All three matchups between Buffalo and New York in 2022-23 were decided in overtime or a shootout.

A win in tonight's game would give **Don Granato** three consecutive wins in season-opening contests as a head coach. **Granato** currently holds a 2-0-0 record as a head coach in such games.

A win in tonight's game would give the Sabres three consecutive wins against the Rangers for the first time since the team

won three straight contests against New York from April 2, 2016 to Jan. 3, 2017.

If he plays tonight, Zach Benson (18 years, 153 days) would become the second-youngest Sabre to appear in a regular-season game, behind only Pierre Turgeon (18 years, 41 days).

Alex Tuch (1+6) and Casey Mittelstadt (5+5) each ended the 2022-23 season having tallied at least one point in each of their last six games.

If he scores the Sabres first goal, JJ Peterka would become the first Sabres skater since Conor Sheary from 2018-19 to 2019-20 to record Buffalo's first goal of the season in consecutive years.

**Kyle Okposo** leads all Buffalo skaters in points against the Rangers with 33 (11+22) in 58 total games against New York.

Should he start in tonight's game, Devon Levi (21 years, 289 days) would become the youngest Sabres goaltender since Mika Noronen (21 years, 110 days) on Oct. 5, 2000 (4-2 win vs. Chicago) to start in a season-opening game.



#### **OPENING NIGHT**

Tonight's game marks the 53rd season-opener in franchise history.

The Sabres are 27-20-5 all-time in season-openers; 19-11-5 when opening at home.

Buffalo is 24-21-7 all-time in their first home game of the season. This is the team's ninth season-opener in the last 10 seasons to take place at home.

Tonight's game marks just the second time the Sabres have opened their season against the Rangers in franchise history. Buffalo is 1-0-0 against New York in season-openers.

The Jeanneret family will be honored in a pregame ceremony ahead of tonight's game, including a ceremonial faceoff.
