PLAYER NOTES

- John Tavares scored for the Maple Leafs at 19:05 of the first period, posting his third goal of the postseason.
- Matthew Knies scored for Toronto at 10:12 of the second period. With his third goal of the 2025 Stanley Cup Playoffs, Knies set a new record for goals scored in a single postseason surpassing his previous career-high of two in 2024. Knies has scored in back-to-back games (2G). Per NHL Stats, "Knies scored his sixth career playoff goal and tied Steve Thomas for the fourth most by a Maple Leafs player age 22 or younger during the expansion era (since 1976-77), following Auston Matthews (12), Wendel Clark (11) and Russ Courtnall (8)... Knies (22 years, 191 days) became the youngest Maple Leafs player to score in a potential series-clinching game since Kent Manderville (22 years, 33 days) during Game 7 of the 1993 Division Finals vs St. Louis."
- Oliver Ekman-Larsson scored for the Maple Leafs at 14:31 of the third period, posting his second goal of the postseason. Per NHL Stats, "Ekman-Larsson scored his fourth goal in a potential series-clinching game, which tied Miro Heiskanen for the fourth most by an active defenseman. He trails Kris Letang (7), Victor Hedman (5) and Drew Doughty (5)."
- **William Nylander** recorded the primary assist on Tavares' goal and the primary assist on Ekman-Larsson's goal, improving to five assists recorded during the postseason. Nylander has recorded an assist in four-consecutive games (5A), marking the longest assist streak of his playoff career. Nylander marked the seventh multi-assist game of his playoff career and the 13th multi-point game of his playoff career.
- **Chris Tanev** registered the secondary assist on Tavares' goal, posting his first assist of the postseason. With the assist, Tanev recorded his first career postseason point as a Maple Leaf.
- **Mitch Marner** recorded the lone assist on Knies' goal, posting his sixth assist of the postseason. Marner has recorded an assist in four-consecutive games (6A).
- Jake McCabe posted the secondary assist on Ekman-Larsson's goal, recording his first assist of the postseason.
- Anthony Stolarz stopped 17 of 21 shots he faced in tonight's overtime loss.
- Jake McCabe was on the ice for a team-high 23 Toronto shot attempts-for at 5-on-5.
- William Nylander finished the game with a team-high 5-on-5 shot attempt percentage of 55.17 percent (16 for, 13 against).

TEAM NOTES

- Toronto owns an all-time record of 65-64-1 in playoff overtime decisions (26-29 on the road).
- The Maple Leafs were 0-for-4 on the power play and 1-for-2 on the penalty kill tonight.
