PRACTICE UPDATE:

- The Stars will not practice on Sunday, Dec. 3 before their flight to Tampa.

NOTES:

- Seven different players lit the lamp for the Stars in an 8-1 victory over the Tampa Bay Lightning.

- Captain **Jamie Benn** recorded a goal and two points (1-1—2) against Tampa Bay, giving him 17 points (5-12—17) in 22 GP overall.

- With 864 points (367-497—864) Benn is four points away from surpassing Neal Broten (274-593—867) for second place on the franchise's all-time points leader board.

- Forward **Joe Pavelski** (1-2—3) earned career assists No. 564 and 565 in his NHL career and passed **Craig Janney** (563) for sole possession of 14th place on the league's all-time list among U.S.-born players. At age 39, Pavelski - who has points in nine consecutive games (6-6—12) - owns the longest point streak in franchise history by a player at his age and the lengthiest by any NHL skater 39 or older since **Teemu Selanne** with the Ducks from Dec. 2-19, 2011 (3-10—13 in 9 GP).

- With 61 multi-point games since turning 35, Pavelski ranks second for the most by a U.S.-born player after that age. He now only trails Stars legend **Mike Modano** (63).

- Forward **Jason Robertson** (2-0—2) extended his point streak to a season-long five consecutive games with two goals. Robertson has seven points (3-4—7) over that span. He also has points in seven of his past eight (3-6—9) and in 13 of his past 16 games (7-11—18).

- With a goal and an assist against the Lightning, forward **Mason Marchment** recorded multiple points for the second game in a row (3-1—4). Marchment also extended his point streak to three consecutive games (3-2—5).
- Forward **Tyler Seguin** (1-0—1) scored his 41st career game-opening goal with Dallas to pass **Neal Broten** (40) and tie **Brenden Morrow** for ninth place on the franchise's all-time list. Seguin has points in each of this past three games (2-1—3) and 17 points (8-9—17) in 22 GP overall.
- Forward **Roope Hintz** tallied his fifth multi-point performance of the 2023-24 campaign with two assists (0-2—2).
- Defenseman **Thomas Harley** recorded his second career multi-point game with a goal and an assist (1-1—2). Harley continues to lead Stars defensemen in goals (5) and ranks second in points (5-3—8).
- Defenseman **Esa Lindell** picked up his first multi-point game of the season with two helpers (0-2—2) vs. the Lightning.
- Defenseman **Jani Hakanpää** registered his fourth career multi-point game with two assists (0-2—2) against Tampa Bay. His assists marked his first points of the 2023-24 season.
- Goaltender **Jake Oettinger** recorded 32 saves on 33 shots to improve his record this season to 10-4-2.
