# FLAMES LAST GAME RECAP December 28, 2024 – CALGARY FLAMES [3] vs. SAN JOSE SHARKS [1]

Game Summary | Event Summary

The Calgary Flames began a back-to-back set last night at the SAP Center against the San Jose Sharks. The Flames would outshoot the Sharks 17-7 in the opening frame, culminating in Jonathan Huberdeau giving the road side a 1-0 edge through 20. In the second, both teams traded blows with Macklin Celebrini drawing the Sharks level, before captain Mikael Backlund restored the Flames lead, as Calgary held a 2-1 advantage through 40. In the third, Dustin Wolf shut the Sharks down, turning aside all eight shots he faced while Huberdeau added an empty netter for his second of the night to give Calgary a 3-1 win.

## **TONIGHTS STORYLINES & STATS**

This is the second of four meetings this season between the Flames and Golden Knights. Calgary fell 5-0 in their first meeting with Vegas on October 28<sup>th</sup>.

This is a Pacific Division matchup; the Flames have a record of 4-3-1 against Pacific Division teams and a record of 9-6-2 against Western Conference opponents.

#### **HUNGRY LIKE THE WOLF:**

Dustin Wolf turned aside 21 of the 22 shots he faced last night in San Jose to earn his 19<sup>th</sup> career win which ties him with Collin Delia for the second most by a California-born goaltender in NHL history. Wolf earned his 11th victory of the season to extend his League lead for most among rookie goaltenders.

#### **HUBY DOO:**

With two goals in last night's win in San Jose, Jonathan Huberdeau scored his 41st and 42nd goal for the Flames since being acquired prior to the start of the 2022-23 campaign, passing Mikael Backlund (41) for the third-most on the team in that span. Only Nazem Kadri (66) and Blake Coleman (56) have more. Huberdeau has also notched the game-opening goal in back-to-back outings, and is tied with a league-leading four game-opening goals through the month of December (Dec. 8 at DAL, Dec. 12 vs. TBL, Dec. 21 vs. CHI, Dec. 28 at SJS)

#### LOOK BACKS AT IT:

With his goal last night in San Jose, Mikael Backlund scored his 207<sup>th</sup> marker in Flames colours to surpass Eric Vail (206) for the 10<sup>th</sup>-most in Flames franchise history. Backlund now joins Kent Nilsson as the second Swedish-born skater in the top 10 in Flames scoring. Backlund also scored the 103<sup>rd</sup> road goal of his career, and in do so, he passed Lanny McDonald for the fifth-most road goals in Flames franchise history. The only skaters to have more are: Jarome Iginla (257), Theoren Fleury (159), Joe Nieuwendyk (133), and Gary Roberts (109).

#### **BACK-TO-BACKS:**

The Flames are set to finish-off their fourth back-to-back set tonight in Vegas following last night's 3-1 win in San Jose. Calgary has a record of 3-1-0 in game one of back-to-back scenarios, and a record of 1-2-0 in game two of back-to-back scenarios. The Flames next back-to-back set will come in the New Year when they face Anaheim at the Honda Center on January 7<sup>th</sup>, before heading to Crypto.com Arena to meet the Kings on January 8<sup>th</sup>.

### **CALGARY VEGAS TIES:**

On March 6<sup>th</sup>, 2024 the Calgary Flames acquired a first-round pick in the 2026 NHL Draft, a conditional third-round pick in the 2024 NHL Draft (Kirill Zarubin) and defenseman Daniil Miromanov from Vegas in exchange for Noah Hanifin in a three-way deal involving Philadelphia. Hanifin spent six years with Calgary, skating in 420 games with 42 goals and 149 assists for 191 points. Miromanov has skated in 48 games so far through his Calgary Flames tenure, scoring four goals and nine assists for 13 points.

Flames defenceman Brayden Pachal was claimed off waivers by Calgary from Vegas on February 4<sup>th</sup>, 2024 and has skated in all 35 games for the Flames so far this season. Golden Knights centre Cole Schwindt was claimed off waivers by Vegas from Calgary earlier this year. Schwindt skated in four games with the Flames during the 2023-24 season. Fellow Golden Knights forward Brett Howden was born in Calgary and has skated in 13 prior games against his hometown team.

# **INTERIM COACH:**

Due to family reasons, on December 8th, Brad Larsen was granted an indefinite leave of absence from his duties as assistant coach with the Flames. Wranglers Head Coach Trent Cull will join the Flames as an assistant coach for the unforeseeable future. Cull is in his second season as bench boss with the Wranglers. Having coached in the AHL for 15 years, Cull was also an assistant coach with the Vancouver Canucks during the 2022-23 campaign.

## **WORLD JUNIOR WATCH:**

Flames prospect Axel Hurtig was selected to represent Sweden at the 2025 World Junior Championships. Hurtig has registered one assist in two games so far, helping his nation go 2-0 so far through the tournament. Entering the World Juniors, Hurtig posted two goals and seven assists for nine points along with a team-best +22 rating in his first WHL season with the Calgary Hitmen.

#### **HEY DID YOU KNOW?**

Nazem Kadri's 10 career goals against Vegas are tied for the sixth-most by a single skater against the Golden Knights. Only Anze Kopitar (15), Ryan O'Reilly (12), Leon Draisaitl (12), Tyler Toffoli (12), and Kyle Connor (11) have more.
