



FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP

April 13, 2025 – CALGARY FLAMES [5] vs. SAN JOSE SHARKS [2]

The Calgary Flames welcomed the San Jose Sharks to the Scotiabank Saddledome for game 80 of the 2024-25 season. The Sharks would open the scoring with Tyler Toffoli putting the visitors up just 3:09 into the contest. Later in the frame, MacKenzie Weegar would tee up a shot and blast home his eighth on the campaign to draw the Flames level. Then with less than five minutes remaining in the first, Nazem Kadri would make a slick move around Henry Thrun and find Adam Klapka at the back post who tapped in his fifth to give the Flames their first lead of the night and head into the break up 2-1. In the middle stanza, Jan Rutta would score the only goal of the period and level things at two through 40. Calgary retook their lead just 1:30 into the third after Yegor Sharangovich finished off a give-and-go with Morgan Frost. Midway through the period, Matt Coronato added to the Flames advantage with his 24th of the season and Sharangovich would add an empty netter to give the Flames a 5-2 win.

TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS

This is the fourth and final meeting this season between the Flames and Golden Knights. Calgary has fallen to Vegas in their three prior meetings.

This is a Pacific Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 14-4-6 against Pacific Division teams and a record of 24-16-8 against Western Conference opponents.

SHARKNADO:

Yegor Sharangovich's first of his two goals on Sunday against San Jose was the 100th of his NHL career. Sharangovich has become just the third skater of Belarussian descent in NHL history to reach the 100-goal plateau, the others are: Mikhail Grabovski (125) and Andrei Kostitsyn (103). He also became the third member of the 2018 NHL Draft Class to reach the mark, joining Brady Tkachuk (191) and Andrei Svechnikov (150).

HOWLIN' FOR YOU:

Dustin Wolf earned his 28th win of 2024-25 with his 28-save effort on Sunday to tie Sergei Bobrovsky (28 in 2010-11) for the third most in a campaign by an active netminder in their rookie season. The list is topped by Matt Murray (32 in 2016-17) and Stuart Skinner (29 in 2022-23). With the victory, Wolf also tied Ryan Miller (36) for the fourth-most wins by a U.S.-born rookie goaltender. He trails Jimmy Howard (38), John Gibson (37) and Alex Nedeljkovic (37).

ARSENII SERGEEV:

On Monday morning, the Calgary Flames announced the signing of goaltender Arsenii Sergeev to a two-year, two-way contract. Sergeev, a native of Yaroslavl, RUS backstopped Penn State University for 33 games in 2024-25, posting a .919 save-percentage, a 2.54 goals-against average along with a 19-9-4 record. Sergeev's 19 wins led all goaltenders in the Big Ten and the 22-year-old also posted a conference-best four shutouts.

Arsenii was named the B1G First Star of the Week on February 25th amid a six-game unbeaten run as well as earning a nomination as Big Ten Goaltender of the Year, becoming the first Nittany Lion netminder to be recognized as a Goaltender of the Year finalist. He helped his club earn a spot in the Frozen Four for the first time in program history first with a 26-save effort in Round One to help Penn State upset number three ranked Maine. In the Quarterfinals, he turned aside 42 of the 44 shots he faced in a 3-2 overtime victory against his former club the University of Connecticut, to qualify for Frozen Four. Sergeev was the Flames seventh-round pick (205th overall) in the 2021 NHL Draft. His contract will begin in the 2025-26 season.

KING'S COURT:

On Monday morning, the Calgary Flames announced the signing of forward Carter King to a one-year, two-way contract. King, a Calgary native, captained the University of Denver in 2024-25, skating in 44 games while posting career-bests in goals (21), assists (22) and points (43). King helped Denver qualify for the Frozen Four for the third time in the past four seasons with three points in their two qualification games before falling to eventual-champions Western Michigan in the Semifinals. In 2023-24, King helped the University of Denver capture the National Championship as they stunned number one ranked Boston College in the Frozen Four Final. He was also a member of the Denver squad winning the 2022 National Title following a 31-9-1 campaign. King is signed with the Flames for the 2025-26 season.

CALGARY VEGAS TIES:



Daniil Miromanov was acquired from Vegas in exchange for Noah Hanifin in March of last year. Hanifin spent six years with Calgary, skating in 420 games with 42 goals and 149 assists for 191 points. Miromanov has skated in 63 games so far through his Calgary Flames tenure, scoring five goals and 11 assists for 16 points.

Flames defenceman Brayden Pachal was claimed off waivers by Calgary from Vegas on February 4th, 2024 and has skated in 74 games for the Flames so far this season. Golden Knights centre Cole Schwindt was claimed off waivers by Vegas from Calgary earlier this year. Schwindt skated in four games with the Flames during the 2023-24 season.

HEY DID YOU KNOW?

The Flames extended their point streak to six games (4-0-2) and moved within two points of the Blues (94) for the final Wild Card spot in the Western Conference. Calgary has two games remaining in the regular season (April 15 vs. VGK & April 17 at LAK), while St. Louis has one (April 15 vs. UTA).
