did so in 2020-21.
- Entering play Wednesday, only New Jersey's Jesper Bratt (five games) had a longer active point streak than Johnston.

ROOKIE REPORT

- Logan Stankoven has recorded four assists through the Stars' first three games of the season and was leading all NHL rookies is scoring entering play Wednesday.
- Stankoven's five assists were also tied for the fourth-most among all NHL skaters entering play Wednesday and tied him with Mason Marchment for the team lead in scoring.
- With his assist on Oct. 15 against the Sharks, **Stakoven** became just the second rookie in Stars/North Stars history to record five or more assists through his first four games of a season, joining Marc Bureau (5 in 4 GP in 1990-91) according to NHL Stats.
- He recorded three assists in Dallas' 4-3 win over the Predators on Oct. 10, making him the only rookie to have a threepoint game this season.
- According to NHL Stats, **Stankoven** became the second rookie in franchise history to record three points in the team's season-opening contest, alongside Roland Eriksson (0-4–4 w/ MNS) on Oct. 6, 1976.
- Originally selected by the Stars in the second round (47th overall) of the 2021 NHL Draft, Stankoven appeared in 24 regular-season games for Dallas last year, totaling 14 points (6-8–14) in those contests and adding eight points (3-5–8) in 19 Stanley Cup Playoff games.

BÄCKSTREET'S BÄCK, ALRIGHT!

- Dallas' Oct. 10 matchup against the Nashville Predators marked the first NHL game of **Oskar Bäck's** career. **Bäck** was originally drafted by the Stars in the third round (75th overall) of the 2018 NHL Draft.
- **Bäck** became the seventh player drafted by the Stars between 2017 and 2024 to play in at least one regular-season game for Dallas.
- When **Bäck** has been on the ice this season during 5-on-5 play, the Stars have outshot their opponents 16-11 and have recorded a 60.8 percent on-ice Corsi rating according to Natural Stat Trick.
 - His 60.8 percent on-ice Corsi rating is the highest mark of any NHL rookie to play in at least two games this season.
- **Bäck** and linemates **Colin Blackwell** and **Sam Steele** have not been on the ice for a 5-on-5 goal against this season. Additionally, when the trio is on the ice during 5-on-5 play, the Stars are outshooting their opponents 12-8.

BENN THERE DONE THAT

- Stars captain Jamie Benn enters tonight's contest having played in 301 consecutive games.
- Sunday's matchup against the Kraken marked the 300th consecutive game that **Benn** had played in, becoming the fourth player in franchise history to play in 300 consecutive games for the team according to NHL Stats.

- Benn's current 301-game Iron Man streak is the fifth-longest active streak in the NHL.
- Benn is one of 15 players to have an active Iron Man streak of at least 200 games and is one of 11 NHL players to appear in each of his team's 246 regular-season games between 2021-22 and 2023-24.
- The Stars captain leads all Dallas players in career games played (1,116), goals (384), assists (525) and points (909). His 909 career points rank 12th among active NHL skaters, and he is the second-highest scoring fifth-round draft pick in NHL history (Alexander Mogilny; 1,032).

FROM START TO FINNISH

- Forward Roope Hitz was named one of the Stars alternate captains this season. 2024-25 will mark the first time that Hitz and fellow Fins Miro Heiskanen and Esa Lindell are all a part of Dallas' leadership group.
 - Captain Jamie Benn and alternate captain Tyler Seguin round out the team's leadership group for this season.
- Heiskanen, Hintz and Lindell are three of six Finnish players in the NHL this season to be a part of their team's leadership group, joining Florida captain Aleksander Barkov, Carolina alternate Sebastian Aho and Colorado alternate Mikko Rantanen.
- Heiskanen, Hintz and Lindell are set to face off against Barkov the NHL's Global Series when the Stars will take on the Panthers in back-to-back games on Nov. 1 and 2 at Nokia Arena in Tampere, Finland.
- All three of Heiskanen, Hintz and Lindell rank in the top 15 in all-time scoring among active, Finnish skaters. At eighth, Hintz ranks the highest with 313 career points followed by Heiskanen (258, 10th) and Lindell (191, 13th).

ONE FOR THE HISTORY BOOKS

- **Tyler Seguin** is seven assists away from bringing his total with the stars to 380, which would tie him with Brian Bellows for fifth-most assists by a skater in franchise history.
- Esa Lindell is nine points shy of becoming the 49th player and 13th defenseman in franchise history to record 200 points with the Stars. He is also just three goals away from tying Philippe Boucher (52) for the 10th-most goals among defensemen in franchise history.
- Jake Oettinger's next shutout will be the 12th of his career, which will tie Jon Casey for the sixth-most in franchise history,

FOR PETE'S SAKE

- Dallas' win over the Predators on Oct. 10 marked Head Coach **Pete DeBoer's** 100th behind the Stars bench. He became the fourth Stars head coach (since 1993-94) to record at least 100 regular-season wins with the team, joining Ken Hitchcock (319), Dave Tippett (271) and Lindy Ruff (165).
- Since the start of the 2022-23 season **DeBoer's** first as the team's head coach the Stars have posted a 103-42-23 record for a .682 win percentage, which is the second-best mark in the NHL during that span.
 - Only Jim Montgomery (Boston; 114) and Rod Brind'Amour (Carolina; 105) have recorded more regular-season wins since the starts of the 2022-23 season
 - This excludes the Utah Hockey Club, which has gone 3-1-0 through its first four games this season after relocating to Salt Lake City from Arizona.
- DeBoer has posted a 616-421-146 record over the course of his coaching career with the Dallas Stars, Vegas Golden Knights (2019-20 to 2021-22), San Jose Sharks (2015-16 to 2019-20), New Jersey Devils (2011-12 to 2014-15) and Florida Panthers (2008-19 to 2010-11). His 616 career wins rank 23rd all-time among all NHL coaches and rank fifth all-time among active coaches.
- His next win will tie him with Bruce Boudreau Jacques Lemaire for 21st on the all-time coaching wins list.

FIRST THING'S FIRST

- Dallas opened the 2024-25 season with 11 former first-round picks on its roster; Mavrik Bourque (DAL; 2020), Matt Duchene (COL; 2009), Matt Dumba (MIN; 2012), Thomas Harley (DAL; 2019), Miro Heiskanen (DAL; 2017), Wyatt Johnston (DAL; 2021) Nils Lundkvist (NYR; 2018), Jake Oettinger (DAL; 2017), Tyler Seguin (BOS; 2010), Brenden Smith (DET; 2007) and Sam Steel (ANA; 2016)
- **Tyler Seguin** is the highest drafted player on Dallas' roster, selected by Boston with the second-overall pick in the 2010 NHL Draft. **Seguin** leads all 2010 draft picks in career assists (437) and points (788), and ranks second in goals (351).
- There are two sets of Stars skaters that were taken with the same pick in different years: Matt Duchene and Miro Heiskanen were both taken with the third-overall pick, Duchene by Colorado in 2009 and Heiskanen by Dallas in 2017. Additionally, Sam Steel and Mavrik Bourque were both drafted 30th-overall Steel by Anaheim in 2016 and Bourque by Dallas in 2020.
- Six additional Stars draft picks are on Dallas' opening night roster this year: Oskar Bäck (2018; 3rd round), Jamie Benn (2007; 5th round), Roope Hintz (2015; 2nd round), Esa Lindell (2012; 3rd round), Jason Robertson (2017; 2nd round) and Logan Stankoven (2021; 2nd round).

- Stars forward Evgenii Dadonov and Capitals forward Alex Ovechkin played for Russia's national team together at the 2014, 2015, 2016 and 2019 IIHF World Championships. They medaled in all four tournaments, winning a gold in 2014, silver in 2015, and bronze in 2016 and 2019.
- Pete DeBoer (head coach), Misha Donskov (assistant coach) and Steve Spott (assistant coach) were all on the Golden Knight's coaching staff while Capitals goaltender Logan Thompson was playing in Vegas (2020-21 to 2021-22).
- Stars assistant coach **Misha Donskov** was the video coach for Team Canada at the 2016 IIHF World Junior Championship, a roster that Capitals forward Dylan Strome was on.
- Stars forward Matt Duchene played in Columbus with Capitals forwards Pierre-Luc Dubois and Sonny Milano for part of the 2018-19 season.
- Stars defenseman Matt Dumba played in Minnesota with Capitals Brandon Duhaime forward from 2021-22 to 2022-23. Stars forward Sam Steel was also on the 2022-23 squad.
- Stars vice president of cultural growth and strategy Al Montoya played for Team USA with Capitals forward T.J. Oshie at the 2009 IIHF World Championship.
- Stars defenseman Ilya Lyubushkin and Capitals defenseman Jakob Chychrun both played for Arizona now the Utah Hockey Club from 2018-19 to 2021-22. Capitals forward Dylan Strome also played in Arizona with the two in 2018-19.
- Stars defenseman **Brendan Smith** and Capitals defenseman Dylan McIlrath both played for the Rangers for part of the 2016-17 season.
- Stars forward Sam Steel played with Capitals forward Sonny Milano in Anaheim from 2019-20 to 2020-22.
