- On Saturday, April 12, goaltender Carter George recorded a 33-save shutout in his professional debut against the San Jose • Barracuda. Forward **Reilly Walsh** (2-1=3) notched a season-high three points to help the Reign to the 4-0 victory.
- On Monday, April 14, forward Koehn Ziemmer was reassigned to the Ontario Reign. Ziemmer, 20, scored 71 points (37-34=71) • in 61 regular season games for the Prince George Cougars (WHL) and added seven points (3-4=7) in as many playoff contests. He totaled before adding three goals and four helpers in the postseason. Ziemmer exits his junior hockey career as Prince George's all-time leading goal-scorer, posting 128 goals in 244 regular season games played over parts of six seasons.

- Forward Ryan Conmy led the University of New Hampshire in points, finishing the season with 33 (15-18=33) in 34 games. After recording an 11-game point streak with six goals and eight assists for 14 points (Nov. 9-Jan. 4) en route to setting new career highs in his sophomore season, Conmy was named to the Hobey Baker Ballot for the second consecutive occasion.
- Goaltender Hampton Slukynsky finished his freshman season at Western Michigan University tied for the seventh lowest goals
 against average (GAA) with a 1.92 over 23 appearances on the campaign.



- Forward Liam Greentree finished the regular season third in the Ontario Hockey League (OHL) in total points (49-70=119) behind only teammate Ilya Protas (50-74=124) and Saginaw's Michael Misa (62-72=134).
- Through 189 regular season games played, Greentree's 254 career points (110-144=254), the Spitfires' captain are the seventh most in franchise history. He is one of three Windsor players to have recorded at least 250 career points for the team since the year 2000, joining Ryan Ellis (73-240=313), who played 226 games from 2007-2011, and Taylor Hall (123-157=280), who wore a Spitfires sweater for 183 contests from 2007-2010.
- Goaltender Carter George maintained a .909 SV% through 47 appearances on the year, the seventh best among 43 OHL goalies with at least 10 regular season games played.

- Goaltender Hampton Slukynsky made 24 saves to help Western Michigan win their first ever NCAA National Championship in hockey, just the second national title in the school's history. Slukynsky was named to the Frozen Four All-Tournament Team and is the first freshman goaltender to backstop a team to the national title since 2009, when Kieran Millan did so for the Boston University Terriers.
- On Monday, April 14, Denver Pioneers forward Jared Wright signed a two-year entry-level contract with the Kings.

- Forward Liam Greentree has posted 24 points (14-10=24) through eight games played in the OHL Playoffs, tied with teammate Ilya Protas (4-20=24) for the most among all skaters this post-season.
- Greentree broke a Windsor Spitfires record by factoring on all six of his clubs' goals in their 6-3 victory over the Kitchener Rangers on Monday, April 14.
- Greentree's five goals and one assist mark the the second time in Spitfires history that one player has tallied more than three goals in a playoff game, joining Ernie Godden (4G on March 24, 1981 in Brantford). Per OHL PR, Greentree is the first player to net five goals since Connor McDavid did so almost exactly a decade ago on April 10, 2015 against the London Knights.
