TOD LEIWEKE

Tod Leiweke is the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) for Seattle Hockey Partners. Leiweke is responsible for building a world-class NHL expansion team. He is also responsible for the redevelopment of the Arena at Seattle Center. This \$1.6B enterprise has been transformative to Seattle Center and is the largest private investment in the history of sports in Seattle. Prior to being appointed CEO in April 2018, Tod served as the NFL's Chief Operating Officer from 2015-2018; CEO of Tampa Bay Lightning from 2010-2015; CEO of Seattle Seahawks/Sounders from 2002-2010; President of Minnesota Wild from 1997-2002; Executive Director of The First Tee from 1994-1997; and Golden State Warriors from 1987-1994.



VICTOR DE BONIS

Victor de Bonis is the President of the Seattle Kraken and NHL Alternate Governor. De Bonis has been at the forefront of establishing the Seattle Kraken as the NHL's 32nd team and has led the strategic operations across the organization, including the Kraken Community Iceplex (KCI) and development of both Climate Pledge Arena and KCI. Prior to joining the Kraken as Chief Operating Officer in October of 2018, de Bonis worked for the Vancouver Canucks for 23 years, serving as the Chief Operating Officer (COO) from 2006 to 2016, and NHL Alternate Governor from 2009 to 2017.



ROB LAMPMAN

Rob Lampman is the Senior Vice President and Chief Operating Officer of the Seattle Kraken. As Chief Operating Officer, Rob oversees Seattle Kraken Business Operations and the Kraken Community Iceplex. He has worked in Sports & Entertainment for 25+ years. He previously served as Head of FIFA World Cup Operations and later Business Development for FIFA in Zurich before founding and operating Eiger Marketing Group.



RYAN BRACH EXECUTIVE VICE PRESIDENT, OVG GLOBAL PARTNERSHIPS

Ryan Brach has been a part of the team since 2018. As the EVP of Global Partnerships at Oak View Group, with 25 years of professional sports management experience, Ryan is responsible for managing multiple staffs and developing worldclass partnerships for all OVG Owned and Operated Arenas in the U.S. Currently, his primary focus is leading partnership strategy efforts for the Seattle Kraken and Climate Pledge Arena, New York Islanders and UBS Arena, Coachella Valley Firebirds and Acrisure Arena, Moody Center, home of Texas Longhorns Men's and Women's basketball teams, Mullett Arena, home of ASU Sun Devil Men's Hockey and CFG Bank Arena in Baltimore. He will also lead global partnership efforts for any future OVG Arena projects.

Chris Brumwell oversees broadcast and the Kraken Hockey Network, as well as the team's Communications and Media Relations strategies. He has worked in Sports & Entertainment for more than 25 years. He previously served as Vice President, Communications, Community and Social Impact for Canucks Sports and Entertainment. He has also held leadership roles with the Organizing Committee for the Vancouver 2010 Olympic and Paralympic Winter Games (VANOC) and lululemon athletica.



BILL CHAPIN SENIOR VICE PRESIDENT, SALES & SERVICE

Bill Chapin leads the ticket sales, premium hospitality and service team for both the Seattle Kraken and Climate Pledge Arena. Prior to joining the Seattle Kraken, he was the SVP of Business Operations at the Kansas City Chiefs. Over his career, he has held leadership roles in five different sports leagues (NHL, NFL, MLB, MLS & NBA) including time with the Seattle Seahawks, Seattle Sounders FC, Anaheim Ducks, Los Angeles Kings, San Diego Padres and LA Clippers, and Staples Center. He sits on the Board of Directors for Seattle Aquarium.



ALI DANIELS SENIOR VICE PRESIDENT, MARKETING

Ali Daniels joined the Kraken in 2024 as SVP, Marketing and leads the Marketing, Brand, and Game Presentation teams, focusing on cohesive brand expression and strategic direction. Previously, as CMO of Visit Seattle, she developed the city's brand identity through compelling storytelling, establishing it as a must-visit destination. Ali's expertise lies in integrating strategic insight with creative execution, ensuring that every initiative resonates with audiences.



MARI HORITA SENIOR VICE PRESIDENT, SOCIAL IMPACT & CIVIC AFFAIRS

Mari Horita is executive director of One Roof Foundation, the joint philanthropic arm of the Seattle Kraken and Climate Pledge Arena. In addition, she leads the organization's social impact, philanthropic, DEI and civic affairs work. Prior to joining the Kraken, Mari was President and CEO of ArtsFund, where she led the organization's strategic transition to better represent and serve the evolving population and arts community in the Puget Sound region. Mari began her professional career as a lawyer at Bogle & Gates, and later at Dorsey & Whitney and K&L Gates.



ERIC JAEGER SENIOR VICE PRESIDENT, FINANCE

Eric has worked for Climate Pledge Arena since 2019, playing a critical role in building out all key financial processes and systems. Prior to joining the arena, he led a finance team for a third party supporting the maintenance of facilities across Amazon's distribution network. Eric is a leader with over 20 years of experience across all significant accounting and finance functions, including accounting and reporting, financial planning & analysis, budgeting, treasury, market risk, cost accounting, and auditing. His broad industry experience includes facilities management, banking and financial services, technology, aerospace, consulting, and public accounting. He is a certified public accountant.



ROB JOHNSON SENIOR VICE PRESIDENT, TRANSPORTATION & SUSTAINABILITY

Rob Johnson manages sustainability for the Seattle Kraken and Climate Pledge Arena. Rob led the team that's secured the arena LEED Silver and ILFI Zero Carbon Certifications, eliminated front of house single use plastics, achieved the NHL's first zero waste season, and this year transitioned the arena to all reusable cups. Previously, Rob led the team that stood up the arena's transportation plan including offering subsidized transit passes for all publicly ticketed events. After a career as a transit advocate, Rob was elected to be the first councilmember from Seattle's Council District #4, a position he held from 2015 to 2019.



LANCE LOPES EXECUTIVE VICE PRESIDENT & GENERAL COUNSEL

Lance Lopes has been with the enterprise since December of 2016. After assisting on securing the right to build a new arena at Seattle Center, he became the first employee of the new NHL hockey franchise. In addition to his legal responsibilities, he led the effort to build the training facility for the team. He is now focused on development projects. He previously served as Senior Associate Athletic Director for the University of Washington, Executive Vice President and General Counsel for the Seattle Seahawks and Vice President and General Counsel of the Green Bay Packers.



STEVE MATTSON EXECUTIVE VICE PRESIDENT, OVG FACILITIES & GENERAL MANAGER

Steve Mattson joined Oak View Group in 2017 as EVP and General Manager for Climate Pledge Arena - Steve has full responsibility for the day-to-day management of 18,000-seat multi-purpose facility. Prior to joining OVG, Steve spent 27 years at Target Center in Minneapolis, the final 16 years as VP and General Manager of the City-owned venue.



KATY SEMTNER SENIOR VICE PRESIDENT, PEOPLE & CULTURE

Katy Semtner leads strategic human resources initiatives for the Seattle Kraken, including talent acquisition, compensation, benefits, and employee engagement. Drawing on over 25 years of experience in HR leadership across sports and hospitality, she has a proven track record of building people-first cultures. Before joining the Kraken, she served as Vice President of Human Resources for the Oklahoma City Thunder and Director of Human Resources for the Seattle Sonics & Storm. Her passion for creating a thriving and inclusive work environment continues to drive the Kraken's culture of excellence and innovation.



HEWAN TESHOME SENIOR VICE PRESIDENT, GENERAL COUNSEL

Hewan Teshome oversees commercial legal affairs, including policy matters, labor and employment and risk management, for the Seattle Kraken, Climate Pledge Arena and the One Roof Foundation. She joined from VICIS, a local sports technology company, and started her career as a corporate lawyer advising media and sports companies in New York. Hewan is proudly Seattle born and raised and holds a JD from Stanford Law School and BA from New York University.



KATIE TOWNSEND SENIOR VICE PRESIDENT & CHIEF COMMUNICATIONS OFFICER

Katie Townsend leads enterprise communications, strategic storytelling and crisis communications. Since joining the organization in 2019, she has guided the team through pivotal moments such as arena construction, team naming, and launching the team. Her efforts help drive organizational success through compelling narratives and reputation management. She previously worked for WE Communications with clients including Microsoft, The Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation and Volvo, following a successful career with the BBC as a senior news and sport producer.



KENDALL TYSON SENIOR VICE PRESIDENT, FINANCE & BUSINESS INTELLIGENCE

Kendall Tyson is responsible for overseeing the financial affairs, strategic planning, and data management of the Kraken and its affiliates. She brings financial and operational cross-industry expertise from her previous roles at Accenture, Topgolf and the LPGA. Kendall holds an MBA from Yale School of Management and bachelor's degrees from Emory University and Georgia Institute of Technology.



JEFF WEBSTER CHIEF COMMERCIAL OFFICER

Jeff Webster serves as Chief Commercial Officer for the Seattle Kraken and Climate Pledge Arena where he leads partnership sales and marketing, broadcast media partnerships, premium events, and retail merchandise verticals. His work also includes revenue oversight of the Kraken Hockey Network, Seattle Center, and key regional 3rd party clients within OVG's Global Partnerships division. Previously, Jeff was with AEG in Los Angeles, focused on revenue generation for some of the most iconic brands and venues in sports and entertainment. Over the course of his career, he has negotiated and led more than \$1 billion in deals spanning the NFL, NHL, NBA, MLS, motorsports, and live music. A Seattle-area native, Jeff holds a B.A. from Washington State University and dual master's degrees from Ohio University. He is proud to have taken part in launching a world class franchise in the city he calls home.



NICK VAEREWYCK SENIOR VICE PRESIDENT, PROGRAMMING AT CLIMATE PLEDGE ARENA

Nick Vaerewyck is the Senior Vice President of Programming at Climate Pledge Arena and is responsible for all strategic content programming of over 200 events annually including all concerts, family shows, sporting events, and private events, as well as facilitating the NHL hockey and WNBA basketball schedules at the facility. Nick has over 18 years of experience in arena programming with previous stops in Brooklyn, NY and Phoenix, AZ and is an active commissioner on the Seattle Music Commission.



RON FRANCIS **PRESIDENT OF HOCKEY OPERATIONS**

The 2025-26 season marks Francis' first as the Kraken's President after serving as the team's Executive Vice President and General Manager since its inception in 2019. Under his leadership, the Kraken quickly emerged as a competitive NHL franchise, including a memorable run to the second round of the Stanley Cup Playoffs in just their second season. A Hall-of-Fame player and seasoned executive, Francis previously held front-office roles, including GM of the Carolina Hurricanes and has been widely respected for his strategic vision, talent evaluation, and culture-building approach.

Francis is one of the most accomplished players in NHL history, ranking fifth all-time in points with 1,798 over a remarkable 23-season career. A two-time Stanley Cup champion with the Pittsburgh Penguins, Francis was inducted into the Hockey Hall of Fame in 2007 and both the Penguins and National Italian Sports Hall of Fame in 2025. He served as captain of the Hartford Whalers, Penguins, and Hurricanes and remains second all-time in assists (1,249) behind only Wayne Gretzky.



JASON BOTTERILL **GENERAL MANAGER**

In his first season as Seattle's General Manager, the 2025 offseason saw Botterill make notable additions to Seattle's roster including Mason Marchment, Ryan Lindgren, Freddy Gaudreau and Matt Murray, as well as signing a highly anticipated three-year deal with Kaapo Kakko. Botterill joined the Kraken as Assistant General Manager in 2021 during the inaugural season. Previously he was the General Manager of the Buffalo Sabres from 2017 to 2020 after spending a decade working for the Pittsburgh Penguins front office, helping construct a Penguins roster that would ultimately win three Stanley Cups (2009, 2016, 2017). He was part of the three-manager leadership team with Ron Francis for the silver medal-winning Team Canada squad at the 2019 IIHF World Championship. The former NHL left wing was selected by Dallas with the 20th overall pick in 1994 NHL Draft and went on to appear in 88 career regular-season games with Dallas, Atlanta, Calgary and Buffalo.



RICKY OLCZYK **VP & ASSISTANT GENERAL MANAGER**

Ricky O. enters his seventh season in the Vice President & Assistant General Manager roles with the Kraken and serves as the Kraken's lead expert on contract negotiations, managing the salary cap, and the NHL collective bargaining agreement. Previously, Olczyk was the Assistant GM to Ron Francis for four years in Carolina, where he played an integral role in transforming the player development system from the lower third to a top third team across the NHL. He was a driving force in founding Oklahoma City's AHL franchise when he was the Assistant GM for the Edmonton Oilers (seven seasons). At the 2016 World Cup, as Assistant GM he was a key member of the management team for Team Europe, which won silver after a tight best-of-three final vs. Canada.



ALEXANDRA MANDRYCKY **VP & ASSISTANT GENERAL MANAGER**

Entering her fourth season as Vice President and Assistant General Manager and seventh year with the organization, Mandrycky oversees the Kraken Amateur Scouting group and Research & Development team. Previously, Mandrycky worked for four seasons with the Minnesota Wild as a hockey operations analyst. The Atlanta native earned a B.S. in industrial engineering from Georgia Tech in 2013.



RYAN JANKOWSKI **VP & ASSISTANT GENERAL MANAGER**

Jankowski joins the Kraken as Vice President and Assistant General Manager after spending the 2024-25 season as the Utah Mammoth's Associate Director of Amateur Scouting. He held the same role with the Arizona Coyotes from 2020-24. Jankowski's NHL experience includes seven years with the New York Islanders, four of which as an assistant GM (2006-10). During his time as assistant GM, Jankowski oversaw amateur scouting and player development. He joined the Islanders at the start of the 2002-03 season as a Western Scout. After one season in that role, he became the club's director of European scouting for three seasons before he was elevated to assistant GM. Jankowski spent three seasons (2010-13) with the Montreal Canadiens as an amateur scout and three seasons (2017-20) with the Buffalo Sabres as director of amateur scouting. The Calgary, Alberta, native also spent four years (2013-17) in several roles with Hockey Canada, including head scout and director of player personnel. Prior to working in the NHL, Jankowski served as a scout for the Spokane Chiefs of the Western Hockey League (WHL) from 1997-2003, covering the entire Alberta province.



LANE LAMBERT **HEAD COACH**

Lambert joins the Kraken after serving as the Toronto Maple Leafs' assistant coach in 2024. He previously served as head coach of the New York Islanders from 2022 to 2024, compiling a 61-46-20 record and leading the team to the Stanley Cup Playoffs in 2023. Before becoming head coach, Lambert was the Islanders' associate coach from 2018 to 2022. From 2014 to 2018, he was an assistant coach with the Washington Capitals, including during their 2018 Stanley Cup championship season. He held the same role with the Nashville Predators from 2011 to 2014.

Lambert's teams have advanced to the second round or better eight times, highlighted by a Stanley Cup championship in 2018 with the Washington Capitals. Over that span, Lambert's been behind the bench for 21 playoff series. During his time as an assistant coach with the Caps (2014-18), the team also won the Presidents' Trophy for the best overall record twice in a row (2015-16 & 2016-17). In 14 seasons as a coach in the NHL, Lambert's teams have made the playoffs 10 times.

Lambert's coaching resume includes six seasons in the American Hockey League (AHL). During his time with the Milwaukee Admirals as an assistant coach (2006-07) and head coach (2007-11), he led the club to two West Division titles (2008-09 and 2010-11). He also served as an assistant coach for the Bridgeport Sound Tigers during the 2005-06 campaign.

Before coaching at the professional level, Lambert worked in the Western Hockey League (WHL) as an assistant coach with the Moose Jaw Warriors (2002-03 to midseason of 2003-04) and head coach of the Prince George Cougars (2003-05).

Originally selected by the Detroit Red Wings with the 25th overall pick in the 1983 NHL Draft, Lambert went on to play 283 career regular-season NHL games with the Red Wings, New York Rangers and Quebec Nordiques, recording 124 points (58g/66a). Lambert won an AHL Calder Cup with the Adirondack Red Wings in 1986 and helped the Houston Aeros win the IHL's Turner Cup Championship in 1999.



AARON SCHNEEKLOTH **ASSISTANT COACH**

Schneekloth joins Seattle as a veteran of over 600 games as a player during his career, spending time in the AHL, ECHL, and CHL. After playing collegiate hockey at the University of North Dakota, he began his pro career in 2001 and went on to have significant stints with teams including the St. John's Maple Leafs, Houston Aeros, and ultimately the Colorado Eagles, where he played from 2006 until his retirement in 2013. Following his playing career, Schneekloth joined the Eagles' coaching staff as an assistant and was named head coach in 2016. In his two seasons as head coach, he led the team to back-to-back Kelly Cup championships in 2017 and 2018 before the franchise transitioned to the AHL.



CHRIS TAYLOR **ASSISTANT COACH**

Taylor joins the Kraken from the New Jersey Devils after serving as an assistant coach with the team for five seasons from 2020 to 2025, helping lead the team to two playoff appearances. He began his coaching career in 2011, becoming Rochester's development coach in his first year, then assistant coach through 2016. In August 2016, he joined the AHL's Wilkes-Barre/Scranton Penguins as an assistant before being named the Americans' head coach in June 2017, a post he held through June 2020, compiling a 116-65-33 record over three seasons and earning two playoff appearances. Taylor's playing career spanned from 1992 to 2011 across the NHL, AHL, IHL, and Europe. Drafted 27th overall by the New York Islanders in 1990, he appeared in 149 NHL games with the Islanders, Boston Bruins, and Buffalo Sabres and tallied over 600 AHL games, most notably in Rochester, where he ranks top five in assists, points, and games played.



JESSICA CAMPBELL ASSISTANT COACH

Campbell enters her second season with the Kraken as an assistant coach after becoming the first full-time female assistant coach in NHL history to work behind the bench during the regular season. Prior to the NHL, she spent two seasons on the Coachella Valley Firebirds' coaching staff, helping the team lead the AHL in goals (252) in 2023-24 and reach the Calder Cup Finals in consecutive seasons. Prior to her tenure with Coachella Valley, Campbell worked as an assistant coach and skills coach for the Nürnberg Ice Tigers of the DEL, the top men's professional league in Germany, during the 2021-22 season. On an international level, Campbell served as an assistant coach for Team Germany at the 2022 IIHF World Championship.

Campbell played four seasons (2010-11 to 2013-14) of collegiate hockey at Cornell University, captaining the team in her senior year, before making her professional debut for the Calgary Inferno. She represented Canada in international competition in several tournaments including the IIHF U18 World Junior Championships in 2009 and 2010 and the IIHF World Championship in 2015.



COLIN ZULIANELLO GOALTENDING COACH

Zulianello joins Seattle from the Coachella Valley Firebirds, where he served as goaltending coach from 2022 to 2025. In Coachella Valley, he worked closely with Seattle goaltender Joey Daccord and Kraken prospect goalie Nikke Kokko. Zulianello's playing career included four seasons at Colorado College (1997-2001) before turning pro and competing in the ECHL and AHL, with stops including the Peoria Rivermen, Toledo Storm, and Springfield Falcons. After retiring from playing in 2005, Zulianello began his coaching career at Lakehead University, where he served as the goaltending coach from 2008 to 2016. He then moved into professional coaching roles, joining the AHL's Stockton Heat as a goaltending coach from 2016 to 2019 as part of the Calgary Flames organization.



TIM OHASHI VIDEO COACH

Ohashi returns for his fourth season with the Kraken. He began as an intern with the Washington Capitals' coaching staff in 2014. Then-head coach Barry Trotz created and offered Ohashi a full-time video analyst role for the 2015-16 season. He also won a Stanley Cup as a member of the Capitals' coaching staff in 2018.

Fun Facts: He played club hockey at Bates College in Lewiston, ME. Avid fan of baseball, board games, and crosswords. Wife grew up in Bellevue, WA.



ADAM PURNER VIDEO COACH

Purner began his career in the Western Hockey League (WHL) as video coach for the Portland Winterhawks in 2015-16. He spent five seasons with the Winterhawks before moving to the American Hockey League (AHL) in 2020-21, joining the Binghamton Devils. In 2021 he won a silver medal in the World Championships with Team USA's women's squad. Purner continued his AHL career for five seasons, with stints at both the Utica Comets (2021-22) and the Hershey Bears (2022 to 2025). He played a key role in helping the Bears capture back-to-back Calder Cup championships in 2023 and 2024. This season marks his first with the Kraken and as a video coach in the NHL.



JUSTIN RAI HEAD OF PLAYER STRATEGY

Rai joined the Kraken in 2022-23 as a member of the player development staff before becoming the Head of Player Strategy. Prior to Seattle, Rai spent three seasons (2019 to 2022) with the Coquitlam Express of the British Columbia Hockey League (BCHL) as a skills and assistant coach. His playing career includes three years with BCHL Prince George Spruce Kings (2012-2015) where he added 102 points (47g/55a) in 116 games and college hockey at the University of Maine and University of British Columbia.





CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- Signed a seven-year contract (\$7.14m AAV) with Seattle on Aug. 20, 2024.
- Amassed 43 points (20g/23a) in 2024-25, the first NHL season where he appeared in all 82 games.
- His goals, points and assists ranked fourth, fifth and eight, respectively among all Kraken skaters in 2024-25.
- Finished the 2024-25 campaign ranked fourth in shots on the roster and one shy of matching his career-high of 148, which included registering a single-game career high of seven shots against Anaheim on Nov. 27, 2024.
- Set career highs in faceoff wins (569) and total faceoffs (1,194), ranking second among all Kraken skaters in each category in 2024-25.
- Had a single-game career high 17 faceoff wins on Jan. 28, 2025.
- Won all eight of his faceoffs against Colorado on Oct. 22, 2024, marking his single-game career-best faceoff win percentage in games where he took eight or fewer faceoffs.
- Matched his single-game career high of three points twice; Oct. 24, 2024 vs. Winnipeg and March 26, 2025 vs. Anaheim.
- Tallied six points (2g/4a) in a four-game point streak from Oct. 24 to 31, 2024, his first of two such point streaks in 2024-25.
- Netted goals in three straight games from Dec. 28 to Jan. 2, 2025.
- Posted seven multi-point efforts which ranks fifth among all Kraken skaters.
- Appeared in his 200th career NHL game on Dec. 17, 2024 at Ottawa.
- Finished the 2023-24 season ranked sixth on the Kraken in scoring, totaling 37 points (15g/22a) in 77 regular-season games.
- Set a career high with six power-play goals and 13 power-play points in 2023-24, both of which ranked fourth on Seattle's roster.
- Became the first draft pick in franchise history and the third player from the 2021 NHL Draft to appear in 100 regular-season NHL games when he did so on Oct. 30, 2023 against Tampa Bay.
- Recorded his 100th career point with a goal at Anaheim on April 5, 2024, making him the sixth player and the first draft pick in franchise history to total 100 points with the Kraken. He also became the second player from the 2021 NHL Draft Class to reach the 100-point milestone.
- Won the Calder Memorial Trophy as the NHL's top rookie and earned NHL All-Rookie honors in 2022-23.
- Finished the 2022-23 season leading all rookies in goals (24, tied), points (57) and even-strength points (46) and ranked second among first-year players with 33 assists and four game-winning goals. He was the youngest player in the NHL that season to total at least 50 points.
- Ranked in the top five on Seattle's roster in 2022-23 in goals (second), assists (fourth), points (fourth), power-play goals (four, tied fifth) and even-strength points (46, fourth).
- Finished the 2022-23 season having been assessed just one penalty for two minutes, leading the league in points and games played among players with two or fewer penalty minutes.
- Became just the 13th player in NHL history and second in the last 32 years to total 57 or more points and have two or fewer penalty minutes in a season. Was also the first-ever rookie to accomplish this feat and the fourth player in NHL history to play in 80 or more games and have two or fewer penalty minutes.
- Was selected to play in the 2023 NHL All-Star Game but had to withdraw due to injury. At the time, his selection made him the first player from the 2021 draft class to earn an All-Star nod. It also made him the youngest player and first rookie to be selected to play in an NHL All-Star game since Vancouver's Quinn Hughes in 2020.
- Had an assist vs. Vegas on Oct. 15, 2022, which made him the seventh rookie in NHL history to record a point in at least 12 of his first 13 career games according to NHL Stats.
- Scored the first overtime goal of his career to extend his point streak to a career-best six games vs. Washington on Dec. 1, 2022. The goal came seven seconds into overtime, the fastest overtime goal in franchise history. According to NHL Stats, it was also the fastest goal by a rookie from the start of a regular-season overtime in NHL history.
- Scored a goal in five consecutive games, a career best, from Jan. 3, 2023 at Edmonton to Jan. 10, 2023 at Buffalo. His five-game goal streak made him the first player in franchise history and the only rookie in 2022-23 to score in five consecutive games.
- Had six goals during the Seattle's seven-game road trip in January of 2023, which tied for the fourth-most by a rookie in NHL history during a road trip of at least seven games according to NHL Stats.
- Finished Seattle's 2022-23 playoff run with seven points (3g/4a) in 14 postseason games, leading all rookies in playoff points and assists and tying for second in goals.
- His 54.3 percent Corsi rating during the 2022-23 postseason led all Seattle skaters according to Natural Stat Trick.
- When he was on the ice during 5-on-5 play during the 2023 Stanley Cup Playoffs, the Kraken outscored their opponents 12-4 according to Natural Stat Trick. His plus-eight goal differential at 5-on-5 tied for the team lead and tied for 15th among all NHL skaters.

- Posted a 27-23-5 record in 57 regular-season games with the Kraken in 2024-25, finishing the season with a .906 save percentage, 2.75 goal-against average and two shutouts.



- Enters the 2025-26 season ranked in the top four in career goals (75, third), assists (211, fourth) and points (286, fourth) by defensemen selected in the 2015 NHL Draft.
- Appeared in 62 regular season games in 2024-25, recording the third most points (39) in a season during his NHL career.

The Slack channel is also how the media can submit interview requests, specifically for post-practice and game scrums. Please reach out to a member of the Kraken PR staff to be added to the media Slack if you are not already.

HOME PRACTICES

If in Seattle, the Kraken will typically practice at 10:30 a.m. local time, unless it is a day after a game, in which they will practice at 11 a.m. All home practices will take place at Kraken Community Iceplex unless specified otherwise. The length of practice varies depending on the day and can last anywhere from 30 minutes to an hour.

Sharing line combinations, injury updates, photos and videos from practice is all permissible.

Head Coach Lane Lambert and Kraken players will be made available to the media after practice in the team's locker room. Media members are encouraged to go to the locker room as soon as the first player leaves the ice. Any requests for one-on-one interviews should be made as far advance as possible to ensure a greater chance they can be fulfilled.

The Kraken PR staff will take requests for players, but the media is not limited to speaking with just those players while in the locker room. Every player in the locker room is available to be interviewed unless otherwise specified by the Kraken PR staff.

MORNING SKATE - HOME GAMES

The Kraken will hold a morning skate prior to each home game at 10:15 a.m. at Climate Pledge Arena. If the game is on the second day of a back-to-back, the Kraken may not hold a morning skate and will instead hold media availability in the early evening prior to that night's game at Climate Pledge Arena.

The media is encouraged to arrive at CPA by 9:45 a.m. local time in the event that morning skate is optional. A member of the Kraken PR staff will communicate if a skate is optional to the media as soon as it has been decided on. Head Coach Lane Lambert and players will be made available to the media at the conclusion of morning skate or after their team meeting if morning skate is optional. Morning skate media availabilities will be held in the locker room at Kraken Community Iceplex.

Media requests - whether for a scrum or a one-on-one - should be made to Kraken no later than 10 a.m. local time to ensure that all requests can be fulfilled. Please note that media requests on a game day should be limited to questions/content for that night's game only. Any requests for non-game day content should be made on practice days.

POSTGAME - HOME GAMES

A member of the Kraken PR staff will reach out to the media during the third period to take scrum requests. Requests can be adjusted up until the end of the game but may be more difficult the later the request is made. Postgame media availability for players and Coach Lambert will be held in the main locker room at CPA. Similarly, to morning skates, questions the games. One-on-ones will not be permitted during postgame media.

VISITING TEAM MEDIA

Visiting teams will hold morning skates at CPA at 11:30 a.m. Morning skates may be optional or cancelled, especially if the team is playing the second game of a back-to-back. Please note that with the Kraken skating at a different venue, there is a high chance some visiting teams may elect to skate early, and any schedule questions should go to the visiting team's PR department to ensure accuracy. Visiting teams can change their schedule at a moment's notice, so it is best to reach out directly to that team.

Media requests for the visiting team should be made directly to that team's PR department. Please reach out to Kraken PR or visit the NHL's media site if you need their contact info.

CREDENTIALS

Media members who do not have a season credential can request a single-game credential by visiting the Kraken press site. Credentials will be approved based on need and availability in the press box. Media members will be notified if their credential request has been approved 48 hours before the game.

If approved, credentials can be picked up the day of the game at the Climate Pledge Arena media entrance. The media entrance is located at the southwest corner of CPA, just north of Alaska Airlines Atrium, and is open from 8 a.m. until 8:30 p.m. Please note that these times may change in the event that the game does not have a 7 p.m. start time. Media will not be permitted to enter the building after 8:30 p.m. unless specifically approved by a member of the Kraken PR staff.

Please reach out to a member of the Kraken PR staff if you need a single-day credential for a practice or other Kraken event.

If you have a season credential, we ask that you RSVP to each game so we can plan for your attendance. RSVP forms will be sent out by a Kraken PR staff member.

KRAKEN ROAD GAMES

One member of the Kraken PR staff will travel with the team when they are on the road. All media requests that pertain to the road trip can be made through them.

Times and locations for Kraken road practices may vary depending on the day and arena availability. Media for practices, morning skates and postgame will be held in the visiting locker room of the home building. The traveling PR rep. will coordinate with traveling media for all requests.

If you plan to cover a Kraken road game, please notify Kyle Shohara and he will include you with our team credential requests.

GAME NOTES

The team's game notes will be sent out the evening prior to every game, unless the team is playing a back-to-back, in which case they will be sent out after the conclusion of the first game. 

ACCESS TO PLAY

But while all kids want to play, the opportunity to participate is largely dictated by zip code, household income, and primary language spoken at home. One Roof Foundation and the Seattle Kraken leverage our resources to break down barriers to all forms of sport so that all kids can play. We aim to ensure all children can participate in sports by funding multisport courts, donating equipment, and providing financial assistance for on-ice programming. ENDING YOUTH HOMELESSNESS

2,000 Seattle Public School Students are currently experiencing homelessness.

No one grows up wanting to be homeless. In Washington alone over 40,000 public school students were homeless or facing housing insecurity last year. Founded in 1974, YouthCare was one of the first shelters to serve runaway and homeless youth on the West Coast. YouthCare now provides shelter, housing, education, and employment training to over 1,500 deserving young people a year so that they have the hope, skills, and self-confidence needed to thrive. One Roof Foundation, Seattle Kraken, and Climate Pledge Arena raise funds for YouthCare, amplify YouthCare's message to our fans and the broader community, and provide job training, internships, and employment opportunities at our different facilities, to help move the needle in the fight against youth homelessness.

ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE

Youth in Seattle's Duwamish Valley are 3x more likely to be hospitalized with asthma than in other Seattle neighborhoods.

Low income and predominantly BIPOC neighborhoods in our region face a higher degree of environmental risk factors such as proximity to polluted waterways, busy highways, and industrial sites. The negative impacts are compounded by the lack of adequate access to safe fields, courts, and open spaces. One Roof Foundation partners with, supports, and elevates the voices of communities disproportionately impacted by climate change by providing learning opportunities for youth, investing in capital projects, supporting families displaced by flooding, funding events and capacity building programs, and conducting neighborhood cleanups.



BROADCAST INFORMATION

KRAKEN HOCKEY NETWORK

The Kraken Hockey Network (KHN) enters its second year of broadcasting every regional game for the Seattle Kraken. KHN produces and distributes games over the air on KING 5, KONG and select TEGNA, Gray, Cox and Morgan Murphy TV stations, and via streaming on Prime Video. Games are available to fans in Washington, Oregon, Alaska, Montana and Idaho.

KHN is owned and operated by the Seattle Kraken organization which allows fans to get closer to the action than ever before thanks to 13 operated cameras, five super slo-mo replay angles, an advanced stats graphic system, and custom graphics packages. There is more behind-the-scenes access, a new studio, pregame shows, intermission features and postgame analysis that dive deeper into the storylines about the players, coaches and Kraken personalities as they embark on their pursuit for victories throughout the NHL season.

Kraken fans enjoy some of the best and most recognizable talent in the NHL on KHN broadcasts. Games feature play-by-play from John Forslund and analysis from Eddie Olczyk and JT Brown. Piper Shaw is KHN's rink side reporter. Pregame, intermissions and postgame shows include host Ian Furness and analysis from Alison Lukan and Brett Festerling.

HOW FANS CAN WATCH KRAKEN GAMES

KHN will produce and broadcast more than 70 non-nationally exclusive Kraken preseason and regular season games plus the first round of the playoffs, including pre- and postgame shows.

Prime Video will stream all non-nationally televised games for Prime members in Washington, Oregon, Alaska, Montana and Idaho, which will include preseason, regular season and the first round of playoffs. The Kraken are the first NHL team to partner directly with the streamer.

In addition, the games will be carried over-the-air in the Seattle region on TEGNA's KONG, with at least 15 games simulcast on TEGNA's NBC affiliate, KING 5. Fans outside of Seattle will see the games on TEGNA stations KREM-KSKN, the CBS affiliate in Spokane, Wash.; KAPP-KVEU, the ABC affiliate in Yakima and Tri-Cities, Wash.; KGW, the NBC affiliate in Portland, Ore.; KEVU & KLSR, the MyNet affiliates in Eugene, Ore.; and Gray Media's KAUU in Anchorage, Ala. & KYEX in Juneau, Ala.

KING 5 also airs a weekly 30-minute Kraken magazine show called Kraken Home Ice, featuring host Paul Silvi. The show features deep storylines and exclusive interviews with Kraken players, management and coaches.

Fans can also tune into Kraken games on the iHeart Kraken Audio Network on 99.3 KJR, with hosts Everett Fitzhugh and Al Kinisky, plus pre- and postgame coverage with Mike Benton. Viewing and listing information can be found at seattlekraken.com/broadcast.

JOHN FORSLUND

John Forslund is the play-by-play announcer for the Seattle Kraken's TV broadcasts on The Kraken Hockey Network and is known for coining the iconic phrase "That's Kraken Hockey, Baby!" He joined the Kraken during their inaugural season in 2021 after spending 25 years as the voice of the Carolina Hurricanes/Hartford Whalers. He also currently serves as the play-by-play voice for NHL on TNT and SportsUSA NHL Radio and is the lead voice for Amazon Prime's Monday Night Hockey.

During his tenure with the Hurricanes, Forslund was named the North Carolina Sportscaster of the Year by the National Sports Media Association in both 2018 and 2019. In addition to his responsibilities with the Hurricanes, Forslund also served as the play-by-play announcer for ESPN National Hockey Night, NHL on Versus, NBCSN and NBC Sports. His broadcasting career has also seen him call ACC and SEC men's basketball games on Fox Sports Net. Before joining the Hurricanes, he was the voice of the AHL's Springfield Indians, winning the 1989 Ken McKenzie Award for the AHL's Top Publicist/Broadcaster.



EDDIE OLCZYK

Eddie Olczyk serves as one of the Kraken's TV color analysts and also appears on national game broadcasts for TNT as the network's lead analyst.

Prior to coming to the Kraken, he spent 15 seasons with the Chicago Blackhawks as their TV color analyst. Before joining the broadcast booth, Olczyk spent 16 seasons in the NHL playing for the Chicago Blackhawks, Toronto Maple Leafs, Winnipeg Jets (now Utah Hockey Club), New York Rangers, Los Angeles Kings and Pittsburgh Penguins. He was a member of the Rangers 1994 Stanley Cup-winning team and was inducted in the United States Hockey Hall of Fame in 2012.



JT BROWN

JT Brown is a TV color analyst for all Kraken broadcasts. Brown has been in the booth with John Forslund going back to the Kraken's inaugural season in 2021.

Brown previously spent 11 seasons as a collegiate and professional hockey player, recording 72 points (23 goals, 49 assists) in 365 career NHL regular season games with Tampa Bay, Anaheim and Minnesota. Prior to turning pro, he played two seasons with the University of Minnesota-Duluth Bulldogs, where he won the 2011 National Championship and was named the Frozen Four's Most Outstanding Player. Today he is a member of the NHL's Player Inclusion Coalition.



PIPER SHAW

Piper Shaw has served as rinkside reporter for the Seattle Kraken since the inaugural season.

Before coming to Seattle, Shaw served as a reporter, host, and content producer for Wisconsin Badger Hockey on Fox Sports Wisconsin for three seasons. She also covered high school sports for the network, in addition to broadcasting a variety of college athletics for the Big East Conference on BEDN, NBC Sports Chicago, and FS1. Shaw began her broadcasting career as a news reporter at WMTV NBC15 News in Madison, WI.



ALISON LUKAN

Alison Lukan is a full-time color analyst for the Kraken and has been with the broadcast since the inaugural season. She became an instant hit with fans for her clever and easy-to-understand use of data.

Lukan also contributes to Kraken digital channels and for the Seattle Kraken app. Before her time with the Kraken organization, Lukan covered the NHL, the Columbus Blue Jackets and Ohio State men's and women's hockey for The Athletic while also spending time with Fox Sports Ohio.



BRETT FESTERLING

Brett Festerling is a studio analyst for select KHN broadcasts, joining Ian Furness and Alison Lukan at the desk for pre-game, intermissions and post-game shows.

Festerling spent over a decade as a professional defenceman, including 88 games in the NHL with the Anaheim and Winnipeg, registering eight assists and 35 penalty minutes. He played major-junior hockey in the WHL with the Tri-City Americans and the Vancouver Giants, where he served as captain in his final season and led the Giants to the club's first Memorial Cup in 2007. Beyond the NHL, Festerling had an extensive pro career in the AHL and in Germany. Festerling brings his experience as a player into his broadcasting role, offering his insights from a player's perspective.



IAN FURNESS

Ian Furness joins the KHN team as a host after being a fixture in Seattle Sports Media for almost two decades. His on-air career began as the voice of the Seattle Thunderbirds before he moved to the same role with the Tri-City Americans. In total, he's served as announcer for over 1500 games in the American Hockey League, International Hockey League and Western Hockey League.

Born and raised in Seattle, Furness has covered the Seahawks, Trailblazers and Kraken and hosts a daily Seattle sports radio show on KJR 93.3.

KJR RADIO BROADCAST TEAM



EVERETT FITZHUGH

Everett Fitzhugh is the play-by-play announcer for the Kraken's radio broadcasts on KJR. Prior to coming to Seattle, Fitzhugh spent five seasons with the Cincinnati Cyclones of the East Coast Hockey League, a developmental pro league for the NHL. During that time, he held the dual role as the Cyclones' director of media relations and broadcasting.

In addition to his role in Cincinnati, Fitzhugh served as a guest-broadcaster in his first NHL game for the Washington Capitals. He also was part of the broadcast crew for the 2018 CCM/ECHL All-Star Classic. During the Kraken's inaugural season, Fitzhugh joined J.T. Brown in the booth to become part of the first all-Black broadcast team for an NHL game.



AL KINISKY

Al Kinisky, who provides color commentary on the Kraken's radio broadcast, brings four decades of hockey experience as a player, coach, and color commentator to KJR. Originally born and raised in the Vancouver, BC area, Kinisky has lived in the Seattle area for over three decades where he and his wife have raised their two boys.

He first came to Seattle to play for the Seattle Thunderbirds in 1989 after spending a year in Northern Saskatchewan playing for the Nipawin Hawks. With the Thunderbirds, he totaled 83 points (27 goals, 56 assists) in 149 regular-season games. In 1990, he was drafted by the Philadelphia Flyers in the 3rd round, 52nd overall.

On October 1, 2022, the Seattle Kraken introduced the newest member of the team to fans: Buoy, a six-foot-tall blue sea troll and the official Kraken mascot.

ABOUT BUOY

- Buoy is a sea troll from Seattle, who lives in the caverns of Climate Pledge Arena.
- Buoy loves hockey and people, not necessarily in that order.
- Buoy eats lots of different foods but shark with a sprig of maple leaf is the ultimate meal.
- Other than cheering on the Kraken, Buoy's next favorite thing is music. *It's said that Buoy once jammed with Mudhoney at the Crocodile!!*
- People are drawn to Buoy's fun-loving spirit, funky dance moves, skating talents and endless energy.
- Sometimes you can find Buoy trekking along the Burke Gillman trail and making a quick detour to visit the Fremont Troll, Buoy's uncle.
- We believe Buoy previously met the deep-sea creature from which our name originates. There is a touch of Kraken magic in Buoy's hockey flow.
